1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. (a) Two Million Two Hundred Eighty-Two Thousand
3 Dollars (\$2,285,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
4 Public Utility Agency of Guam to design and construct water lines, a deep
5 well, and a reservoir in the Municipality of Agana Heights.

6 (b) Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000) are hereby
7 appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam to
8 construct and install fire hydrants in the Municipality of Agana Heights.

9 Section 2. One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) are
10 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public
11 Works to renovate the baseball field in the Municipality of Merizo.

12 Section 3. Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) are hereby appropriated
13 from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to construct
14 restroom facilities at the Merizo Youth Center, Municipality of Merizo.

15 Section 4. Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) are hereby appropriated
16 from the General Fund to the Guam Power Authority to install power poles
17 and power lines at Santa Ana, Municipality of Agat.

1 Section 5. (a) Subpart O, 3 of Part XVI (Department of Education)
2 of Section 1 of Chapter II of the General Appropriation Act for Fiscal Years
3 1990-1991 (the "Act") is amended to read:

4 "3. Supplies & Materials 27,789 27,789"

5 (b) The "TOTAL" of Subpart O of Part XVI (Department
6 of Education) of Section 1 of Chapter II of the Act is amended to read:

7 "TOTAL \$ 1,683,365 \$ 1,673,365"

8 (c) The "GRAND TOTAL" PART XVI (Department of
9 Education) Section 1 of Chapter II of the Act is amended to read:

10 "GRAND TOTAL \$88,187,138 \$88,187,138"

11 Section 6. Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) are hereby
12 appropriated from the General Fund to the Municipal Planning Council of
13 Agana Heights to buy street cleaning equipment.

14 Section 7. Subsection (1) of Section 5 of Chapter III of the Budget
15 Act is hereby amended to read:

16 "(1) \$686,125 To supplement the appropriation in
17 Section 1 of Public Law 20-8 for the construction of a
18 gymnasium on Lot No. 12-2 REM in the Municipality of Agana
19 Heights. The construction and use of such gymnasium on
20 such lot are hereby authorized."

21 Section 8. Section 1 of Public Law 20-104 is amended to read:

22 "Section 1. One Million Five Hundred Fifty-Two Thousand Four
23 Hundred Dollars (\$1,552,400) are hereby appropriated from the General
24 Fund to the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority to complete
25 eighty-two (82) housing units for the elderly in Agat, Dededo, Merizo
26 and Talofoyo."

27 Section 9. Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000) are hereby
28 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to
29 install a net, lights and fencing at, and to resurface, the Talofoyo tennis
30 court.

31 Section 10. Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000) are hereby
32 appropriated from the General Fund to the Municipal Planning Council of
33 Talofoyo to clear, fill and landscape a portion of Block 228, consisting of

1 18,000 square meters, in the village of Talofofu to provide a public golf
2 driving range.

3 Section 11. Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) are hereby
4 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to
5 install lights at the Talofofu Baseball Field.

6 Section 12. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are hereby
7 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to
8 repair and improve the Central Community Center in Dededo.

9 Section 13. Thirty-Six Thousand Three Hundred Dollars (\$36,300) are
10 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Education
11 to pay the expenses of persons selected to participate in the Close Up
12 Program. Funding provided in this Section may be used for participation
13 by public and private schools, the Director of Education to determine the
14 amount needed per participant.

15 Section 14. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from
16 the General Fund to the Department of Education to fund the participation
17 of the John F. Kennedy High School Concert Band in the Pacific Basin
18 Band Festival to be held in Honolulu, Hawaii from March 25 to April 1,
19 1990. Within sixty (60) days after April 1, 1990, the Director of Education
20 shall submit to the Legislature a report of all expenditures under this
21 section, including but not limited to a balance sheet, a statement of receipts
22 and a general description of expenses arising out of the participation of the
23 band in the Festival.

24 Section 15. Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that due to
25 the unprecedented development of the Mogfog and Macheche areas, there is
26 an increasing need to upgrade the sewer services for these areas. There
27 is an estimated population of 2,500 in this area which is expected to
28 increase to 3,500 by the year 2000. There are already six sewage pumping
29 stations servicing this population with more expected to be constructed. It
30 is the further finding of the Legislature that the continuing proliferation of
31 sewage pumping stations and the expanding population demonstrate the
32 necessity of masterplanning for the sewer and water system infrastructure,
33 and that such infrastructure is necessary to protect the northern water
34 lens which is located in these communities. Inasmuch as the Public Utility

1 Agency of Guam ("PUAG") and a consortium of developers in these areas
2 have drawn up a plan whereby PUAG and the consortium will jointly finance
3 the \$1,628,641 Macheche-Mogfog Sewer System Improvement Project (the
4 "Project"), the Legislature also finds that the Project should be supported
5 in order to address the problems. Accordingly, Nine Hundred Thirty
6 Thousand Dollars (\$930,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to
7 PUAG to fund PUAG's share of the cost of the Project.

8 Section 16. Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that Public
9 Law 18-33 provided that each elementary teacher not given paid time for
10 preparation be paid additional salary equivalent to one (1) hour per day,
11 but due to lack of funds, this law has never been implemented. The
12 Legislature finds now that funds are available and that the law should be
13 carried out. Accordingly, Three Million Seven Hundred Fifty-Six
14 Thousand, Six Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$3,756,668) are appropriated
15 from the General Fund to the Department of Education for preparation pay
16 to those approximately 653 elementary teachers who have not as yet
17 received but are entitled to such pay.

18 Section 17. Subsection (a) of Section 17 of Public Law 18-33 is hereby
19 amended to read:

20 "(a) Pursuant to Section 11 of Public Law 18-1, and Section 9 of
21 Public Law 18-15, Language Arts and Mathematics Program teachers
22 teaching any students in grades six through twelve are entitled to
23 preparation period pay."

24 Section 18. Twenty-One Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-Five Dollars
25 and Ninety-Seven Cents (\$21,385.97) are appropriated from the General
26 Fund to the Department of Education to provide preparation period pay for
27 those Language and Mathematics teachers described in subsection (a) of
28 Section 17 of Public Law 18-33.

29 Section 19. Twenty-five (25) additional full-time equivalent positions
30 are hereby authorized for the Public Utility Agency of Guam.

31 Section 20. The government of Guam has received funds to be
32 expanded for energy related programs approved by the Department of
33 Energy pursuant to §153 of Public Law 97-377, and the cases of U.S. vs.
34 Exxon and In Re Department of Energy Stripper Well Exemption Litigation.

1 Pursuant to §8310 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, the plan for
2 expenditure of such petroleum violation escrow funds is hereby approved
3 with the funds to be expended as follows:

**COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS
REPORT ON
BILL NO. 1040**

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR
INSTALLATION OF WATER LINES AND FIRE
HYDRANTS IN AGANA HEIGHTS.**

The Committee on Way & Means conducted a public hearing on Monday, November 6, 1989 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Session Hall to hear testimony on Bill No. 1040. Senator Herminia D. Dierking, Acting Chairperson of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senator Martha C. Ruth.

TESTIMONY

Testimony was presented by Mayor Frank Portusach in support of the passage of Bill 1040 for the community of Agana heights. Mayor Portusach in his testimony stated a few reasons why this proposed Bill needs to be enacted into law and they are, the population keeps increasing and the growth of Agana Heights is unrestricted by the vast land area still undeveloped, there is an urgent need to replace the 2" undersized water lines to 6" water lines to alleviate the overburdened lines to increase the water supply and water pressure for fire protection and sufficient distribution of water for all the residents of Agana Heights.

Alex Ching, acting on behalf of PUAG's Director, Mr Tony Blaz, testified in support of Bill 1040 where by it will bring services to other communities nearby. The infrastructure improvements in Agana Heights have not kept pace with residential growth and development in the past decades and the design and construction of water lines, a deep well, and a reservoir will substantially improve water services to the area. PUAG also stated in its testimony the the installation of fire hydrants will complement the storage reserves and provide a reliable source of water for fire protection.

A Fiscal Note was submitted by the Bureau of Budge and Management Research indicating that the amount specified on the proposed Bill is sufficient to accommodate the design, construction, and installation of water lines and fire hydrants in Agana Heights.

RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 1040 be passed by the Twentieth Guam Legislature.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislative Committee on Ways & Means. I am here today to testify in support of Bill 1040 - An Act to Appropriate Funds for Installation of Water Lines and Fire Hydrants in Agana Heights.

Infrastructure improvements in Agana Heights have not kept pace with residential growth and development in the past decades. The design and construction of water lines, a deep well, and a reservoir will substantially improve water services to the area. It will not only increase services to areas presently not being adequately served, it will also provide additional reserve water capacity for usages during peak demand periods, and for emergency and fire protection usages.

Besides benefitting the people of Agana Heights, this project will also benefit the local government and taxpayers. Presently, water for the Agana Heights area is predominately being supplied from Navy water source. The additional water being produced by the new well will lessen that much water purchase from the Navy.

The installation of fire hydrants will complement the storage reserves and provide a reliable source of water for fire protection.

PUAG has had preliminary discussions with the Mayor of Agana Heights and we jointly agree and support the urgent need to provide additional water supply and storage facilities; therefore, reducing their dependence on the Navy to provide this most vitally needed commodity.

PUAG appreciates members of this legislature in expressing their constant sincere concern in providing better water and wastewater services islandwide. This is evidenced by this and many of the recent legislation all introduced to provide funds for capital improvements in the water and wastewater areas.

PUAG encourages your passage for Bill 1040.

On behalf of the Municipal Planning Council and the residents of Agana Heights, I hereby submit testimony in favor of Bill No. 1040, which is an urgent measure that would benefit the residents of Agana Heights.


The Municipal Planning Council and I recognize the importance of this bill, which is an act to appropriate \$2,500,000 for the design, and construction of water lines, deep well and a one million gallon reservoir, which will bring consistent water pressure; and \$85,000 to make fire hydrants available throughout Agana Heights. An adequate and reliable water supply is an essential part to firefighting facilities of a municipality. Water is so fundamental to firefighting, that a good water supply is the most important single factor in firefighting.

To mention a few of the many reasons why this bill needs to be enacted into law: (1) The population keeps increasing and the growth of Agana Heights is unrestricted by the vast land area still undeveloped; (2) There is an urgent need to replace the 2" undersized water lines to six inch water lines to alleviate the overburdened lines to increase the water supply and water pressure for fire protection, a sufficient distribution of water for all the residents of Agana Heights.

To eliminate low water pressure problems and afford adequate pressure and to reduce fire hazards is one of the major concerns of the Municipal Council. With the growing population, there is an increased concern for not only adequate water pressure, but for adequate fire hydrants, sanitary and aesthetic quality of water, and a healthy, safe and clean environment in the community. At present, many water mains within the Agana Heights proper are below the acceptable water main size as recommended by fire protection engineers.

On behalf of the Municipal Planning Council and residents of Agana Heights, thank you for allowing me to render my supportive comments to this urgent measure. I have prepared herewith a map designating the areas in need of improvements. The Municipal Planning Council and I support this bill that will bring water line and fire hydrant improvements throughout Agana Heights. Thank you for this opportunity to render supportive testimony on behalf of my constituents.

Comments on Bill No. 1040


Bill No. 1040 is an act to appropriate funds for the installation of water lines and fire hydrants in Agana Heights.

Sections 1(a) and (b) proposes to appropriate a total of Two Million Three Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$2,370,000) from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam. Of this amount, Two Million Two Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,285,000) is for the design and construction of water lines, a deep well, and a reservoir; and Eighty Five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000) is for the construction and installation of fire hydrants.

Per information received from PUAG, the appropriation as proposed will be sufficient to accommodate the design, construction, and installation of water lines and fire hydrants in Agana Heights.
