

ADJUSTMENTS, AND THE EXPENSES OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE ASSOCIATION OF PACIFIC ISLAND LEGISLATURES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that the old legislative building, known as the Guam Congress Building, embodies an important segment of the history of Guam. It serves as a reminder of the efforts, work and accomplishments of the many members of the legislative branch who unselfishly served the people of Guam. The Legislature, therefore, finds it of paramount importance to renovate the old legislative building and to preserve this piece of legislative history for posterity and future generations. The Legislature also finds that a new legislative building should be constructed in the same location with sufficient parking for senators, employees and visitors. This legislative building shall be at least one hundred thousand square feet in size, pursuant to the recommendation of the engineering consultant, and should be a multi-story building, reflective of the aesthetic, cultural and anthropological values of the island.

Section 2. Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) are appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund of the Legislature for the renovation and restoration of the Guam Congress Building.

Section 3. Sixteen Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,200,000) are appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund of the Legislature for the design and construction of a new legislative building.

Section 4. Two Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand Three Hundred Sixty-Eight Dollars (\$284,368) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operations Fund of the Legislature to pay for state funeral expenditures for the period covering January 1, 1989 to March 31, 1990, and to pay for the cost of living salary adjustments of the central legislative employees.

Section 5. Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Operation Fund of the Legislature to fund the expenses of the July assembly in Guam of the Association of Pacific Island Legislatures.

This legislative building shall be at least one 100,984 square feet, pursuant to the recommendation of the engineering consultant, and it should be a multi-story building and shall be reflective of the aesthetic, cultural and anthropological values of the island.

COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 1294(LS)

Bill No. 1294(LS) is an Act to appropriate an additional amount of \$9,000,000 from the FY 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund of the Guam Legislature to supplement the original appropriation of \$6,000,000 of P.L. 20-41 for the design and construction of a new legislative building.

Enactment of the proposed bill will not result in a fiscal impact on the General Fund during the current fiscal year. However, it will impact on the General Fund in FY 1991 by \$9,000,000.

Based on current construction valuation rates for a legislative office at 100,984 square feet, cost estimates range from a minimum of \$6,123,418 to a maximum of \$9,118,856, inclusive of a 5% inflation allowance. The average 10% architectural and engineering design cost is well within the total amount of \$15,000,000, when adding the original appropriation in P.L. 20-41 and the proposed amount. No detail budget breakdown is available at this time.
