





AN ACT TO AMEND §59010 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO PROVIDE FUNDING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM IN LIEU OF A TUITION INCREASE, TO REPEAL §§59019 AND 59019.1 OF SAID CODE, AND TO TRANSFER TO THE UNIVERSITY THE BALANCE OF THE VETERANS BONUS FUND.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:  
2 Section 1. §59010 of the Government Code is amended to read:  
3 "§59010. Pari-mutuel Tax.

1           (1) In addition to any other tax, there shall be  
2 deducted from the total daily pari-mutuel pool and paid to the  
3 government of Guam a daily operating tax of three percent  
4 (3%) of all money paid into the pari-mutuel pool.

5           (2) The pari-mutuel tax revenue provided for in this  
6 Section and all other revenue paid to the Territory pursuant to  
7 Section 59007 of the Government Code is appropriated to the  
8 University of Guam (the "University"). The Treasurer shall  
9 remit such revenue to the University at the end of each  
10 quarter. The Board of Regents of the University shall use the  
11 revenues generated from the pari-mutuel tax as an additional  
12 source of funding to prevent any proposed tuition increase.  
13 Any additional funding requirements not covered by the pari-  
14 mutuel tax shall be requested of the Legislature."

15       Section 2. §§59019 and 59019.1 of the Government Code are repealed.

16       Section 3. Any balance in the Veterans Bonus Fund existing on the  
17 effective date of this Act is appropriated to the University in lieu of the  
18 tuition and fee increases proposed by the Board of Regents for the academic  
19 year 1990-1991.

COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION  
ON BILL NO. 1252(LS)

AN ACT PROVIDING FUNDING TO THE UNIVERSITY  
OF GUAM IN LIEU OF A TUITION INCREASE.

PREFACE

The Committee on Education conducted a scheduled public hearing on Tuesday, March 17, 1990 in the Legislative Session Hall. Committee members present at the hearing were as follows:

Senator Franklin J. A. Quitugua, Chairman  
Senator Eddie R. Duenas, Member

**Discussions on Bill No. 1252 were as follows:**

Senator Quitugua had asked the President and the Chairman of the Board of Regents how much was needed from the Guam Greyhound proceeds to substitute for the proposed increase in tuition for the University of Guam.

President Leon Guerrero stated that the Board was looking at establishing a policy on tuition, and that the proposed increase was tied in with the consumer price index.

He also stated that the Board was very much concerned on setting up a policy alone for tuition, one that would not have the students suffer and ensure that the institution be able to plan effectively based on a policy.

Senator Quitugua asked President Leon Guerrero if the Board had developed the policy.

President Leon Guerrero responded by commenting that the Board had based their tuition on the consumer price index within the mainland universities and came up with the figure of \$480,000 to be generated from revenues. He also stated it was the Governor who had asked the Board if they would reconsider their stand on this issue so that the \$480,000 would come from revenues out of the Guam Greyhound.

Senator Quitugua had asked the Board, what if there were no revenues available from the Guam Greyhound, what would their option be then. He also noted that the committee is aware of the resentments from the students regarding tuition increase, and why is the Board prompting a tuition increase when the Legislature has been generous to the University for its previous funding needs.

President Leon Guerrero remarked on the fact that operational costs have continued to rise and also the cost of education has risen. President Leon Guerrero stated they are at the point right now where they are trying to catch up with what needs to be done.

Senator Quitugua requested the Board to submit the proposed policy on the tuition increase to the Committee and their projection of their needs for the next few years.

#### ANALYSIS OF BILL 1252

Bill 1252 seeks to provide funding to the University of Guam in lieu of a tuition increase.

#### COMMITTEE FINDINGS

1. The Committee finds that Bill No. 1252 needs to be studied further for recommended changes and points for further consideration.

2. There was great concern stressed by the Board of Regents that because of operational and educational costs have multiplied over the years, the need of a tuition increase is justifiable.

#### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Education, concerned of the need to provide an additional source of funding to support the operational needs of the University of Guam, recommends that Bill 1252 be passed so that the present, as well as new students, may enroll and not be burdened by an increase in tuition fees.



Section 1. Section 59010 of the Government Code is  
amended to read:

(3%) of all money paid into the pari-mutuel pool.

(2) The pari-mutuel tax revenue provided for in

Department of Revenue and Taxation or his designee for his  
operation] pursuant to Section 59007 of [this Act)] the  
Government Code (as amended in Section 120 of Public Law  
19-05) is appropriated to the University of Guam. The  
Treasurer shall remit such revenue to the University at the  
end of each quarter. [may from time to time be allocated or  
appropriated for special purposes by the Legislature, and  
such revenue may be encumbered or pledged for the purpose of  
borrowing for such special purposes. In the event the

Legislature fails or neglects to make any special allocation or appropriation for the revenues as provided herein or in the event any special allocation or appropriation is by its own terms fully paid or lapsed, then the revenues shall thereafter be paid into the General Fund for the general use and benefit of the Territory.]"

Section 2. Sections 59019 and 59019.1 of the Government Code as enacted in Public Law 14-126 and as amended in Public Law 15-119 are repealed.

Section 3. Any balance in the Veterans Bonus Fund existing on the effective date of this Act is appropriated to the University of Guam in lieu of the tuition and fee increase proposed by the Board of Regents for the academic year 1990-1991.


