CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 1342 (LS), "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$638,350) TO THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE PASSENGER BUSES TO SERVICE CLIENTS OF THE SERVICIO PARA I MANAMKO, GOODWILL INDUSTRIES, GUMA MAMI AND RSVP PROGRAMS, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBITEM (2) OF SUBSECTION (a) OF §23104, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON EXECUTIVE TRAVEL, TO ADD SUBSECTION (g) TO §65002, TITLE XLVIX, GOVERNMENT CODE, ON MONTHLY STIPENDS FOR THE GUAM COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, FOR OFF-ISLAND TRAVEL OF YOUTH FOOTBALL, FOR GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH, FOR A MEMORIAL TO THE INSULAR GUARDS, FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC ASSOCIATION FOR THE DISABLED, AND FOR BACK WAGES OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES," was on the 1st day of August, 1990, duly and regularly passed.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$638,350) TO THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE PASSENGER BUSES TO SERVICE CLIENTS OF THE SERVICIO PARA I MANAMKO, GOODWILL INDUSTRIES, GUMA MAMI AND RSVP PROGRAMS, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBITEM (2) OF SUBSECTION (a) OF \$23104, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON EXECUTIVE TRAVEL, TO ADD SUBSECTION (g) TO \$65002, TITLE XLVIX, GOVERNMENT CODE, ON MONTHLY STIPENDS FOR

THE GUAM COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, FOR OFF-ISLAND TRAVEL OF YOUTH FOOTBALL, FOR GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH, FOR A MEMORIAL TO THE INSULAR GUARDS, FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC ASSOCIATION FOR THE DISABLED, AND FOR BACK WAGES OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Six Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$638,350) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Mass Transit Authority to purchase seventeen (17) passenger buses to service its programs in accordance with the following allocation:
 - 1. Fourteen (14) passenger vans to transport Servicio Para I Manamko clients.
- 8 2. Three (3) passenger vans, one (1) for each of the following programs:
 - a. Goodwill Industries.
 - b. Guma Mami.

- c. Retired Senior Volunteers Program ("RSVP").
- Section 2. Subitem (2) of subsection (a) of §23104 of Title 5, Guam 14 Code Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
 - "(2) If the employee is an Executive Assistant or Special Assistant to the Governor, director or deputy director of any department, or member of the board of directors or commission of any autonomous agency, authority or public corporation, the rate is One Hundred Twenty Five Percent (125%) of the basic per diem rates;".
 - Section 3. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are hereby appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to construct retaining walls and storm drainage at Manga Street in the municipality of Piti. The Director of Public Works is hereby directed to expedite the construction so as to complete the project before March of 1991.
- Section 4. (a) A new subsection (g) is added to \$65002 of Title XLVIX of the Government Code to read:

"(g) Compensation: While serving in office and attending meetings, members shall receive a stipend of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per meeting, but not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in any one calendar month."

- (b) Funding for retroactive payment; appropriation. Members of the Guam Council on Arts and Humanities ("CAHA") who have attended past meetings without compensation shall be retroactively paid stipends, for the period beginning January 1, 1987, at the rate set out in paragraph (a) of this Section. Seventeen Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$17,200) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to CAHA to retroactively pay the stipends set out in said paragraph and to fund stipends for meetings up to September 30, 1990."
- Section 6. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are hereby appropriated into the Workmen's Compensation Fund established in §37042 of Title XXXIII of the Government Code to pay workmen's compensation to employees of the government of Guam.
- Section 7. Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation (the "Department") for Guam Youth Football League off-island travel, and for expenses of the board of directors of the Department.
- Section 8. Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Micronesian Area Research Center at the University of Guam to complete the master genealogical database for the Chamorro Family History.
- Section 9. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to design and construct a suitable memorial to honor the Guam Insular Guards.
- Section 10. Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$18,500) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Western Pacific Association for the Disabled to hire a driver, and to defray the costs of fuel, gas and insurance for its passenger van which provides transportation services to disabled persons.
- Section 11. Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation to pay its

- 1 employees' outstanding back wages. Any balance in such appropriation not
- 2 expended by September 30, 1990 shall revert to the General Fund.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$638,350) TO THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY FOR THE PURCHASE OF VAN PASSENGER BUSES TO SERVICE CLIENTS OF THE SERVICIO PARA I MANAMKO, GOODWILL INDUSTRIES, GUMA MAMI AND RSVP PROGRAMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Six Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$638,350) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Mass Transit Authority for the purpose of purchasing Van passenger Mini-Buses, to service program in accordance with the following allocation:

- 1. Fourteen (14) passenger Vans to transport Servicio Para I Manamko clients.
- 2. One (1) passenger Van to service each of the following programs:
 - a. Goodwill Industries
 - b. Guma Mami
 - c. Retired Senior Citizen Program (RSVP)
