CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SIX HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$638,350) TO THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY TO PURCHASE PASSENGER BUSES TO SERVICE CLIENTS OF THE SERVICIO PARA I MANAMKO, GOODWILL INDUSTRIES, GUMA MAMI AND RSVP PROGRAMS, TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBITEM (2) OF SUBSECTION (a) OF §23104, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON EXECUTIVE TRAVEL, TO ADD SUBSECTION (g) TO §65002, TITLE XLVIX, GOVERNMENT CODE, ON MONTHLY STIPENDS FOR

THE GUAM COUNCIL ON THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION, FOR OFF-ISLAND TRAVEL OF YOUTH FOOTBALL, FOR GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH, FOR A MEMORIAL TO THE INSULAR GUARDS, FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC ASSOCIATION FOR THE DISABLED, AND FOR BACK WAGES OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Six Hundred Thirty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred and Fifty  
3 Dollars (\$638,350) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Mass  
4 Transit Authority to purchase seventeen (17) passenger buses to service its  
5 programs in accordance with the following allocation:

6 1. Fourteen (14) passenger vans to transport Servicio Para I  
7 Manamko clients.

8 2. Three (3) passenger vans, one (1) for each of the following  
9 programs:

10 a. Goodwill Industries,

11 b. Guma Mami,

12 c. Retired Senior Volunteers Program ("RSVP").

13 Section 2. Subitem (2) of subsection (a) of §23104 of Title 5, Guam  
14 Code Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

15 "(2) If the employee is an Executive Assistant or Special  
16 Assistant to the Governor, director or deputy director of any  
17 department, or member of the board of directors or commission of any  
18 autonomous agency, authority or public corporation, the rate is One  
19 Hundred Twenty Five Percent (125%) of the basic per diem rates;".

20 Section 3. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are hereby  
21 appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the  
22 Department of Public Works to construct retaining walls and storm drainage  
23 at Manga Street in the municipality of Piti. The Director of Public Works is  
24 hereby directed to expedite the construction so as to complete the project  
25 before March of 1991.

26 Section 4. (a) A new subsection (g) is added to §65002 of Title XLVIX  
27 of the Government Code to read:

1           "(g) Compensation: While serving in office and attending  
2 meetings, members shall receive a stipend of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per  
3 meeting, but not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100) in any one  
4 calendar month."

5           (b) Funding for retroactive payment; appropriation. Members of the  
6 Guam Council on Arts and Humanities ("CAHA") who have attended past  
7 meetings without compensation shall be retroactively paid stipends, for the  
8 period beginning January 1, 1987, at the rate set out in paragraph (a) of this  
9 Section. Seventeen Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$17,200) are hereby  
10 appropriated from the General Fund to CAHA to retroactively pay the  
11 stipends set out in said paragraph and to fund stipends for meetings up to  
12 September 30, 1990."

13           Section 6. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are hereby  
14 appropriated into the Workmen's Compensation Fund established in §37042  
15 of Title XXXIII of the Government Code to pay workmen's compensation to  
16 employees of the government of Guam.

17           Section 7. Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) are hereby appropriated  
18 from the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation (the  
19 "Department") for Guam Youth Football League off-island travel, and for  
20 expenses of the board of directors of the Department.

21           Section 8. Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) are hereby  
22 appropriated from the General Fund to the Micronesian Area Research Center  
23 at the University of Guam to complete the master genealogical database for  
24 the Chamorro Family History.

25           Section 9. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are hereby  
26 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to  
27 design and construct a suitable memorial to honor the Guam Insular Guards.

28           Section 10. Eighteen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$18,500) are  
29 appropriated from the General Fund to the Western Pacific Association for the  
30 Disabled to hire a driver, and to defray the costs of fuel, gas and insurance for  
31 its passenger van which provides transportation services to disabled persons.

32           Section 11. Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) are appropriated from  
33 the General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation to pay its

1 employees' outstanding back wages. Any balance in such appropriation not  
2 expended by September 30, 1990 shall revert to the General Fund.
