

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR


This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 733 (LS), "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SIX MILLION DOLLARS TO FUND A ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLAR LUMP SUM COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREES AND THEIR SURVIVORS, TO AUTHORIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OPTION 1 EQUIVALENCY STUDY, TO AMEND SUBSECTION (a) OF SECTION 2 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-65 CHANGING THE RETROACTIVE DATE ON THE PAY SALARY INCREASES TO AUGUST 15, 1986, TO REASSIGN PAY RANGES FOR CERTAIN POSITIONS, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE COMMISSION ON SELF-DETERMINATION, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE GUAM YOUTH CONGRESS, TO REASSIGN PAY RANGES FOR TECHNICAL ENGINEERING POSITIONS, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE DR. PEDRO SANCHEZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, TO AMEND SUBPARAGRAPH (b) OF SECTION 5 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-105 ON SUCH PROGRAM, TO AUTHORIZE PAY INCREASES FOR PART-TIME NURSES, TO AUTHORIZE LUMP SUM PAYMENTS FOR NURSES WITH EXCESS ANNUAL LEAVE, TO AUTHORIZE THE HIRING OF RETIRED NURSES, TO EXEMPT NURSING POSITIONS FROM RESTRICTIONS ON FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS, AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR RESEARCH AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS ARISING FROM THE STUDY OF LYTICO AND BODIG," was on the 28th day of August, 1990, duly and regularly passed.



AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE SIX MILLION DOLLARS TO  
FUND A ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLAR  
LUMP SUM COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR  
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREES AND THEIR  
SURVIVORS, TO AUTHORIZE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF  
THE OPTION 1 EQUIVALENCY STUDY, TO AMEND  
SUBSECTION (a) OF SECTION 2 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-65  
CHANGING THE RETROACTIVE DATE ON THE PAY  
SALARY INCREASES TO AUGUST 15, 1986, TO

REASSIGN PAY RANGES FOR CERTAIN POSITIONS, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE COMMISSION ON SELF-DETERMINATION, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE GUAM YOUTH CONGRESS, TO REASSIGN PAY RANGES FOR TECHNICAL ENGINEERING POSITIONS, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE DR. PEDRO SANCHEZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, TO AMEND SUBPARAGRAPH (b) OF SECTION 5 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-105 ON SUCH PROGRAM, TO AUTHORIZE PAY INCREASES FOR PART-TIME NURSES, TO AUTHORIZE LUMP SUM PAYMENTS FOR NURSES WITH EXCESS ANNUAL LEAVE, TO AUTHORIZE THE HIRING OF RETIRED NURSES, TO EXEMPT NURSING POSITIONS FROM RESTRICTIONS ON FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS, AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR RESEARCH AND TRANSPORTATION COSTS ARISING FROM THE STUDY OF LYTICO AND BODIG.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000) are hereby appropriated  
3 from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Government of  
4 Guam Retirement Fund (the "Fund") to fund a One Thousand Eight Hundred  
5 Dollars (\$1,800) lump sum cost of living allowance to be paid to those  
6 government of Guam retired employees or survivors on the rolls of the Fund  
7 as of October 1, 1990, such payment to be paid not later than October 31,  
8 1990.

9 Section 2. Implementation of the Option 1 equivalency study  
10 recommended in the Civil Service Commission memorandum No. CSC 9-423  
11 and the Attorney General Supplemental Opinion No. CSC 89-0389 is hereby  
12 authorized. Funds appropriated pursuant to Section 5 of Public Law 20-65 as  
13 amended are hereby authorized to be expended for such purpose.

14 Section 3. Subsection (a) of Section 2 of Public Law 20-65 is hereby  
15 amended to read:

16 "(a) The proposed salaries in the Pay Range Schedule and  
17 Wage Schedule as recommended by the Civil Service Commission in  
18 the Classification and Pay Maintenance Review Task Force Phase 1

1 Report dated November 7, 1985, and as corrected in Section 1 of this  
2 Act, shall be fully and immediately implemented, to be retroactively  
3 effective to August 15, 1986."

4 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the  
5 reassignments of pay ranges for the positions of Administrative Assistant,  
6 Administrative Supervisor, Administrative Officer, and Public Health Dental  
7 Administrative Manager as approved by Civil Service Commission  
8 memoranda Nos. CSC 89-308 and 89-671, are hereby made retroactive to  
9 August 15, 1986, and appropriations for Fiscal Year 1991 are authorized to be  
10 expended for such purpose.

11 Section 5. Five Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$510,000) are hereby  
12 appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Commission on Self-  
13 Determination (the "Commission") to fund the operations of the Commission  
14 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1991, to be expended in accordance  
15 with the following schedule:

32 The Commission shall prepare and file with the Speaker of the  
33 Legislature quarterly reports of its activities throughout fiscal year 1991  
34 beginning with October 1, 1990.

1 Section 6. Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) are appropriated  
 2 form the General Fund to the Legislature's Operations Fund for the operation  
 3 of the Guam Youth Congress (the "Congress"). All monies in the appropriation  
 4 to the Congress made in Section 4 of Public Law 20-108 not expended at the  
 5 end of the term of such Congress are hereby carried over to the operations of  
 6 the Congress for Fiscal Year 1991.

7 Section 7. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the following  
 8 technical professional engineering positions in the government of Guam are  
 9 reclassified as follows:

14       The foregoing reassignments shall be retroactive to September 30,  
15 1988, and shall be implemented on a step-to-step basis, pursuant to the Civil  
16 Service Commission's order thereon.

17       Section 8. (a) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) are  
18 appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the  
19 Department of Administration for the tuition, fees and authorized expenses of  
20 the participants in the Dr. Pedro Sanchez Scholarship program at the  
21 University of Guam.

22       (b) Subparagraph (b) of Section 5 of Public Law 20-105 is hereby  
23 amended to read:

24       "(b) Employees enrolled in the program shall be allowed  
25 administrative leave with pay to attend classes during working  
26 hours. Annual leave charged recipients shall automatically be  
27 reinstated. In the case of graduate students, the agency shall allow  
28 full-time administrative leave with pay during the semester in which  
29 the scholarship recipient performs research toward his or her special  
30 project or thesis."

31       Section 9. Registered nurses who are hired by the Guam Memorial  
32 Hospital, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, or the  
33 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, on a part-time basis, and  
34 are required to have and to maintain current licensure as registered nurses

1 with the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners, shall be granted an increase in their  
2 hourly wages upon completion of an accumulated two thousand eighty (2080)  
3 hours of work.

4 Section 10. Registered nurses employed by the Guam Memorial  
5 Hospital, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, or the  
6 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, who have accrued an  
7 excess of five hundred eighty (580) hours of annual leave shall be granted a  
8 lump sum payment at their regular hourly wage for each hour of excess  
9 annual leave exceeding five hundred eighty (580) hours; provided, that said  
10 lump sum payment shall be made only if such a nurse cannot be granted such  
11 excess leave within sixty (60) days of its accrual.

12 Section 11. Retired registered nurses, who have current licenses and  
13 registration issued by the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners and who are hired  
14 by the Guam Memorial Hospital, the Department of Public Health and Social  
15 Services, or the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, in  
16 positions requiring a currently licensed and registered nurse, shall be  
17 exempted from the provisions of §8121, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to  
18 permit their temporary or part-time employment without loss or suspension  
19 of their retirement annuity payments.

20 Section 12. All nursing positions in the nursing divisions of the Guam  
21 Memorial Hospital, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, and  
22 the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse are exempt from  
23 position freezes and the full-time equivalent position restrictions imposed by  
24 Public Law 19-10. If critical to nursing care, two (2) equivalent part-time  
25 nurses may share one (1) full-time equivalent position.

26 Section 13. (a) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are  
27 appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the  
28 University of Guam to fund its neurological research in Guam on Lytico and  
29 Bodig, in conjunction with the Mayo Clinic. Any monies appropriated in this  
30 subsection and not expended in Fiscal Year 1991 shall be carried over to the  
31 following fiscal year.

32 (b) One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are authorized to be  
33 appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1992 revenues of the General Fund to the  
34 University of Guam to fund the continuance of such research on Guam. Any



1 monies appropriated pursuant to this subsection and not expended in Fiscal  
2 Year 1992 shall be carried over to the following fiscal year.

3 (c) Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated form the Fiscal  
4 Year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the University of Guam for the  
5 transportation of patients and accompanying persons to the University of  
6 British Columbia to participate in the research on Lytico and Bodig. Any  
7 funds appropriated by this subsection and not expended in Fiscal Year 1991  
8 shall be carried over to the following fiscal year.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,500,000.00) FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING A SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$625.00) LUMP SUM COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREES OR THEIR SURVIVORS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1991 ONLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) is appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose of funding a Six Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$625.00) Lump Sum Cost of Living Allowance for Government of Guam Retirees or their Survivors for Fiscal Year 1991 only.
