

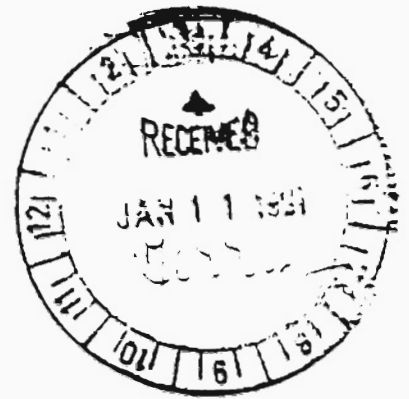

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Enclosed is Substitute Bill No. 1348 which I have signed into law as Public Law 20-224 with the exception of Section 4.

The appropriation made in Section 4 has been reduced to \$300,000 which is the amount required by the Department of Education to clear sufficient land near F. Q. Sanchez Elementary School for a playground. Equipment is available for the playground from other sources.

There appears to be an error in Section 8, Item 3. which should read:

3. Construction of and purchase of collateral equipment for cafeteria-auditorium \$606,000,.

I request that the Legislature correct the error as soon as possible so that work may begin at San Miguel Elementary School.



CRUZ SUBDIVISION, AGAT; TO AMEND PARAGRAPH (a) OF §6610.4 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO INCLUDE THE COUNCIL OF THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES IN THE GOVERNMENT TRAVEL LAW; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO RENOVATE PORTIONS OF THE SINAJANA COMMUNITY CENTER OCCUPIED BY THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES OF GUMA'MAMI, INC.; AND TO APPROPRIATE FIVE MILLION DOLLARS TO REPAIR DAMAGE CAUSED BY TYPHOON RUSS," was on the 24th day of December, 1990, duly and regularly passed.



SCHOOL, AND TO ADD SIX NEW CLASSROOMS TO SAN MIGUEL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, ACQUIRE EQUIPMENT FOR ITS CAFETERIA AND AUDITORIUM AND EXPAND ITS PARKING LOT AND PLAYGROUND; TO PURCHASE OTHER INSTRUCTIONAL EQUIPMENT; TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (c) OF §4303, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON GROUP LIFE INSURANCE FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES; TO AMEND §19951 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO INCREASE THE VOTING MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE LEGISLATURE TO THE GUAM TAX CODE COMMISSION; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO CONSTRUCT ADDITIONAL WATER AND SEWER LINES, ROAD PAVING AND SIDEWALKS IN THE R.R. CRUZ SUBDIVISION, AGAT; TO AMEND PARAGRAPH (a) OF §6610.4 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO INCLUDE THE COUNCIL OF THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES IN THE GOVERNMENT TRAVEL LAW; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO RENOVATE PORTIONS OF THE SINAJANA COMMUNITY CENTER OCCUPIED BY THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES OF GUMA'MAMI, INC.; AND TO APPROPRIATE FIVE MILLION DOLLARS TO REPAIR DAMAGE CAUSED BY TYPHOON RUSS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 SECTION 1. Legislative findings. The Legislature is aware of the urgent
3 need in certain Guam public schools for desperately needed facilities and
4 repairs. The Legislature believes that these needs must be addressed
5 immediately for the safety of Guam's children. The Legislature makes the
6 following specific findings:

7 (a) Carbullido Elementary School needs a new stage and storage
8 area because the former stage was destroyed, leaving the remaining
9 structure unsightly and hazardous to student safety.

10 (b) Piti Middle School needs a complete gymnasium with
11 shower facilities to accommodate the boys' and girls' physical education
12 program. For the safety of the children and to provide them the
13 complete physical education program that they deserve, this facility
14 must be completed as soon as possible.

15 (c) F. Q. Sanchez Elementary School does not have a designated
16 playground area, the lack of which makes students obtain field trip
17 permission just to cross the street to use the facilities at the Mayor's
18 Office for recreation.

1 (d)— Agat Elementary School's playground and parking area need
2 to be enlarged because both are currently inadequate to accommodate
3 students, staff and visitors.

4 (e) C. L. Taitano Elementary School needs to enlarge and
5 upgrade its parking area so as not to endanger students with private
6 transportation who have to pass between buses due to the inadequate
7 space in the current parking lot when buses are loading and unloading
8 students.

9 (f) The inadequate parking at M. A. Ulloa Elementary School
10 causes a traffic jam both mornings and afternoons, and is a safety
11 hazard for students in the parking lot who are disembarking from buses
12 and private vehicles.

13 (g) San Miguel Elementary School needs six (6) additional
14 classrooms, equipment for a cafeteria auditorium and playground, to
15 expand its parking lot and playground and to purchase instructional
16 equipment, all to accommodate the great increase in student enrollment.

17 Section 2. Carbullido Elementary School. One Hundred Ninety Thousand
18 Dollars (\$190,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department
19 of Education (the "Department") to design and construct a concrete stage and
20 storage area at Carbullido Elementary School.

21 Section 3. Piti Middle School. One Million Five Hundred Thousand
22 Dollars (\$1,500,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
23 Department for the following projects in the following amounts, all at Piti
24 Middle School:

Projects:	Amounts:
25 1. Design and construction of gymnasium,	\$995,000,
26 2. Shower, locker and restroom facilities,	185,000, <i>Q 7 ad</i>
27 3. Collateral equipment for the gymnasium,	360,000.
28	<i>Three Hundred Thousand</i>

29 Section 4. F. Q. Sanchez Elementary School. ~~One Million Five Hundred~~
30 ~~Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000)~~ ^(*\$300,000*) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
31 Department to design and develop a playground area at F. Q. Sanchez
32 Elementary School.

1 Section 5. Agat Elementary School. One Hundred Twelve Thousand
2 Dollars (\$112,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department
3 to enlarge the playground and parking areas at Agat Elementary School.

4 Section 6. C. L. Taitano Elementary School. One Hundred Thirty-One
5 Thousand Dollars (\$131,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
6 Department to enlarge and upgrade the parking area at C. L. Taitano
7 Elementary School.

8 Section 7. M. A. Ulloa Elementary School. One Hundred Sixty-Five
9 Thousand Dollars (\$165,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
10 Department to upgrade the parking area at M. A. Ulloa Elementary School.

11 Section 8. San Miguel Elementary School. One Million Three Hundred
12 Forty-Eight Thousand Eight Thousand Ninety-Two Dollars (\$1,348,892) are
13 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for the following
14 projects in the following amounts, all at San Miguel Elementary School:

17	2. Construction of six (6) classrooms,	432,000,
18	3. Construction or purchase of collateral

24 Section 9. (a) Subsections (b) and (c) of §4303, Title 4, Guam Code
25 Annotated, are repealed and reenacted to read:

26 "(b) Participation by employees, as employees are defined in
27 subsection (d) of this Section, in such contracts of life insurance shall
28 provide coverage for up to a face amount of Ten Thousand Dollars
29 (\$10,000), and shall be non-contributory by the employees, the
30 premium to be paid by the government of Guam.

31 (c) Contracts of life insurance procured under the foregoing
32 subsection (b) shall be limited to a face amount of up to Ten Thousand
33 Dollars (\$10,000) including charges for accidental death and
34 dismemberment. Coverage under such non-contributory plan shall

1 commence after an employee has served six (6) consecutive months
2 service in the government on entry or re-entry. Retirees and survivors
3 of retirees are covered as of the day they become retirees or survivors
4 of retirees.

5 Supplemental coverage may also be procured as an added benefit
6 for an active employee only. The face amount of such supplemental
7 coverage shall be at least Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000), the
8 premium for which shall be paid entirely by the employee. Such
9 supplemental insurance shall be on a voluntary basis and may include
10 such features as accidental death and dismemberment, and waiver of
11 premium. Dependent coverage may be included as part of the
12 supplemental coverage. The government of Guam shall provide payroll
13 deduction for payment of the premiums for such supplemental
14 coverage."

15 (b) The provisions of subsection (a) of this Section shall take
16 effect upon the award of the next Group Life Insurance Contract for the
17 government of Guam, scheduled for April 1991.

18 Section 10. §19951 of the Government Code of Guam is amended to read:

19 "§19951. Guam Tax Code Commission: establishment and
20 organization. The Guam Tax Code Commission (the "Commission") is
21 hereby established which Commission is composed of eleven (11) voting
22 members, appointed or selected as follows: Three (3) voting members
23 appointed by the Governor including one (1) Guam certified public
24 accountant; five (5) voting members appointed by the Speaker of the
25 Legislature, including the minority leader of the Legislature or his
26 designee; and three (3) ex officio voting members consisting of the
27 Director of Revenue and Taxation, the Chairman of the Legislature's
28 Committee on Federal, Foreign and Legal Affairs, and the Chairman of
29 the Legislature's Committee on Ways and Means. All other appointed
30 members shall serve for the life of the Commission (Reference P.L. 20-
31 220:39). Any member of the Commission may be dismissed for cause,
32 approved by a majority vote of the members. Any vacancy shall be
33 filled by the same authority who originally appointed the member to
34 such vacant position. The Commission shall elect a chairman from

1 among ~~its~~ members, who shall designate such other officers as are
2 necessary to conduct the Commission's business. The Commission shall
3 draft and implement operating procedures for the conduct of its
4 business, which procedures are exempt from the provisions of the
5 Administrative Adjudication Law."

6 Section 11. Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000) are appropriated
7 from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam to construct
8 additional water and sewer lines in the R.R. Cruz Subdivision, Agat (the
9 "Subdivision"); Five Hundred Eighty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$585,000) are
10 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works (the
11 "Department") to pave roads in the Subdivision; and Ten Thousand Dollars
12 (\$10,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department to
13 construct sidewalks in the Subdivision.

14 Section 12. Paragraph (a) of §6610.4 of the Government Code is
15 repealed and reenacted to read:

16 "(a) Prior to departure, the employee shall receive an advance
17 per diem allowance equal to the number of days of authorized official
18 travel multiplied by the following rates: The basic per diem rates shall
19 be as follows:

20 1. Hawaii, San Francisco, New York and, Washington, D.C.
21 areas and Japan; \$175 per day.

22 2. All of Micronesia and the Commonwealth of the
23 Northern Mariana Islands; \$125 per day.

24 3. All other areas; \$150 per day.

25 a. If the employee is the Governor, or Lieutenant
26 Governor, a member of the Legislature or a Judge, the rates
27 are One Hundred Thirty Percent (130%) of the basic per
28 diem rates;

29 b. If the employee is an Executive Assistant or
30 Special Assistant to the Governor, director or deputy
31 director of any department, or member of the board of
32 directors or commission of any autonomous agency,
33 authority, line agency (including the Council of the Arts and
34 Humanities), authority, or public corporation, the rates are

1 One Hundred and Twenty-Five Percent (125%) of the basic
2 per diem rates;

3 3. If the employee does not receive payment
4 pursuant to subparagraphs (1) and (2) of this paragraph (a),
5 the rates are the basic per diem rates. This subsection is
6 effective as of June 2, 1989."

7 Section 13. Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) are appropriated from
8 the General Fund to the Sinajana Municipal Planning Council to renovate that
9 portion of the Sinajana Community Center occupied by the administrative
10 offices of Guma'Mami, Inc.

11 Section 14. (a) Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) are appropriated from
12 the General Fund to the Office of the Governor to assist in repairing damage
13 caused by Typhoon Russ, which passed over Guam December 20-21, 1990.
14 This appropriation may be used for repairing damage to power, water, road,
15 housing rental and other problems occurring throughout the island, including
16 direct grants of up to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) per family. For purposes
17 of this Section, any monies received as a disaster relief from the government
18 of Guam shall not be considered as income for the family.

19 (b) The Office of the Governor shall report to the Legislature
20 periodically and within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Act on the
21 progress of the repair of damage from Typhoon Russ and shall report on
22 expenditures made from this appropriation.

23 (c) The Office of the Governor shall make a plan for future island
24 improvements, especially in the area of housing, to secure the people of Guam
25 more adequately from typhoon damage in the future and shall transmit this
26 plan to the Legislature within said sixty (60) day period.

27 (d) The Governor shall establish by Executive Order rules and
28 regulations governing the grants authorized by this Section and waiving the
29 provisions of the Administrative Adjudication Law.

PREFACE

The Committee on Education conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, May 22, 1990, at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Conference Room to hear public input on Bill 1348. Members present were as follows:

Senator Franklin J.A. Quitugua, Chairman
Senator J.G. Bamba, Member

BACKGROUND

Testimonies heard were as follows:

1. Mrs. Isabel Montague, Acting Director, Department of Education

Mrs. Montague read the Department's written position in favor of Bill No. 1348. The Department agrees with the intent of Bill No. 1348. Mrs. Montague also stated that passage of Bill 1348 would allow the department to initiate work on the desired school improvement activities. **(See Exhibit A)**

2. Dr. Lawrence Kasperbauer, Chairman, Territorial Board of Education

Dr. Kasperbauer gave an oral testimony in favor of Bill 1348. He stated whatever could be done to improve the school's conditions would be strongly supported by the Territorial Board.

3. Norma Tabayoyong, Assistant Principal, Carbullido Elementary School

Ms. Tabayoyong gave an oral testimony in favor of Bill 1348. Ms. Tabayoyong stated that the current population of Carbullido Elementary is at 500 students, and when guests are present that amount almost doubles. Currently there is no stage for Carbullido and the storage space had been cited by O.S.H.A. for inappropriate and congested usage therefore the need for a new stage and adequate storage space is eminent.

4. Del L.G. Taitano, Cafeteria Manager, Carbullido Elementary School

Ms. Taitano, gave an oral testimony in favor of Bill 1348. She stated that commodities are now stored in the dining facility which make it inappropriate for the 500 students to utilize the stage area. Therefore the need for expansion of the storage area is greatly needed.

Discussions following the above testimonies are as follows:

Senator Quitugua questioned Mrs. Montague, who was representing the Director of Education, "are you aware of the situation regarding F.Q. Sanchez Elementary School? In that F.Q. Sanchez is the smallest school yet is requesting the largest portion of the appropriation?"

Mrs. Montague - Yes, everytime the students need to use the playground they must acquire a parental permission slip to utilize the mayors facility across the street.

Senator Quitugua - has the Department of Education officials been contacting public works regarding the construction of the new road as it affects the F.Q. Sanchez elementary school?.

Mrs. Montague - had stated that the new road will end at the village and not near the school area.

Senator Quitugua - he had informed D.O.E. officials to touch base with Public Works planning regarding the department's desire to accommodate the students at F.Q. Sanchez Elementary school with an adequate playground area.

Senator Quitugua - Piti Middle School's shower facility is a very deplorable situation, we cannot wait until the new Southern High School is completed. Something has got to be done as soon as possible.

Mrs. Montague - the Southern Task Force had decided that once the new Southern High School is completed the new gymnasium and shower facility would not be utilized to it's fullest extent, because of the present Middle school will revert back to an Elementary school. However, the department is in favor of building a shower facility as long as it does not require too much time and money, so as to be able to spend those funds to the best possible use.

Senator Quitugua - has the department discussed how long it will take to complete the new high school?

Mrs. Montague - the A & E has been identified to do the study all that is needed would be the money.

Senator Quitugua - Ten Million Dollars has already been appropriated for A&E and foundation work and is just sitting idle waiting to be expended, time is of the essence.

ANALYSIS OF BILL 1348.

Bill 1348 seeks to make public law that the amount of Two Million Two Hundred Eighty Fours Dollars (\$2,284,000) be appropriated from the general fund to accommodate the urgent needs for the following Guam public schools for desperately needed facilities and repairs.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee finds that Bill 1348 containing urgent appropriation measures for several schools be recommended for favorable passage.

We sincerely appreciate the efforts of the Committee on Education to provide for the upgrading of various public elementary or middle schools. Passage of this bill will bring long-sought improvements to our school system.

The 1982 restructuring of the Department of Education affected those schools converted from elementary to middle schools. Piti Middle School was one of those schools adversely affected by the creation of middle schools. Although the intent of the Department to organize was academically sound, there has been a lack of planning and implementation of facilities improvement. Consequently, the Department is experiencing the negative impact of the reorganizational change.

Physical education is a course required of middle school students. Because of the skills involved in the teaching and learning of physical education courses, adequate facilities are necessary. Unfortunately, Piti Middle School has not been

providing adequate shower and locker facilities to its students. In some instances, the current "make do" situation has resulted with unsanitary conditions which have added an additional burden on the staff to provide proper maintenance and custodial care. Passage of this bill on behalf of Piti Middle School definitely will benefit students attending that institution.

Elementary schools addressed by this bill also will benefit from the increased safety features of improved parking facilities and upgraded playgrounds. Students for years have needed the improve playgrounds and accompanying equipment. Passage of this bill will allow the Department to initiate work on the desired school improvement activities.

We recommend passage of this bill.



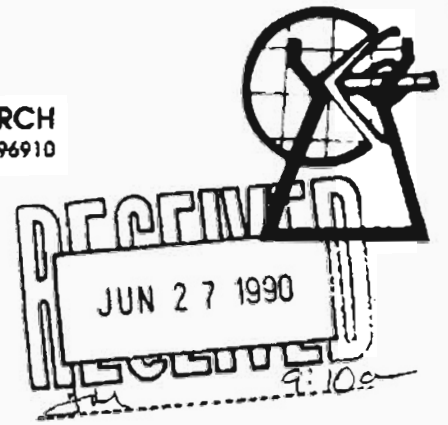
