- Section 1. New subitems (6) and (7) are added to subparagraph (a) of §67.80 of Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
- 4 "(6) All moneys, negotiable instruments, securities, or other 5 things of value furnished or intended to be furnished by any person

in exchange for a controlled substance in violation of this Act, all proceeds traceable to such an exchange, and all moneys, negotiable instruments, securities used or intended to be used to facilitate any violation of this Act, shall be forfeited to the criminal justice agency making the seizure;

(7) All firearms which are visible, carried during or used in furtherance of a violation of this Act."

## Committee Report On Substitute Bill 1313

AN ACT TO ADD NEW SUBSECTIONS (a) (6) AND (a) (7) TO §67.80 CHAPTER 67 OF TITLE 9 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATING TO ITEMS SUBJECT TO FORFEITURE FOR VIOLATION ACT.

#### **PREFACE**

The Judiciary and Criminal Justice Committee convened at 9:00 a.m., Wednesday, April 11, 1990, in the temporary Legislative Session Hall at Agana, Guam to hear testimony on Bill 1313.

Committee members in attendance, alongside Chairwoman Pilar C. Lujan were Elizabeth P. Arriola, Ted S. Nelson, Edward D. Reyes, and Edward R. Duenas. Also present to join the Committee was Senator Don Parkinson.

#### **OVERVIEW**

Unlike most mainland communities where convicted drug offenders have assets seized and forfeited to the government, our island's asset and forfeiture statute does not take into consideration the tremendous assets acquired and vast financial empires built by drug traffickers.

In anticipation of potential drug traffickers constructing such an empire on island, Judiciary and Criminal Justice Committee Chairwoman Pilar C. Lujan introduced Bill 1313 to seize illegal fruits borne out of such trafficking.

The bill calls for any money, negotiable instruments, securities, or other things of value, or traceable proceeds furnished or intended to be furnished by any person in exchange for a controlled substance to be subject to seizure and forfeiture by the government.

#### **COMMITTEE FINDINGS**

Attorney General Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson submitted written testimony in full support of the measure. (ATTACHMENT I)

Pointing out that items forfeited under existing statutes are "subject to disposition by the Governor," the Attorney General recommended that items seized under this particular section be forfeited "to the criminal justice agency making the seizure, such as the Guam Police Department, the Department of Commerce, or the Attorney General's Office."

Guam Police Department Chief Adolf Sgambelluri submitted written testimony (ATTACHMENT II) registering no objections to the measure.

**COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS** 

Taking into account the Attorney General's recommendation, the Committee suggests modification to the measure by allowing forfeiture to the seizing authority. The Substitute Bill should add a new §67.80 (a) (8) to read

"§67.80 (a) (8) Any property subject to forfeiture under the ensuing two subsections may be seized by the criminal justice agency upon process issued by the Superior Court."

THE COMMITTEE, BASED ON THE AFOREMENTIONED FINDINGS, RECOMMENDS THAT:

- (1) Substitute Bill 1313 be passed at the soonest date possible to strengthen efforts in protecting and serving the public; and
- (2) Substitute Bill 1313 be passed into law since it would help to curtail the enjoyment of illegal profits by convicted offenders.

We fully support and endorse Bill 1313(LS), an act to enhance our current forfeiture statutes by adding thereto forfeiture of moneys, negotiable instruments, securities, proceeds, and other things of value traceable to use and trafficking in drugs.

Under the present statute, items forfeited under Chapter 67, 9 GCA are subject to disposition by the Governor. We would encourage that items forfeited under Section 67.80 be forfeited to the criminal justice agency making the seizure, such as the Guam Police Department, the Department of Commerce, or the Attorney General's Office.
