



BILL NO. 641 - An Act to Appropriate the Amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) to the Soil and Water Conservation Districts

I. <u>PREFACE</u>

The Committee on Economic Development held a public hearing on Tuesday, 01 August 1989, at 8:00 a.m. at the Legislative Session Hall. Members present at the hearing were Chairman Edward D. Reyes and Senator Ted S. Nelson.

II. <u>BACKGROUND</u>

Bill No. 641 was introduced by Senator Edward D. Reyes. It proposes to appropriate the sum of \$30,000 to the Soil and Water Conservation Districts under the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of supplementing its Fiscal Year 1989 budget. The additional funding is to cover travel, equipment, supplies, contractual services and other miscellaneous needs.

III. <u>TESTIMONY</u>

There were only two (2) individuals who testified at the hearing. They were Mr. Felix Quan, Chairman, Northern Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Directors; and Mr. Jack Custer, member and Chairman of the Education Committee, Northern Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Directors. Both testified in favor of the bill.

Ms. Annie Bonds was also present at the hearing and answered questions regarding the Soil and Water Conservation Districts budget; however, she did not testify on behalf of the Department of Agriculture either for or against the bill.

Following is a synopsis of the testimony:

- A. <u>FELIX P. QUAN</u> testified in favor of the bill, and justified the appropriation as follows:
 - Travel to Hawaii and Missouri for four (4) Directors of the Board......\$ 6,200
 - 2. Equipment two (2) augers and weeders, and video camera..... 13,200

 - Contractual Printing of coloring books for distribution to children grades K-3..... 5,000
- B. <u>JACK CUSTER</u> testified in favor of the bill, stating that the funds to be appropriated would allow members of the two

districts to represent Guam at national and international conferences, and provide for tools, supplies and payment of dues.

IV. <u>FINDINGS</u>

The Committee on Economic Development finds:

- A. All those who testified favored the passage of Bill No. 641.
- B. Alternatives were explored during the hearing to utilize the transfer authority of the Governor instead of direct appropriation.
- C. Representatives from the Northern and Southern Soil and Water Conservation Districts met with both Chairmen of the Committees on Economic Development and Ways & Means after the hearing, and the Chairmen were advised that the end of the fiscal year is fast approaching and some requirements can be fulfilled in Fiscal Year 1990. Therefore, the total supplemental request can be reduced to \$9,286 to include travel for two (2) Directors of the Board to Hawaii and two (2) to Missouri for national conferences, as well as to pay for membership dues.
- V. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

The Committee recommends that Bill No. 641 be passed, with the appropriation change from \$30,000 to \$9,286.


