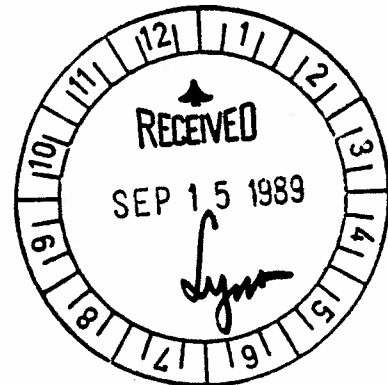





1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Legislative finding. The Legislature finds that public
3 school classrooms are where young minds are educated and shaped. The
4 learning task can be more effectively accomplished where the environment
5 for learning is safe and comfortable. It is the intent of the Legislature to

1 provide all students and teachers involved in meaningful teaching and
2 learning interaction with the comfort of cool air-conditioned classrooms.
3 The Legislature is fully aware that it is financially impossible to
4 air-condition all classrooms in the public school system at one time. It is
5 the intent of the Legislature to establish a policy that will provide for the
6 air conditioning of all classrooms over a period of five years. The
7 Department of Education shall develop a coordinated plan of action to
8 convert, prepare and install air-conditioners for all classrooms in the public
9 school system. The plan of action should provide that all such conversion
10 should take place during the time where schools are not in session and or
11 when students are not in the classrooms. The plan should authorize the
12 installation of the units over a five year period to insure that each school
13 identifies the classrooms most in need of modifications of its electrical
14 requirements and to prepare the rooms to accommodate the air conditioning
15 system. Each school will gradually phase in the air conditioning system as
16 the school system continues to catch up with urgent instructional needs and
17 physical requirements that have been neglected due to financial constraints
18 of the past.

19 Section 2. Authorization of plan. The Department of Education (the
20 "Department") is hereby authorized to plan, prepare, and implement the air
21 conditioning of all classrooms in the public school system in increments of
22 twenty percent (20%) within a time span of five (5) years. Such
23 installation of air conditioning systems shall commence in school year 1989-90
24 based upon the following priority order:

25 (1) Those classrooms accommodating special education or
26 handicapped students.

27 (2) Those classrooms that are excessively warm and humid due
28 to poor ventilation.

29 (3) All other classrooms as determined by the principal, the
30 school nurse and other school staff.

31 Section 3. Appropriation. Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) are hereby
32 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for fiscal year 1990
33 to fund the first increment of air conditioning installation in the classrooms
34 of the public school system of Guam. This is a continuing appropriation.

1 Section 4. Authorization for appropriations in succeeding years.
2 There are hereby authorized to be appropriated from the General Fund to
3 the Department for fiscal year 1991, Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the
4 second increment, for fiscal year 1992, Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for
5 the third increment, for fiscal year 1993, Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000)
6 for the fourth increment, and for fiscal year 1994, Two Million Dollars
7 (\$2,000,000) for the fifth and final increment

8 Section 5. One Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$180,000) are
9 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for air conditioning
10 retrofitting of thirteen (13) schools.

11 Section 6. One Hundred Ninety-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$197,000)
12 are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for cleaning,
13 sealing leaks and coating roofs with reflective paint of thirteen (13)
14 schools.

15 Section 7. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated
16 from the General Fund to the Department for the replacement of
17 deteriorated sliding doors at Tamuning Elementary School.

18 Section 8. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated
19 from the General Fund to the Department for termite treatment and
20 fumigation of schools.

21 Section 9. Finding. The Legislature finds that there is no suitable
22 tele-communications system to enable the deaf to communicate from their
23 homes with various public agencies and offices, and that such technology is
24 currently available in Guam and should be made available to these
25 handicapped persons.

26 (a) The Guam Telephone Authority shall ensure that the Department
27 of Education, including the Special Education Division, Brodie Memorial
28 School, Guam Memorial Hospital, Guam Police Department, Guam Fire
29 Department, Department of Public Health and Social Services, Department of
30 Vocational Rehabilitation, the Guam Telephone Authority, and such other
31 departments and agencies deemed appropriate to the health, welfare and
32 education of handicapped persons, shall each have communication terminals
33 compatible with telephone devices for the deaf ("TDD").

1 (b) Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are hereby appropriated from the
2 General Fund to the Guam Telephone Authority to implement this Section 9
3 of this Act.

4 Section 10. The Guam Telephone Authority shall monitor the
5 effectiveness of the TDD in use and make changes as necessary to achieve
6 the purpose of the legislative findings set out in Section 9 of this Act and
7 report thereon to the Legislature on an annual basis.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE INSTALLATION OF AIR CONDITIONING SYSTEM IN ALL OF GUAM'S PUBLIC SCHOOL CLASSROOMS OVER A FIVE YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING WITH THOSE WHERE AIRCONDITIONING IS MOST URGENTLY NEEDED AND TO APPROPRIATE TWO MILLION FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY SEVEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,577,000) TO INSTALL FOR THE FIRST YEAR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Committee on Education conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, August 22, 1989 at the Legislative Session Hall at 9:30 a.m. to hear public input on Bill No. 721. Joining Chairperson Franklin J.A. Quitugua was Senator Doris F. Brooks.

Testimony

Senator Doris F. Brooks gave written testimony in favor of the passage of the bill (See Exhibit A). She recommend modification on sections 1, 2, 3, of the bill.

Mr. Joe Camacho gave Department of Education Director Sukola's testimony in support of the bill (See Exhibit B). He stated that the intent of the bill address costs associated with installation and was in support of a five year phase-in plan. He also explains the direct and long-term benefits. He further mentioned that the Department's priorities for the installation of airconditioning are in early childhood program, special needs classes and in media learning resources rooms.

Mr. Lon Bottcher, Guam Federation Teachers, Executive Director, gave oral testimony in support that he was in favor of air conditioning all schools on one time basis vs the phase in plan.

Committee Finding and Recommendations

The Committee concurs that the classroom is where young minds are educated and shaped. The learning task can be more effectively accomplished where the environment for learning is safe and comfortable.

The Committee recommends that the Department of Education develop a coordinated plan to implement air conditioning in all classrooms within a time span of five years. Each school will gradually phase-in the air conditioning system as each school prepares the installation requirements.

The Committee recommends that the bill be reported out favorably as amended by the Committee on Education and to do pass as amended.

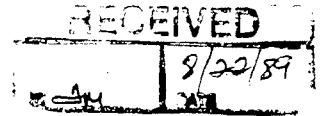

Dear Senator Quitugua:


My commitment to obtaining air conditioning of the classrooms of Guam's public schools is a matter of record. Regardless of whose bill is used as the vehicle for accomplishment of this vital purpose, I will support legislation that achieves it. Therefore, please note that I favor passage of Bill 721 if it should reach the floor of the Legislature prior to the bills that I have introduced on this subject.

Section 1 of Bill 721 establishes priorities for the implementation of air conditioning. I recommend that the list of priorities be flexible enough that schools are not air conditioned on a piecemeal basis. As written it would seem to require that all audio-visual instruction rooms be first air conditioned. This might be cost ineffective. The best approach is to address all of the needs of a particular school or schools at one time rather than jumping back and forth among the schools.

Section 2 appropriates \$2 million "to fund the first increment of air-conditioning installation." I recommend that this language be broadened to make clear that the funds may be used not only for installation but also procurement. We don't want to have progress stalled by a legal technicality.

Section 3 contains an obvious typographical error. The sentence after the caption begins "Thereby is authorized . . . " I assume the drafter intended "There is hereby authorized . . . "

Dear Senator Quitugua:

The Department of Education, as in previous testimonies on bills relative to the installation of air-conditioning systems in the schools, reiterates and reasserts its support for such a legislative measure and intent. The direct and long-term benefits of air-conditioning cannot be debated, especially on our island with its corresponding climatic conditions and the harsh effects of heat, rust and corrosion.

With air-conditioning, our schools can reap benefits and improvements such as:

1. Longer life span of equipment and instructional materials;
2. A more conducive environment for the teaching/learning process;
3. Noise abatement in areas exposed to highways, flights and flight training, music rooms, gymnasiums, playground areas, etc.;
4. A decrease in accumulation of dirt and dust;
5. A potential for improved morale, increased attention span, and greater achievement and productivity.

The intent of the bill to address costs associated with the installation of air-conditioning is laudable and we also thank you for supporting a five-year phase-in plan so that all schools will be afforded equity in the implementation. It is my staunch belief that the people affected by this measure need to determine priorities for the installation of the system. In general, the Department considers early childhood programs, special needs classes, media learning centers, and resource rooms to be areas that merit strong emphasis. However, it is essential that school

23 from the General Fund to the Department of Education to fund the first
24 increment of air-conditioning installation in the classrooms of the public
25 shool system of Guam. This is a continuing appropriation.

26 Section 3. Authorization for appropriation in succeeding years.
27 Thereby is authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 1991 \$2 million

1 from the General Fund to the Department of Education for the second
2 increment, \$2 million for FY 1992 for the third increment, \$2 million for
3 FY 1993 for the fourth increment, and \$2 million for the FY 1994 for
4 Fifth and final increment.
