AN ACT TO AMEND \$\$13651 AND 13652 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE ON LAND EXCHANGES IN THE PENITENTIARY AREA.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: 2 Section 1. \$13651 of the Government Code is amended to read: 3 "\$13651.

The Governor is authorized to exchange government land on a value-for-value basis for private land, either with or without 4 5 buildings, owned on the effective date of this Act and located within 6 the five-hundred (500) foot perimeter of the present site of the existing Department of Corrections penitentiary facility, namely within a five-hundred foot radius of the perimeter of the penitentiary site as 9 shown on preliminary drawing No. 14-80T122-A, Land Management data 10 number 35-FY81, excluding the area designated on such map for a ponding basin."

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Section 2. \$13652 of the Government Code is amended to read:

2 The Governor is authorized to exchange government "\$13652. 3 land on a value-for-value basis for portions of basic lot number 5384 4 located in Land Square 19, \$4, in Sabanan, Magas, Municipality of 5 Barrigada, known as the following: Lot No. 5384-3 as shown on 6 drawing H-105Y63 made by Horatio G. Carolina and dated December 13, 7 1963, Lot No. 5384-6-1 as shown on drawing no. M222-353 made by 8 Mesa and recorded under Land Management date no. Juan R. 9 917-FY72, Lots Nos. 5384-6-2, 5384-R11 and 5384-6-2 as shown on 10 drawing no. SDCO 39-1176 made by Vicente C. Sian, Jr. and recorded 11 on December 9, 1976 under instrument 274298, Lot Nos. 5384-7, 12 5384-9, 5384-8, and 5384-10 as shown on drawing no. 7310-11 made by 13 Gregorio S. Torres, Jr., recorded under Land Management Data No. 14 244-FY74 and Lot No. 5384-2 as shown on the map prepared by Juan 15 T. Untalan, recorded under Document No. 400-71, and Lot No. 5384-1 16 containing an area of 1827.21 square meters as shown on the map 17 prepared by Juan T. Untalan, licensed surveyor, and all other private 18 land described in Section 13651 of this Chapter."

# PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES ON BILL NO. 680

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 2 s 13651 AND TO AMEND SECTION 3 s 13652 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE (P.L. 17-54) RELATIVE TO LAND EXCHANGE.

Witnesses Present: Mr. Frank L.G. Castro, Director of Department of Land Management; Mr. Fred Natividad and Mr. Juan C. White.

### SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

All witnesses recommended amendment to and passage of Bill 680. This Bill, with the recommended amendments, would correct the inequities caused Mr. Fred Natividad and Mr. Juan C. White.

Mr. Castro: In support of Bill 680, and to include a provision that whether or not the property is improved property owners should be entitled to exchange, and the exchange should be on a value for value basis.

The prior law which authorized the payment and exchange of lands affected by the Department of Correction specified that properties with improvements can receive both money and land exchange. It was silent whether the Government can exchange properties without improvements, as such is the case with Mr. Natividad. Somehow, Mr. Natividad was inadequately compensated and Mr. White was missed.

Mr. Natividad testified that in 1982 the Government bulldozed his ranch. In 1983, he was informed that he cannot exchange his property so he agreed to receive \$2,500 in return because he thought it was the only thing he could do. In 1984, he found out that his neighbors were able to land exchange and receive cash as well.

Mr. White testified that he has two lots, one with improvement and another without. Ever since he received the notice that his property is to be condemned, he has not been able to do anything on his property because he does not know what to expect next.

Chairperson Mailloux noted that changes will be made as requested by Department of Land Management.

#### FINDINGS:

The Committee to which was referred Bill No. 680 finds that:

1. Mr. Juan C. White and Mr. Fred Natividad had their lots condemned for expansion of Department of Corrections in the year 1982.

1. P. L. 17-54 specified that property with improvements can receive both money and land exchange. It did not state if the government can exchange property without improvements.

2. Department of Land Management is in favor of the bill but include a provision that whether or not the property is improved the owners should be entitled to land exchange on a value for value basis.

3. Mr. Natividad was informed in 1983 that he could not exchange his property so he agreed to receive \$2500. In 1984 he found out that other neighbors had been compensated with money and land exchange.

4. Mr. White was not compensated monetarily or by land exchange. He had two lots, one with improvement and one without.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Committee on Housing and Community Development, to which was referred Bill No. 680, AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 2 13651 AND TO AMEND SECTION 3 13652 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE (P.L. 17-54) RELATIVE TO LAND EXCHANGE," has had the same under consideration, and now wishes to report back the same with the recommendation to substitute Bill No. 680 to include the provision that whether or not the property is improved property owners should be entitled to exchange land on a value for value basis.


