



PREFACE

The Ways and Means Committee convened at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, July 25, 1989 in the Legislative Session Hall at Agana, Guam to hear testimony on Bill 847. Committee members in attendance, alongside with Acting Chairman Ted S. Nelson, were Senators John P. Aguon and Ernesto Espaldon. Senator Pilar C. Lujan joined the panel in hearing the measure.

OVERVIEW

Department of Law Compiler Charles Troutman recently noted to legislative oversight committee Chairwoman Pilar C. Lujan the need to acquire appropriation for publishing government codes, statutes, and laws. The last appropriation made to the Fund was in Fiscal Year 1987.

It was further pointed out that the Bureau of Budget and Management Research forgot to include the appropriation requested by the Department for Fiscal Year 1989.

Currently with a balance of \$865, the Fund is insufficient to further publish rules, codes, and session laws.

TESTIMONY

**Bill 727 - An act to appropriate the sum of seventy thousand dollars (\$70,000) to the  
Printing Revolving Fund of the Department of Law.**

Department of Law Compiler Charles Troutman testified in favor of the measure and noted that the sum requested "is somewhat in excess of quota our former request of \$50,000" because BBMR forgot to provide an appropriation for Fiscal Year 1989. According to Troutman the Fund has a current balance of \$865.

The Compiler pointed out that the following publications are awaiting appropriations for printing:

- \*Update of the Guam Administrative Rules (1,371 pages);
- \*Title 5-Div. 1-General Government Operations (750 pages);
- \*Republication and update of Title 10, GCA Health & Safety (2 vols.);
- \*Republication of Title 17, Education (350 pages);
- \*Republication and update of Title 15, Probate (1 vol.);
- \*19th Guam Legislature Session Laws;
- \*20th Guam Legislature Current Laws-2nd Dist.

BBMR Director Michael Reidy also testified in favor of the measure.



Senator Pilar C. Lujan thanked the Compiler of Laws for the detailed breakdown of projects pending and justification for the funds.

Discussion about attorneys having difficulty finding relevant and updated codes prompted the Compiler to note the need to conduct seminars and improve access via automation.

Committee member John P. Aguon asked Compiler Troutman when printing would be completed if given the appropriation and was informed that it all hinges on the printers.

According to Troutman, large publications "will probably take four or five months at the printers." He added that republications of Titles would take around 60 days, based on previous experience.

Committee member Aguon was informed that the materials are ready for print.

Committee member Aguon asked what advantage exists, if any, in appropriating the funds to either the Department of Law Revolving Fund or the General Fund. Citing previous experience, Compiler Troutman pointed out that earmarking the amount directly to the Department of Law would spare "6 months argument with the Department of Administration."

Committee member Aguon asked how soon printing can begin if the measure is approved and Troutman stated "immediately."

Committee Member Martha C. Ruth inquired if the measure was "extracted from the executive budget request by the Governor."

BBMR Director Reidy noted that "a number of measures which have been publicly heard were extracted from the executive budget request" and that such efforts are viewed as "support by the Senators."

#### COMMITTEE FINDINGS

In ensuring that the Territory has revised, updated, and available codes, statutes, and laws, the Committee finds that the Department of Law should be provided \$70,000 to print necessary materials.

Dear Mr. Chairman and members of the Committees,

I wish to testify on behalf of myself and the Attorney General in favor of Bill No. 727, appropriating \$70,000 to the Printing Revolving Fund.

The Fund has in it a balance of about \$865 as of the middle of July. The Bureau of Budget and Management Research forgot to provide the appropriation we requested for FY1989. The last appropriation to this Fund was in 1987. In our hearings on the Attorney General's budget, there was discussion of placing this appropriation as a "miscellaneous item" in the government's FY1990 budget. I do not care in what bill you place this appropriation, but until it is made, there can be no further publications coming from the Compiler of Laws.

Awaiting appropriation are the following publications, which have been completed in our office:

Update of the Guam Administrative Rules	1,371 pages
Title 5 - Div. 1 - General Government Operations	750 pages
Republication and update of Title 10, GCA	2 vols.
Republication of Title 17, Education	350 pages
REpublication and update of Title 15, Probate	1 volume
19th Guam Legislature Session Laws	
20th Guam Legislature Current Laws - 2nd Dist.	

In preparation for publication during FY 1990:

Title 21 GCA - Real Property  
 Title 7 - GCA - Civil Procedure  
 One volume of Guam Court Reports  
 GCA Updates not mentioned above

If at all possible, I would like to see the Printing Fund handled on an annual basis from now on. It can not be self-sustaining so long as our publication list continues to grow. In fact, in addition to the titles listed above, we have only the remainder of Title 5 and Title 18 - Business & Professions - left to be codified. After that,

we can dispose of the entire set of "green codes" and their supplements. Of course, this codification does not mean that the Compiler's Division will be out of a job. Court reports come next, but that is a longer term project. Then there is updating the automation of both the Compiler's Division and the Attorney General's Office.

In connection with automation, it is my ultimate goal to have our publications available in computer form so that they may be research on-line. I am now testing this concept on our PC/AT, but our present capability does not permit other offices to benefit from this database. Likewise, I would like to be able to publish some of our material in microfilm editions, if we can convince lawyers of the benefits. For us it would be faster and easier, but only one lawyer (that I know of) has even a microfiche reader on Guam, and that is not used for legal research. The Territorial Law Library has several, but the printing side is broken. The other libraries -- Flores and the UOG library - both use microfilm extensively.

For the present, however, the immediate need is for funds to get printed those of our publications that we have ready for the printer and continue with our current projects. I will be submitting our needs for FY1991 at the appropriate time. I hope we can normalize this process in the future.
