

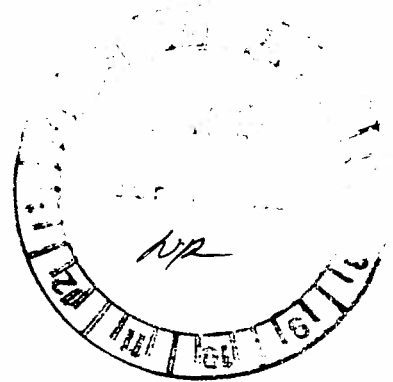

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 758, which I have signed into law this date as Public Law 20-75.

In order to end fiscal year 1989 with a balanced budget, I request that the Legislature amend Section 1 to read:

"Section 1. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated from the fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam and Eight Hundred Six Thousand One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$806,150) are appropriated from the fiscal year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the design and construction of a sewer line collector for the Ordot-Chalan Pago Elementary School."

COMMITTEE REPORT

BILL 758

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF NINE HUNDRED SIX THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS (\$906,150.) TO THE PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY OF GUAM FOR THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF SEWER LINES COLLECTOR FOR CHALAN PAGO- ORDOT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL"

A public hearing was conducted by the Committee on Ways & Means, on Wednesday, July 19, 1989 at 9:20 a.m. in the Legislative Session Hall. The hearing was chaired by Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, also in attendance were, Senators Ted S. Nelson, Vice-Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, and Don Parkinson.

BACKGROUND

The Chalan Pago-Ordodot Elementary School utilizes a septic tank/leaching field sewage disposal system. This method of sewage disposal is old and costly, due to the high volume of sewage discharge, requiring frequent maintenance to comply with local and federal regulations.

Presently, PUAG has existing water wells in this area supplying water to central and southern districts on Guam. This limited water resource shall not be exposed to the potential contamination of raw sewage due to lack of adequate maintenance.

PUAG is therefore, requesting funds for the installation of sewer lines to eliminate exposure to health, ecological and environmental hazards and also to accommodate future physical improvements of our island.

TESTIMONY

Attached is written testimony presented to the legislative committee by the Deputy Director of PUAG, Mr. Felix Camacho, Mr. Anthony C. Blaz, Director of PUAG, was in attendance during the presentation.

Mr. Anthony C. Blaz stated the need for the construction of the sewer lines, for the health and environmental reasons of the island and especially for our school children. Bill 760 is to complete the sewer system project in the Chalan Pago-Ordot municipal district. He also stated that PUAG engineers are preparing designs for a sewer system in areas that are presently above the aquifer, e.g., the Bello road in Barrigada which has about seven (7) water wells. Senator Carl Gutierrez questioned the status of projects that has been recently approved by the Legislature. Mr. A. Blaz said that PUAG engineers are preparing sewer system design in the BPM area in Mangilao, because the location of the Guam Community College, George Washington High School and residential customers demanding proper sewage disposal system.

Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez requested that billboard signs for proposed projects placed at construction site identify main sponsor of bill funding the project. Mr. Anthony C. Blaz supported the Senators' request.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS & ANALYSIS

The fiscal Note for Bill 758 is attached along with BBMR's comments that \$906,150 will further increase the deficit of appropriation vs revenue this fiscal year.

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislative Committee on Ways and Means. I am here today to testify in support of the following bills relating to wastewater infrastructure improvements in specific villages:

1. ~~██████████~~ - An Act to appropriate the sum of Nine Hundred Six Thousand One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$906,150) to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the Design and Construction of Sewer Lines Collector for Ordot-Chalan Pago Elementary School.
2. Bill 759 - An Act to appropriate the sum of Seven Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Dollars to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the Purpose of Constructing a Sewer Line in Bello Road, Municipality of Barrigada.
3. Bill 760 - An Act to appropriate the sum of One Million Eight Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$1,870,000) to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the Design and Construction of Sewer Lines in the Municipality of Ordot-Chalan Pago.

The areas targeted for sewer infrastructure improvements are moderately dense residential areas with no public sewage collection system. Sewage from the aforementioned elementary school and residences are being collected through individualized septic tank/leachfields. Like septic tank/leachfields in other areas of Guam, many are old and may not be properly maintained and operating at a desirable efficiency level. As a result, residents are being exposed to

possible health and environmental hazards from improperly disposed sewage. Of extreme concern is the high volume of sewage being discharged from the public school.

Presently, PUAG has existing wells located in and around the proposed sewer improvement areas mentioned in the above bills; and these areas are located on top of our precious ^{water} aquifer. Any contamination of these water resources will force the government to abandon the affected wells, and result in a substantial decrease in the water supply for central and southern Guam.


The installation of sewer lines will provide a reliable public sewage collection system that would eliminate overflows and improper treatment of raw sewage from septic tanks that may not be properly maintained. As a result, risk of exposure to health, ecological and environmental hazards will be minimized if not totally eliminated. In addition, the risk of contaminating our valuable underground water resources in these districts will greatly be reduced.

We are very pleased to see bills such as these introduced by the Legislature. We strongly support such initiatives which would provide financing for water and wastewater infrastructure improvements and facilitate better service to our residents.

The passage of these bills will provide adequate wastewater infrastructure to not only accommodate the school and existing residences, but also future

developments in the areas. The added public sewage collector systems will not only improve the health and environmental conditions of the impacted areas, but will also generate additional revenue for PUAG through expanded sewer services.
