

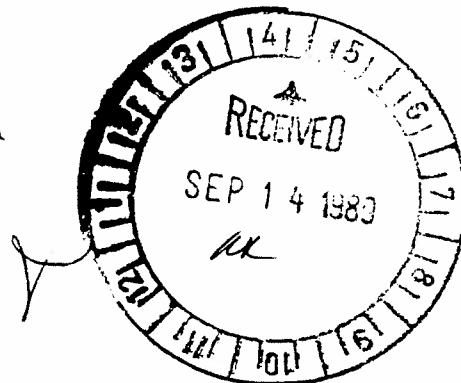





PREFACE

The Ways and Means Committee convened at 9:00 a.m., Tuesday, July 25, 1989 in the Legislative Session Hall at Agana, Guam to hear testimony on Bill 847. Committee members in attendance, alongside with Acting Chairman Ted S. Nelson, were Senators John P. Aguon and Ernesto Espaldon. Senator Pilar C. Lujan joined the panel in hearing the measure.

OVERVIEW

After a recent survey of radio communication and marine surveillance equipment by the Judiciary and Criminal Justice Committee, Senator Pilar C. Lujan introduced Bill 847.

Noting current operations at the Agana Marina, including anticipated completion of the Agat Marina and construction of the Merizo Marina, Senator Lujan pointed out the need to procure the equipment in helping GPD carry out its mission.

In order to ensure dependability and durability in and around marine areas, the Police Department is searching for equipment which is designed to be anti-corrosive.

TESTIMONY

**Bill 847 - An act to appropriate two hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$215,000) for the purchase of radio communication and marine surveillance equipment for the Guam Police Department.**

Police Department Captain Tomas Chargualaf represented the Guam Police Department and spoke favorably on the measure. Reading testimony from Police Chief Adolf Sgambelluri, it was noted that passage of the measure "will assist GPD's Harbor Patrol in accomplishing their mission."

The GPD representative added that Harbor Patrol activities in Agana, Agat, and Merizo have been planned "to provide each of the three locations a full compliment of personnel and equipment" such as a base station, VHF Marine radio, mobile radio for each boat, walkie talkie, and communications accessories.

Bureau of Budget and Management Research Director Michael Reidy also testified in favor of the measure and pointed out that the measure is a part of the Fiscal Year 1990 Executive Budget request.

Upon completion of testimony from government representatives, Committee Member Martha C. Ruth inquired if the measure was "extracted from the executive budget request by the Governor."

BBMR Director Reidy noted that "a number of measures which have been publicly heard were extracted from the executive budget request" and that such efforts are viewed as "support by the Senators."

#### COMMITTEE FINDINGS


In ensuring that the Territory has a strong, effective, and efficient Police Force monitoring and patrolling coastal waters, the Committee finds that the Guam Police Department is in need of \$215,000 for procuring communications and marine surveillance equipment for operations at the Agana, Agat, and Merizo marinas.

As a result of a Judiciary and Criminal Justice Committee tour and inspection of GPD facilities and equipment, alongside of an administrative request for additional resources, there is a necessity to procure such equipment for GPD's operations.


The Guam Police Department supports the intent of Bill No. 847. The passage of this bill will assist our Harbor Patrol in accomplishing their mission; this bill correlates with the Department's future plan in upgrading the department capability for marine activities.

As you may be aware, aside from the Agana Marina, Agat Marina is near completion while the Merizo Marina's plan is on target as approved by the Army Corp of Engineers. The future GPD plans are to provide each of the three locations a full complement of personnel and equipment. In terms of communications equipment as mentioned in Bill 847 each one will be equipped with a "base station, VHF Marine Radio, mobile radio for each boat, walkie talkie, and communications accessories."

The communications equipment that are to be purchased with this funding will not be of the same design used in the mobile patrol cars. The effect of salt water on the equipment will be a factor. Our Department is now searching the market to ensure durability and operational dependability.

We greatly appreciate your assistance in this matter and we are confident that the Twentieth Guam Legislature will support the passage of this bill.
