

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Nine Thousand Dollars (\$9,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to improve and resurface the Toto Multi-Purpose Court, in Toto.

Section 2. The Mongmong-Toto-Maite Municipal Planning Council shall coordinate the Toto Multi-Purpose Court project authorized by Section 1 of this Act with the Departments of Parks and Recreation and of Public Works.

The contracting officer for the project shall be the Director of Public Works.

Section 3. One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to construct a basketball court, together with a lighting system, in the vicinity of the Santa Rosa Subdivision and Truman Elementary School in the village of Santa Rita.

COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 816

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR IMPROVEMENT OF RECREATIONAL FACILITY IN TOTO VILLAGE"

INTRODUCTION

The Committee on Ways and Means held a public hearing on Thursday, July 20, 1989, at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Session Hall. Members present at the hearing were: Senators Carl T.C. Gutierrez, Chairman; Ted S. Nelson; Doris Brooks; and Elizabeth P. Arriola.

Letters to provide written testimony were sent to the Governor; the Attorney General; the President of the Commissioners Council; the Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation; and the members of the Committee on Ways and Means.

BACKGROUND

Bill 816 is an act to make an appropriation of Nine Thousand Thousand Dollars (\$9,000.00) for the purpose of making improvements and resurfacing of the Toto multi-purpose court.

TESTIMONY

Appearing to testify in favor of Bill 816 was Michael Reidy, Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research.

Director of Department of Parks and Recreation submitted written testimony, which is attached for the record.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred Bill No. 816, "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR IMPROVEMENT OF RECREATIONAL FACILITY IN TOTO VILLAGE" has had the same under consideration and now wishes to report back the same with the RECOMMENDATION TO DO PASS.



Dear Senator Gutierrez:

I am present to testify on several closely associated bills that relate to the Department of Parks and Recreation. These are Bill Nos. 811, 815, 816, 818, 819, and 820. Allow me to briefly comment on each bill.

First is Bill No. 811, an act to appropriate funds for improvement of recreational facility in the village of Barrigada.

Barrigada is one of the largest villages on Guam. Yet the village does not have a standard sized basketball court. What exists is an old, 1950's era, flat asphalt court. Therefore, I support the appropriation to improve the court into a lighted multi-purpose court.

Second is Bill No. 815, an act to appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Fifteen Thousand Dollars for improvement of sports facilities in Yona and Baza Garden area.

Section 1 appropriates funds to rebuild and renovate the Yona Multi-purpose Court. This court is currently substandard in size, being the smallest of the multi-purpose courts on Guam. In addition, the current lighting system is not operational. Section 2 appropriates funds to improve the Baza Garden Ballfield, at the Col. Stanley Bohnic Recreation Area. The ballfield receives increasing use and merits lighting and a restroom facility. Therefore, I support the enactment of Bill No. 815 to improve the recreation facilities in Yona.

Next is Bill No. 816, an act to appropriate funds for improvement of recreational facility in Toto village. The Toto Multi-purpose Court, while a better court on the island with a good slope, is the most heavily used court on Guam. There the surface has been worn smooth from nightly use by the Toto Youth Center operations for the last 10 years and simply needs a plexipave resurface job. Therefore, I support enactment of Bill No. 816.

Next is Bill No. 818, an act to appropriate funds for travel expenses for youth sports organizations.

Currently, there is \$23,000 in our fund for off-island sports travel for youth. It should be noted that the current balance and proposed appropriation are different from the Sports Fund for off-island travel. Fortunately, the new sports travel fund does not need to follow the more strigent rules and regulations of the sports fund for off-island travel. Therefore, I support this appropriation for Fiscal Year 1990.

Next is Bill No. 819, an act to appropriate funds for improvements to public parks; principally at Ypao Beach, now Governor Joseph Flores Beach Park, and at the Paseo. Our heavily used beach park on Tumon and must be maintained as a showcase. The Paseo is planned for major improvement. Funding from Section 2.a. will result in a new road and separate new jogging track. This will be fully lighted. Currently, the jogging track is poorly lit with approximately eight street lights. Further, the funds will provide needed parking for the currently heavy use to increase further with the new Jose C. Guerrero Stadium going in at the old softball field. As a result, the Paseo will continue as the island's sports center.

Section 2.b. will fund a new Paseo recreation building. The current building is deteriorated, termite infested, and does not meet our current recreation needs. A new Paseo recreation building would be built adjacent to the Paseo stadium as the home of the DPR recreation staff.

Section 2.c. will fund a needed new full-size multi-purpose court for Agana. As proposed, the facility would be covered but open on the sides and managed as a gymnasium open to the general public for sporting events, and for Youth Center activities. One recommended change to Bill No. 819 is to specify the covered multi-purpose court to be in Agana and not limited to the Paseo since the current planning for public facilities in the Paseo could result in no room in the Paseo for the court, but it could be located elsewhere on park land in Agana.

Finally, Bill No. 820 is an act to appropriate funds for improvement of the Chalan Pago Baseball Field.

This field is a major league field that receives heavy use and is deteriorated, especially the lighting. Therefore, it needs upgrading to take pressure off the Paseo Stadium and to allow another site for Major League type baseball games. Therefore, I recommend passage of Bill No. 820.
