AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (1) OF \$2103 AND \$2206.1, CHAPTER 2, TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ADDING \$\$2206.2 AND 2206.3 TO SAID CHAPTER 2 TO AUTHORIZE DIRECT LOANS BY THE GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, AND ESTABLISHING CRITERIA THEREFOR.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (1) of \$2103, Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read:
 - "(1) The Corporation is authorized to make loans or to guarantee loans to non-profit cooperative associations licensed to do business in Guam in furtherance of the purposes and activities stated in this Act. All loans or guarantees so made shall be of such sum, value or so

secured as to reasonably assure repayment or shall be of such vital need to the economy of Guam as to warrant additional risk or subsidies. As used in this subsection, non-profit cooperative association means any corporation organized under the provisions of Division First, Part IV, Title V of the Civil Code."

Section 2. \$2206.1 of Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read:

"\$2206.1. From the Agricultural Development Fund, the Guam Economic Development Authority shall make direct loans to and guarantee loans of responsible non-profit cooperative associations and individual farmers necessary for expanding facilities for the improvement of marketing of agriculture products and other related agriculture activities in carrying out provisions of \$\$2203, 2206, and 2303 of this Chapter."

Section 3. Section 3 of Public Law 16-125 is hereby amended to read:

"Section 3. The sum of One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,600,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Agricultural Development Fund for use in carrying out the provisions of §\$2203, 2206 and 2203 of Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated."

Section 4. \$2206 of Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read:

Funds will be advanced to whatever "\$2206. Use of Funds. entity is involved for the purpose of purchasing poultry, hogs, cattle, supplies, feed, etc., all related to poultry, hog or beef production; leasing and purchasing of equipment; establishing and developing agriculture, aquaculture, horticulture and mariculture operations, processing plants and the leasing of land when applicable to the development of poultry, pork and beef production, products or processing plants. Collateral security will be obtained, if Funds so advanced will be on the basis of an interest possible. charge of four percent (4%) per annum. In some instances funds advanced will be on a continuing and revolving basis, until such time as the project is self-supporting."

Section 5. §2206.2 is hereby added to Chapter 2, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

- "\$2206.2. Criteria and Requirements. In undertaking any such loan, the Board of Directors shall be guided by and shall observe the following criteria and requirements; provided, that the determination by the Board of Directors as to its compliance with such criteria and requirements shall be final and conclusive:
 - (1) There is a need for such facilities in the area in which the facilities are to be located;
 - (2) No facilities shall be leased to any public or non-profit agency unless a feasibility study supporting the project's financing is submitted by the applicant to the Corporation. The study shall contain information as directed by the Corporation.
 - (3) Adequate provision shall be made for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said loan and any necessary reserves therefor and for the operation, repair and maintenance of the facilities at the expense of the lessee(s); and
 - (4) Public facilities, including utilities, and public services necessary for the facilities will be made available."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsection (u) of Section 53552, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"The Corporation is authorized to <u>make loan or guarantee loans</u> to non-profit cooperative associations licensed to do business on Guam in furtherance of the purposes and activities stated in this Act. All <u>loan</u> or guarantees so made shall be of such sum, value or so secured as to reasonably assure repayment or shall be of vital need to the economy of Guam as to warrant additional risk or subsidies. As used in this Subsection 'non-profit cooperative association' means any corporation organized under the provisions of Division First Part IV, Title V of the Civil code.

Section 2. Section 53601.1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 53601.1. "From the Agricultural Development Fund, the Guam Economic Development Authority shall <u>make loan</u> to or guarantee loans to responsible non-profit cooperative associations necessary for expanding facilities for the improvement or marketing of agricultural products."

Section 3. Section 53601.2, is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 53601.2. Criteria and Requirements.

In undertaking any such loan, the Board of Directors shall be guided by and shall observe the following criteria and requirements provided that the determination by the Board of Directors as to its compliance with such criteria and requirements shall be final and conclusive:

- 1) There is a need for such facilities in the area in which the facilities are to be located;
- 2) No facilities shall be leased to any public or non-profit agency unlesss the financial feasibility of the financing is supported by a feasibility

study prepared by a professional consultant, which may be an independent firm or certified public accountants, having favorable national repute for skill and and experience in such work;

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- 3) Adequate provision shall be made for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said loan and any necessary reserves therefore and for the operation, repair and maintenance of the facilities at the expense of the lessess; and
- 4) The public facilities, including utilities, and public services necessary for the facilities will be made available."

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION U OF SECTION 53552 AND SECTION 53601.1 AND ADDING SECTIONS 53601.2 AND 53601.3 ESTABLISHING CRITERIA FOR SAID LOANS.

I. Introduction

This Bill was introduced by Senator Pilar C. Lujan on January 4, 1989 and referred by the Committee on Rules on January 19, 1989 to the Committee on Economic Development and the Committee on Ways and Means.

The purpose of the Bill is to give the Guam Economic Development Authority the mandate to make direct loans to non-profit cooperative associations. Currently, GEDA's mandate provides that it may only guarantee loans to cooperatives, although it may make direct loans to farmers.

The Committee conducted a public hearing on May 22, 1989 beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the legislative session hall. Chairman E.D. Reyes presided and members present included Vice Chair M.Z. Bordallo, J.P. Aguon, E.P. Arriola, J.G. Bamba, P.C. Lujan and T.S. Nelson.

II. Testimony

Mr. Charles Crisostomo, Acting Administrator of the Guam Economic Development Authority, provided written and verbal testimony.

He testified that the \$1.6 Million appropriated by Public Law 16-125 to cover loan guarantees had been received by GEDA. However, in attempting to make use of those funds, GEDA found that few banks were willing to participate in the loan guarantee program and those few banks wanted to issue only short term notes.

In addition, he indicated there exists the need for direct loans to farmers for equipment and materials to begin, sustain or expand their operations. He furnished the Committee proposed amendments for this purpose.

A discussion ensued after Mr. Crisostomo's reading of his testimony. When asked by the Chair about the need for a firm of national repute to do the feasibility study and loan proposal, Mr. Crisostomo defended the stipulation because of the high failure rate among cooperatives. Moreover, GEDA can finance the study, if need be. The Chair indicated that GEDA should assist regardless.

when asked by the Chair about GEDA's policy on loan foreclosures, Mr. Crisostomo assured him that GEDA is foremost concerned with development and that they refrain from seizures when possible. Senator Lujan reinforced the Chair's position and recommended that local businesses be afforded the opportunity to do the study and package the loan application. Senator Bamba wanted to know how the guarantee program worked and suggested additional funds be appropriated for new applicants. Senator Nelson suggested that GEDA give loans to bonafide local farmers first, then to off-island developers. In response to Senator Arriola's question, Mr. Crisostomo mentioned that it may cost as much as \$70,000 to retain a firm to prepare a loan package and that GEDA could provide financing at three (3) percent. Senator Aguon wanted information about banks' direct participation with this program.

III. Committee Findings

There is consensus among the members that non-profit cooperative associations as well as individual farmers need the support of the government in financing their projects. The loan guarantee program is not enough because banking institutions apparently have little interest in participating. It appears that direct loans, then, should be provided by the government.

There is a program called the "Agricultural Development Fund" created by §2201, 12 Guam Code Annotated, and which is administered by GEDA and the Department of Agriculture jointly. It was established to aid in the development or subsidization of poultry, pork and beef production, agricultural products, processing plants, equipment and aquaculture loans to farmers as well as to guarantee loans to responsible non-profit cooperatives necessary for expanding facilities for the improvement of marketing of agricultural products. It is to this Fund that \$1.6 Million was appropriated by Public Law 16-125; however, that appropriation was specifically to guarantee loans for non-profit cooperatives and not for direct loans to either individual or group farmers.

IV. Committee Recommendations

The Committee on Economic Development recommends that GEDA's mandates to issue loans and to guarantee loans be expanded so that individuals as well as organized groups whose occupation is farming (whether it be agriculture, aquaculture, horticulture or mariculture) can apply for and receive government assistance.

The Committee further recommends substitution of Bill 27 for this purpose.
