BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. §13985.80 of the Government Code is repealed and reenacted to read:

"\$13985.80. Guam Preservation Trust. There is hereby established as a public non-profit corporation the Guam

Preservation Trust (the "Trust"). The Trust shall have the following purposes, which are within its powers:

(a) To seek grants and donations;

(b) To acquire title to threatened Guam properties for the

- (b) To acquire title to threatened Guam properties for the preservation of their historical value, whether in fee simple, by leasehold, or by easement, and whether through donation, transfer, dedication, purchase, or eminent domain;
- (c) To award grants for archaeological investigations, for the recording and salvage of sites of historic or prehistoric interest and value, for locating, recording and saving prehistoric and historic remains on sites that will be utilized for non-profit and non-commercial purposes, such as private homes, schools, churches, and other similar purposes;
- (d) To support other activities directly related to increasing the public appreciation of and benefit from historical places."
- **Section 2.** §13985.83 is added to the Government Code to read:
- "§13985.83. Limitation to purposes of Trust. Expenditures by the Trust shall be limited to purposes of the Trust and may not be used for any operation of the Department."
- **Section 3.** §13985.84. is added to the Government Code to read:
- "**§13985.84. Power of the Trust.** The Trust shall have the following powers in coordination with its purposes:
 - (a) To sue and be sued in its own name;
 - (b) To hire its own legal counsel;
- (c) To hire or contract for the management of Trust assets and the conduct of Trust business."
- **Section 4.** §13985.85 is added to the Government Code to read:
- "\$13985.85. Exemption from Executive Budget Act and Government Procurement Law. The Trust is exempt from the provisions of the Executive Budget Act (P.L. 12-115, as amended) and the Government Procurement Law (P.L. 16-124, as amended)."
- **Section 5.** §13985.86 is added to the Government Code to read:

PREFACE

A public hearing on **Bill No. 135** was held by the Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens and Cultural Affairs on Tuesday, February 26, 1991, at the Legislative Public Hearing Room, Pacific Arcade Building.

Present at the hearing were Chairperson, Senator Elizabeth P. Arriola and attended by Senator Pilar C. Lujan.

TESTIMONY

Mr. Anthony C. Mariano, Director, Department of Parks and Recreation, testified that the Bill will accomplish a number of desirable technical revisions in the organization of the Guam Preservation Trust. The Bill clarifies the intent of the Legislature regarding proposed activities of the Trust in a way that should work to the benefit of the general public.

Mr. Richard Davis, Territorial Archaeologist and Deputy Historic Preservation Officer, testified that the Bill gives the administrative thrust to effectively administer the program. The Bill would empower the Trust to give grants to private home-owners, schools, and churches which could not otherwise afford to comply with historic preservation requirements.

After brief discussion on some of the on-going and anticipated projects by the Historic Resource Division, Chairperson Arriola adjourned the hearing on Bill No. 135.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens, Cultural Affairs, and Human Resources wishes to report Bill No. 135, "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §13985.80 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE AND TO ADD 13985.83, 13985.84, 13985.85 AND

Dear Senator Arriola:

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposed bill number 135. It is the position of the Department of Parks and Recreation that this bill will accomplish a number of highly desireable technical revisions in the organization of the Guam Preservation Trust. It also clarifies the intent of the legislature regarding proposed activities of the Trust in a way that should work to the benefit of the general public.

The bill recognizes that reasonable measures to search for and to respond to concealed, deeply buried archaeological materials often does impose a cost burden on private, non-profit and non-commercial land owners which is difficult to meet. It directs the Guam Preservation Trust to include within their concerns a systematic effort to assist such persons facing these situations.

The Trust already has sufficient latitude in its authorizing legislation to address these situations through grants programs, and in fact, the Trust has already moved to establish a formal grant program. They have also begun to deliberate how to most appropriately respond to the private land owners who are unduly burdened by preservation concerns. Even in small projects, there can be the need to document and learn from archaeological remains, and to provide sensitive and respectful treatment to the ancient human remains that often are encountered even in areas that have been used for other purposes in more recent years.

This bill will help the Trust accomplish these and many other beneficial actions not only by directing specific attention to them, but by streamlining the administrative status of the Trust. At the present time, the Trust is required to carry out its actions under the same constraints as any line agency in the executive

branch, though it is a public, non-profit corporation similar to the Guam Mass Transit Authority or the Territorial Law Library. The remaining provisions of this bill give the Trust the same administrative structure as other public corporations. They will allow much quicker and effective responses to public needs, allow the Trust to manage their own resources for greater effectiveness, yet still provide for open public accountability and scrutiny of their actions.

I have only one suggestion, which is that in section 1 of the bill, that the word "public" be inserted after "non-profit". This would explicitly retain the Trust's status of a public corporation, and would also reassure the Board of Directors that while they operate within the bounds of their duties as members of the Board, that they are indemnified from personal liability for actions of the Trust. Other than this small change, I wholeheartedly support this bill.
