8 **Section 2. Appropriation for lights.** Four Hundred Thousand Dollars
9 (\$400,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department
10 of Public Works to install lights at the Inarajan High School Baseball Field.

**COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS
COMMITTEE REPORT ON**

BILL NO. 340

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$300,000) TO COMPLETE CONSTRUCTION OF THE INARAJAN BOAT RAMP AS ESTABLISHED BY P.L. 20-14.

PURPOSE AND ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS.

Bill No. 340 is to provide \$300,000 in addition to the \$250,000 appropriated in P.L. 20-14 to construct of the Inarajan Boat Ramp. The original funding was inadequate to complete the project.

PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Ways and Means conducted a public hearing on Friday, May 24, 1991 at 1:30 p.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room to gather testimony on Bill No. 340. Present at the hearing were the Chairman, Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators Doris F. Brooks, Joe T. San Agustin, David L.G. Shimizu, Anthony C. Blaz, Don Parkinson, Ernesto M. Espaldon, and Marilyn D.A. Manibusan.

TESTIMONY

Mr. Sabino Flores offered oral testimony at the public hearing indicating that P.L. 20-14 appropriated \$250,000 for the construction of the Inarajan Boat Ramp but that this amount is inadequate, and Bill 340 would provide the necessary amount needed to put the project out for bid. He testified in favor of the bill.

Eduardo C. Paulino, Acting Mayor of Inarajan testified in favor of the bill. He pointed out that many residents of the southern villages rely on fishing and the fishermen are anxious to launch boats without going to Agana to do so. Acting Mayor Paulino feels that the boat ramp will enhance the fishing activity in the south.

Peter Barcinas, Director of the Department of Commerce, testified in favor of Bill 340. He pointed out that the Department of Commerce is overseeing the development of boat ramps throughout the island in conjunction with federal funding. He also indicated that the design and construction plans are in order and that it can go forward with the additional appropriation.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION.

The Committee on Ways and Means, after due consideration of the testimony in support of Bill 340, recommends to do pass Bill 340, as introduced.



Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee on Ways and Means

I am Marissa P. Roldan, an employee of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, under the Bureau of Health Care Financing, which administers the Medicaid, Medically Indigent and the Catastrophic Illness Assistance Programs.

The creation of positions to replace Assistance Payment Worker series to Eligibility and Claims Specialist and the Medicaid Specialist to Utilization Review and Claims Processing Officer has been an issue way back in 1985. This action was necessary primarily because everybody working for the Public welfare Programs were identified as Assistance Payment Workers inappropriately. The position description for the Claims and Eligibility processors and Medicaid Specialist is much more than those prescribed for the APW Series.

An audit was done during the period of 12/90 through 2/91 which confirmed or justified the reallocation of positions. However supervisory positions one of which I am occupying is going to be unfairly subjected to the Merit Promotion Plan.

I am here not to speak only for myself but for the other employees who are in the same dilemma. We've been in supervisory positions and doing the job and performing the responsibilities of the position we occupy. It is going to be unfair that now that we have the position by virtue of our knowledge and work experience and that the audit has determined that we are qualified and are doing the job, why now do we have to compete for our position?

The fact is, the government is saving funds on training expenses the quality of work is maintained, and done accurately and on a timely basis, with us who are knowledgeable and experienced in doing the job.

Since the creation of positions was intended to reclassify personnel based on the duties and responsibilities that they are doing, and compensation be allocated accurately, now that audit has determined us qualified for the job, why again then, do we have to compete for our positions.

Good afternoon Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee on Ways & Means. My name is Eduardo C. Paulino, I am the acting Mayor of Inarajan.

I am here today to testify in full support of Bill 340 which will appropriate \$300,000 to complete construction of the Inarajan boat ramp.

I have been advised that an additional amount of \$300,000 is necessary to cover the costs of building a boat ramp in Inarajan.

It is generally known that there is a large number of fishermen from the South who rely heavily on the ocean for food for their families, and then there are those who fish for sport. Many fishermen from Inarajan and neighboring villages are anxious to be able to launch their boats without having to go across the island or to Downtown Agana to do so safely.

We are grateful for the efforts being made by the Legislature to enhance the local fishing potential in the South, and commend Senator Shimizu and the co-sponsors of Bill 340 for their sensitivity and care for the people of Malojloj, Inarajan. I urge your support in passing this Bill in order that construction of the boat ramp will commence in the very near future.
