Dear Madame Speaker:

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Enclosed herewith is Substitute Bill No. 962 which I have signed into law as Public Law 21-141.

This measure is a corrective one to Public Law 21-126. Section 1 addresses the concern addressed to the Legislature in the Acting Governor's message on Public Law 21-126. However, the Legislature in amending this section again created a disparity in the minimum fine as between 10 GCA §51206 and 5 GCA §40115(c). In Title 10 the fine is a minimum of \$200 and in Title 5 the fine is a minimum of \$500.

Further, the addition of a Subsection (d) increasing the Department of Public Works security personnel is inappropriate under the section governing Mayors. I recommend two additional personnel be hired at Guam Environmental Protection Agency instead.

The litter problem on Guam is a serious one. The enactment of Public Law 21-126 and this amendment to it should make our island a cleaner one.

Section 1. Paragraph (c) of §40115 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is
 amended to read:

"(c) To fine violators of sanitary and health laws and to cite 3 violators of litter and defacement laws and regulations. Such 4 citations shall be accompanied by an order to appear at the Traffic 5 6 Court Division of the Superior Court of Guam, pursuant to §51206 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. The Traffic Court shall 7 have the authority to impose a fine to those found guilty of 8 9 violating such laws and regulations in an amount not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) and not more than One Thousand 10 Dollars (\$1,000) and to pay over such fines in the following 11 12 one half to the Litter and Defacement Control manner: Revolving Fund and one half to the Municipal Litter and 13 Defacement Fund; or to perform community service not to exceed 14 15 one hundred (100) hours or both. The community service shall include cleaning of roadsides, public grounds and the cleaning of 16 17 public buildings and facilities within the municipality in which the 18 violation took place. Such community service shall be assigned by the Mayor, or in his or her absence, by the Vice-Mayor. Any 19 20 decision or action of the Mayor or Vice-Mayor pursuant to the 21 authority of this subsection may be appealed to the Superior Court of Guam within thirty (30) days of the date of such decision 22 23 or action."

Section 2. A new paragraph (d) is added to §40115 of Title 5, Guam
Code Annotated, to read:

"(d) The Department of Public Works is authorized to hire
 additional security personnel to enforce the provisions of this
 section."

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Section 3. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the
General Fund to the Department of Public Works to fund the provision of
§40115(d) of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated.

Section 4. As part of the educational process on litter and environment,
the Guam Environmental Protection Agency shall conduct a public contest in
the forms of a painting contest, an essay contest, a poetry contest or a music
contest.

AN ACT TO AMEND PARAGRAPH (c) OF §40115, TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, REGARDING MAYORAL CITATIONS OF VIOLATORS OF LITTER AND DEFACEMENT LAWS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
 Section 1. Paragraph (c) of §40115 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is
 amended to read:

"(c) To fine violators of sanitary and health[, litter and 4 defacement] laws [and regulations] and to cite violators of litter 5 6 and defacement laws and regulations. Such citations shall be 7 accompanied by an order to appear at the Traffic Court Division of the Superior Court of Guam, pursuant to §51206 of Title 10, 8 9 Guam Code Annotated. The Traffic Court shall have the authority to fine those found guilty of violating such laws and 10 regulations in an amount not less than Two Hundred Dollars 11 (\$200) and not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) and to 12 pay over such fines in the following manner: one half to the Litter 13 and Defacement Control Revolving Fund and one half to the 14 Municipal Litter and Defacement Fund; provided, that the 15

1 violator may choose to perform community service not to exceed 2 one hundred (100) hours in lieu of payment of the fine. The community service shall include cleaning of roadsides, public 3 grounds and the cleaning of public buildings and facilities within 4 5 the municipality in which the violation took place. Such community service shall be assigned by the Mayor, or in his or her 6 7 absence, by the Vice-Mayor. Any decision or action of the Mayor 8 or Vice-Mayor pursuant to the authority of this subsection may be 9 appealed to the Superior Court of Guam within thirty (30) days of 10 the date of such decision or action."
