



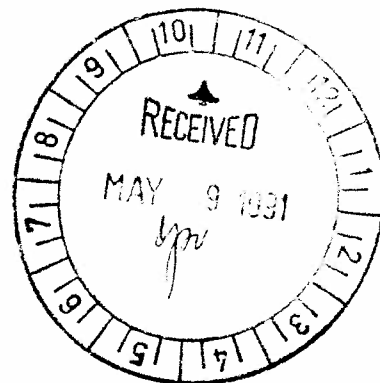




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Substitute Bill No. 96 (LS), "AN ACT MAKING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE GUAM COMMISSION ON SELF-DETERMINATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 1991; AMENDING SUBSECTION (c) OF SECTION 100, PUBLIC LAW 20-221 TO INCREASE THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS TO SIX HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS; REPEALING AND REENACTING PARAGRAPH (15) OF §4102(a) AND §6207, ALL OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE; MAKING A SALARY INCREASE PLUS BENEFITS FOR THE COORDINATOR POSITION IN HAWAII TO BE RETROACTIVE TO OCTOBER 1, 1990; APPROPRIATING FOUR THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS FOR A PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM AT JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL TO SUPPLEMENT P.L. 21-3; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF KGTF; GIVING THE GOVERNOR TRANSFER AUTHORITY FOR FISCAL YEAR 1991; AMENDING SECTION 11 OF P.L. 20-17 ON ASBESTOS REMOVAL; AMENDING SECTION 3 OF P.L. 20-64 ON NURSING SPECIALISTS; AND FUNDING ATTENDANCE AT THE WASHINGTON WORKSHOP," was on the 2nd day of May, 1991, duly and regularly passed.







AN ACT MAKING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE GUAM COMMISSION ON SELF-DETERMINATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 1991; AMENDING SUBSECTION (c) OF SECTION 100, PUBLIC LAW 20-221 TO INCREASE THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS TO SIX HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS; REPEALING AND REENACTING PARAGRAPH (15) OF §4102(a) AND §6207, ALL OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ON THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE;

MAKING A SALARY INCREASE PLUS BENEFITS FOR THE COORDINATOR POSITION IN HAWAII TO BE RETROACTIVE TO OCTOBER 1, 1990; APPROPRIATING FOUR THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS FOR A PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM AT JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL TO SUPPLEMENT P.L. 21-3; APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF KGTF; GIVING THE GOVERNOR TRANSFER AUTHORITY FOR FISCAL YEAR 1991; AMENDING SECTION 11 OF P.L. 20-17 ON ASBESTOS REMOVAL; AMENDING SECTION 3 OF P.L. 20-64 ON NURSING SPECIALISTS; AND FUNDING ATTENDANCE AT THE WASHINGTON WORKSHOP.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) are
3 appropriated from the General Fund to the Commission on Self-Determination
4 for the Fiscal Year ending September 30, 1991, in accordance with the
5 following schedule of expenses:

6 (A) General Operations

7 Payroll \$ 30,000

8 (B) Legal Counsel \$190,000

9 (C) Travel \$ 80,000.

10 **Section 2.** Subsection (c) of Section 100, Public Law 20-221 is
11 hereby amended to read:

12 "(c) Appropriation. Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
13 (\$650,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to
14 GMTA to renovate and remodel the building located on the
15 property conveyed and transferred in subsection (a) of this
16 Section into an administration, operations, and light maintenance
17 facility. Any portion of this appropriation not expended for the
18 purpose stated in this Section shall revert to the General Fund."

19 **Section 3.** Paragraph (15) of §4102(a), Title 4, Guam Code
20 Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:

21 "(15) employees of the Office of the Governor and
22 Lieutenant Governor including off-island offices and Government
23 House, as authorized in the applicable appropriation law."

24 **Section 4.** §6207, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is repealed and

1 reenacted to read:

2 "§6207. **Positions in Governor's Office.** The Governor
3 is authorized to establish such positions as may be necessary for
4 the operation of the Office of the Governor and Lieutenant
5 Governor including off-island offices and Government House;
6 **provided**, however, that no person shall be appointed to fill such
7 a position in the absence of an appropriation to pay the salary set
8 for such position. The Governor shall set the salaries for positions
9 for which salaries are not set by law."

10 **Section 5.** (a) Subpart B, 1 of Part IX (Public Welfare Division) of
11 Part XLII (Department of Public Health and Social Services) of Section 1 of
12 Chapter II of Public Law 21-03 is hereby amended to read:

13 "1. Contractual \$169,200 \$169,200"

14 (b) The "TOTAL" of Subpart B of Part IX (Public Welfare Division) of
15 Part XLII (Department of Public Health and Social Services) of Section 1 of
16 Chapter II of Public Law 21-03 is hereby amended to read:

17 "TOTAL \$169,200 \$169,200"

18 (c) The "NOTE" of Subpart B of Part IX (Public Welfare Division) of
19 part LXII (Department of Public Health and Social Services) of Section 1 of
20 Chapter II of Public Law 21-03 is hereby amended to read:

21 "NOTE: The increase of \$13,000 is for a salary increase of
22 the Administrative Assistant position from \$30,440 to \$36,000
23 and the Medical Referral Assistant position in Hawaii from
24 \$25,440 to \$29,040 and the Coordinator position in Hawaii from
25 \$45,440 to \$48,000 to be retroactive to October 1, 1990 and
26 \$3,000 to purchase additional cellular telephones."

27 **Section 6.** Five Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars
28 (\$5,775) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
29 Education to supplement funding already appropriated in Public Law 21-03
30 for a portable Public Address Unit and related equipment consisting of
31 microphones, cable, speakers, watt drivers, and horns for John F. Kennedy
32 High School.

33 **Section 7.** Five Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$510,000) are
34 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Educational

1 Telecommunications Corporation ("KGTF") for the purchase and installation of
2 equipment to enable KGTF to have the capability to broadcast live from
3 various sites on Guam.

4 **Section 8.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Governor
5 may transfer not more than ten percent (10%) of funds appropriated by the
6 Legislature for Fiscal Year 1991 ending September 30, 1991, to the various
7 departments and agencies of the government of Guam. The Governor shall
8 notify the Speaker in writing of each transfer and justification at the end of
9 each month.

10 **Section 9.** Section 11 of Public Law 20-17 is amended to read:

11 "Section 11. Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) are hereby
12 appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of the Mayor,
13 Agaña Heights to remove and clean-up asbestos in the Agaña
14 Heights incinerator building. Any unused balance of the
15 appropriation set out in this section shall revert to the General
16 Fund."

17 **Section 10.** Section 3 of Public law 20-64 is hereby amended to read:

18 "Section 3. **New job descriptions.** The Civil Service
19 Commission shall respecify job descriptions for each classified
20 position assigned to the following nursing specialty areas:
21 Emergency Room, Intensive Care Unit, NeoNatal Intensive Care
22 Unit, the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, the Hemodialysis Unit, the
23 Labor and Delivery Unit and the Operating Room at the Guam
24 Memorial Hospital; the Inpatient Unit and the Medication Clinic at
25 the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse.
26 Corresponding pay ranges of such nurses shall be adjusted to
27 effect regular straight time hourly rate increases of at least
28 twenty-five percent (25%). The Governor shall implement the
29 provisions of this Section no later than October 1, 1989."

30 **Section 11.** Twenty-One Thousand Five Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars
31 (\$21,558) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Youth
32 Congress to send six (6) members of the Guam Youth Congress to the
33 Congressional, Global and Diplomacy Seminar sponsored by the Washington

1 Workshop Foundation to be held in Washington, D.C.. Upon completion of the
2 seminar the Youth Speaker and the other participants shall prepare a written
3 report of the accomplishments and objectives and expenditures of the
4 seminar for submission to the Legislature within sixty (60) days after
5 returning.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

1 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
