BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Section 3 of Public Law 20-184 is amended to read:
 - "Section 3. Not later than September 1, 1991 the "Task
 - Force" shall establish a program to test sample the Guam schools

Further, Mr. Castro noted that since radon testing is a new activity for which his agency is not equipped. He therefore emphasized the need for personnel, training and organizational set-up. He requested that PL 20-184 be amended to provide the funding to hire and train the additional staff needed to take on the radon responsibility.

Mr. Jess Lizama's testimony outlined the work the PWC is doing with regards radon testing and mitigation. He reported that the Navy established the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP) and under this program, a sampling strategy was developed to screen all types of housing, hospitals, schools and child care centers for elevated radon levels. He further reported that their testing showed that elevated radon levels were concentrated at NAVCAMS South Finegayan and that mitigation by pressurization on five homes were done there.

At the question and answer period, Senator Manibusan, the bill's author, expressed disappointment with GEPA on their testimony. She suggested that norther com-

Bill 226: AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF PL 20-184 RELATIVE TO RADON TESTING IN PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

Background

Bill No. 226 was introduced by Senator Manibusan to amend PL 20-184 which established a task force to conduct a study to determine the extent of radon contamination in the school buildings on Guam and to determine the necessary measures to reduce radon exposure. Bill 226 would require EPA to test public buildings in addition to school buildings as mandated by PL 20-184.

Public Hearing and Testimony

The committee conducted a public hearing on the bill April 22, 1991 at 9:00 A.M. in the public hearing room. The committee chairman Senator David L.G. Shimizu chaired the hearing with the following senators present;

Thank you for your letter dated March 20, 1991 regarding the Public Hearing on Bill No. 226, An Act to Amend Section 3 of Public Law 20-184 Relative to Radon Testing

Testimony on Bill 226 and Public Law 20-184

Bill 226

Guam E.P.A. is in favor of the amending Public Law 20-184 to allow more time for this Agency to undertake the activities mandated in Public Law 20-184. However, due to the newness of radon testing on island, this Agency is requesting additional time to conduct radon screening measurements for all schools on Guam. Requiring the radon screening measurement to be completed within one year of the enactment of Public Law 20-184 will not be sufficient. Because this Agency has developed a "Scope of Work" for the radon screening measurement for schools and residential homes on Guam, this Agency requests that the proposed amendment be changed to coincide with the Scope of Work. Radon screening measurement for public buildings will be address at a later date. The following are reasons for requiring more time for the radon screening

- This Agency has never conducted a radon screening measurement on Guam. 1.
- There are no radon data available on Guam. Therefore, there are no basic 2. information about radon that this Agency can use in order to develop a realistic and methodical approach to the radon problem on Guam (i.e. where high, medium and low readings are occurring, etc.). 3.
- The Air Pollution Control Program staff of two (2) have no experience or training in radon prior to the Radon Grant award and the signing of Public Law 20-184.



PWC GUAM TESTIMONY AT THE GUAM LEGISLATURE ON

BILL No. 226

CONCERNING RADON TESTING ON GOVGUAM PUBLIC

Good Morning Senators:

My name is Jess Lizama. I am the Environmental Officer at the Navy Public Works Center. I am here to share with you the information we have concerning radon testing and mitigation.

Radon is a naturally occurring radioative gas that is produced from decaying uranium. Radon is found mainly in soils and rocks containing uranium. Outdoors, radon is diluted to such low concentration that it rarel poses a health threat. However, inside an enclosed space (such as a home or office building), radon can accumulate to very high levels.

Due to health concern of radon contamination, the Navy established the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP). Under this program, a sampling strategy was developed to screen all types of housing hospitals, schools and child care centers for elevated radon levels.

PWC Guam followed the NAVRAMP in implementing radon mitigation. The three phases involved in radon mitigation are:

SCREENING - initial testing of Navy housing units located in the following 1. housing areas were conducted:

Sumay Lockwood North/South Tipalao New Apra Housing Naval Magazine Apra Heights Nimitz Hill

Nimitz Flag Circle Naval Hospital Naval Air Station NAVCAMS Barrigada FAA NAVCAMS Finegayan South Finegayan

- ASSESSMENT during the screening process, radon detected above 2. the established safe limits (4 pci/L), was then subjected to confirmation testing.
- MITIGATION housing units found to have elevated radon concentration was 3. mitigated following the priority scheme recommended by EPA:

Radon Level (pci/L)

Action

0 to 4

No action required

4 to 20

Schedule mitigation within

5 years.

20 to 200

Schedule mitigation within 6 months.

More than 200

Schedule mitigation within 3 weeks.

Mitigation may consist of ventillation, sealing cracks in floors or walls, pressurization by outside air or sub-slab suction.

Our radon testing showed that elevated radon levels were concentrated at NAVCAMS South Finegayan. The number of homes at NAVCAMS South Finegayan and the corresponding radon levels were as follows:

Radon level (pci/L)

Number of Housing Units

0 to 4	1
4 to 20	40
20 to 200	68
More than 200	1


Radon mitigation by pressurization was done on five homes at NAVCAMS South Finegayan.


