AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A NURSE EXAMINATION PREPARATION PROGRAM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND TO ADD SIX FULL TIME EQUIVALENT EMPLOYEES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES; TO ADD SUBSECTION (e) TO §4301, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO INCLUDE MAMMOGRAM BENEFITS IN HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES; TO PROVIDE A MAMMOGRAM SCREENING PROGRAM IN THE MEDICALLY INDIGENT PROGRAM; TO AMEND §12205 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ADD MEMBERS TO THE BOARD OF ALLIED HEALTH EXAMINERS; TO AMEND SUBSECTION (i) OF §12101, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, DEFINING THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE; TO AMEND

§12461 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RAISING THE NUMBER OF CREDIT HOURS TO RENEW A DENTIST'S LICENSE; TO REPEAL AND REENACT §1229 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ESTABLISH A REVOLVING FUND WITHIN THE HEALTH PROFESSIONAL LICENSING OFFICE; TO AMEND AND ADD CERTAIN SECTIONS OF PUBLIC LAW 19-54, THE ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES ACT; TO REQUIRE THE PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN A FILTRATION SYSTEM AT POTABLE WATER WELLS; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, FOR COMPUTER EQUIPMENT; FOR A NEW WATER FILTRATION SYSTEM; AND TO AMEND SUBSECTION 2 OF SUBPARAGRAPH (a) OF §8134, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO RAISE THE AGE LIMIT OF A MINOR CHILD WHO RECEIVES SURVIVOR ANNUITIES UNDER THE GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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2 Section 1. (a) The School of Nursing and Allied Health, University of Guam (the "University"), shall design and offer a review and training program 3 to prepare Guam resident graduates of nursing schools to pass written 4 examinations required for full licensure by the Guam Board of Nurse 6 Examiners (the "Board"). The nurse examination preparation program (the "program") may be conducted at the Guam Memorial Hospital or other appropriate sites by cooperative agreement. The University may establish minimum eligibility requirements, application procedures, tuition and fees; 9 provided, that a portion of tuition and fees may be deferred for any student 10 on the basis of ability to pay, and who enters into a contract to serve as a full-1 1 time licensed nurse on Guam for a period of not less than twelve (12) months. 12 13 committee comprised of the Guam Memorial Hospital Nursing Administrator, the nursing staff administrator of the Department of Public 14 Health and Social Services, the nursing staff director of the Department of 15 Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and a representative of the Guam Nurses 16 Association shall review and comment on the proposed curriculum, course 17 design and selection criteria prior to submittal to the Board as provided by 18 The program may operate for five years from date of approval by the

Board, and be included in annual and supplemental budget requests of the University of Guam.

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- (b) The Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, Department of Public Health and Social Services, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and other government agencies which employ persons who are eligible to participate in the program shall encourage and facilitate such participation, including granting administrative or educational leave with pay, when such participation does not curtail health program services. Any agency which employs program participants shall report to the Governor at least quarterly on the manpower and budgetary impact of the program.
- Section 2. The Bureau of Community Health and Nursing Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services is authorized an additional six (6) full time equivalent ("FTE") employees for its Home Nursing Services division, as follows: Two (2) Community Health Nurse II, one (1) Licensed Practical Nurse II, one (1) Licensed Practical Nurse II, one (1) Nurse Aide II, one (1) Social Worker II and one (1) Administrative Assistant.
- Section 3. The Department of Public Health and Social Services shall promulgate within one hundred twenty (120) days a schedule of fees for all services available through the Home Nursing Services program, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law.
- Section 4. Subsection (e) is added to §4301, Title 4, Guam Code 22 Annotated, to read:
 - "(e). Mammogram to be included as benefit in every health insurance policy. Every policy of health insurance issued to a female resident of Guam on or after July 1, 1991, except a policy that provides coverage only for specified and limited benefits, shall provide coverage for screening by low-dose mammography for occult breast cancer as follows:
 - (i) For women 35 to 39 years of age, one baseline mammogram;
 - (ii) For women 40 to 49 years of age, a mammogram every two years;
- 30 (iii) For women 50 years of age and older, an annual mammogram; 31 and
- (iv) For a woman of any age with a history of breast cancer or whose mother or sister has experienced breast cancer, a mammogram upon the recommendation of the woman's physician.

The services provided in this subparagraph (e) are subject to any coinsurance provisions which may be in force in such policies, contracts, plans or agreements. The Director, with the advice of the Director of Public Health and Social Services, shall annually review the age and frequency guidelines for mammographic screening recommended by the American Cancer Society, and shall accordingly adjust the age and frequency requirements under subitems (i) through (iv), by rule, if necessary.

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For purposes of this subparagraph (e), the term 'low-dose mammography' means the x-ray examination of the breast using equipment dedicated specifically for mammography, including but not limited to the x-ray tube, filter, compression device, screens, films, and cassettes, with an average radiation exposure delivery of less than one rad mid-breast, with two views for each breast. An insurer may provide the services required by this subparagraph (e) through contracts with providers; provided, that the contract is determined to be a cost-effective means of delivering the services without sacrifice of quality and meets the approval of the Director of Public Health and Social Services."

Section 5. §291352.01 is added to Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§291352.01. Mammogram Screening. The Department shall make available a mammogram screening program that provides coverage for screening by low-dose mammography for occult breast cancer as follows:

- (a) For women 35 to 39 years of age, one baseline mammograph;
- (b) For women 40 to 49 years of age, a mammogram every two years;
- (c) For women 50 years of age and older, an annual mammogram; and
- (d) For a woman of any age with a history of breast cancer or whose mother or sister has experienced breast cancer, a mammogram upon the recommendation of the woman's physician.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Catastrophic Illness Assistance Program within the Department of Public Health and Social Services shall provide mammograph screening to those female residents of

Guam who do not have health insurance or do not qualify for coverage under the Medically Indigent Program.

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The Director of Public Health and Social Services shall annually review the age and frequency guidelines for mammographic screening recommended by the American Cancer Society, and shall accordingly adjust the age and frequency requirements under subparagraphs (a) through (c) by rule, if necessary.

For purposes of this section, the term 'low-dose mammography' means the x-ray examination of the breast using equipment dedicated specifically for mammography, including but not limited to the x-ray tube, filter, compression device, screens, films, and cassettes, with an average radiation exposure delivery of less then one rad mid-breast, with two views for each breast."

Section 6. §12205 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to 15 read:

"§12205. Board of Examiners. The Governor shall appoint members of the Board of Examiners as follows: (a) a Board of Medical Examiners, (b) a Board of Allied Health Examiners, and (c) such other Boards of Examiners as the Commissioner deems necessary because of the number of licenses in the profession. Each Board of Examiners shall consist of five (5) members, except for the Board of Allied Health Examiners, which shall have nine (9) members. The Governor shall appoint as a member of any such board a person who is a citizen or permanent resident of Guam for at least one (1) year immediately preceding his appointment.

The Board of Allied Health Examiners shall examine applicants for licensure in fields not having separate Boards of Examiners, except Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, who shall be examined by the Board of Medical Examiners.

Each examining board shall elect a chairman and a secretary and may make such rules regarding the discharge of its duties as the Commission may approve. Each board shall conduct the examination and make reports as required by law and by the rules of the Commission.

Licenses issued to osteopathic physicians and/or surgeons by the Board of Allied Health Examiners which are current as of the effective date of this

Section shall be recognized as valid by the Board of Medical Examiners, and shall remain in effect until the Commission on Licensure has acted on applications submitted by licensed osteopaths, in accordance with duly promulgated rules and regulations governing osteopaths."

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Section 7. Subsection (i) of §12101 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

- "(i) The Practice of Medicine means the diagnosis, correction and treatment in any manner or by any means, methods, devices instrumentalities of any disease, illness, pain, wound, fracture, infirmity, deformity, defect, or abnormal, physical and mental condition including physician assistants under the supervision of a licensed physician of medicine but does not include the practice of dentistry, podiatry, nursing, optometry, psychology, chiropractic or pharmacy by a person licensed under the provisions of this Chapter."
- 15 Section 8. §12461 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to 16 read:

17 "§12461. Continuing Dental Education and Licensure Renewal. 18

Prior to renewal of a license, a dentist must submit evidence of having completed or attended a total of sixty-five (65) credit hours of Continuing Dental Education in both Category I and Category II, of which not less than twenty (20) hours shall be from Category II, at the end of every two (2) years before being allowed to pay his annual renewal fee.

- 23 One Credit Unit is equivalent of one (1) hour attendance of (a) 24 Category I courses.
 - Credit Unit equivalency of Category II courses, lectures, seminars, scientific papers, journals or audiovisual materials shall be evaluated by the Board.
 - A dentist licensed by the territory of Guam who is also a licensed (c) dentist in another jurisdiction and who has completed Continuing Dental Education credit unit hours under the category in the jurisdiction in which he is licensed may apply those Continuing Dental Education units towards his licensure renewal in the territory of Guam.
- 33 Under certain unusual circumstances, such as illness or temporary disability of a licensed dentist, which makes it impossible for him or her to 34

complete the Continuing Dental Education requirements, the Board may waive the Continuing Dental Education requirement for the dentist for that particular year."

Section 9. §12229 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:

§12229. Revolving Fund. There is created a Revolving Fund within the Health Professional Licensing Office, into which all money payable under the provisions of this Chapter and Chapter V of Title XVII, Government Code of Guam, shall be deposited. The revolving fund shall be used solely to defray the cost of obtaining standardized examination materials and services for the healing arts and cosmetology licensure and the cost of proctoring examination at the testing site. Tests for licensure of all the healing arts and cosmetology shall be given at least every six (6) months."

Section 10. §2951, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended by adding the following definition immediately after definition of "Substantiated Report":

"Unsubstantiated Report means a report made pursuant to this Chapter if an investigation by the Adult Protective Services Unit determines that there is inconclusive evidence of abuse but existence of the abuse cannot be disproved to the satisfaction of the Unit."

Section 11. Item 1 of Subsection D of §2952, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"1. The name of the person making the report and where he or she can be reached. The identity of the person making the report shall be confidential, but made available to an agency contracted by Adult Protective Services to provide case investigation."

Section 12. A new Subsection E is added to §2952 of Title 10, Guam
"E. Reports of olders are

"E. Reports of elderly or disabled adult abuse may be made anonymously under this Chapter."

Section 13. §2955 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to "82955 Adult Periods."

33 "\$2955. Adult Protective Services. The Division of Senior Citizens of the 34 Department of Public Health and Social Services, (the 'Department') shall

establish an Adult Protective Services Unit, (the 'Unit') which shall have 1 sufficient staff to fulfill the purposes of this Article and organized in such a 2 way as to maximize the continuity of responsibility, care and services of 3 individual workers toward individual adults and families. the sole unit responsible for receiving and investigating all reports of elderly The Unit shall be or disabled abuse made pursuant to this Article, specifically including but not limited to reports of abuse in facilities operated by the Department and other public or private agencies and in private residences. The Unit shall have authority to delegate to other social service agencies the responsibility of investigating reports of abuse, but shall monitor the investigations conducted by such other authorized agencies."

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12 Section 14. Subsection C of §2956, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read: 13 14

Determine within sixty (60) days whether the report is "C. substantiated or unsubstantiated. If the assessment results in determination that the elderly or disabled adult has suffered serious abuse, report such determination to the Attorney General within forty-eight (48) hours. Attorney General may investigate and decide whether to initiate criminal

20 Section 15. A new Subsection F is added to §2956, Title 10, Guam Code 21 Annotated, to read:

22 Appoint a multi-disciplinary team which may include, but is not limited to, representatives from the Department of Mental Health and 23 24 Substance Abuse, the Guam Medical Society, Guam Legal Services Corporation, the Advocacy Office, the Catholic Archdiocese of Guam, the Guam 25 Ministerial Association and the Mayors' Council. Such members shall receive 26 Forty-Five Dollars (\$45) as compensation for attendance at any meetings of 27 the team, but such compensation shall not apply to more than two (2) 28 meetings in any one (1) calendar month. No member shall receive any other 29 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual travel, subsistence and out-30 3 1 of-pocket expenses incurred in the discharge of such responsibilities, including authorized attendance at meetings held away from 32 33 34

Section 16. Subsection B of §2958, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is

repealed and reenacted to read:

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"B. Both substantial and unsubstantiated reports of elderly or disabled adult abuse shall be placed and maintained in the central registry for a period of ten (10) years."

Section 17. Item 1 of Subsection B, of §2959, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

- "1. Any agency or individual, authorized, contracted or licensed through the Unit to care for, protect or provide services to an elderly or disabled adult who is a victim of abuse, which agency or individual shall share information related to the abuse with the Unit."
- Section 18. Subsection E of §2959, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is redesignated as Subsection F, and amended to read:
- "F. Any person who willfully releases or permits the release of any information or records is in violation of this Section and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."
- Section 19. A new Subsection E is added to \$2959 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
- "E. Students authorized by the Director of the Department may be permitted access to Adult Protective Service ('APS') files for the purpose of research and to gather statistical information. Such authorized students, under supervision, may be permitted to receive APS referrals and participate in APS intake, interviews and case management assignments. Such authorized students shall be registered in a field placement, practicum internship, or block placement with an accredited college or university. Such students will be under the direct supervision of a social services supervisor and subject to all conditions of this Chapter and government of Guam policies, procedures and guidelines. Such students shall not disseminate any information beyond the scope of the program objectives."
- Section 20. The Public Utility Agency of Guam (the "Agency") shall install and maintain an effective filtration system at the wellhead of potable water wells operated by the Agency in areas where chemical substances and compounds harmful to the health of humans are known to exist or are detected in regular sampling of such wells. The Guam Environmental Protection Agency shall determine the most effective and efficient filtration

system for use, and shall establish operational standards by regulation for Agency compliance with applicable federal laws and regulations.

Section 21. One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam to accomplish the purposes of Section 1 of this Act.

Section 22. Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, to accomplish the purposes of Section 2 of this Act in fiscal year 1991.

Section 23. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, to purchase and install computer equipment and software for the Health Professional Licensing Office, and for its staff training.

Section 24. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam to accomplish the purposes of Section 20 of this Act. Priority shall be given to Agency well sites adjacent to the Dededo solid waste transfer station.

Section 25. Section 3 of Chapter V, Public Law 21-03 is amended to 18 read:

"Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the FTE restrictions imposed by this Act shall not be applicable to persons practicing the healing arts as defined in Subsection (b) of 10 GCA §12101 for the Department of Public Health and Social Services and the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (the "Authority"), or to certified or registered ancillary service personnel in the following position areas with the Authority: Pharmacy, Physical Therapy, Medical Laboratory, Radiology, Cardiopulminary, and Dietary, and the Authority is authorized to hire personnel to fill positions in such areas in Fiscal Year 1991."

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A NURSE EXAMINATION PREPARATION PROGRAM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND TO ADD SIX FULL TIME EQUIVALENT EMPLOYEES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES; TO ADD SUBSECTION (e) TO §4301, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO INCLUDE MAMMOGRAM BENEFITS IN HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES: TO PROVIDE A MAMMOGRAM SCREENING PROGRAM IN THE MEDICALLY INDIGENT PROGRAM: TO AMEND §12205 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ADD MEMBERS TO THE BOARD OF ALLIED HEALTH EXAMINERS: TO AMEND SUBSECTION (i) OF §12101, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, DEFINING THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE; TO AMEND §12461 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RAISING THE NUMBER OF CREDIT HOURS TO RENEW A DENTIST'S LICENSE; TO REPEAL AND REENACT §1229 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ESTABLISH A REVOLVING FUND WITHIN THE HEALTH PROFESSIONAL LICENSING OFFICE; TO AMEND AND ADD CERTAIN SECTIONS OF PUBLIC LAW 19-54, THE ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES ACT; TO REQUIRE THE PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY TO INSTALL AND MAINTAIN A FILTRATION SYSTEM AT POTABLE WATER WELLS: TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, FOR OPERATIONAL NEEDS OF THE HEMODIALYSIS UNIT, TO OPERATE THE MARY CLAIRE HOME, FOR COMPUTER EQUIPMENT, FOR THE NEW MENTAL HEALTH BUILDING, FOR A NEW WATER FILTRATION SYSTEM; TO REPEAL AND REENACT §23105 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO PROVIDE A MILEAGE ALLOWANCE FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES WHO USE PERSONAL VEHICLES FOR OFFICIAL BUSINESS: TO AMEND SUBSECTION 2 OF SUBPARAGRAPH (a) OF §8134, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO RAISE THE AGE LIMIT OF A MINOR CHILD WHO RECEIVES SURVIVOR ANNUITIES UNDER THE GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT BENEFITS: TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBSECTION (b) OF §4301 OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ESTABLISHING CLASSES OF EMPLOYEES FOR HEALTH INSURANCE; AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE FAMILY COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. (a) The School of Nursing and Allied Health, University of Guam (the "University"), shall design and offer a review and training program to prepare Guam resident graduates of nursing schools to pass written examinations required for full licensure by the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners (the "Board"). The nurse examination preparation program (the "program") may be conducted at the Guam Memorial Hospital or other appropriate sites by cooperative agreement. The University may establish

minimum eligibility requirements, application procedures, tuition and fees; provided, that a portion of tuition and fees may be deferred for any student on the basis of ability to pay, and who enters into a contract to serve as a fulltime licensed nurse on Guam for a period of not less than twelve (12) months. 4 committee comprised of the Guam Memorial Hospital Nursing Administrator, the nursing staff administrator of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the nursing staff director of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and a representative of the Guam Nurses Association shall review and comment on the proposed curriculum, course design and selection criteria prior to submittal to the Board as provided by 10 The program may operate for five years from date of approval by the Board, and be included in annual and supplemental budget requests of the 12 13 University of Guam.

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The Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, Department of Public Health and Social Services, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, and other government agencies which employ persons who are eligible to participate in the program shall encourage and facilitate such participation, including granting administrative or educational leave with pay, when such participation does not curtail health program services. agency which employs program participants shall report to the Governor at least quarterly on the manpower and budgetary impact of the program.

Section 2. The Bureau of Community Health and Nursing Services of the Department of Public Health and Social Services is authorized an additional six (6) full time equivalent ("FTE") employees for its Home Nursing Services division, as follows: Two (2) Community Health Nurse II, one (1) Licensed Practical Nurse II, one (1) Licensed Practical Nurse II, one (1) Nurse Aide II, one (1) Social Worker II and one (1) Administrative Assistant.

The Department of Public Health and Social Services shall promulgate within one hundred twenty (120) days a schedule of fees for all services available through the Home Nursing Services program, in accordance with the Administrative Adjudication Law.

Section 4. Subsection (e) is added to §4301, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

(a) For women 35 to 39 years of age, one baseline mammograph;

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- (b) For women 40 to 49 years of age, a mammogram every two years;
- (c) For women 50 years of age and older, an annual mammogram; and
- (d) For a woman of any age with a history of breast cancer or whose mother or sister has experienced breast cancer, a mammogram upon the recommendation of the woman's physician.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Catastrophic Illness Assistance Program within the Department of Public Health and Social Services shall provide mammograph screening to those female residents of Guam who do not have health insurance or do not qualify for coverage under the Medically Indigent Program.

The Director of Public Health and Social Services shall annually review the age and frequency guidelines for mammographic screening recommended by the American Cancer Society, and shall accordingly adjust the age and frequency requirements under subparagraphs (a) through (c) by rule, if necessary.

For purposes of this section, the term 'low-dose mammography' means the x-ray examination of the breast using equipment dedicated specifically for mammography, including but not limited to the x-ray tube, filter, compression device, screens, films, and cassettes, with an average radiation exposure delivery of less then one rad mid-breast, with two views for each breast."

Section 6. §12205 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"§12205. Board of Examiners. The Governor shall appoint members of the Board of Examiners as follows: (a) a Board of Medical Examiners, (b) a Board of Allied Health Examiners, and (c) such other Boards of Examiners as the Commissioner deems necessary because of the number of licenses in the profession. Each Board of Examiners shall consist of five (5) members, except for the Board of Allied Health Examiners, which shall have nine (9) members.

The Governor shall appoint as a member of any such board a person who is a

citizen or permanent resident of Guam for at least one (1) year immediately preceding his appointment.

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The Board of Allied Health Examiners shall examine applicants for licensure in fields not having separate Boards of Examiners, except Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, who shall be examined by the Board of Medical Examiners.

Each examining board shall elect a chairman and a secretary and may make such rules regarding the discharge of its duties as the Commission may approve. Each board shall conduct the examination and make reports as required by law and by the rules of the Commission.

Licenses issued to osteopathic physicians and/or surgeons by the Board of Allied Health Examiners which are current as of the effective date of this Section shall be recognized as valid by the Board of Medical Examiners, and shall remain in effect until the Commission on Licensure has acted on applications submitted by licensed osteopaths, in accordance with duly promulgated rules and regulations governing osteopaths."

Section 7. Subsection (i) of §12101 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"(i) The Practice of Medicine means the diagnosis, correction and treatment in any manner or by any means, methods, devices or instrumentalities of any disease, illness, pain, wound, fracture, infirmity, deformity, defect, or abnormal, physical and mental condition including physician assistants under the supervision of a licensed physician of medicine but does not include the practice of dentistry, podiatry, nursing, optometry, psychology, chiropractic or pharmacy by a person licensed under the provisions of this Chapter."

Section 8. §12461 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"§12461. Continuing Dental Education and Licensure Renewal.

Prior to renewal of a license, a dentist must submit evidence of having completed or attended a total of sixty-five (65) credit hours of Continuing Dental Education in both Category I and Category II, of which not less than twenty (20) hours shall be from Category II, at the end of every two (2) years before being allowed to pay his annual renewal fee.

(a) One Credit Unit is equivalent of one (1) hour attendance of Category I courses.

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- (b) Credit Unit equivalency of Category II courses, lectures, seminars, scientific papers, journals or audiovisual materials shall be evaluated by the Board.
- (c) A dentist licensed by the territory of Guam who is also a licensed dentist in another jurisdiction and who has completed Continuing Dental Education credit unit hours under the category in the jurisdiction in which he is licensed may apply those Continuing Dental Education units towards his licensure renewal in the territory of Guam.
- (d) Under certain unusual circumstances, such as illness or temporary disability of a licensed dentist, which makes it impossible for him or her to complete the Continuing Dental Education requirements, the Board may waive the Continuing Dental Education requirement for the dentist for that particular year."
- Section 9. §12229 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:
- §12229. Revolving Fund. There is created a Revolving Fund within the Health Professional Licensing Office, into which all money payable under the provisions of this Chapter and Chapter V of Title XVII, Government Code of Guam, shall be deposited. The revolving fund shall be used solely to defray the cost of obtaining standardized examination materials and services for the healing arts and cosmetology licensure and the cost of proctoring examination at the testing site. Tests for licensure of all the healing arts and cosmetology shall be given at least every six (6) months."
- Section 10. §2951, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended by adding the following definition immediately after definition of "Substantiated Report":
- "Unsubstantiated Report means a report made pursuant to this Chapter if an investigation by the Adult Protective Services Unit determines that there is inconclusive evidence of abuse but existence of the abuse cannot be disproved to the satisfaction of the Unit."
- Section 11. Item 1 of Subsection D of §2952, Title 10, Guam Code 34 Annotated, is amended to read:

"1. The name of the person making the report and where he or she can be reached. The identity of the person making the report shall be confidential, but made available to an agency contracted by Adult Protective Services to provide case investigation."

Section 12. A new Subsection E is added to §2952 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"E. Reports of elderly or disabled adult abuse may be made anonymously under this Chapter."

Section 13. §2955 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"§2955. Adult Protective Services. The Division of Senior Citizens of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, (the 'Department') shall establish an Adult Protective Services Unit, (the 'Unit') which shall have sufficient staff to fulfill the purposes of this Article and organized in such a way as to maximize the continuity of responsibility, care and services of individual workers toward individual adults and families. The Unit shall be the sole unit responsible for receiving and investigating all reports of elderly or disabled abuse made pursuant to this Article, specifically including but not limited to reports of abuse in facilities operated by the Department and other public or private agencies and in private residences. The Unit shall have authority to delegate to other social service agencies the responsibility of investigating reports of abuse, but shall monitor the investigations conducted by such other authorized agencies."

Section 14. Subsection C of §2956, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"C. Determine within sixty (60) days whether the report is substantiated or unsubstantiated. If the assessment results in determination that the elderly or disabled adult has suffered serious abuse, report such determination to the Attorney General within forty-eight (48) hours. The Attorney General may investigate and decide whether to initiate criminal proceedings."

Section 15. A new Subsection F is added to §2956, Title 10, Guam Code 33 Annotated, to read:

Appoint a multi-disciplinary team which may include, but is not 1 2 limited to, representatives from the Department of Mental Health and 3 Guam Medical Society, Guam Legal Services Substance Abuse, the 4 Corporation, the Advocacy Office, the Catholic Archdiocese of Guam, the Guam 5 Ministerial Association and the Mayors' Council. Such members shall receive Forty-Five Dollars (\$45) as compensation for attendance at any meetings of 6 7 the team, but such compensation shall not apply to more than two (2) meetings in any one (1) calendar month. No member shall receive any other 8 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual travel, subsistence and out-9 10 of-pocket expenses incurred in the discharge of such 11 responsibilities, including authorized attendance at meetings held away from 12 Guam.

Section 16. Subsection B of §2958, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is repealed and reenacted to read:

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Both substantial and unsubstantiated reports of elderly or disabled adult abuse shall be placed and maintained in the central registry for a period of ten (10) years."

Item 1 of Subsection B, of §2959, Title 10, Guam Code Section 17. Annotated, is amended to read:

- "1. Any agency or individual, authorized, contracted or licensed through the Unit to care for, protect or provide services to an elderly or disabled adult who is a victim of abuse, which agency or individual shall share information related to the abuse with the Unit."
- Section 18. Subsection E of §2959, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is redesignated as Subsection F, and amended to read:
- Any person who willfully releases or permits the release of any information or records is in violation of this Section and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."
- Section 19. A new Subsection E is added to §2959 of Title 10, Guam 30 Code Annotated, to read:
- Students authorized by the Director of the Department may be 31 "E. 32 permitted access to Adult Protective Service ('APS') files for the purpose of 33 research and to gather statistical information. Such authorized students, 34 under supervision, may be permitted to receive APS referrals and participate

in APS intake, interviews and case management assignments. Such authorized students shall be registered in a field placement, practicum internship, or block placement with an accredited college or university. Such students will be under the direct supervision of a social services supervisor and subject to all conditions of this Chapter and government of Guam policies, procedures and guidelines. Such students shall not disseminate any information beyond the scope of the program objectives."

Section 20. The Public Utility Agency of Guam (the "Agency") shall install and maintain an effective filtration system at the wellhead of potable water wells operated by the Agency in areas where chemical substances and compounds harmful to the health of humans are known to exist or are detected in regular sampling of such wells. The Guam Environmental Protection Agency shall determine the most effective and efficient filtration system for use, and shall establish operational standards by regulation for Agency compliance with applicable federal laws and regulations.

Section 21. One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam to accomplish the purposes of Section 1 of this Act.

Section 22. Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, to accomplish the purposes of Section 2 of this Act in fiscal year 1991.

Section 23. Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services, to purchase and install computer equipment and software for the Health Professional Licensing Office, and for its staff training.

Section 24. Five Hundred Eight Thousand Six Hundred and Seventy Dollars (\$508,670) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the following operational needs of the Hemodialysis Unit for Fiscal Year 1991:

Section 25. Five Million Three Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$5,385,800) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to supplement funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of Public Law 20-56, for construction of a new building for the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse inpatient-outpatient and administrative services, for construction management, and for the purchase of collateral equipment, and art work as mandated by law. Funds appropriated in Public Law 20-56 and in this Section shall remain available until expended. Section 26. Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, for contractual expenses in the second program year to

operate the group home for mentally-retarded adults with behavioral problems, known as the "Mary Claire Home".

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Section 27. Southern Regional Community Health Center. (a) Notwithstanding the reversion clauses included in Sections 8 and 9 of Public Law 20-183, the unexpected balance of such appropriations for personnel, supplies, equipment, and capital outlay for the Department of Public Health and Social Services Southern Regional Community Health Clinics in Santa Rita and Inarajan shall remain available until expended.

(b) One Hundred Fifty-One Thousand Dollars (\$151,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Social Services for the completion of the Southern Regional Community Health Center.

Section 28. One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam to accomplish the purposes of Section 20 of this Act. Priority shall be given to Agency well sites adjacent to the Dededo solid waste transfer station.

Section 29. (a) Legislative intent. The Legislature has been apprised that there has been an increasing use by government employees of their personal vehicles for official business primarily because of the non-availability of official government vehicles. With the extreme rise in the cost of operating a vehicle, inclusive of the increase in the cost of gasoline and oil, vehicle maintenance and vehicle insurance, the Legislature deems it unjust that these employees are not eligible for a fair and reasonable reimbursement of their personal expenses for operating and maintaining their vehicles when such vehicles are being used for the benefit of the government of Guam. The Legislature, therefore, seeks to establish a just and reasonable level of reimbursement for the use of personal vehicles for official government of Guam business and purposes.

(b) Mileage Allowance. Effective thirty (30) days after the enactment of this Act, §23105 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:

"§23105. Mileage Allowance. Persons authorized to travel at government expense shall, in accordance with regulations and whenever such mode of transportation is authorized or approved as more advantageous to

the government, be paid in lieu of transportation Sixty Cents (\$.60) per mile for the use of a privately owned four-wheeled passenger motor vehicle, when engaged on official business."

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Section 30. Subsection (2) of subparagraph (a) of §8134 of Chapter 8, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

"(2). If both the surviving spouse and minor children under age eighteen (18) survive the member, an annuity shall begin immediately upon death of the member. The allowance for a minor child shall be payable until the child's attainment of age eighteen (18), or age twenty-three (23) if the child is a full-time student."

Section 31. (a). Legislative finding. The Legislature finds that government of Guam employees, both active and retired, are entitled to benefits comparable to those of other workers or retirees, it being in the best interest of the people of Guam to attract and retain qualified employees for Since the cost of health care continues to rise more rapidly public service. than the Consumer Price Index, and premiums for health insurance also rise to meet the spiraling costs for medical care, it is reasonable and just to assign the costs of those benefits on an equitable basis. Since the cost of benefits utilized by active employees compared to retirees is an accurate depiction of benefit utilization; since lower cost to the active employees for such benefits is a means of keeping qualified employees; since the people of Guam recognize the debt owed to retired government employees for their years of valued services and wish to assure the retirees that increases in the cost of their medical benefits will have a minimal impact on their hard earned annuities; and since previous efforts to achieve these goals and intentions have been found unclear; it is the finding of the Legislature that the following legislation is necessary.

- (b) Subsection (b) of §4301 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:
- "(b) All participation by employees in such contracts of insurance shall be on a voluntary basis. Effective October 1, 1991 for Fiscal Year 1992 and for each fiscal year thereafter, the government's contributions for health and dental insurance shall be determined by using a level of percentage of the cost of providing the benefits for each class of employees by family status

and by active versus retiree status as set forth herein below, except that the government shall increase the contribution it makes on behalf of retired employees or survivor(s) of retired employees (Classes IV through VIII, below) so that retired employees or the survivors of retired employees contribute no more than active employees who are otherwise similarly situated except for being active and not retired.

The government's contribution shall not be less than fifty percent (50%) of the lowest premium for a single employee and shall be the same dollar amount for all companies providing health benefits to government of Guam employees, dependents, retirees and survivors. Classes of employees for all contracts of health insurance shall be:

Section 32. (a) The Legislature expressed its Legislative intent. support for Guam's continued participation in the Family Community Leadership project by appropriating funds in Public Law 20-41, which appropriation was not included in the budget that was automatically reappropriated for the current fiscal year, and therefore a new appropriation for continued operation of the project is necessary in fiscal year 1991, and to defray the cost of a scheduled audit.

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Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the University of Guam, for continued participation of the

- 2 project, and for the costs of all office staff positions for such project.
