Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) are appropriated 12 from the General Fund to the Guam Power Authority for Fiscal Year 1992 payments of the 13 Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollar (\$5,440) salary increase granted pursuant to P. L. 14 20-166, as amended. All funds appropriated pursuant to this Subsection are to be utilized only 15 for positions within the Guam Power Authority.

16 (c) Guam Legislature. Two Million Seven Hundred Ninety Three Thousand 17 Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$2,793,450) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam 18 Legislature for Fiscal Year 1992 payment of the Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollar 19 (\$5,440) salary increase. All funds appropriated pursuant to this Subsection are to be utilized 20only for positions within the Guam Legislature.

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(b) Individuals who are presently rendering services on contract to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and whose qualifications match those required in the proposed position descriptions contained in the July 3, 1991 memorandum from the Department's Director to the Director of Administration requesting a Classification Study/Creation of New Positions, shall be placed in the positions created in Subsection (a) of this Section as soon as their individual contracts expire, or sooner by mutual agreement of the parties. The individuals to be converted from contract to classified employee status shall not be required to apply for the positions or be selected from a list of applicants.

(c) The funds previously utilized for hiring persons on contract in the Department shall be utilized to fund the positions created in this Section upon the conversion of any individual affected by this Section from contractual hire to classified employee.

17 Section 13. Fifteen-Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) are appropriated from the General 18 Fund to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse to produce a public 19 information broadcast video on drug and alcohol treatment and recovery programs available 20 in Guam.

Section 14. Eighteen Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$18,100) are appropriated from
the General Fund to the Mayors' Council of Guam for prior year obligations for overtime
work during and after Tropical Storm Forrest (October 23-24, 1988), Typhoon Jack (December
25-28, 1989) and Typhoon Koryn (January 14-15, 1990).

Section 15. Three Hundred Eighty Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-six Dollars
(\$380,376) are appropriated from the Guam Contractors License Board Fund to the Guam
Contractors License Board for its Fiscal Year 1992 Operations.

Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council for maintenance and operations of the Agana Heights Gymnasium consisting of Ninety Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Five Dollars (\$90,235) for employees, Eight Thousand Two Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$8,220) for utilities, power and water; and Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) for supplies, materials and equipment.

Section 23. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
 to the Department of Law to continue the Federal Maritime Litigation.

Section 24. One Hundred One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$101,400) are
appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Law, White Collar Crime Unit, for
office equipment, lease of vehicles, investigation equipment, training, legal research and
materials, and for other operational expenses.

Section 25. Seven Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-five
 Dollars (\$763,725) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Bureau of Planning for the
 Islandwide Lot Line Mapping and Relational Data Base Project. This appropriation shall be
 available until expended.

2 2 Section 26. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund 2 2 to the Territorial Planning Council for its Fiscal Year 1992 operations.

Section 27. One Million Seven Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-five Dollars (\$1,764,565) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land Management to fund the Geographic Information System and Land Information System (GIS/LIS) Division within the Department of Land Management for the purpose of recording and updating survey data and land documents into a computerized mapping and land graphic data management system. Notwithstanding the limitations in any provision of law, rule, or

regulation concerning limited term personnel appointments, the Department of Land Management is authorized thirteen (13) additional positions to staff the GIS/LIS Section and is authorized to keep these positions filled, and to use until expended, the funds appropriated 3 in this Section, for this purpose only. 4

Section 30. One Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-five Dollars 15 (\$120,535) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam State Council on Vocational 16 Education to supplement federal funds and other operational requirements for Fiscal Year 17 18 1992.

Section 31. Twenty Four Million One Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Two Hundred 19 Sixty Dollars (\$24,185,260) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of 20 21 Guam Retirement Fund to continue the provisions of:

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5 Section 32. Nine Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$960,000) are appropriated from 6 the General Fund to fund our quest for Commonwealth, and of this sum, Nine Hundred Fifty 7 Thousand Dollars (\$950,000) are allocated to the Commission on Self-Determination for its 8 Fiscal Year 1992 operations and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are allocated to the Office of 9 Guam's Delegate to Congress for purposes related to Guam and the Commonwealth effort. 10 The Office of Guam's Delegate to Congress shall provide an itemization of expected 11 expenditures to the Governor and the Legislature before expenditures are made. The Office of 12 Guam's Delegate to Congress shall make a report of the expenditures of the funds in this 13 appropriation to the Governor and the Legislature.

The Bureau of Budget and Management Research and Department of Education shall report on the status of the above items of appropriation to the Legislature every six (6) months, until completed.

Section 37. Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the architectural and engineering design and for the construction of a new Detention Facility at the Department of Corrections.

Section 38. Nine Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$9,200,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purposes of acquiring real property for the Ordot Landfill and for constructing a cover system at the Ordot Landfill.

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Section 39. One Million Three Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$1,340,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the architectural and engineering design and for construction of a new building and parking lot for the Motor Vehicle Division of the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

Section 40. Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) are appropriated from the 9 General Fund to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the architectural and 10 11 engineering design of the Skilled Nursing Facility.

Section 41. Two Million Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,200,000) are 12 13 appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the renovation 14 of the redesigned Northern District Sewage Treatment Plant, consisting of renovation and replacement of primary clarifiers, comminutor, pre-aeration tanks, centrifuge control panel, 15 16 clarifier pump building, chlorination room, chlorine contact tanks and new chlorination line.

Section 42. One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$170,000) are appropriated from 17 18 the General Fund to the Commission on Persons with Disabilities for personnel services and 19 operations of the Commission for Fiscal Year 1992. -0-970a

An appropriation for a gymnasium has already been made in previous law for the villages of Tamuning, Agana Heights, and Chalan Pago-Ordot. The Department of Public Works shall use the same design for all the gymnasiums to be built in the various villages of Guam as was used for the gymnasium in the village of Agana Heights.

Section 44. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund

Legislative Findings. Since the end of World War II and Section 50. (a) 3 continuing until this day, various individuals on Guam have been inadvertently exposed to 4 the harmful effects of PCB's, dibenzofurans, dioxins and chlorobenzenes ("hazardous 5 6 materials"). Because so much is still unknown about the side effects of these hazardous materials, and the seemingly increasing disastrous effects of the exposure, we feel that 7 additional protective steps must be taken to assist all of those government of Guam employees, United States employees, former employees of the government of Guam and the United States, and private citizens who may have been affected. 10

11 The Legislature having stated its findings, hereby (b) Purpose. declares that the purpose of this Section is to further and supplement the desires of those 12 **1**3 individuals contaminated with hazardous materials by declaring that it is in the public 14 interest:

> to seek from the responsible parties, the creation of an (1) adequate program of remedies to the individuals and their families contaminated with hazardous materials;

> to investigate and pursue, on behalf of these individuals, the (2) steps and procedures necessary to secure adequate and just compensation; and

for the individuals to be assisted in proceeding with the legal (3) work, with consultant, and with medical support services necessary to allow such a settlement to take place.

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Definitions. As used in this Section: (c)

"Individual" means any government of Guam employee, (1) United States employee, former employee of either the government of Guam or the United States, or private citizen.

"Hazardous material" means PCB's, dibenzofurans, dioxins (2)and chlorobenzenes.

"Fund" means the Hazardous Exposure Fund created by (3) Subsection (d) of this Section.

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(4) "Department" means the Department of Administration.

(d) Hazardous Exposure Fund. There is hereby created the "Hazardous Exposure Fund", whose purpose is to give financial assistance to all those individuals who may have been affected by hazardous material in obtaining the necessary legal, consultant, and medical support services needed to redress the injustice of this exposure. The fund shall be utilized to give financial assistance to the individuals and their families to contract with attorneys and any necessary non-attorney consultant and medical support staff, to further their aims in securing compensation and other remedies from the responsible parties. 10

ZERO 11 Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000) are Appropriation. (e) appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for the purpose of establishing a fund 12 13 to be known as the "Hazardous Exposure Fund". These appropriations shall be used by the 14 Department to identify those individuals who have been exposed to the effects of hazardous material; to cover the costs of complete physical examinations for individuals and their 15 16 families needing such care, whether it is provided on-island or off-island. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) of this appropriation shall be used to cover the costs of hiring one (1) 17 18 secretary and one (1) administrative officer, who shall administer the program under the 19 direction of the Director of Administration.

20 The Director of the Department shall Administering Authority. (f) 21 be the administering authority of the Hazardous Exposure Fund and shall administer the 22 Fund and give the authorized financial assistance. The Department shall promulgate rules 23 and regulations necessary for the operation of the fund in accordance with this Section. In the event that individuals or their families recover monetary damages, then the financial 24 25 assistance given them shall be treated as loans and be duly repaid, but in no event shall the 26 interest on the loans exceed three percent (3%) per annum.

All individuals who suspect that they have been exposed to 27 (g) 28 hazardous material shall be strongly urged to report to the Department.

(h) Director of Department shall make twice yearly reports to the 1 Committee on Ways and Means, which reports shall reflect all of the findings and 2 conclusions of the Department in relation to this program, the statistical results of the medical 3 examinations, the number of individuals affected, and the anticipated costs of the program for 4 5 the next twelve (12) months. The first report shall be due one hundred and twenty days (120) 6 after enactment of this Section. These reports shall also be made available to the Governor, Speaker of the Guam Legislature, the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social 7 8 Services, and any other interested persons.

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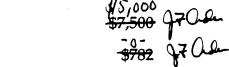

Section 57. Thirty Eight Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$38,600) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture to supplement the sums in P. L. 21-03 which are reappropriated pursuant to this act, to be allocated as follows:

(a) \$12,750 for travel of the Agricultural Board of Commissioners;

(b) \$6,500 for equipment of the Agricultural Board of Commissioners;

The Secretary-General of EROPA has invited the students and the 13 conference theme will be "Administrative Reforms Toward Promoting Productivity in 14 Bureaucratic Performance".

15 Section 65. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are appropriated from the
16 General Fund to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for the purpose of funding off17 island community-integrated rehabilitation programs for clients with neurovascular insult
18 (e.g. cerebral vascular accident or intracranial hemorrhage).

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5 Section 70 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to 6 the Legislature Operations Fund for the operation of the Guam Youth Congress (the "Congress"). All funds in the appropriation to the Congress made in Section 6 of Public Law 8 20-218 not expended at the end of the term of such Congress are hereby carried over to the operations of the Congress for Fiscal Year 1992.

10 The "Distant Cousins Cultural Program" is a travel/cultural Section 71. (a) 11 program that would bring together the people of two distantly related countries for the purpose of sharing their cultures, music, language, art and other aspects of their daily lives 12 13 and traditions. The program has been developed to enable the Guam Manamko to meet with 14 the Manamko of Bali and share and compare their respective cultures and traditions. The program will involve approximately thirty (30) of our Manamko with specific skills to 15 16 represent Guam in this cultrual program of historical significance.

17 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the (b) 18 Guam Council of the Arts and Humanities Agency (CAHA) to help defray cost of the 19 Manamkos to attend the "Distant Cousins Cultural Program" to be held in Bali, Indonesia 20 between September and October 1991. CAHA in coordination with the Servicio Para I 21 Manamko (SPIMA) will select approximately two (2) Manamkos from each senior citizens' 22 center or from other villages who would have the skills necessary to best represent Guam's 23 culture. The recipient of this appropriation shall make a report of the expenditures of the 24 funds in this appropriation to the Governor and the Legislature, following standard 25 government accounting procedures, within thirty (30) days after the event funded by this 26 Section.

27 The Guam Legislature has been informed by the members of the **Section 72.** (a) 28 Guam Boxing and Wrestling Commission that the Guam Boxing Commission has been

suspended from the Oriental Pacific Boxing Federation for the failure of a local promoter to pay debts owed to boxers and officials in a OPBF Jr. Lightweight Championship title bout held on August 23, 1988. It is the opinion of the Guam Boxing and Wrestling Commission that it would be difficult for the Government of Guam to prosecute the promoter to pay the debts still owed to the boxers and officials for the August 23, 1988 title bout.

6 The suspension of Guam from the OPBF could only be lifted when the amount owed is 7 fully paid. There have been no significant boxing activities on Guam after the suspension of 8 the GBWC from the membership of the OPBF. It is noted that precedences have been 9 established by the Legislature by appropriating funds to pay debts for expenses incurred by the Smokin Wheels Event sponsored by the Guam Visitors Bureau and the Fifth Wheel, 10 Incorporated acting as agents for the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities.

Five Cents (\$2,377.25) are appropriated from the General Fund to Anthony M. Bautista (Post Office Box 1504, Agana, Guam 96910) for reimbursement owed to him by the Government of Guam for the costs incurred by him for the installation of a water-line at his Mangilao residence.
