
CERTIFICATION TO THE GOVERNOR OF PASSAGE OF ITEM-VETOED
SECTIONS OF AN ACT

This is to certify that subparagraph (c) of Section 22 and Sections 46, 47, 55, 56, 59, 78, 89 and 100, of Chapter III, Miscellaneous Appropriations, of Substitute Bill No. 487 (COR), "AN ACT TO REENACT THE APPROPRIATIONS PROVIDED TO THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH IN FY 1991 TO MAKE THE SAME LEVEL OF APPROPRIATIONS AVAILABLE IN FY 1992, TO PROVIDE CERTAIN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS AS SPECIFIED, AND TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATIONS TO THE GUAM VISITORS BUREAU, THE GUAM MASS TRANSIT AUTHORITY, AND THE GUAM LEGISLATURE," returned to the Legislature as having been item vetoed or modified by the Governor were, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration, the Legislature did, on the 5th day of November, 1991, agree to pass said subparagraph (c) and Sections 46, 55, 59, 89 and 100 notwithstanding the objection of the Governor by a vote of two-thirds or more of all the members thereof, to wit:





2 MISCELLANEOUS APPROPRIATIONS

3 Section 1. Appropriation for \$5,440 salary increase. (a) Executive Branch. Forty
4 Million Dollars (\$40,000,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
5 Administration for Fiscal Year 1992 payments of the Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty
6 Dollar (\$5,440) salary increase granted pursuant to P. L. 20-166, as amended. All funds
7 appropriated pursuant to this Subsection are to be utilized only for positions within the
8 Executive Branch of the government of Guam which are not within any autonomous agency.
9 The Department of Administration may include the correct amount as required for each
10 position funded by this Section.

11 (b) Guam Power Authority. ~~Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000)~~ ^{ZERO Dollars - 0 - JFO} are appropriated
12 from the General Fund to the Guam Power Authority for Fiscal Year 1992 payments of the
13 Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollar (\$5,440) salary increase granted pursuant to P. L.
14 20-166, as amended. All funds appropriated pursuant to this Subsection are to be utilized only
15 for positions within the Guam Power Authority.

16 (c) Guam Legislature. Two Million Seven Hundred Ninety Three Thousand
17 Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$2,793,450) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam
18 Legislature for Fiscal Year 1992 payment of the Five Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollar
19 (\$5,440) salary increase. All funds appropriated pursuant to this Subsection are to be utilized
20 only for positions within the Guam Legislature.

21 Section 2. Forty-Four Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-One Dollars (\$44,961) are
22 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Mental Health and Substance
23 Abuse for retroactive payment to Mr. Aniceto S. Dignadice who received incorrect salary for
24 his position title and pay range from July, 1980 until resignation on September 26, 1988.

25 Section 3. ~~Thirty-five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000)~~ ^{ZERO - 0 - JFO} ~~THIRTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS~~ ^(1135,000) are appropriated from the General ~~Fund~~
26 Fund to Fleet Reserve Association Branch 73 to prepare for the celebration and
27 commemoration of the World War II events of December 7, 1941 that the Association will
28 participate in on Guam on December 7, 1991 (mainland date). This appropriation is to be used

1 to plan and fund the event, travel to the mainland to seek out World War II Veterans and
2 related activities. The recipient of this appropriation shall make a report of the expenditures
3 of the funds in this appropriation to the Governor and the Legislature, following standard
4 government accounting procedures, within thirty (30) days after the event funded by this
5 Section.

6 **Section 4.** (a) Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) previously appropriated from
7 the General Fund to the Chamorro Language Commission in Item 5 of Part IV of Chapter II of
8 P.L. 21-03, is reappropriated from the General Fund to the Chamorro Language Commission
9 as part of the Fiscal Year 1992 budget for office relocation expenses, rental, and office furniture.

10 (b) Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
11 to the Chamorro Language Commission to supplement the appropriation made in Subsection
12 (a) of this Section for office relocation expenses, rental, and office furniture.

13 **Section 5.** One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated from the
14 General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the construction and installation of
15 traffic control lights for a pedestrian crossing at the vicinity of the public school bus shelter
16 which is across the street from house no. 531, the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Vicente U. Blas,
17 on Route 4, Chalan Pago. This location is next to Nuestra Senora de la Paz y Bien Viaje
18 Church.

19 **Section 6.** Four Hundred Twenty Three Thousand Dollars (\$423,000) are
20 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and Taxation to fund the
21 Tax Collection Task Force for the purpose of collecting outstanding delinquent taxes.

22 **Section 7.** Seventy-Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-One Dollars (\$78,251) are
23 appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Educational Telecommunications
24 Corporation (KGTF) for PBS National Programming Assessment/Public Broadcasting Service
25 National Program Service.

26 **Section 8.** Item A3, Part XXVIII, Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse,
27 Chapter II, P.L. 20-03, is repealed and reenacted to read:

(b) Individuals who are presently rendering services on contract to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and whose qualifications match those required in the proposed position descriptions contained in the July 3, 1991 memorandum from the Department's Director to the Director of Administration requesting a Classification Study/Creation of New Positions, shall be placed in the positions created in Subsection (a) of this Section as soon as their individual contracts expire, or sooner by mutual agreement of the parties. The individuals to be converted from contract to classified employee status shall not be required to apply for the positions or be selected from a list of applicants.

(c) The funds previously utilized for hiring persons on contract in the Department shall be utilized to fund the positions created in this Section upon the conversion of any individual affected by this Section from contractual hire to classified employee.

16 pending departmental re-organization for inclusion in later Appropriations Acts."

17 Section 13. ²⁵⁷⁰ ~~Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000)~~ ^{-0- JPO} are appropriated from the General
18 Fund to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse to produce a public
19 information broadcast video on drug and alcohol treatment and recovery programs available
20 in Guam.

21 Section 14. Eighteen Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$18,100) are appropriated from
22 the General Fund to the Mayors' Council of Guam for prior year obligations for overtime
23 work during and after Tropical Storm Forrest (October 23-24, 1988), Typhoon Jack (December
24 25-28, 1989) and Typhoon Koryn (January 14-15, 1990).

25 Section 15. Three Hundred Eighty Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-six Dollars
26 (\$380,376) are appropriated from the Guam Contractors License Board Fund to the Guam
27 Contractors License Board for its Fiscal Year 1992 Operations.

1 **Section 16.** Seventy-six Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-one Dollars (\$76,981) are
2 appropriated from the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Fund to the
3 Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Board for its Fiscal Year 1992
4 operations.

5 **Section 17.** Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000) are appropriated from
6 the General Fund to the Government Claims Fund for the purpose of paying eligible and
7 approved claims.

8 **Section 18.** One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$170,000) are appropriated from
9 the General Fund to the Printing Revolving Fund for the purposes set out in Section 1607 of
10 Title 1, Guam Code Annotated.

11 **Section 19.** One Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,700,000) are
12 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Revenue and Taxation for the
13 Triennial Reevaluation Study of Real Property.

14 **Section 20.** Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) are appropriated from the General
15 Fund to the Department of Education as an advance appropriation from the Fiscal Year 1993
16 revenues of the General Fund to procure textbooks, workbooks and library books from local
17 and off-island vendors for the School Year 1992-1993.

18 **Section 21.** Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000) are appropriated from the
19 General Fund to the Workers Compensation Fund for the purposes set out in Section 37042 of
20 Title XXXIII of the Government Code to pay workers compensation to employees of the
21 government of Guam.

22 **Section 22.** Two Million One Hundred Twenty Three Thousand Seven Hundred-
23 Fifty-Nine Dollars (\$2,123,759) are appropriated from the General Fund to be utilized for
24 maintenance workers, equipment, supplies, and utilities including power and water, to be
25 allocated as follows:

26 (a) One Million Seven Hundred Sixty Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Four Dollars
27 (\$1,769,704) to the Community Development Fund for the payment of salary and benefits of
28 four (4) maintenance workers authorized for each municipalities; and

1 (b) Two Hundred Thirty-five Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$235,600) to the
2 Community Development Fund for the purchase of equipment and supplies necessary to
3 perform minor repairs and maintenance pursuant to Section 15009.5 of the Government
4 Code; and

5 (c) One Hundred Eighteen Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Five Dollars (\$118,455) to the
6 Agana Heights Municipal Planning Council for maintenance and operations of the Agana
7 Heights Gymnasium consisting of Ninety Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-Five Dollars
8 (\$90,235) for employees, Eight Thousand Two Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$8,220) for utilities,
9 power and water; and Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) for supplies, materials and
10 equipment.

11 **Section 23.** One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
12 to the Department of Law to continue the Federal Maritime Litigation.

13 **Section 24.** One Hundred One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$101,400) are
14 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Law, White Collar Crime Unit, for
15 office equipment, lease of vehicles, investigation equipment, training, legal research and
16 materials, and for other operational expenses.

17 **Section 25.** Seven Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-five
18 Dollars (\$763,725) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Bureau of Planning for the
19 Islandwide Lot Line Mapping and Relational Data Base Project. This appropriation shall be
20 available until expended.

21 **Section 26.** Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
22 to the Territorial Planning Council for its Fiscal Year 1992 operations.

23 **Section 27.** One Million Seven Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-
24 five Dollars (\$1,764,565) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Land
25 Management to fund the Geographic Information System and Land Information System
26 (GIS/LIS) Division within the Department of Land Management for the purpose of recording
27 and updating survey data and land documents into a computerized mapping and land graphic
28 data management system. Notwithstanding the limitations in any provision of law, rule, or

1 regulation concerning limited term personnel appointments, the Department of Land
2 Management is authorized thirteen (13) additional positions to staff the GIS/LIS Section and
3 is authorized to keep these positions filled, and to use until expended, the funds appropriated
4 in this Section, for this purpose only.

5 **Section 28.** One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) are appropriated from
6 the General Fund to the Department of Land Management to pay prior year obligations to be
7 expended as follows:

8 (a) Twenty-one Thousand One Hundred Eighty-Eight Dollars (\$21,188) for
9 retroactive pay owed to former employees for the period from 9/30/88 to 9/30/90.

10 (b) Ninety-eight Thousand Eight Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$98,812) for FY90
11 computer hardware/software for the Geographic Information System.

12 **Section 29.** Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
13 to the Guam Police Department to pay prior year obligation for Inmate/Patient billings from
14 Fiscal Year 1988 to Fiscal Year 1990.

15 **Section 30.** One Hundred Twenty Thousand Five Hundred Thirty-five Dollars
16 (\$120,535) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam State Council on Vocational
17 Education to supplement federal funds and other operational requirements for Fiscal Year
18 1992.

19 **Section 31.** Twenty Four Million One Hundred Eighty Five Thousand Two Hundred
20 Sixty Dollars (\$24,185,260) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of
21 Guam Retirement Fund to continue the provisions of:

- 22 (i) the One Thousand Two Hundred Dollar (\$1,200) annuity benefits;
- 23 (ii) the One Thousand Five Hundred Dollar (\$1,500) supplemental annuity
24 benefits;
- 25 (iii) the Seven Hundred Dollar (\$700) supplemental annuity benefits;
- 26 (iv) the Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollar (\$838) annuity benefits;
- 27 (v) Governor and Lieutenant Governor pensions;
- 28 (vi) the Retiree group health, dental, life insurance premiums;

1 (vii) the Retiree life insurance subsidy;

2 (viii) the Cost of Living Adjustment consisting of One Thousand Eight Hundred
3 Dollars (\$1,800)

4 all for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1992.

5 **Section 32.** Nine Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$960,000) are appropriated from
6 the General Fund to fund our quest for Commonwealth, and of this sum, Nine Hundred Fifty
7 Thousand Dollars (\$950,000) are allocated to the Commission on Self-Determination for its
8 Fiscal Year 1992 operations and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are allocated to the Office of
9 Guam's Delegate to Congress for purposes related to Guam and the Commonwealth effort.
10 The Office of Guam's Delegate to Congress shall provide an itemization of expected
11 expenditures to the Governor and the Legislature before expenditures are made. The Office of
12 Guam's Delegate to Congress shall make a report of the expenditures of the funds in this
13 appropriation to the Governor and the Legislature.

14 **Section 33.** Two Hundred Twenty-two Thousand Four Hundred Forty Dollars
15 (\$222,440) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Administration for
16 the tuition, fees and authorized expenses of the participants in the Dr. Pedro Sanchez
17 Scholarship program at the University of Guam for Fiscal Year 1992.

18 **Section 34.** One Million Forty-nine Thousand Four Hundred Ninety Dollars
19 (\$1,049,490) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Administration for
20 the Group Term Life Insurance program pursuant to Section 9 of Public Law 20-224, which
21 provides for the non-contributory premium on a Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000) basic life
22 insurance amount for all eligible employees of the government of Guam.

23 **Section 35.** There is hereby appropriated such sums as are necessary from the
24 Summer School Fund established pursuant to Section 6118 of Title 17 GCA to fund the
25 operation of the 1992 Summer School Program.

26 **Section 36.** Nineteen Million Two Hundred Ninety-Seven Thousand Dollars
27 (\$19,297,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Education to be

1 allocated as follows for the construction and renovation of the following schools and facilities,
2 which may include Headstart classrooms:

- 3 1) **Agana Heights Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional
4 classrooms.
- 5 2) **Agat Elementary School** - \$500,000 to construct five (5) additional classrooms.
- 6 3) **Carbullido Elementary School** - \$300,000 to construct three (3) additional
7 classrooms.
- 8 4) **Finegayan Elementary School** - \$600,000 to construct six (6) additional classrooms.
- 9 5) **F. Q. Sanchez Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct temporary classrooms.
- 10 6) **Harmon Loop Elementary School** - \$800,000 to construct eight (8) additional
11 classrooms.
- 12 7) **Inarajan Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional classrooms.
- 13 8) **L. B. Johnson Elementary School** - \$200,000 to construct two (2) additional
14 classrooms.
- 15 9) **M. A. Ulloa Elementary School** - \$10,000 to construct concrete roof for outdoor
16 stage and \$300,000 to construct three (3) additional classrooms.
- 17 10) **Merizo Elementary School** - \$200,000 to construct two (2) additional classrooms.
- 18 11) **M. U. Lujan Elementary School** - \$500,000 to construct five (5) additional
19 classrooms.
- 20 12) **Ordot/Chalan Pago Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional
21 classrooms.
- 22 13) **P. C. Lujan Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional
23 classrooms.
- 24 14) **Price Elementary School** - \$600,000 to construct six (6) additional classrooms.
- 25 15) **Talofofu Elementary School** - \$500,000 to construct five (5) additional classrooms.
- 26 16) **Tamuning Elementary School** - \$200,000 to construct two (2) additional
27 classrooms.
- 28 17) **Upi Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional classrooms.

- 1 18) **Wettengel Elementary School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional
2 classrooms.
- 3 19) **Yigo Elementary School** - \$600,000 to construct six (6) additional classrooms and
4 \$22,500 to purchase, install, and construct fifteen (15) sinks/cabinets for
5 classrooms.
- 6 20) **Agueda Johnston Middle School** - \$6,000 to renovate the nurse's office, \$50,000 to
7 renovate the student restrooms, \$14,000 to renovate the locker rooms, \$15,000 to
8 repair the bus parking lot, and \$200,000 to construct two (2) additional
9 classrooms.
- 10 21) **Dededo Middle School** - \$5,000 to renovate the nurse's office, \$50,000 to renovate
11 the restroom for nurse's office/Special Education, \$100,000 to renovate the girls
12 and boys locker and shower rooms, \$90,000 to construct two (2) additional
13 restrooms, and \$500,000 to construct five (5) additional classrooms.
- 14 22) **F. B. Leon Guerrero Middle School** - \$400,000 to construct four (4) additional
15 classrooms and \$1,700,000 to construct a gymnasium.
- 16 23) **Inarajan Middle School** - \$8,500 to fence the basketball court, \$38,000 to renovate
17 the nurse's office/restroom, \$4,500 to purchase and install two (2) soccer goals,
18 \$25,000 to construct one (1) softball backstop, and \$200,000 to construct two (2)
19 additional classrooms.
- 20 24) **Piti Middle School** - \$7,000 to expand the parking lot, \$7,000 to construct the
21 extension of the Library-AV room, \$10,000 to fence around the school, and
22 \$500,000 to construct five (5) additional classrooms.
- 23 25) **L. P. Untalan Middle School** - \$700,000 to construct seven (7) additional
24 classrooms.
- 25 26) **George Washington High School** - \$4,000 to replace the basketball superstructure
26 including the winch, \$4,000 to refurbish the gymnasium floor, \$1,500 to resurface
27 the bus entrance, \$6,000 to construct covered walkway from M-Wing to
28 temporary classrooms, \$10,000 to construct covered walkway from B-Wing to E-

1 Wing, \$8,000 to construct and replace north wall of the library with concrete,
2 \$15,000 to construct and replace the east wall of the library with concrete, \$30,000
3 to construct a restroom for the athletic field, \$42,000 to purchase, install and
4 construct a sink and counter for the science classroom, \$96,000 to construct office
5 areas for Career Center, STOP program, and counselors, \$150,000 to construct two
6 (2) classrooms with bathroom facilities, \$800,000 to renovate the track and
7 football field, and \$1,300,000 to construct thirteen (13) additional classrooms.

8 27) **Inarajan High School** - \$50,000 to renovate and resurface the outdoor volleyball
9 courts and \$88,000 to renovate and repair eight (8) restrooms.

10 28) **John F. Kennedy High School** - \$45,000 to renovate and expand the nurse's office,
11 \$50,000 to renovate and relocate the outdoor volleyball and basketball courts,
12 \$800,000 to renovate the track and football field, \$75,000 to construct baseball field,
13 \$300,000 to renovate ten (10) classrooms in the existing building \$30,000 to
14 construct two (2) restrooms in the new building, \$150,000 to construct and install
15 one (1) elevator, and \$1,000,000 to construct ten (10) additional classrooms.

16 29) **Oceanview High School** - \$300,000 to construct three (3) additional classrooms.

17 30) **Simon Sanchez High School** - \$1,000,000 to construct ten (10) additional
18 classrooms.

19 31) **Facilities and Maintenance Division** - \$180,000 for structural repairs and
20 replacement

21 The Bureau of Budget and Management Research and Department of Education shall report

4 continuing until this day, various individuals on Guam have been inadvertently exposed to

6 materials"). Because so much is still unknown about the side effects of these hazardous
7 materials, and the seemingly increasing disastrous effects of the exposure, we feel that
8 additional protective steps must be taken to assist all of those government of Guam
9 employees, United States employees, former employees of the government of Guam and the
10 United States, and private citizens who may have been affected.

11 (b) Purpose. The Legislature having stated its findings, hereby
12 declares that the purpose of this Section is to further and supplement the desires of those
13 individuals contaminated with hazardous materials by declaring that it is in the public

15 (1) to seek from the responsible parties, the creation of an
16 adequate program of remedies to the individuals and their families
17 contaminated with hazardous materials;

18 (2) to investigate and pursue, on behalf of these individuals, the
19 steps and procedures necessary to secure adequate and just compensation; and

20 (3) for the individuals to be assisted in proceeding with the legal
21 work, with consultant, and with medical support services necessary to allow
22 such a settlement to take place.

23 (c) Definitions. As used in this Section:

24 (1) "Individual" means any government of Guam employee,

26 the United States, or private citizen.

27 (2) "Hazardous material" means PCB's, dibenzofurans, dioxins
28 and chlorobenzenes.

1 (3) "Fund" means the Hazardous Exposure Fund created by
2 Subsection (d) of this Section.

3 (4) "Department" means the Department of Administration.

4 (d) Hazardous Exposure Fund. There is hereby created the "Hazardous
5 Exposure Fund", whose purpose is to give financial assistance to all those individuals who
6 may have been affected by hazardous material in obtaining the necessary legal, consultant,
7 and medical support services needed to redress the injustice of this exposure. The fund shall
8 be utilized to give financial assistance to the individuals and their families to contract with
9 attorneys and any necessary non-attorney consultant and medical support staff, to further
10 their aims in securing compensation and other remedies from the responsible parties.

11 (e) Appropriation. ²⁵⁷²⁰ ~~Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$650,000)~~ ^{-0- J70a} are
12 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department for the purpose of establishing a fund
13 to be known as the "Hazardous Exposure Fund". These appropriations shall be used by the
14 Department to identify those individuals who have been exposed to the effects of hazardous
15 material; to cover the costs of complete physical examinations for individuals and their
16 families needing such care, whether it is provided on-island or off-island. ²⁵⁷²⁰ ~~Fifty Thousand~~
17 ~~Dollars (\$50,000)~~ ^{-0- J70a} of this appropriation shall be used to cover the costs of hiring one (1)
18 secretary and one (1) administrative officer, who shall administer the program under the

20 (f) Administering Authority. The Director of the Department shall
21 be the administering authority of the Hazardous Exposure Fund and shall administer the
22 Fund and give the authorized financial assistance. The Department shall promulgate rules
23 and regulations necessary for the operation of the fund in accordance with this Section. In the
24 event that individuals or their families recover monetary damages, then the financial
25 assistance given them shall be treated as loans and be duly repaid, but in no event shall the
26 interest on the loans exceed three percent (3%) per annum.

27 (g) All individuals who suspect that they have been exposed to
28 hazardous material shall be strongly urged to report to the Department.

1 (h) Director of Department shall make twice yearly reports to the
 2 Committee on Ways and Means, which reports shall reflect all of the findings and
 3 conclusions of the Department in relation to this program, the statistical results of the medical
 4 examinations, the number of individuals affected, and the anticipated costs of the program for
 5 the next twelve (12) months. The first report shall be due one hundred and twenty days (120)
 6 after enactment of this Section. These reports shall also be made available to the Governor,
 7 Speaker of the Guam Legislature, the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social
 8 Services, and any other interested persons.

11 from the General Fund to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency to conduct the first
12 phase of a study of the Northern Water Lens. First phase will include modeling, extensive
13 review of existing data, limited field work and exploratory drilling.

14 **Section 78.** A Police Precinct is hereby established in the village of Inarajan to make the
15 presence of police officers more evident and accessible to the residents in Southeastern Guam.
16 The Inarajan Municipal Planning Council, the Guam Police Department and the Department
17 of Public Works shall coordinate the establishment of the Inarajan Police Precinct. Two
18 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
19 Guam Police Department for the implementation of this Section.

20 **Section 79.** (a) Legislative Purpose. Inspections of Municipal Centers conducted in
21 1990 by the Division of Occupational Safety and Health, Department of Labor, Guam Fire
22 Department, Guam Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Public Works
23 noted deficiencies on the facilities affecting the health and safety of users of these centers.
24 These centers are used by the Senior Citizens and perilously expose them to serious physical
25 harm.

26 (b) Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) are appropriated from the General
27 Fund to the Department of Public Works for assessment work, repair and renovation of all
28 Municipal Centers used by the Senior Citizens. The Department of Public Works shall

1 consult and coordinate with the Municipal Planning Council regarding the implementation
2 of this Section. The Director of Public Works shall file a written report of the assessment of
3 the facilities to the Legislature within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Section.
4 Nothing in this Section shall prevent the Department of Public Works from contracting
5 projects under this Section to private contractors.

6 **Section 80.** Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$420,000) are appropriated from
7 the General Fund to the Legislature Operations Fund for use by the Committee on Ways &
8 Means of the Legislature to accomplish the purposes set out in Section 11101 of Title 2 of the
9 Guam Code Annotated and other related fiscal monitoring activities.

10 **Section 81.** Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) are appropriated from
11 the General Fund to the Committee on Ways & Means of the Twenty-First Guam Legislature
12 for the purpose set out in Section 14, Chapter III of P.L. 20-41.

13 **Section 82.** ^{ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) for} ~~Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000)~~ are appropriated from the
14 General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs to purchase equipment (desk, computer,
15 typewriters, etc.), supplies and other emergency needs for the Juvenile Hall of the
16 Department.

17 **Section 83.** Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000) are appropriated from the General Fund
18 to the Department of Parks and Recreation for the construction of a large lighted flagpole and
19 mini-park that will service both the Guerrero and Paseo Stadiums.

20 **Section 84.** One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) are appropriated from the
21 General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the installation of all-weather synthetic
22 surfacing for the Paseo Park Jogging Path.

23 **Section 85.** Section 16 of Public Law 21-40 is amended to read:

24 "Section 16. One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000) are
25 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Mental Health and
26 Substance Abuse (the "Department") to fund the specialization compensation
27 earned by the Department's nursing personnel for the period from October 1,

1 1989 to September 30, 1991, and as provided for in Public Laws 20-64, Section 3,
2 and 21-17, Section 10."

3 **Section 86.** Thirteen Thousand Four Hundred Ten Dollars (\$13,410) are appropriated

AN ACT TO REENACT THE APPROPRIATIONS PROVIDED TO THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH IN FY 1991 TO MAKE THE SAME LEVEL OF APPROPRIATIONS AVAILABLE IN FY 1992.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Estimated Revenues. The estimated revenues section enacted in Section 1 of P. L. 21-3 representing the revenue forecast for fiscal Year 1991 is hereby adopted by the Legislature as the revenue forecast for Fiscal Year 1992.

Section 2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the appropriations made in Section 4 of this Act:

(a) "Capital Outlay" includes:

(1) equipment such as loader trucks, tractors, trailers, automobiles or other vehicles; machinery; reference books; filing cabinets, typewriters, adding and calculating machines, other business machines, office equipment; and tools, implements and instruments which may be used continuously without material change in physical condition and must have a useful life of one (1) year or longer and cost not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) but not more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000);

(2) repair, remodeling or alteration of a building or replacement thereof and the replacement and renewal of plumbing, wiring and air conditioning systems costing more than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000). Capital Outlay does not include normal maintenance expenditures;

(3) construction of an entirely new building, including the materials and labor either supplied by an agency of the Government or supplied by contract; and

(4) non-structural improvements to buildings, the grading, leveling drainage and landscaping of land or the construction of roadways, fences, ditches, or sanitary or storm sewers.

(b) "Contingency" means expenditure for unbudgeted items.

(c) "Contractual Services" include:

(1) services rendered or performed by business, other government agencies or individuals other than expenses for personnel services;

(2) current services or charges for rental of personal property, insurance premiums (not employee benefits), dues, paid subscriptions, and other fixed charges; and

(3) telex and other forms of communication except telephone and facsimile.

(d) "Equipment" means items having a purchase price of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) or less.

(e) "Expenditures" means all amounts of money, other than refunds authorized by law, paid out or encumbered for payment by a territorial agency other than for investment securities or as agent or trustee for other governmental entities or private persons.

(f) "FTE" means the equivalent of one (1) permanent position continuously filled for two thousand eighty (2,080) hours per year for the year commencing October 1, 1991, and the year commencing October 1, 1992.

(g) "Federal Funds" means payments by the United States Government to the territorial government or territorial agencies for specific purposes or in lieu of taxes, including grants, reimbursements, and payments made in accordance with contracts but does not include payments pursuant to Section 30 of the Organic Act of Guam.

(h) "General Fund" means that Fund as defined by Section 6309 of the Government Code.

(i) "Office Space Rental" means payment to an entity for rental of office space and may include the cost of maintenance, power, and other utility expenses.

(j) "Match" means direct cost sharing or in-kind General Fund support required as a condition for acceptance for federal funds.

(k) "Other Fund" means:

(1) unencumbered balances in territorial agency accounts appropriated by the General Appropriation Act of 1992; and

(2) all revenue available to territorial agencies from sources other than the General Fund and federal funds.

(l) "Personnel Services" include:

(1) salaries and wages payable to persons employed by the Government;

(2) the Government's contributions to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund and the employer's contribution under the Federal Insurance Contribution Act; and

(3) the Government's contribution for health, dental and life insurance plans.

(m) "Power" includes all expenses incurred for the use of electricity or natural gas.

(n) "Revenue" means all amounts received by a territorial agency from sources external to that agency, net of refunds and other correcting transactions, other than from issue of debt liquidation of investment or as agent or trustee for other governmental agents, entities, or private persons.

(o) "Supplies and Materials" means materials which by their nature are consumable, which have a useful lifetime of less than one (1) year, and which, after use, undergo an impairment or a material change in physical condition.

(p) "Telephone" includes all charges for telephone service.

(q) "Toll Calls" includes all charges for long distance telephone calls and facsimile.

(r) "Territorial Agency", for purposes of this Act, means any office, department, institution, board, bureau, commission, council, authority, committee of the territorial government and the Guam Visitors Bureau.

(s) "Travel & Transportation" means off-island travel expenses and local mileage reimbursement in accordance with the laws of Guam.

(t) "Water/Sewer" includes all expenses for the purchase of water and all expenses for waste-water treatment.

Section 3. General Provisions. The following General Provisions shall apply to the appropriations made in Section 4 of this Act:

(a) Except as otherwise specifically provided, amounts set out under the column headings "General Fund" and "Other Fund" are appropriated from the source indicated by the column heading. Amounts set out under the column heading "Federal Funds" are appropriated matching funds. Amounts designated as "Totals" are provided for informational purposes and are not appropriations.

(b) For Fiscal Year 1992, appropriations are those amounts set out in Chapter II of this Act, from the General Fund or other funds, as indicated, to territorial agencies named, for the purposes expressed, or so much thereof as may be necessary, within available revenues and unencumbered balances.

(c) The governor or his official designee shall monitor revenue received by territorial agencies from sources other than the General fund and shall order reductions in the operating budget of any territorial agency whose revenue from these sources is not meeting budgeted projection.

(d) The total number of FTE authorized for Fiscal Year 1992 and for fiscal Year 1993 is indicated by a number in parentheses following the line item or subtotal under the column showing the fund source. The total number of FTE shall not be exceeded. All regular and overtime hours of work performed and, except for hours of accrued leave paid upon separation from the Government, hours for which leave is granted and compensation given, shall be applied against the total FTE. No FTE shall be used to employ more than one (1) person at the same time, whether on a full-time, part-time, or limited term basis.

(e) It shall be a petty misdemeanor for any person to knowingly employ in the government of Guam more than one (1) person at a time on a part-time, limited term, or temporary basis so that more than one (1) person receives salary at the same time from funds appropriated for the utilization of one (1) FTE.

(f) The Governor or his official designee shall transmit to the Speaker of the Legislature, no later than the seventh day of each month, a schedule showing actual cash receipts, actual cash disbursements, and encumbrances during the previous month.

(g) Prior to the payment of overtime, a territorial agency shall submit for payroll processing at the end of each pay period, a statement of the amount of overtime due an employee, the purpose for which the employee worked in excess of regular working hours, and an explanation and justification as to the need for the overtime.

(h) Payment for overtime claims shall be prepared only if the claims are properly documented, and shall be paid to the employee in the employee's next pay check.

(i) The Governor or his official designee shall conduct periodic spot audits to determine if any employee claiming overtime compensation was on duty at the time the overtime was earned.

(j) The Director or chief officer of any territorial agency upon whose decision a payment for overtime is authorized shall be personally liable to the government for any payment of overtime made contrary to the provisions of Paragraph (h) of this Section, or for any payment of overtime found to have been made for unauthorized work, or no work, and also shall be liable as provided by law for illegal or unauthorized expenditure of government funds.

(k) In keeping with the doctrine of separation of powers, the Superior Court of Guam shall be as independent as possible from the control of the other co-equal branches of the government of Guam. Such independence shall include provision for a year-to-year budget appropriation measure for the operations of the Superior Court of Guam which is separate and apart from the portions of the Act making general appropriations for the operations of the Executive Branch.

(l) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no reclassification/reassignment of pay ranges of any positions not funded by appropriations of the Legislature may be implemented.

(m) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, it is prohibited to expend General, Other, or Federal Funds for in-service training or other professional development training, excluding seminars, to persons occupying unclassified or temporary positions within the Executive Branch.

Section 4. Appropriations. Except for all items of appropriation within Chapter II of P. L. 21-3 for capital outlay, Chapter II of P. L. 21-3, including items as item-vetoed and reduced by the Governor, is reenacted and each item of appropriation not excepted by this Section is reappropriated and available for expenditure on October 1, 1991 and until September 30, 1992.

Section 5. No transfer authority. Section of 8 of P. L. 21-17 (Governor's transfer authority) is repealed.
