

AN ACT TO IDENTIFY GOVERNMENT LAND IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF DEDEDO FOR SPORTS FACILITIES AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO CONSTRUCT, REPAIR, AND REPLACE SPORTS FACILITIES IN THE VILLAGE OF DEDEDO AND TO CONSTRUCT A CANOPY AT J. P. TORRES ELEMENTARY SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that many 2 densely populated areas and sections of the Municipality of Dededo are 3 lacking sports and multi-purpose facilities for the use and recreation of the 4 residents, in particular, the youth of Guam's most populous village. 5 Likewise, the Legislature finds that the availability of such facilities, when 6 actively utilized to promote youth sports programs, contributes to the overall 7 welfare and benefit of the youth and the village, commensurately decreasing 8 incidents of unrest and delinquency due to unoccupied free time. In this stead, 9 the Legislature finds it necessary and desirable to initiate the construction of 10 multi-purpose sports facilities, courts and attendant facilities in Dededo and 11 to maintain and repair its existing facilities. 12 13

Section 2. Identify land. The Department of Land Management, in consultation with the Mayor's Office of the Municipality of Dededo, the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, where applicable, shall identify government land in the areas of Machanao, GHURA 35 and GHURA 48, all within Dededo, to construct basketball courts and attendant facilities.

Section 3. Appropriations. Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works to construct, repair, or replace the following sports facilities in Dededo:

23 GHURA 501: Construction of a basketball court with lighting facilities;

Astumbo Garden: Construction of a basketball court with lighting facilities;

Dededo Baseball Field: Construction of restroom facilities, scoreboard 1 and announcer facilities; replacement of fence; 2 Central Park: Construction of lighting facilities for the tennis court; 3 repair of the tennis court; 4 5 Y-Paopao Estates: Construction of lighting facilities for the basketball court; repair of the basketball court; 6 Liguan Terrace: Construction of a basketball court with lighting 7 facilities; construction of lighting facilities for the existing basketball court; 8 9 repair of the existing basketball court; Machanao: Construction of a basketball court with lighting facilities. 10 11 GHURA 35 and 48: Construction of one basketball court with lighting 12 facilities at a central location that would serve both areas. 13 Section 4. Appropriation for canopy. Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 14 Education (the "Department") to construct a canopy at J. P. Torres 15 Elementary School. In carrying out the construction of such project, the 16 Department may work with the Parent Teacher Organization ("PTO") of the 17 school which may undertake such construction as an organization project; 18 provided, however, that all such construction activity by the PTO shall be 19 monitored by the Department to ensure compliance with construction 20 21 standards. 22 Section 5. Severability. If any provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, are held invalid, such invalidity shall 23 not affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given 24

- 1 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
- 2 provisions of this Act are severable.

OVERVIEW

All individuals testifying before the Committee testified in favor of the measure.

Mayor Rivera testified that he is avidly supporting the legislation as he feels that the facilities will provide much needed recreational activities for the residents of the village, especially in the evenings. Mayor Rivera noted that the construction of the facilities, as planned in the legislation, will greatly alleviate the incidents of vagrancy and delinquency among the youth of those particular areas. Mayor Rivera urged expeditious passage of the measure.

Mayor Borja, representing the Mayors' Council's Legislative Liaison Committee, urged the Committee and Legislature to look into providing the same type of legislation for all villages of the island noting that such facilities were much needed and would provide the needed activities to reduce the incidents of vagrancy and juvenile delinquency in the villages. Mayor Borja noted that much of the problems now being experienced stems from the fact that the youth of the villages have much free time on their hands without a constructive way of expending their pent up energies.

Mr. Frank Castro, Director of Land Management, noted that his Department is prepared to work with the Department of Public Works and the Department of Parks and Recreation to identify government land for the projects.

Mr. Dennis Zermeno, representing the Department of Parks and Recreation, noted that Parks and Rec is in favor of the legislation but that the Department would like to see present facilities upgraded and maintained first. Mr. Zermeno also noted that it should be remembered that the new Sports Complex will be built in Harmon Loop area and that these facilities will be able to serve a part of the Dededo populace. Speaker San Agustin disagreed noting that Parks and Rec was more interested in the Sports Complex and that this Complex would be dedicated to organized sports while the intent of the legislation was to provide open facilities to the population in general.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS and RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Committee finds and recommends that there is a need for additional sports facilities and multi-purpose courts in the village of Dededo, specifically in those areas where such facilities are not now in existence.
- The Committee finds and recommends that there is a need for continued maintenance and repair of existing facilities.
- The Committee finds and recommends that it is desireable for the government to identify government land for the construction of multipurpose facilities and courts in the areas specified in the legislation.
- The Committee finds and recommends that there is a need for the Office of the Mayor of Dededo, the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Public Works and the Department of Land Management to work together on the purposes and intent of this legislation.
- However, the Committee finds and recommends that it would be desireable if the Office of the Mayor of Dededo was given the lead role in this legislation in order to insure the most expeditious accomplishment of its purposes.

TESTIMONY FOR BILL 169 June 6, 1991

By Mayor Jose A. Rivera

My name is Jose A. Rivera, I am the Mayor of Dededo. I am here to testify in favor of Bill 169 An Act to identify

Government land in the Municipality of Dededo for sports

facilities and to appropriate two hundred fifty thousand dollars

(\$250,000) from the general fund to the department of Public

Works for the purpose of constructing, repairing and replacing

sports facilities in the village of Dededo.

I praise Senators J.P. Aguon, C.T.C. Gutierrez and D.LG Shimizu for introducing this much needed bill to address the long overdue repairs and construction of additional facilities in the village of Dededo.

GHURA 501 Subdivision has an existing vacant land area in the mist of the housing for recreational facilities. However,

GHURA failed to built any recreational facility and for years

has deprived the residents of this subdivision of any recreational facility.

Astumbo Garden: This subdivision consisting of 98 families is in dire need of a basketball facility for the many youth residing in this area which is quite a distance from the basketball courts in the Dededo village. There is an existing recreational area for this facility.

Dededo Baseball Field: On July 1989, GEDA in reference to a concept of exchanging tax benefits received by Qualifying Certificates to the community at large requested a listing of established village projects and cost for each project from the village. I immediately responded with a the Announcer's Booth Project that would include restrooms facilities, scoreboard and snack bar. The quotation at the time given by Public Works was

\$90,000. No information or correspondence to date has been received by this office. Central Park: The Tennis court has remained idle due to the need for lighting facilities and resurface of the tennis court.

Y-Paopao Estates: The basketball court is in dire need of construction of total lighting infrustructure and resurfacing.

Liguan Terrace: This court located behind the former Donald's Mart I managed to salvage two concrete poles from GPA and will have the lighting infrustructure connected at the expense of a business company. However, resurfacing and additional lighting in this park area is definitely needed. However, construction of another basketball court and repairing the existing ones are very much needed.

Machanano: Norecreational facility exists. This area is rapidly growing and now being occupied by approximately 165 residents. A basketball court would certainly benefit and serve

the many youths in this area. Land for this facility would have to be identified.

GHURA 35 & 48: A basketball court would be of great benefit to the 83 families in these two low-cost housing areas. However, government land would have to be identified and reserved for this recreational facility.

I am definitely in favor of Bill 169 in its entirety. And so I am asking all the Senators for support and passage of this bill. Some of our youth are just eager to use their energy and some have inspirations of joining the Olympics or becoming professional, so it is imperative that we not only support our youth projects and activities, but provide them with adequate recreational facilities as early as possible. Dear Senator Santos:

The Department of Parks and Recreation supports the intent of Bill 169, an act to identify land in the municipality of Dededo for sports facilities and to appropriate funds for constructing, repairing and replacing sports facilities in the village of Dededo.

However, based on the listing provided and the funding level requested, I suggest that the Mayor of Dededo determine a priority listing for the specific projects. All of the projects as listed will go beyond the funding source as recommended. I also recommend that the funding level be raised to \$325,000.

I would also recommend that Section 1, Liguan Terrace, be amended to include the construction of a new multipurpose court in the tract of Government land adjacent to the southern side of North Chalan Liguan street. There is no multipurpose court in all of Liguan Terrace South of Marine Drive. Such a facility is long overdue.
