1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1. Legislative findings.** In recent inspections and tours, the
2 Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice has found that facilities of the
3 Department of Corrections, the Guam Police Department, and the Guam
4 Fire Department are in dire need of repair and refurbishment. Operating in
5 facilities which were not originally designed and constructed for public safety
6 utilization, public safety personnel are in need of resources to assist them to
7 execute their vital public missions. From structural deficiencies threatening
8 both inmates and personnel assigned to such facilities, to a gross lack of basic
9 furnishings and equipment, the operations of public safety personnel are
10 hampered. The Legislature therefore finds that resources must be provided
11 to enable corrections, police and fire personnel to operate efficiently and
12 effectively in their workplaces.

13 **Section 2. Title.** This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
14 "Omnibus Public Safety Restoration Act".

15 **Section 3. Appropriation for fire and police facilities.** Six Hundred
16 Twenty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$629,000) are hereby appropriated from the
17 General Fund to the Department of Public Works to renovate and refurbish
18 Guam Fire Department and Guam Police Department facilities, the moneys
19 to be distributed as follows:

10 Federal prison standards.

11 **Section 7. Appropriation for locking system.** Two Hundred Twenty
12 Thousand Dollars (\$220,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund
13 to the Department of Corrections to purchase and install an electronic
14 locking-unlocking system in all its correctional facility buildings requiring
15 such locks.

16 **Section 8. New correctional facility.** (a) The Governor of Guam shall
17 direct appropriate government instrumentalities to plan, select a site, and
18 undertake a schematic design and program design for a new adult
19 correctional facility.

20 (b) The planning for such facility shall take into consideration:

21 (i) Location in the existing Department of Corrections
22 compound.

23 (ii) Housing for two hundred (200) inmates immediately upon
24 opening, with design and service capacity for expansion to house three
25 hundred (300) inmates.

1 (c) Such planning shall commence sixty (60) days after enactment of
2 this Act and shall be completed and a report thereon transmitted to the
3 Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice of the Legislature within two
4 hundred seventy (270) days.

5 **Section 9. Reports.** The Director of Corrections, the Chief of Police
6 and the Fire Chief shall each submit a report to the Committee on Judiciary
7 and Criminal Justice of the Legislature within two hundred and seventy (270)
8 days after enactment of this Act on the status of renovations and equipment
9 purchases authorized and directed by this Act.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS: In recent inspections and tours, the Legislative Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice has found that facilities of the Department of Corrections, Guam Police Department, and Guam Fire Department are in dire need of repair and refurbishment. Operating in facilities which were not originally designed and constructed for public safety utilization, public safety personnel are in need of resources to assist them execute their respective missions. From structural deficiencies threatening both clients and personnel assigned to such facilities, to a gross lack of basic furnishings and equipment, the operations of public safety personnel are hampered. The committee finds that resources must be provided to enable fire, police, and corrections personnel to operate efficiently and effectively in the workplace.

Section 2. TITLE: This Act shall be called the Omnibus Public Safety Restoration Act.

Section 3. The sum of Six Hundred and Twenty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$629,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of renovating and refurbishing Guam Police Department and Guam Fire Department stations as follows:

Section 6. Section 7. The sum of Two Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$220,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of purchasing and installing an electronic locking/unlocking system in all buildings.

Section 8. The Chief of Police, Fire Chief, and Director of Corrections shall submit a report on the status of renovations and equipment purchases to the legislative Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice within Two Hundred and Seventy (270) days after passage of this Act.

Bill 317--- An act to establish the Omnibus Public Safety Restoration Act for the purpose of renovating and refurbishing public safety facilities throughout Guam.

Preface

The Judiciary and Criminal Justice Committee convened on Friday, May 17, 1991 in the Legislative Public Conference Room at 9:20 a.m. to receive testimony on Bill 317.

Present alongside Committee Chairwoman Pilar C. Lujan were Committee members Anthony C. Blaz and Thomas V. C. Tanaka.

Overview

Since 1987, under the direction of Chairwoman Pilar C. Lujan, the Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice has conducted annual oversight inspections and tours of public safety facilities throughout the island.

At the beginning of this year, the Committee toured and surveyed all police, fire, detention, and correctional facilities.

As a result of the recent tours, the Committee found that all the public safety facilities are either dilapidated or ill-furnished.

In response, the Committee has drafted Bill 317--- the Omnibus Public Safety Restoration Act--- to restore public safety facilities at a cost of \$1,104,000.

The measure addresses structural deficiencies which threaten clients and personnel who utilize the facilities. It also provides funds for basic furniture and equipment.

Lastly, the measure provides for much-needed appropriations to address federal citations of deficiencies at the Department of Corrections and Rosario Detention facility.

Testimony

Guam Fire Chief Francisco C. Lizama submitted written testimony (Attachment I) in favor of the measure.

Guam Police Chief Adolf Sgambelluri also submitted written testimony (Attachment II) commending the introduction of the measure and urging its passage.

Former Senator Jim Miles appeared before the Committee registering support for the measure but questioned if amounts cited were sufficient.

Department of Corrections Director Ricardo A. Salas submitted written testimony (Attachment III) in support of the measure with suggested modifications.

Noting the settlement agreement between GovGuam and federal government over alleged civil rights violations at the Adult Correctional and Rosario Detention facilities, the Director stated that the \$175,000 contained in Section 6 for retrofitting the facilities with fire sprinkler systems is insufficient. The Director noted that \$600,000 would be necessary to fulfill objectives.

Additionally, the Director urged deletion of appropriations in Section 7 since such funds were provided for in the department's supplemental budget.

The Director also pointed out that the \$150,000 cited in Section 8 for purchase and installation of an electronic locking/unlocking system system in all buildings is insufficient, based on estimates. The sum of \$220,000 would be required.

Lastly, the Director wrote in his testimony that Section 9 of the measure is already taken care of in the department's supplemental budget.

The Bureau of Budget and Management Research also submitted a fiscal note (Attachment IV) on the bill's impact.

Committee Recommendations

Recognizing the dire necessity to upgrade dilapidated public safety facilities around island to ensure that personnel and clients are housed in a proper environment, the Committee recommends passage of Bill 317 with modifications. Taking into account the DOC Director's testimony on amounts already provided under the Fiscal Year 1991 Supplemental Budget and the need for additional funds for items specified, the Committee recommends passage of Substitute Bill 317.



TESTIMONY ON BILL 317

Section 6 of Bill 317 appropriates \$175,000 to retrofit the Adult Correctional and Rosario Detention Facilities. This amount is now insufficient to meet the requirements of a Settlement Agreement entered into by the Government of Guam and the U.S. Department of Justice in April 1991. A sufficient amount of \$600,000 has been requested by the Governor in a bill transmitted to the Legislature on May 2, 1991.

Section 7 of Bill 317 is no longer needed as funds have been approved by the Legislature and the Governor with the enactment of the Supplemental Budget Bill for Fiscal Year 1991. Additionally, the federal inspection did not identify any specific electrical deficiencies in their inspection in April 1991.

Section 8 of Bill 317 appropriates \$150,000 to purchase and install an electronic locking/unlocking system in all buildings. Initial unsolicited estimates indicate a need for an additional \$70,000 to complete this requirement. The Governor has already requested for \$220,000 for this requirement.

Section 9 of Bill 317 is an appropriation for a siren/alarm system for escapes. DUC is in need for this system. However, the appropriation of \$920,000 in the FY-91 Supplemental Budget Law is sufficient to include this requirement. DOC will ensure that a siren system will be made part of the specifications for the new perimeter alarm system.

FOOTNOTES:

Section 1. Although this section does have a fiscal impact the impact cannot be determined at this time. Identifying structural deficiencies, equipment and furnishing needed and what repairs are required are unavailable to determine the fiscal impact.

Section 2. No fiscal impact is anticipated by this section.

Section 3, 4 and 5. All three sections proposed to appropriate various sums of monies to renovate, refurbish and equip the various island Police and Fire Stations. No information is available to determine whether the amounts appropriated for each station is sufficient to cover the cost of the intended appropriated amounts. It is suggested that a comprehensive study be done on the need and requirements of these stations to ensure adequate funding be provided to complete the projects.

Comments on Sections 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of Bill No. 317

Section 6 proposes to appropriate One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of retrofitting the Adult Correctional and Rosario Detentional Facilities with fire sprinkler system to comply with federal prison standards. According to the Deputy Director of the Department of Corrections, the appropriated amount of \$175,000 is insufficient to carry out the intent of Section 6. The United States Government is requiring that the Government of Guam install a complete automatic sprinkler systems which will utilize quick response heads throughout the buildings housing inmates and detainees at the Adult Correctional Facility, Women's Facility and Rosario Detention Facility. A total of \$600,000 is needed for this purpose.

Section 7 proposes to appropriate Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of rewiring faulty electrical systems in the Adult Correctional Facility and to comply with federal standards. According to the Deputy Director of the Department of Corrections, DOC's FY1991 operational budget is being tapped to fund the rewiring of Adult Correctional Facility's electrical system. Furthermore, the United States Department of Justice did not find any deficiencies in the electrical system at the Adult Correctional Facility.

Section 8 proposes to appropriate One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of purchasing and installing an electronic locking/unlocking system in all buildings. According to the Deputy Director of the Department of Corrections, a total of \$220,000 is needed in order to install remote control locks for all cell doors and egress/ingress doors and local common key operations for each separate unit's egress/ingress doors for the buildings (including "B" Building) at the Adult Correctional Facility and at the Rosario Detention Facility.

Section 9 proposes to appropriate Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections to purchase and install an alarm/siren system for escapes. According to the Deputy Director of the Department of Corrections, the alarm/siren system can be incorporated in the purchase/contract for the Security Alarm System which was budgeted under Adult Correctional Facility's FY1991 operational budget in the amount of \$920,000.

Section 10 requires that the Chief of Police, Fire Chief and Director of Corrections submit a report on the status of the renovations and equipment purchases to the Legislative Committee on Judiciary and Criminal Justice within Two Hundred and Seventy (270) days after passage of this Act.
