AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §4107 AND TO ADD A NEW §4117.1, ALL TO TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, INCREASING MATERNITY LEAVE AND PERMITTING PATERNITY LEAVE FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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Section 1. §4107 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:

"§4107. Maternity leave. Maternity leave shall be granted to a female employee occupying a permanent position who is absent from work as a result of childbirth. Such maternity leave shall not exceed twenty (20) days encompassing the date of childbirth. Any additional leave taken for such childbirth purpose may be charged against accumulated sick leave or may be unpaid leave, at the option of the employee. Total leave, whether maternity, sick or unpaid leave, shall not exceed six (6) months without approval of the employee's supervisor."

Section 2. A new §4117.1 is hereby added to Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read as follows:

"§4117.1. Paternity leave. Paternity leave shall be granted to a male employee occupying a permanent position upon the birth to his wife of a child or children. Such paternity leave shall not exceed five (5) days of paid leave and must encompass the date of childbirth. Any additional leave taken for such purpose may be charged against accumulated sick leave, or may be unpaid leave at the option of the employee. Total leave, whether paternity, sick or unpaid leave shall not exceed two (2) months without approval of the employee's supervisor."

Section 3. Title. This Act may be cited as the "Employees' Child Health Care Act of 1991".

### PREFACE:

The Committee on General Governmental Operations, to which was referred the above captioned measure, conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, April 23, 1991, at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room.

Committee members present were Senator Herminia D. Dierking, Chairperson, and Senators, Anthony C. Blaz, Carl T.C. Gutierrez, Martha C. Ruth, Elizabeth P. Arriola, Marilyn D.A. Manibusan, and Speaker Joe T. San Agustin.

### **NOTIFICATION:**

Letters were sent to the Governor; Executive Director, Women's Affairs; the Attorney General; the Director, Department of Administration; the Executive Director and Chairperson, Civil Service Commission; Director, Bureau of Planning; the Director, Bureau of Budget and Management Research; President, Mayors Council; the President, Guam Chamber of Commerce; the Committee members; the media, and the general public.

### **TESTIMONY:**

Although there were no witnesses present, the Committee received written testimony from Ms. Lynn S.N. Munoz, R.N. supporting passage and enactment of Bill No. 204. At this time, the Chairperson requested the author to be a co-sponsor of Bill No. 204. There was no objections from the main sponsor.

### SECTION ANALYSIS

Section 1 repeals and reenacts §4107 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated pertaining to maternity leave. The amendment

provides that a 20 day maternity leave in addition to sick leave, shall be granted to employees.

Furthermore, the legislation provides that such maternity leave shall be any 20 days from the date of birth, and any additional leave taken may be charged against accumulated sick leave or may be unpaid leave, at the option of the employee. Also, the total leave, whether maternity, sick or unpaid leave, shall not exceed 6 months without approval of the employee's supervisor.

Section 2 adds a new §4107.1 to Title 4, Guam Code Annotated pertaining to paternity leave. This section provides that male employees be given paternity leave not to exceed five (5) days, and any additional leave which may be charged against his accumulated sick leave for the purpose of caring for his wife and child.

The Committee recognizing the welfare of its employees and family, recommends that the Legislature pass Substitute Bill No. 204.

Any additional leave taken for such childbirth purposes may be charged against accumulated sick leave or may be unpaid leave, at the option of the employee. Total leave, whether maternity, sick or unpaid leave, shall not exceed (6) months without approval of the employee's supervisor."

Section 2. A new §4117.1 is hereby added to Title 4, Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"§4117.1. Paternity Leave. Paternity leave shall be granted a male employee occupying a permanent position upon the birth of a son or daughter. Such paternity leave shall not exceed five

(5) days of paid leave. Any additional leave taken for such 1 2 purposes must encompass the date of childbirth and may be 3 charged against accumulated sick leave, or may be unpaid leave at the option of the employee. Total leave, whether paternity, 4 5 sick or unpaid leave shall not exceed two (2) months without approval of the employee's supervisor." 6 7 This Act may be cited or referred to as the Section 3. 8 Employees Child Health Care Act of 1991.

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# AN ACT INCREASING MATERNITY LEAVE FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. 4 GCA Section 4107 is amended to read:

"§4107. Maternity Leave. Maternity leave shall be granted to a female employee occupying a permanent position who is absent from work as a result of childbirth. Such maternity leave shall be any [ten-fiff] twenty (20) days shall be in addition to sick leave and shall be paid leave. Such maternity leave shall be any [ten-fiff] twenty (20) days encompassing the date of childbirth[7]. [and -an] Any additional leave taken for such childbirth purposes [shall] may be charged against accumulated sick leave or may be unpaid leave, at the option of the employee. Total leave, whether maternity sick or unpaid leave, shall not exceed six (6) months without approval of the employee's supervisor."

Dear Senator Dierking and Members of the Committee:

My name is Lynn San Nicolas Munoz and I am submitting this testimony for Bill 204, an act to amend §4107 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, increasing maternity leave for government employees.

The allowance of twenty (20) days paid leave, in addition to other leaves of absence, will help to greatly reduce the postpartum ("after birth") anxiety all mothers experience. I know this feeling because I am the mother of a I2-month old boy. I am also a wife, employee and full-time college student. I feel I can speak for all mothers when I say that financial concerns do not facilitate the adjustment to motherhood, parenting and family life, especially within the first six weeks after delivery. This bill will help to reduce this financial stress and allow for a healthier start on these tasks.

In these days of two-paycheck households, any loss of income results in significant difficulties. Bill 204 is necessary to preserve the homeostasis of family life and the nurturance of mother-child bonding since it will address, for the most part, a family's financial concern.

I strongly urge passage of this bill, and an expeditious vote to implement it, so that our mothers will be able to carry on family life with as few complications as possible.
