AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §§15018 AND 15022 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE ON THE SIZE AND COMPOSITION OF MUNICIPAL PLANNING COUNCILS, TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR THEIR MEMBERS; TO ESTABLISH A LIMIT ON MEMBERSHIP; AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS

FOR THE HAWAII MEDICAL REFERRAL OFFICE AND FOR PARTICIPATION OF GUAM GIRLS VOLLEYBALL TEAMS IN THE FAR EAST TOURNAMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative statement. The Legislature finds that while members of various government boards and commissions receive stipends for services rendered, members of the various Municipal Planning Councils do not receive such stipends for the services they render on behalf of the community, and therefore, the Legislature further finds that it is fitting and proper that such council members be given stipends for such services rendered.

Section 2. §15018 of the Government Code is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"§15018. Same: composition and eligibility. A Municipal Planning Council shall be composed of ten (10) members to be appointed by the Mayor from among the residents of the district who are registered voters, who are U.S. citizens, and who are at least eighteen (18) years of age. In addition, the Mayor may appoint one (1) additional member to the Municipal Planning Council for every one thousand (1,000) residents of the district in excess of ten thousand (10,000); provided, that the total membership shall not exceed twenty (20) members.

A Mayor and a Vice-Mayor shall be **ex officio** members of their respective Municipal Planning Councils, may participate in all proceedings, and shall be eligible to vote thereat. The Mayor

shall be chairman of the Municipal Planning Council." 1 2 Section 3. §15022 of the Government Code is hereby repealed and 3 reenacted to read as follows: 4 "§15022. Municipal Planning Councils meetings: stipends. (a) Each Municipal Planning Council shall meet regularly, at least 5 6 once a month, or more often as necessary. A two-(2-)day notice 7 shall be given for a special meeting; provided, that the members may waive notice by all executing a written waiver. A quorum, 8 9 which consists of a majority of the members, is required for any 10 action by the Council. 11 (b) Each Council member, except the Mayor and Vice-12 Mayor, shall be eligible to receive a stipend of Fifty Dollars (\$50) 13 for every regular and special meeting attended; provided, 14 however, that such stipend shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars 15 (\$100) in any one (1) calendar month." 16 Section 4. PREFACE:

The Committee on General Governmental Operations, to which was referred the above captioned measure, conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, April 23, 1991, at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room.

Committee members present were Senator Herminia D. Dierking, Chairperson, and Senators Anthony C. Blaz, Carl T.C. Gutierrez, Elizabeth P. Arriola, Marilyn D.A. Manibusan, Martha C. Ruth, and Speaker Joe T. San Agustin.

NOTIFICATION:

Letters were sent to the Governor; the President and members, Mayors' Council; the Director, Bureau of Budget and Management Research; the Attorney General; the Committee members; the news-media, and the general public.

TESTIMONY:

At this time, the Chairperson called on the Mayors present to submit testimony. Mayor Greg Borja informed the Committee that the Council's Legislative Review Committee fully supports the passage and enactment of Bill Nos. 136, 159, and 177.

Mayor Frank Portusach testified that council members are great public servants. He considers them partners in the work and progress of the community. He went on to say that all council members are to be commended for their dedication and spirit of service to their respective community.

Next to submit testimony was Mayor Jose A. Rivera. Mayor Rivera reminded that Committee that the Dededo Municipal Planning Council on July 10, 1990, adopted Resolution 90-09. This resolution, said Mayor Rivera, requested the Twentieth Guam Legislature to amend existing legislation and to appropriate stipend funds from the General Fund for the Dededo Municipal Planning Council. Another resolution (91-02) was adopted and transmitted to the Legislature.

After questioning by Committee members, all Mayors unanimously agreed that council members should be eligible to receive a Fifty Dollars (\$50) stipend for each regular or special meeting, provided that the amount does not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month. It was also agreed that the legislation retroactively take effect to January 1, 1991.

There being no further questions, the Chairperson adjourned the Committee hearing on Bill Nos. 136, 159, and 177.

A CLOSER LOOK

The Legislature finds that while members of various government boards and commissions receive stipends for

services rendered, Council members from the 19 municipalities who at times, perform numerous municipal duties, are not eligible to receive compensation of any sort.

The Municipal Planning Council was first established in 1977. This was made possible through the enactment of Bill No. 15, passed by the Fourteenth Guam Legislature. Since then, the various municipalities have appointed at least a minimum of nine (9) members to serve on the Council.

Since 1977, council members have worked closely with the Mayor and Vice-Mayor, and oftentimes, find themselves advising the Mayor on matters affecting the well-being of the community; reviewing and approving the Mayor's request for expenditure of funds; attending and conducting public meetings to ascertain the needs of the community.

Most recently, the Guam Legislature, through Section 7 of Public Law 20-217, increased the duties and scope of responsibilities of the Municipal Planning Councils. Now, Council members are part of the participatory process in the disposition of government lands, and zoning requests in their respective communities.

The Committee believes it would be appropriate to include a provision limiting the size of the Planning Councils. To prevent an open-ended mandate of unlimited Council members, the Committee recommends that effective January 1993, each Council shall limited to 10 members, except for those municipalities with more than a population of 10,000. In these cases, the Mayor would appoint one addition member for every 1,000, not to exceed 20 members.

Therefore, the Committee recognizing the contributions and importance of the members of the Municipal Planning Council, does hereby recommend that the Legislature act favorably on Substitute Bill No. 136.

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AN ACT TO ESTABLISH STIPENDS FOR THE MEMBERS OF EACH DISTRICT'S MUNICIPAL PLANNING COUNCIL

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Legislative Findings. The legislature finds
that while other Government of Guam boards and commissions
receive stipends for services rendered, the Municipal
Planning Councils in each district, as established and
authorized by Sections 15017 and 15021 of Chapter I, Title
XVI of the Government Code, receive no stipend for the
services they render on behalf of their constituents. The
Legislature therefore further finds that the Government Code
should be amended to include an appropriate stipend to be
granted to members of the Municipal Planning Council of each
village.

Section 2. A new paragraph is added to Section 15022 of Chapter I, Title XVI of the Government Code to read:

"Each member of the Municipal Planning Council in each district (excluding the Mayor and Vice-Mayor) shall be paid a stipend of fifty dollars (\$50) per official regular or special meeting attended, not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 3. Five Hundred Seventy Thousand dollars (\$570,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Mayor's Council of Guam for stipends for members of each district's Municipal Planning Council as defined in Section 15017 of Chapter I, Title XVI of the Government Code.

Section 4. Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on January 1, 1991.

\$15015. Capital Projects Participation.
The Commissioners shall be authorized to participate in the annual consideration of capital improvements program by the Executive Branch. They shall be allowed to express their views, make recommendations and propose projects for their respective districts.

\$15016. Advising the Commissioner. . All government of Guam departments and agencies shall advise in writing and appraise the Commissioner of any public works project or activity to be undertaken in his district at least five (5) days prior to the start of said project or activity. In case of an emergency, said department or agency shall advise the Commissioner of the same immediately.

115017. Municipal Planning Council: Establishment. There is established a Municipal Planning Council within each of the districts of the territory of Guam.

\$15018. Same: Composition and Eligibility.

The Municipal Planning Council shall be composed of at least nine (9) members to be appointed by the Commissioner from among the residents who are registered voters in each district; who are U.S. citizens at least eighteen (18) years of age. The Commissioner and the Assistant Commissioner, if applicable, shall be ex-officio members of the Council and may participate in all the proceedings and shall be eligible to vote. The Commissioner shall be chairman of the Planning Council.

115019. Municipal Planning Council: Term of Office. Each member of the Municipal Planning Council shall hold office for a period of two (2) years, said term to begin on the first Monday in January following his or her appointment.

\$15020. Municipal Planning Council: Vacancy In case of a vacancy on the Municipal Planning Council by reason of death, resignation or incapacity, said vacancy shall be filled by appointment of the Commissioner.

\$15021. Municipal Planning Council: Powers, Duties and Responsibilities. The Municipal Planning Council in each district shall work closely with the district commissioner and shall perform the following duties and responsibilities:

(a) Advise the Commissioner on all matters affecting the well-being of the

(b) Review and approve the Commissioners' requests for expenditures of money community. from the Municipal Fund as established by \$15010 of this Chapter.

(c) Hold joint public hearings with the Commissioner and Assistant Commissioner,

if applicable, on matters affecting the community.

(d) Cooperate with the Commissioner and Assistant Commissioner, if applicable, in whatever manner appropriate to ensure the well-being of the residents of the community.

(e) Promulgate such rules and regulations as necessary for the proper operation of the programs under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner, provided however, that said rules and regulations do not infringe on the authority of the Commissioner as provided in \$15008 of this Chapter.

\$15022. Municipal Planning Council: Meetings. Each Council shall meet regularly at least once a month, or more often as necessary. two-day notice shall be given for a special meeting, provided that the members may waive notice by executing a written waiver. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members and is required for any action.

\$15023. Effective Date. This Act shall take effect immediately upon enactment, but the Governor may postpone the actual transfer of all or a portion of such functions to be transferred by this law until such time as the organization provided for can be put in full force and effect but not later than January 1979. Except as otherwise provided herein, all officers, their subordinates and employees whose functions are covered by this Act, shall continue to perform their duties from the date this Act takes effect."

Testimony For Bills

146, 159 , 177

April 23, 1991

My name is Jose A. Rivera, Mayor of Dededo. I am here to testify for Bills (A), Bill 159 and Bill 177, relative to establishing stipends to provide compensation for the Members of each District's Municipal Planning Council.

First of all, I render thanks and appreciation to the 21st Guam Legislature Committee on General Governmental Operations for scheduling a public hearing for Bills 146, Bill 159 and Bill 177, and to the authors of these Bills.

Senators in the 20th Guam Legislature will recall that on July 10, 1990, the Dededo Municipal Planning Council introduced Resolution 90-09 relative to requesting the 20th Guam Legislature to appropriate stipend funding from the General Fund for the Dededo Municipal Planning Council members. Senators Madeleine Z. Bordallo and Senator Marilyn Manibusan both introduced Bills pertaining to a stipend for the Municipal Planning Council then, but the Bills never got out of Committee. On January 15, 1991, the Dededo Municipal Planning Council re-introduced to the 21st Guam Legislature the same request in Resolution 91-02.

Public Law 14-27 Section 15020 established the responsibilities and duties of the Municipal Planning

Councils and Public Law 20-217 Section 7 increased the duties and responsibilities of the Municipal Planning Councils, yet an inequity exists in that both laws do not contain any stipulation for compensation as provided to other Government of Guam Boards and Commissions who receive stipend for their services.

Certainly, I am in favor of appropriating from the General Fund fifty dollars (\$50.00) per member attending a meeting, not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) a month and for said stipend to be retroactive from January 1, 1991.

The Municipal Planning Council Members hold office for a period of two years. Public Law 14-27 Section 15018 states that the Municipal Planning Council shall be composed of at least nine (9) members, but it does not limit as to how many members it can consist of. Therefore, since an appropriation is to be established, maybe a provision stating the number of members to compose the Municipal Planning Councils of each district can be included, but with the provision to retain all present council members to conclude their term of office.

Again, I confirm my full support for said Bills and solicit support from all the 21st Guam Legislature Senators to incorporate the intent of these three Bills and reinforce its passage. Thank you!

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH STIPENDS FOR THE MEMBERS OF EACH DISTRICT'S MUNICIPAL PLANNING COUNCIL

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Legislative Findings. The legislature finds
that while other Government of Guam boards and commissions
receive stipends for services rendered, the Municipal
Planning Councils in each district, as established and
authorized by Sections 15017 and 15021 of Chapter I, Title
XVI of the Government Code, receive no stipend for the
services they render on behalf of their constituents. The
Legislature therefore further finds that the Government Code
should be amended to include an appropriate stipend to be
granted to members of the Municipal Planning Council of each
village.

Section 2. A new paragraph is added to Section 15022 of Chapter I, Title XVI of the Government Code to read:

"Each member of the Municipal Planning Council in each district (excluding the Mayor and Vice-Mayor) shall be paid a stipend of fifty dollars (\$50) per official regular or special meeting attended, not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) per month."

Section 3. Five Hundred Seventy Thousand dollars (\$570,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Mayor's Council of Guam for stipends for members of each district's Municipal Planning Council as defined in Section 15017 of Chapter I, Title XVI of the Government Code.

Section 4. Section 2 of this Act shall take effect on January 1, 1991.
