# RECEPTION, AND CHANGING A PREVIOUS APPROPRIATION.

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2	Section 1. Legislative intent. Through Public Law No. 21-121, the
3	Institute of the Chamorro Language and Cultural Program was established
4	within the Chamorro Language Commission to address the limited
5	accessibility of Chamorro language education and instruction on the island
6	Through the Institute of the Chamorro Language and Cultural Program
7	instructional lessons in Chamorro are to be conducted which would give
8	people the necessary vehicle for increasing their Chamorro-speaking skills

10	Following extensive discussions by members of the Chamorro Language

14	Section 2. Change of reference. Every reference to "Institute of

17	Section 3. Appropriation. One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Sixty-
18	Seven Dollars (\$113,067) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to

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ZERO 9 Section 5. Appropriation for Territorial Chorale. Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000) are hereby appropriated from the General Fund 10 to the Department of Administration to pay the expenses of the Guam 11 Territorial Chorale to participate in the Pacific Basin Choral Festival in 12 13 Honolulu, Hawaii, March 23-30, 1993. The funds in this section shall be released to the Guam Territorial Chorale upon presentation of a listing of 14 projected expenses. The recipient of this appropriation shall provide an 15 16 accounting of the funds to the Department of Administration and to the 17 Legislature within ninety (90) days of their release.

# COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

ON

BILL NO. 87: AN ACT RELATIVE TO APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED THIRTEEN THOUSAND SIXTY SEVEN DOLLARS (\$113,067) TO THE CHAMORRO LANGUAGE COMMISSION FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE "INSTITUTE OF CHAMORRO LANGUAGE" PROGRAM AS ESTABLISHED THROUGH PUBLIC LAW 21-121.

The Committee on Ways & Means conducted a public hearing on Thursday, March 4, 1993 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Public Hearing Room to gather testimony on Bill No. 87. Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators Pilar C. Lujan, J. George Bamba, John P. Aguon, Antonio R. Unpingco, Ted S. Nelson, Vicente C. Pangelinan, Marilyn D. A. Manibusan, and Elizabeth P. Arriola.

#### TESTIMONY

#### Mr. Peter Onedera, Program Director

Mr. Onedera submitted written testimony in support of Bill No. 87. He stated in his testimony that "En fin, put fabot, in gaggagao hao na en påsa este ya u ma fa'lai kosaki u ma tutuhon i hagas ginagao i taotao siha. In hålara mohon na u ma baba i Faneyåkan gi Huño na mes. Siempre manitu mo'na i hinanao-ña lao i salåppe' para u ditetmina este".

Ms. Jaunita T. Peredo, Mrs. Bernadetta Dungca, Mrs. Ana B. Garcia, Mr. William Paulino, Sister Bernadette C. Quintanilla, SSND, and Mr. Frank San Nicolas, all members of the Commission

Mr. Paulino recommends that we include the word "Culture" to go hand-in-hand with Language, that neither one can stand alone. His amendment is on page one, line 14, after the word "Language" to add "and culture" Program.

Senator Lujan further suggested that we also include the words "and culture" after every reference to "Institute of Chamorro Language" as set forth in Public Law 21-121.

Mr. Onedera responded to Senator Lujan's suggestion that yes, culture is part of the Institute of Chamorro Language Program.

Senator Arriola stated that her Committee had an oversight hearing with the Department of Parks and Recreation and was informed by the Department that the Lujan family would like to exchange their historical house to that of a government land.

Senator Unpingco asked if someone took a course from the Institute, would the credit apply to the University of Guam?

Mrs. Dungca's response to Senator Unpingco's question is no. This institute is to teach people, who are not or does not have the time to go to the University. The Institute does not have or give out credit hours. So if an individual wants to be a chamorro teacher, he or she would have to take the courses offered at the University of Guam.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION**

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 87 be passed as Substituted by the Legislature.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

#### Section 1. Legislative Intent.

Through Public Law No. 21-121, the "Institute of Chamorro Language" program was established within the Chamorro Language Commission to address the limited accessibility of Chamorro language education and instruction on the island. Through the Institute of Chamorro Language, instructional lessons in the Chamorro Language is to be conducted which would give people the necessary vehicle for increasing their Chamorro speaking skills and their knowledge and understanding of the Chamorro Language. Following extensive discussions by Chamorro Language Commission members on the necessary expenditures associated with the

 effective implementation of the program, the ensuing figures have been submitted.

#### Section 2. Appropriation Measure.

The Sum of One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Sixty Seven Dollars (\$113,067.00) is hereby appropriated from the Government of Guam General Fund to the Chamorro Language Commission for Fiscal Year 1993 for the implementation of the "Institute of Chamorro Language" Program as set forth in Public Law No. 21-121.
