





AN ACT TO AMEND §8105 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO AUTHORIZE THE LOCAL CHAPTERS OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED FEDERAL EMPLOYEES AND THE AMERICAN ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED PERSONS PARTICIPATION IN THE GUAM COUNCIL ON SENIOR CITIZENS; AND TO AMEND SUBPARAGRAPH (b) OF §12311, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE

ANNOTATED, ON THE LICENSING OF NURSES BY
ENDORSEMENT.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative intent.** The National Association of Retired
3 Federal Employees ("NARFE") is a national organization with more than
4 half a million members, two hundred of whom are members of Guam's
5 NARFE chapter. The Association of American Retired Persons ("AARP") is
6 the principal organization in the United States for individuals aged fifty and
7 over. It serves their needs and those of all older Americans through
8 legislative advocacy, research, informative programs and community
9 services, and offers a wide range of member benefits. The Legislature finds
10 the substantial number of local Federal retirees and other local members of
11 AARP warrant their inclusion and comparable representation as provided for
12 the other entities composing the Guam Council on Senior Citizens. Such
13 legal recognition will insure participation by a large segment of Guam's
14 senior citizen community not presently directly represented.

15 **Section 2.** §8105 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to
16 read:

17 **"§8105. Guam Council on Senior Citizens.** There is
18 established within the Division the Guam Council on Senior Citizens
19 (the "Council"). The Council shall function in consonance with §8106
20 of this Chapter and pursuant to the Federal guidelines contained
21 under Section 10a(3) of Title III of the Older Americans Act of 1965,
22 as amended. The Council shall consist of seventeen (17) members,
23 the majority of whom shall be at least fifty-five (55) years or older, to
24 be appointed by the Governor, ten (10) of whom shall be appointed
25 from the following:

- 1 (a) Guam Mayors' Council - one (1) member,
2 (b) Guam Association of Retired Persons - one (1)
3 member,
4 (c) Southern Region Community - two (2) members,
5 (d) Central Region Community - two (2) members,
6 (e) Northern Region Community - two (2) members,
7 (f) Guam Chapter of the National Association of
8 Retired Federal Employees - one (1) member, and
9 (g) Guam Chapter of the American Association of
10 Retired Persons - one (1) member.

11 The remaining seven (7) members shall be appointed by the
12 Governor from representatives of the community at large, such as
13 from the government, retiree organizations, the ministry, and from
14 civic professional and non-profit organizations.

15 As its initial meeting, the Council members shall elect from
16 among their ranks a chairman and vice chairman. Nine (9) members
17 of the Council shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative vote of a
18 majority of members present at a duly constituted meeting at which a
19 quorum is present shall be necessary for Council action. Of the initial
20 appointment, seven (7) members of the Council shall serve for a
21 period of one (1) year, five (5) members shall serve for a period of
22 three (3) years, and five (5) members shall serve for a period of two (2)
23 years. At the expiration of these initial terms, all members shall be
24 appointed for three (3) year periods. Members of the Council shall be
25 paid at the rate of Fifty Dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance at a
26 meeting of the Council; **provided**, however, that such compensation
27 shall not exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100) per month, and they

1 may be reimbursed for reasonable expense incurred in carrying out
2 their duties."

3 **Section 3.** Subparagraph (b) of §12311, Title 10, Guam Code
4 Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:

5 "(b) **By endorsement. A. Conditions.** The Board shall issue a
6 license to practice as a registered nurse without examination to an
7 applicant who meets the following requirements by having:

8 (1) Graduated from a state board approved school of
9 nursing which meets the nursing education standards of the
10 Board; and

11 (2) Obtained an original license to practice as a
12 registered nurse by examination with a passing score as set by
13 the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc.; and

14 (3) Been duly licensed and holding an active license as a
15 registered nurse in one or more states or territories of the
16 United States, or in the District of Columbia, and having no
17 disciplinary action pending and no prior disciplinary
18 proceedings which concluded by disciplining the applicant.

19 **B. Interim licenses.** In the case of an applicant holding a
20 license from another state or territory, based upon a rescore by such
21 state or territory of the nursing examination taken by such applicant,
22 whose original score would have not been passing under the
23 standards of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc.,
24 the Board shall issue an interim license to such applicant to practice
25 as a registered nurse on Guam for a period of one (1) year, subject to
26 the conditions that such applicant must:

1 (1) Have five (5) years continuous nursing practice in one
2 or more states or territories immediately preceding the
3 application for endorsement to practice on Guam;

4 (2) Be duly licensed and hold an active license as a
5 registered nurse in one or more states or territories of the
6 United States, or in the District of Columbia, and have no
7 disciplinary action pending and no prior disciplinary
8 proceedings which concluded by disciplining the applicant; and

9 (3) Within one (1) year from the date of the issuance of
10 the interim license, take and pass the approved examination
11 for registered nurses with the passing score set by the National
12 Council of State Boards of Nursing, Inc.; provided, however,
13 that if the applicant takes the examination and the results
14 thereof have not been received within the one (1) year period,
15 then the interim license shall remain in effect until the Board
16 reports whether the applicant has passed or failed the
17 examination.

18 After passing the examination as required in paragraph (3) above,
19 the Board shall grant the applicant a full license to practice as a
20 registered nurse on Guam."

PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens and Cultural Affairs conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, December 28, 1993, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the Public Hearing Room of the Temporary Legislative Building in Agana. Senator Elizabeth P. Arriola, Chairperson of the Committee, conducted the hearing and attended by Senators John P. Aguon, J. George Bamba and Felix P. Camacho.

PURPOSE

Bill No. 599 is designed to include the National Association of Retired Federal Employee' participation on the Guam Council on Senior Citizens.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONIES

Mr. John Phillips, past president of the local chapter of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees (NARFE), and other NARFE members testified in support of Bill No. 599. The group told the Committee that having a representative of their organization in the Guam Council of Senior Citizens would give legal recognition to a large group of retirees, and ensures that the voice of this group will be heard through its appointed representative.

Mr. Jose Perez, Chairman of the Guam Council on Senior Citizens and current District Director of the American Association of Retired Persons and Mr. Alfred Rios, president of the local chapter of AARP, testified in support of Bill No. 599. They, too, recommend that AARP be included in the membership of the Guam Council of Senior Citizens.

Ms. Julie Ann Blaz, Director, Volunteers are Important People, recommended that additional membership to the Council should be accomplished by increasing the at-large membership, all to be appointed by the Governor.

There being no further testimony, Chairperson Arriola adjourned the hearing on Bill No. 599.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens and Cultural Affairs finds that the Council on Senior Citizens provide a forum for exchange of ideas and discussion of the needs and problems of the manamkos. By making membership more inclusive so that more divergent views can be heard, the more comprehensive will be the product and the work of the Council. By giving legal recognition of the local chapters of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees and the American Association of Retired Persons to become members of the Council, it will change the Council composition to reflect representation of a large group of retirees and senior citizens, and ensures that the voice of these groups will be heard through their appointed representatives.

The Committee hereby recommends to the Twenty-Second Guam Legislature to do pass Bill No. 599, as substituted.

11 **Section 2.** 8105 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:
12 "There is established within the division of Guam Council on Senior Citizens The
13 Council shall function consistent with §8106 of this chapter and pursuant to the
14 federal guidelines contained under Section 10, a (3) of Title III of the Old


My Name is John M Phillips, a domicile of Guam and a voting resident of Santa Rita. I am the immediate Past President of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees:

The addition of a member of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees to the Guam Senior Citizens Council will provide representation of the Federal Retiree on the Council and make the Council more representative of the retiree community on Guam.

The National Association of Retired Federal Employees is a national organization of over one-half million senior citizens. On Guam the dues paying membership is over 200 and it is believed that there are over 2000 retired Federal employees on Guam. The Federal Government is the second largest employer of civilians on Guam after the Government of Guam.

Currently this group of retirees is not officially recognized by membership on the Senior Citizens Council. The federal retiree has unique needs that the council has currently not addressed. The inclusion of a member of the National Association of Retired Federal Employees on the Senior Citizens Council will be of mutual benefit to both groups. The council will be able to serve better a large portion of the senior citizens on Guam and the Senior Citizens Council can help the National Association of Retired Federal Employees members by helping them maintain their entitlements from the Federal government.

**AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 8105 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED
TO AUTHORIZE THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF RETIRED FEDERAL
EMPLOYEES' PARTICIPATION ON THE GUAM COUNCIL ON SENIOR
CITIZENS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1: Legislative Intent. The National Association of Retired Federal Employees is a national organization whose membership numbers more than one-half million (500,000), two hundred of which comprises Guam's NARFE chapter. The federal civil service represents the second largest employer on Guam next to the government of Guam and the the Legislature finds the substantial number of local federal retirees warrants its inclusion and comparable representation as provided for each entity of the Council. Such legal recognition will insure participation by a large segment of the Senior Citizen community not presently directly represented.

Section 2. 8105 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated is amended to read: "There is established within the division of Guam Council on Senior Citizens The Council shall function consistent with §8106 of this chapter and pursuant to the federal guidelines contained under Section 10, a (3) of Title III of the Old American Act of 1965 , as amended. The Council shall consist of (fifteen) (15) (sixteen (16)) fifty-percent (50%) of whom shall be at least fifty-five years or older, appointed by the Governor. The members shall be so selected that there be representatives from each of following entities as indicated;

- (a) District Governmental Council - one (1) member;
- (b) Guam Association of Retired Persons - one (1) member;
- (c) Southern Region Community - two (2) members;
- (d) Central Region Community- two (2) members;
- (e) Northern Region Community- two (2) members;
- ((f) National Association of Retired Federal Employees - one

(1) member)
