


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §26010.1 TO TITLE XXVII OF
THE GOVERNMENT CODE, TO PERMIT PRIVATE
INDIVIDUALS AND NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS
TO CONTRACT FOR THE MAINTENANCE AND
UPKEEP OF PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES
UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DEPARTMENT
OF PARKS AND RECREATION, AND TO APPROVE

THE PLAN FOR THE SUMMER YOUTH
EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, it is recognized that there is limited manpower within the
2 Department of Parks and Recreation to adequately satisfy the demand of
3 quality maintenance of parks and recreational facilities; and

4 WHEREAS, it will therefore be in the best interests of the community to
5 have the Department of Parks and Recreation augmented by providing the
6 opportunity to responsible individuals, families or non-profit organizations
7 to care for the local parks and recreational facilities through contractual
8 arrangements; now, therefore,

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

10 Section 1. §26010.1 is added to Title XXVII of the Government Code of
11 Guam to read as follows:

12 "§26010.1. (a) Department of Parks and Recreation facility
13 maintenance. The Department of Parks and Recreation (the
14 "Department") may contract for the maintenance and upkeep of its
15 recreational facilities with responsible persons and organizations
16 under the provisions of this section. "Maintenance and upkeep" for
17 purposes of this section is defined as follows:

- 18 (1) Collection and disposal of rubbish and trash;
- 19 (2) Mowing and upkeep of lawns and grassy areas;
- 20 (3) Removal of weeds and trimming of paths;
- 21 (4) Maintenance of pitching mounds, dugouts and bleachers;
- 22 (5) Maintenance of light fixtures within building areas;
- 23 (6) Dragging and rolling of baseball fields;
- 24 (7) Trimming of shrubbery;

1 (8) Removal of water, debris and other substances from the
2 surfaces of tennis and basketball courts;

3 (9) Maintenance of toilets, showers, wash basins, urinals and
4 floors of restroom areas;

5 (10) Removal of trash and debris from parking lots that service
6 parks and recreational facilities;

7 (11) Beautification of parks and grounds of recreational
8 facilities including, but not limited to the planting of flowers and
9 trees;

10 (12) Maintenance of community centers which house
11 recreational activities.

12 Each maintenance and upkeep contract shall be between the
13 Department and a person, family or non-profit organization. The
14 Department shall award such contracts to the parties that can most
15 effectively carry out their terms, the ability to satisfy the terms, costs
16 and conditions of the contract being the primary basis for awarding
17 the contract.

18 Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this section, each
19 contract shall be let by competitive bidding, as defined by the
20 Department in its regulations, and shall include but not be limited to
21 the following:

- 22 (1) Duration of contract;
- 23 (2) Public facilities included under the contract;
- 24 (3) Names of all individuals performing the contract;
- 25 (4) Complete description of duties;
- 26 (5) Amount of contract;
- 27 (6) Date of completion of the contract; and

1 (7) Provision for the cancellation of contract on non-
2 performance.

3 The Office of the Attorney General shall assist in preparing
4 such contracts. The Director of Parks and Recreation (the
5 "Director") shall, in the Department's annual budget, include the
6 necessary sums to implement the provisions of this section. The
7 Department, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, shall
8 promulgate rules and regulations governing procedures under this
9 section, including but not limited to competitive bidding procedures.

10 (b) For contracts not exceeding Twenty Thousand Dollars
11 (\$20,000) in total payments to the contractor, the Director may waive
12 the competitive bid requirement, the posting of any performance
13 bond, the provision of workmen's compensation insurance, and the
14 payment of gross receipts tax; provided, that in any contract granted
15 pursuant to this subparagraph (b), no advance payment shall be
16 permitted, payment to be made only upon completion of work under
17 the contract.

18 (c) Any contractor under this section shall hold harmless the
19 government of Guam, the Department, and any of its employees
20 from liability arising from violation of any wage or hour or child
21 labor law."

22 **Section 2. Approval of Summer Youth Plan.** The Guam Legislature
23 does hereby on behalf of the people of Guam approve of and concur in the
24 1993 Summer Youth Employment and Training Program Plan submitted to
25 the Legislature on April 2, 1993 by the Governor of Guam, with each Senator
26 of the Legislature being allotted six (6) summer youth employees for work at
27 the Legislature or elsewhere.

PREFACE

A public hearing on **Bill 136** was held by the Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens and Cultural Affairs at 4 p.m. Wednesday, March 3, 1993 in the Public Hearing Room of the Temporary Legislative Building in Agana.

Present at the hearing were Chairperson, Senator Elizabeth P. Arriola and attended by Senators David L.G. Shimizu, Felix Camacho and Doris F. Brooks.

TESTIMONY RECEIVED

The Committee received oral testimony from Department of Parks and Recreation Director Tony Mariano and Deputy Director Dennis Zermeno and written testimony from Mangilao resident Ronald D. Smith. Mariano testified that the issue of subcontracting park maintenance is one frequently addressed and that the Department embraces any and all efforts to help maintain public parks. Mariano said the Department often comes under fire for public parks being an "eyesore" but that the department cannot adequately maintain Guam parks despite its consistent maintenance schedule. He questioned why the responsibility of beach maintenance was transferred to the Department from that of the Guam Visitor's Bureau.

• Mangilao resident Ronald D. Smith, executive director of the Guam Rehabilitation Training Center, testified in support of **Bill 136** but recommended giving non-profit organizations, whose members predominantly are people with disabilities, the edge in consideration in the awarding of contracts by the Department of Parks and Recreation. Smith proposed the deletion of any reference of preference -- Line 16, Page 2 -- to guard

against any semblance of preference hierarchy. Smith suggests that hiring be left at the discretion of the Department.

There being no further testimony, Chairperson Elizabeth P. Arriola adjourned the public hearing on **Bill 136** at 4.05 p.m.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

The Committee on Youth, Senior Citizens and Cultural Affairs finds that the desired quality in the maintenance of our public parks can be realized by the Department of Parks and Recreation if its existing park maintenance duties are augmented with services rendered independent of the Department. Such services can be secured without semblance of impropriety or preferential consideration through a contractual arrangement between the Department and with families, private individuals or non-profit organizations, groups with the awarding of the contract to be based on the contractor's ability to meet the terms and conditions of the contract.

(c) Each maintenance and upkeep contract shall be between the Department of Parks and Recreation and the individual, families and/or non-profit organizations upon certification by the Village Mayor, in accordance with and limited to the following preferences;

(1) First preference shall be given to persons residing within the Municipality where the subject park and recreational facilities are located and whose income does not exceed the limits established for a low-income family or a head of a household, as defined by the United States Internal Revenue Code.

(2) Second Preference shall be given to a person or persons residing within the Municipality and nearest to the subject park and recreational facilities.

(3) Third preference shall be given to non-profit organizations.

(d) Each contract shall be let by competitive bidding and shall specify the following:

- (1) duration of contract;
- (2) public facilities included under the contract;
- (3) name of all individuals performing the contract;
- (4) complete description of duties;
- (5) amount of contract; and
- (6) date of completion of the contract.

(e) The Office of the Attorney General shall assist in preparing the contracts under Subsection (c) herein.

(f) The Director of Parks and Recreation shall, in its annual budget, include the necessary amount to implement the purposes of this Act."
