AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF A CERTAIN PARCEL OF GOVERNMENT LAND SITUATED IN MANGILAO, MUNICIPALITY OF BARRIGADA, TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM, TO AUTHORIZE AN EASEMENT ACROSS SUCH PROPERTY, AND TO PERMIT A CONDITIONAL USE OF THE PROPOSED SITE OF THE PACIFIC BIBLE COLLEGE; AND TO ADD §75104.1 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO TRANSFER LOT NO. 237-6-1,

AGAÑA, TO THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: 1 2 **Section 1. Legislative statement.** The government of Guam owns Lot No. 5372-3A, situated in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, said to 3 contain an area of 42,752 square meters, as delineated on LM Drawing No. 4 C4-671-5 (the "Mangilao Lot"). The Mangilao Lot is conveniently situated in 5 6 the immediate vicinity of the University of Guam (the "University"). The University continues to experience an unprecedented annual enrollment 7 8 growth of fourteen percent. This growth has necessitated adjustments to the 9 University's Physical Master Plan in its classroom, faculty, and support capacities. The current student enrollment of 3,800 is a signal that the 10 11 University must plan to have adequate learning facilities in the very near future. Acquisition of sufficient properties is needed to allow for expansion of 12 its facilities in anticipation of projected enrollments of 5,000 in 1996 and 7,000 13 by the year 2000. 14 15 The Executive Branch has indicated its intention to reserve the 16 Mangilao Lot for the use of the University. At the time the Legislature was considering which government lots were to be reserved for future use by 17 18 government agencies and departments, the Mangilao Lot was not made part 19 of the legislative action which concluded as Public Law 22-18 because of the impending adoption of a resolution supporting reservation of the land by the 20 University's Board of Regents. 21 22 Now the Board of Regents has come forward to seek use of the

Mangilao Lot for dormitories and other facilities as part of the University's

Master Plan implementation. The Legislature supports the University's

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efforts to expand its educational programs and facilities and finds that the Mangilao Lot is needed for that purpose.

Section 2. Authorization to transfer. For the purpose of building international student dormitories, fine arts facilities, international studies centers and additional classrooms, the Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to grant to the University of Guam, in fee simple, all the right, title and interest of the government of Guam in the Mangilao Lot.

Section 3. Conditions of grant. The transfer of the interest of the government of Guam in the Mangilao Lot to the University of Guam is expressly subject to the condition subsequent that in the event it is determined that the Mangilao Lot is no longer used by the University for university-related purposes, the government of Guam shall have the right to re-enter the the Mangilao Lot after recorded notice to such effect and the University shall convey by Quitclaim Deed all its right, title and interest in the Mangilao Lot to the government of Guam upon demand. As used herein, "university-related purposes" shall include the construction of international student dormitories, fine arts facilities, international studies centers and additional classrooms. The Governor of Guam shall include, in any deed effecting the transfer of the Mangilao Lot to the University of Guam, a clause to such effect.

Section 4. Authorization to grant an easement. For the purpose of access and utility easements to the planned site of the Pacific Island Bible College, the University is hereby authorized to grant to Liebenzell Mission-Guam, a non-profit corporation, at fair market value, an easement forty feet (40') in width to provide underground utilities and access to the Pacific Island Bible College over the Mangilao Lot.

Section 5. Conditional use granted. Conditional use is hereby granted to Liebenzell Mission-Guam to utilize Lot No. 5396-R5-NEW-3, Mangilao, for the construction and operation of a non-profit private bible college.

Section 6. §75104.1 is hereby added to Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§75104.1. **Transfer of Lot No. 237-6-1, Agaña.** The Governor shall transfer to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission administrative control of Lot No. 237-6-1, Agaña, which contains an area of 100± square meters and is within Lot 9, Block 9, Agaña, as depicted on sheet 2 of Drawing P-384, recorded in the Department of Land Management as a part of Instrument No. 20083."

November 21, 1994

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Housing and Community Development scheduled a Public Hearing on August 25, 1994 at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, Temporary Legislative Building, Agana, Guam. Public notice was published in the Pacific Daily News on August 24, 1994.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Department of Land Management testified that it recognizes the projected growth of the University of Guam and, therefore, it supports the intent of the Bill. Without the additional land, it would be difficult for the University to implement its Master Plan.

Dr. Nededog read testimony signed by J.U. Torres, Chairman, Board of Regents, University of Guam.

The Board of Regents, University of Guam, supports Bill 1126 relative to the transfer of Lot 5372-3A, Mangilao to the University.

The University of Guam is the only nationally accredited four-year higher education institution in the Western Pacific serving more three million square miles of area. The University belongs to the people of Guam and is the institutional home for an ever-increasing student population. Student enrollment for the fall semester 1994 was some 4,101. Because of this accelerated growth, it is projected that the student population will be over 7,000 by year 2000. This anticipated growth has necessitated adjustments to the classrooms, dormitories and support facilities of their Physical Master Plan.

The immediate concern of the Board of Regents and the University administration is the acquisition of of sufficient properties adjacent to the main campus to allow for the needed expansion of the facilities. The parcel of land identified as Lot 5372-3A, Mangilao, comprising of approximately ten acres is adjacent to the University of Guam and is part of the overall Physical Master Plan for expansion. This land acquisition is authorized by the Board of Regents as substantiated in Resolution No. 94-4 (copy attached).

III. FINDING AND RECOMMENDATION

The University of Guam and Department of Land Management both support transferring Lot No. 5372-3A in Mangilao to UOG. The University proposed that the land will be used to site dormitories for international students, a fine arts and international studies facilities and additional classrooms.

In a related matter, Liebenzell Mission-Guam, a non-profit Guam corporation, is the owner of Lot No. 5396-R5-NEW-3, Mangilao, containing 4,200 square meters, more or less. It was zoned "A Rural" so the corporation sought a zone of "R2 Multiple Dwelling" through the Fast Track Review Process. Extensive opposition to the bible college's proposed location was raised by residents in the Mariano Road area. The identification by PIBC of government-owned Lot No. 5372-3A, containing some 42,752 square meters and located closer to the UoG campus, resulted in a proposal to exchange the northeastern portion of the government lot with the private lot on an area-for-area basis.

The Committee finds that the efforts of the organizers of the Pacific Island Bible College have been extensive. They purchased a lot on Mariano Road in Mangilao because it was in close proximity to the University of Guam. Their curriculum strategy includes reliance on general education courses offered at the University of Guam, thus the need to locate their college nearby. They have invested over \$74,000 for a feasibility study, land survey, land appraisal, rezoning package, impact engineering analysis, and engineering architectural design.

At the June 29, 1993 Committee public hearing, the Committee was apprised of the University of Guam's intention of securing Lot No. 5372-3A for development of a housing project for faculty and staff. The Committee was not convinced that this land exchange proposal would hinder that particular project. The Committee, on the other hand, wants to assist PIBC to avoid any further losses than necessary. The Committee has information that PIBC lost several sponsors, including one which committed \$300,000. Additional costs will be incurred for studies on the exchanged site and the time delay while the land exchange transaction is undertaken will be approximately one year.

Subsequent discussions between Chairman Reyes and University officials concluded in a compromise that Lot 5372-3A will be transferred to the University of Guam to facilitate expansion of programs and facilities in anticipation of additional student enrollment, now at the rate of fourteen (14%). After re-evaluating its initial plan to build staff housing, officials now feel higher priority must be assigned to other needs. According to the University, this lot most likely will be the site of international student

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dormitories, fine arts facilities, international studies centers and additional classrooms. In addition, the Committee recommends that the transfer of said Lot shall include a provision for the University to lease to Liebenzell Mission-Guam a portion of Lot 5372-3A for access and utility easements to the planned site of Pacific Island Bible College, Lot No. 5396-R5-NEW-3.

The Committee on Housing and Community Development to which was referred Bill No. 1126 - " An Act to Authorize the Transfer of a Certain Parcel of Government Land Situated in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, to the University of Guam." - does hereby submit its findings and recommendation to the Twenty-Second Guam Legislature "TO DO PASS" Bill No. 1126, as amended by the Committee.

The University of Guam is the only nationally accredited four-year higher education institution in the Western Pacific serving more than three million square miles of area. The University belongs to the people of Guam and is the institutional home for an ever increasing student population.

As of 5:00 p.m. yesterday, the student enrollment for the fall semester 1994 was 4,101. Because of this accelerated growth, it is projected that the student population at the University will be over 7,000 by year 2000. This anticipated growth has necessitated adjustments to the classrooms, dormitories and support facilities of our Physical Master Plan.

The immediate concern of the Board of Regents and the University administration is the acquisition of sufficient properties adjacent to the main campus to allow for the needed expansion of the university facilities.

The parcel of land identified as Lot 5372-3A, Mangilao comprising of approximately ten (10) acres is adjacent to the University of Guam and is part of the overall Physical Master Plan for expansion. This land acquisition is authorized by the Board of Regents as substantiated in Resolution No. 94-4. A copy of the Resolution is attached to this testimony.

I cannot overemphasize to the committee the need for the transfer of lot 5372-3A, Mangilao to the University of Guam. The transfer is critical if the University is to expand its facilities to accommodate the demands of an ever increasing student population as we approach the Twenty-First Century.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF A CERTAIN PARCEL OF GOVERNMENT LAND SITUATED IN MANGILAO, MUNICIPALITY OF BARRIGADA, TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE STATEMENT. The government of Guam owns
Lot No. 5372-3A, situated in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, said to contain an
area of 42,752 square meters, as delineated on LM Drawing No. C4-67T-5. This lot is
most conveniently and desirably situated in the immediate vicinity of the University of
Guam.

The University continues to experience an unprecedented annual enrollment growth of fourteen percent (14%). This growth has necessitated adjustments to the University's Physical Master Plan in its classroom, faculty, and support capacities.

The current student enrollment of 3,800 is a signal that the University must plan to have adquate learning facilities in the very near future. Acquisition of sufficient properties is needed to allow for expansion of its facilities in anticipation of projected enrollments of 5,000 in 1996 and 7,000 students by the year 2000.

The Executive Branch has indicated its intention to reserve said lot for the use of the University. At the time the Guam Legislature was considering which government lots were to be reserved for future use by government agencies and departments, this 1 particular lot was not made part of the legislative action which concluded as Public

2 Law 22-18 because of the impending adoption of a resolution supporting reservation of

3 the land by the University of Guam Board.

Now the Board has come forward formally seeking use of the property for dormitories and other facilities as part of the University's Master Plan implementation.

6 The Legislature supports the University's efforts to expand its educational programs

and facilities and finds that Lot 5372-3A is needed for that purpose.

SECTION 2. AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSFER. For the purpose of building international student dormitories, fine arts facilities, international studies centers and additional classrooms, the Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to transfer to the University of Guam, in fee simple, all the rights, title and interest of the government of Guam in that parcel of land designated as Lot No. 5372-3A, situated in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, said to contain an area of 42,752 square meters, as delineated on LM Drawing No. C4-67T-5.

SECTION 3. CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER. The transfer of the interest of the government of Guam in the property to the University of Guam is expressly subject to the condition subsequent that in the event it is determined that the property is no longer used by the University for university-related purposes, the government of Guam shall have the right to re-enter the property after notice of record to such effect and the University shall convey by Quitclaim Deed all its right, title and interest in the property to the government of Guam upon demand. As used herein, university-related purposes shall include without limitation, the construction of international student dormitories, fine arts facilities, international studies centers and additional classrooms. The Governor of Guam shall include, in any deed effecting the transfer of the property to the University of Guam, a clause to this effect.
