Dear Mr. Speaker:

Enclosed is Bill No. 13, which I have signed into law.

GPA has had a standing policy of some time of responding favorably in situations where appliances have been ruined through actions attributable to GPA, but I am glad to sign this bill into law in order to permanize that policy. People have a right to expect good and reliable power, free from spikes, surges and drop-offs that can wreak havoc with machinery of various types. Although we are all aware that GPA faces special challenges since it operates a power system that must stand alone, this just means GPA must rise to the occasion. If redundancy of systems and excess capacity of systems is required to ensure reliability, than that is what must be. We must be willing as well to pay for that reliability.

This law simply underscores how serious we are about that, and I am pleased to enact it, and send a strong message about our expectations. Thank you and the members of your body for their assistance.







AN ACT TO ADD §8120 TO TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO MAKE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY LIABLE FOR DAMAGES CAUSED TO APPLIANCES AND CONSUMERS AS A RESULT OF POWER SURGES OR FLUCTUATIONS IN VOLTAGE OR FREQUENCY IN ELECTRIC POWER SUPPLIED BY THE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY; AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM SECTION 2 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 20-39 FOR

INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE
TALOFOFO SUBDIVISION.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative findings.** The Legislature has received numerous
3 complaints about ruined appliances resulting from power surges. The
4 Legislature finds that there is a continuing problem with consumers with
5 ruined appliances and electrical equipment as a result of power surges and
6 fluctuations with voltage over Guam Power Authority lines. The Legislature
7 finds that this situation is totally unacceptable. The consumers have no
8 control over the quality of power delivered by the Guam Power Authority (the
9 "Authority"). Control over power voltages and power frequency (60 mhz) is
10 strictly in the hands of the Authority. Despite this, the Authority takes the
11 position that it is the responsibility of the consumers to provide elaborate
12 voltage control devices and power conditioning units to protect refrigerators,
13 air conditioners, televisions, VCR's, and other electrical appliances. The
14 consumers of the Authority are entitled to quality, reliable power and should
15 not be required to bear the costs of damage caused by voltage and frequency
16 fluctuations nor should they be required to buy voltage and frequency
17 regulators which in some cases cost more than some of the appliances they
18 are designed to protect. The Legislature further finds that this problem is
19 unique to Guam among the states and territories of the United States, and
20 that the people of Guam, as Americans, are entitled to the same quality of
21 electrical power as in the United States mainland. The Legislature also finds
22 that the Authority should bear the cost of damage to electrical appliances
23 caused by the Authority's negligence.

24 **Section 2.** §8120 is added to Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, to read as
25 follows:

1 **"§8120. Authority liable for damage.** The Authority shall be liable for
2 damage caused to electrical appliances and devices when such damage is
3 proximately caused by power surges, voltages fluctuations or frequency
4 fluctuations in the power supplied by the Authority to a consumer and when
5 such damage is not a result of any negligence on the part of the consumer and
6 is not a result of an otherwise defective appliance or electrical device.

7 **Except** for computer equipment or equipment for which the
8 manufacturer recommends that a voltage protection device, surge protector,
9 or power conditioning device be installed by the consumer, the Authority may
10 not require the use of voltage protection devices, surge protectors or power
11 conditioners and may not raise the failure to use such devices as a defense to
12 claims for damages arising out of voltage or frequency fluctuations or power
13 surges. In establishing liability for damages pursuant to this section, the
14 consumer need only prove that the appliance or electrical device was
15 damaged by a variation of voltage or a variation of frequency or a surge in
16 power supplied by the Authority. The Authority may raise as an affirmative
17 defense proof that the appliance or electrical device in question was defective
18 or that the fluctuation of voltage or frequency or power surge was not caused
19 by the Authority but was in fact caused by the consumer's electrical wiring
20 system or devices or equipment belonging to the consumer. It shall be an
21 affirmative defense for the Authority to establish that the quality of power
22 delivered to the consumer's meter was satisfactory.

23 Any consumer claiming damages from the Authority who relies upon
24 the provisions of this section must file such a claim with the Authority within
25 ninety (90) days of the date of the alleged damage. Otherwise, except for the
26 shortened period in which to make a claim, the procedures contained in the
27 Government of Guam Claims Act shall apply to claims brought pursuant to

1 this section to the extent not otherwise inconsistent herewith. This section
2 shall be effective only as to damages occurring after the date that this section
3 becomes law."

4 **Section 3. Appropriation for Talofoto subdivision from previous**
5 **appropriation.** Two Million Three Hundred Ten Thousand Seven Hundred
6 Eighty-Nine Dollars (\$2,310,789) are hereby appropriated from the
7 appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in
8 Section 2 of Public Law No. 20-39 in order to fund the following
9 infrastructure improvement projects for the Talofoto Subdivision (Land for
10 the Landless):

11	(i) Road construction, clearing and grubbing grading	
12	(cut and fill); providing 6" thick base course and	
13	compact:	\$ 298,415,
14	(ii) Installation of RC pipe drainage, catch basins	
15	and concrete valley gutters on both sides of	
16	the roads:	983,110,
17	(iii) Asphaltic cement paving, applying a 2" thick	
18	asphaltic concrete pavement approximately	
19	16,911' long and 24' wide:	604,140,
20	(iv) Construction of ponding basin at 7 locations	
21	as shown on the plan:	<u>215,052,</u>
22	Total direct costs:	\$2,100,717,
23	10% contingency:	<u>210,072,</u>
24	Total costs:	\$2,310,789.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTRICAL POWER AND CONSUMER PROTECTION ON BILL NO. 13: (AS SUBSTITUTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTRICAL POWER AND CONSUMER PROTECTION) AN ACT TO MAKE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY LIABLE FOR DAMAGES CAUSED TO APPLICANCIES AND ELECTRICAL CONSUMERS AS A RESULT OF POWER SURGES OR FLUCTUATIONS IN VOLTAGE OR FREQUENCY IN GPA SUPPLIED POWER BY ADDING A NEW 12 GCA 8119.

PREFACE

The Committee on Electrical Power and Consumer Protection conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, February 2, at 1:30 p.m., in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, Guam Legislature Temporary Building, 155 Hesler Street, Agana, Guam on BILL NO. 13: (AS SUBSTITUTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTRICAL POWER AND CONSUMER PROTECTION) AN ACT TO MAKE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY LIABLE FOR DAMAGES CAUSED TO APPLICANCIES AND ELECTRICAL CONSUMERS AS A RESULT OF POWER SURGES OR FLUCTUATIONS IN VOLTAGE OR FREQUENCY IN GPA SUPPLIED POWER BY ADDING A NEW 12 GCA 8119. The Committee Members present at the hearing include: Senator Don Parkinson, Chairman; Senator Thomas Ada, Vice-Chairman; Senator Madeliene Bordallo, member; Senator George Bamba, member; Senator Vicente Pangelinan, member; Senator Antonio Unpingco, member; Senator Doris F. Brooks, member; Senator Anthony Blaz, member, and Senator Ted Nelson.

TESTIMONY

Mr. Andriano Balajadia, Acting General Manager, Guam Power Authority, submitted written testimony which is listed as Exhibit "A". Mr. Balajadia stated that Guam Power Authority is opposed to Bill No. 13 and believes that there are errors in the findings and has questioned some of the findings, in addition to that GPA believes that the existing system, procedures are in place are working. Further into Mr. Balajadia's testimony GPA provided statistics consisting of various types of complaints towards GPA for various reasons. Mr. Balajadia explained that surges are caused by "lighting, motors starting and stopping, contact with power lines by tree branches or car/pole or guy wire accidents, and various processes such as welding. Mr. Balajadia finds that problems with power quality and power surges are not unique to Guam, and that there are no power transmission or distribution systems that are immune to switching surges caused by nature, accidents or normal utility operations meaning capacitor switching, protective breaker opening/closing." During the public hearing Senator Bordallo asked Mr. Balajadia to further explain how complaints towards Guam Power Authority are processed. Mr. Balajadia answered that Customers are asked to: Fill out a claim form which includes information on the Vendor of whom the appliance was purchased from, the date of purchase, the

amount it was purchased for and the serial or model number of the appliance. When the customer provides only information on the Vender and the serial or model number, GPA would: 1. call the vender whom would provide the date of purchase, type of model and amount of purchase. 2. GPA investigates the complaint to determine the cause and extent of the damage, when needed an engineer from GPA will be sent out to the home to further the investigation. 3. A report is reviewed which would determine whether surges did occur during the period of complaint. 4. When the claim is finally determined that in fact the fault lies upon GPA, the customer is then given the payment for the depreciation amount of cost for the appliance.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Electrical Power and Consumer Protection finds **BILL NO. 13: (AS SUBSTITUTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON ELECTRICAL POWER AND CONSUMER PROTECTION) AN ACT TO MAKE GUAM POWER AUTHORITY LIABLE FOR DAMAGES CAUSED TO APPLICANCIES AND ELECTRICAL CONSUMERS AS A RESULT OF POWER SURGES OR FLUCTUATIONS IN VOLTAGE OR FREQUENCY IN GPA SUPPLIED POWER BY ADDING A NEW 12 GCA 8119**, will resolve the current continuing problem with consumers with ruined appliances and electrical equipment as a result of power surges and fluctuations with voltage over the Guam Power Authority Lines. The People of Guam are entitled to the same quality of electrical power as the United States mainland and also finds that the Guam Power Authority bear the costs of damages caused to electrical appliances caused by the Guam Power Authority's negligence. Therefore, the Committee on Electrical Power and Consumer Protection recommends that Bill No. 13 as substituted be the Committee on Electrical Power and Consumer Protection be passed by the 22nd Guam Legislature.

BILL NO. 13

The Guam Power Authority (GPA) is opposed to Bill No. 13, An Act To Make GPA Liable For Damages Caused To Appliances Ad (and) Electrical Consumers As A Result of Power Surges or Fluctuations in Voltage or Frequency in GPA Supplied Power By Adding a New 12 GCA 8119. GPA disagrees with several of the legislative findings.

First, GPA does not have total control over power surges. Surges are caused by lightning, motors starting and stopping, contact with power lines by tree branches or car/pole or guy wire accidents, and various processes such as welding.

Second, the problems with power quality and power surges are not unique to Guam. There are no power transmission or distribution systems that are immune to switching surges caused by nature, accidents or normal utility operations (capacitor switching, protective breaker opening/closing.)

At present, GPA is liable for damages proximately caused by negligence. See Perez v. GPA, DCA Civil Case 84-0063A, Opinion filed circa 1985. GPA possibly may also be liable in contract for breach of its service rules, approved by the PUC, Section 2(A) (4), requiring it to provide voltages at nominal levels within acceptable industry limits as defined in American National Standard No. C84.


GPA has a procedure which addresses customer claims for equipment damages. We believe that we have an appropriate system; we are providing the Committee statistics which demonstrates that the present procedure works well.

Bill 13(LS) would appear to shift the burden of proof to GPA, once a consumer establishes an appliance or device was damaged by a variation of voltage or frequency, or a surge in power supplied by GPA. Under the bill, GPA may raise as an affirmative defense proof the appliance or device in question was defective, or the fluctuation of voltage or frequency or power surge was not caused by GPA but was in fact caused by the consumer's electrical wiring system or devices or equipment. Further, it would be an affirmative defense for GPA to establish the quality of power delivered to the consumer's meter was satisfactory.

This bill does not define what is a "defective" appliance or device nor what is "satisfactory" quality of power.

Also, in the time available, we have not been able to determine whether this bill, in view of possible increases in costs affecting revenue requirements, constitutes a breach of the GPA 92 Bond Issue Series A covenants or those of the Fuji lease, or, likewise, intrudes on the prerogatives of the PUC in a prohibited manner in violation of any covenant restrictions.
