AN ACT PROVIDING FUNDING FOR THE RECOVERY OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FROM DAMAGE DONE BY THE EARTHQUAKE OF AUGUST 8, 1993, AMENDING 12 GCA GHURA TO TO AUTHORIZE REPAIR ITS §5104 FACILITIES AND REPLACE GUMA IFIL, AMENDING 12 AUTHORIZE §4103 TO GUAM HOUSING GCA TO CERTAIN MAKE LOANS CORPORATION TO EARTHQUAKE VICTIMS, CREATING THE "RAINY DAY FUND", AND AUTHORIZING A GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND TO BE USED FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A CAPITOL BUILDING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Chapter 1

Legislative Finding. On August 8, 1993 Guam 2 Section 1. suffered an earthquake with a magnitude of 8.2 on the Richter 3 Scale. As a result commercial buildings, residences and government 4 owned infrastructure and buildings were damaged. Most of the 5 damaged buildings and infrastructure are covered by insurance. The 6 Small Business Administration is available to assist owners and 7 renters of residences and businesses with low interest loans. The 8 Department of Transportation is available to reimburse funds 9 expended for repair of bridges and highways. The U. S. Department 10 of Labor is available to fund temporary employment for laid off 11 The U. S. Navy has assisted in repair of many of the 12 workers. As a result it is unnecessary to seek a Presidential 13 schools. Declaration of a Disaster. However, it is necessary to make funds 14 available to effectuate repair and replacement of public buildings 15 and infrastructure and authorize Guam Housing Corporation to make 16

loans to homeowners who do not qualify for Small Business Adminis tration loans.

Section 2. The Governor may expend no more than Fifteen 3 Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) of the available balance of the 4 Legislature Capital Improvement Fund aka Legislative Building Fund 5 6 which are hereby appropriated for the purpose of recovering from 7 the earthquake. The funds may be expended for repair and replacement of buildings and infrastructure damaged by the earthquake. 8 9 The funds may also be expended for any necessary architectural and engineering services for public buildings and infrastructure and 10 for diagnostic services necessary for the water and sewer system. 11 12 The Certifying Officer for expenditures made pursuant to this 13 appropriation shall be the Director of the Bureau of Budget and 14 Management Research; provided, that notice of all such expenditures 15 shall be delivered to the Speaker of the Legislature by the end of the month in which the expenditures are made. For purposes of 16 17 making urgent repairs the Governor may use not more than Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000) of any available cash in any fund of 18 19 the Government of Guam as long as it is replenished from the General Fund no later than December 31, 1993. 20

Section 3. Any unencumbered funds as of March 31, 1994 of the appropriation made in Section 2 of this Act and any funds paid to the government of Guam by the Department of Transportation to reimburse expenditures for road and bridge repairs necessitated by the earthquake shall be deposited in the "Rainy Day Fund" created in Chapter 3 of this Act.

Section 4. Pursuant to Item (7) of Subsection (m) of 5 GCA 1 §22430 (as enacted in §2 of Public Law 22-19) any remaining balance 2 3 of bond proceeds not required for the projects listed in items (1) through (6) of Subsection (m) of 5 GCA §22430 and repairing or 4 reconstructing of Inarajan Elementary School shall be expended for 5 6 repairing or reconstructing Ordot-Chalan Pago Elementary School, 7 reconstructing the gymnasium and classrooms at Inarajan High School, repairing or reconstructing Upi Elementary School and 8 repairing or reconstructing any other school. 9 Chapter 2 10 11 Section 5. New items (37) and (38) are added to 12 GCA §5104 to read: 12 13 "(37) provide for the planning, development, construction, lease, improvement, alteration, operation and maintenance of 14 dwellings for the severely mentally ill in consultation with the 15 Director of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse; 16 and 17 (38) expend funds received from the federal government as 18 payments in lieu of taxes (PILOT funds) for the purposes of meeting 19 personnel obligations imposed on the Authority by Public Law 20-215 20 §8; repairing or replacing any facility owned by the Authority 21 which was damaged as a result of the August 8, 1993 earthquake; 22 23 constructing dwellings for severely mentally ill persons (to replace Guma Ifil which was destroyed in the earthquake); and for 24 such other purposes as the Board may from time to time find 25 26 necessary."

A new Article 8 is added to 5 GCA Chapter 22 to read: 10 "Article 8 11 12 Rainy Day Fund §22801. Creation. There is hereby created, separate and 13 apart from other funds of the Government of Guam, a reserve fund 14 15 known as the "Rainy Day Fund." 16 §22802. Separate Fund and Bank Account. The Rainy Day Fund shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other 17 18 fund of the Government of Guam. The Rainy Day Fund shall be 19 maintained in a separate bank account. 20 §22803. Purpose and Expenditures. The Rainy Day Fund 21 shall be expended by appropriation by law for the following 22 purpose: eliminating or reducing any General Fund deficit existing 23 at the end of a fiscal year substantially resulting from an 24 unexpected, substantial decline in revenues received or due to the 25 General Fund caused by a territorial emergency.

Continuous Appropriation. 1 §22804. In addition to 2 special appropriations there is hereby continuously appropriated to the Rainy Day Fund the unencumbered balance of the General Fund at 3 4 the close of business on the last day of each fiscal year commencing on September 30, 1993 (excluding any Section 30 advance 5 6 payment.) The maximum amount of the Rainy Day Fund shall be Twenty 7 Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) and no transfer of funds shall be necessary whenever the fund balance equals Twenty Million Dollars 8 (\$20,000,000). 9

10 §22805. Administration. The Director of the Department 11 of Administration shall account for and administer the Rainy Day 12 Fund. The director shall keep all books, records, files and 13 accounts of the Rainy Day Fund. The Director shall prepare 14 periodic reports relative to the Rainy Day Fund reflecting the 15 transactions and the financial condition of the Rainy Day Fund.

16 §22806. Investment. The Director of Administration 17 shall invest the Rainy Day Fund in any type of investment approved 18 for the Retirement Fund. All proceeds and income from investments 19 of the Rainy Day Fund shall be deposited in the Rainy Day Fund 20 unless the Fund exceeds Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000) in 21 which case the income from investments shall be deposited in the 22 General Fund."

All officers charged by law with any duty in the collection 4 5 of the revenues of the government shall do every lawful thing necessary to collect such sum. The validity of any such bonds 6 shall not be affected by the validity or regularity of any 7 8 proceedings for the implementation of the capital project funded by the bonds. 9

(d) Appropriations from the General Fund. There
are hereby appropriated from the General Fund such sums as will

(g) Form of bonds; covenants; appointment of
fiduciaries. The technical form and language of the bonds,

including provisions for execution, exchange, transfer, registra-1 2 tion, paying agency, lost or mutilated bonds, negotiability , cancellation and other terms or conditions not inconsistent with 3 4 this Section, including covenants relating to the collection of revenues, shall be as specified in the certificate executed by the 5 Governor authorizing the issuance of the bonds. The certificate 6 7 may appoint one (1) or more trustees, co-trustees or other fiduciaries authorized to receive and hold in trust the proceeds of 8 9 the bonds and monies relating thereto, to protect the rights of bondholders and to perform such other duties as may be specified in 10 11 the certificate. The governor is also authorized to execute, on 12 behalf of the government of Guam, any appropriate agreements, 13 certificates or other instruments relating to the bonds and the 14 sale of the bonds.

Authorization for credit enhancement. 15 (h) The 16 Governor is authorized to enter into such contracts or agreements 17 with such banks, insurance companies or other financial institutions as he determines are necessary or desirable to improve the 18 19 security and marketability of the bonds issued under this Section. 20 Such contracts or agreements may contain an obligation to reim-21 burse, with interest, any such banks, insurance companies or other 22 financial institutions for advances used to pay principal of or 23 interest on the bonds. Any such reimbursement obligation shall be 24 a general obligation of the government of Guam, and any such 25 advance, if necessary, shall be treated as creating a reimbursement 26 obligation issued to refund the bonds.

1 (i) Use of proceeds from the sale of the bonds. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds shall be used solely to 2 construct and equip a capitol building, to establish necessary 3 reserves, and to pay expenses relating to the authorization, sale 4 and issuance of the bonds, including, without limitation, printing 5 costs, costs of reproducing documents, bonds insurance premiums, 6 underwriting, legal and accounting fees and charges, fees paid to 7 banks or other financial institutions providing credit enhancement, 8 costs of credit ratings, fees and charges for execution, transpor-9 10 tation and safekeeping of bonds and other costs, charges and fees 11 in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of the bonds.

(j) No personal liability. No employee or elected official of the government of Guam shall be individually or personally liable for the payment of any amounts due on any bonds issued under this Section, or for any other liability arising in connection with the bonds; provided, however, that nothing in this Section shall relieve any employee or elected official from the performance of any ministerial duty required by law."

19 Section 9. Section 8 of this Act shall take effect upon 20 completion of the triennial property tax valuation now underway and 21 a determination that the debt capacity of the government of Guam as 22 limited under Section 11 of the Organic Act of Guam has increased 23 by enough to allow issuance of the bonds for the Northern High 24 School prior to issuance of the bonds for the Capitol Building. 25

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
