AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 19-49 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND PURCHASE OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE AGAÑA TENNIS COURT, TO AMEND SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-83 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND PURCHASE OF RECREATION FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE PASEO STADIUM, THE AGAÑA POOL AND THE AGAÑA TENNIS COURT, TO IMPLEMENT THE AUTHORIZATION UNDER PUBLIC LAW 21-42, CHAPTER V,

SECTION 8 (e) FOR APPROPRIATION OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM LYTICO-BODIG PROJECT TO TRANSPORT PATIENTS TO THE MAYO CLINIC OR TO THE UNIVERSITY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, TO AMEND §26012.2 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO MAKE THE DIRECTOR OF PARKS AND RECREATION CUSTODIAN OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION REVOLVING FUND, AND TO AMEND §42035, TITLE XXXVIII, GOVERNMENT CODE, ON THE DATE THE GUAM MUSEUM FACILITY PROPOSAL SHALL BE SUBMITTED.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative findings and intent.** The Legislature finds that
3 Guam will be hosting the 1994 Micronesian Games, consisting of teams from
4 nine island nations including Guam, competition to be held in thirteen sports,
5 beginning on March 26, 1994 and ending on April 2, 1994. The Legislature
6 further finds that three important venues for a number of events are the
7 Agaña Pool, the Paseo Stadium and the Agaña Tennis Courts, all of which
8 require upgrading and improvements. The Legislature further finds that the
9 Four Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$470,000) originally appropriated
10 in Section 4 of Public Law 19-49 and Section 3 of Public Law 20-83 as amended
11 by Section 41 of Public Law 20-94 have not been expended and are sufficient
12 to bring the three facilities up to the level necessary.

13 **Section 2.** Section 4 of Public Law 19-49 is hereby amended to read:

14 "Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is
15 hereby appropriated to the Department of Parks and Recreation
16 from the Tourist Attraction Fund to be expended as follows:

17 (a) Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) for the Agaña
18 Tennis Courts office, for the pavilion design and construction, and
19 for a tennis fence and wind screens.

1 (b) Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) for portable
2 bleachers for the Agaña Tennis Courts."

3 **Section 3.** Section 3 of Public Law 20-83 is hereby further amended to
4 read:

5 "Section 3. Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) are
6 appropriated from the fiscal year 1991 revenues of the General Fund
7 to the Department of Parks and Recreation to be expended as
8 follows:

9 (a) Two Hundred Three Thousand Dollars (\$203,000) for
10 the Paseo Stadium batting cage, stadium seats, foul poles, VIP box
11 seating, stadium painting, parking lot lights, fence replacement
12 and other improvements.

13 (b) Fifty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$57,000) for the Agaña
14 Pool underwater lights and bathhouse improvements,
15 underwater lane lines, parking lot lights and other improvements.

16 (c) One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000)
17 additional funding for the Agaña Tennis Courts office, the
18 pavilion design and construction, and for a tennis fence and wind
19 screens."

20 **Section 4. (a) Legislative findings.** The Legislature finds that
21 authorization for appropriations was made under Public Law 21-42 under
22 Chapter V, Miscellaneous Provisions, Section 8 (e) from the Fiscal Year 1993
23 revenues of the General Fund to the University of Guam Lytico-Bodig
24 project. The Legislature further finds it is now necessary to appropriate such
25 funds as were previously authorized.

26 (b) **Appropriation for the University of Guam Lytico-Bodig**
27 **project.** Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) are hereby appropriated from the

1 General Fund to the University of Guam Lytico-Bodig project to transport
2 patients and members of control groups to the Mayo Clinic or to the
3 University of British Columbia to investigate Lytico-Bodig. Such
4 appropriation and to other appropriations made for the University of Guam
5 Lytico-Bodig project (Public Law 21-42, Chapter V, Miscellaneous Provisions,
6 Section 8(e) and 21-136, Chapter III, Miscellaneous Appropriations, Section
7 16(i)) shall be available until expended. The University of Guam shall make
8 quarterly reports on the Lytico-Bodig project to the Governor of Guam and
9 the Legislature on the expenditures made under this appropriation and under
10 the other appropriations cited herein until such appropriations are fully
11 expended.

12 Section 5. §26012.2 of the Government Code is hereby amended to
13 read:

14 "§26012.2. Management. The Director of Parks and
15 Recreation (the "Director") shall be the custodian of the Fund and
16 may deposit monies collected therein in one (1) or more local banks.
17 The Director is authorized to draw monies from the Fund, at the
18 request of the Commission, for the development, improvement or
19 maintenance of the Territorial park System under the jurisdiction of
20 the Department, for recreational facilities, or for on-island sports
21 programs and to underwrite the cost of implementing the
22 recreational on-island sports programs established by the
23 Department, not to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000)
24 for any one project or program. No monies from the Fund shall be
25 used for off-island travel. The existing Recreation Activity
26 Revolving Fund rules and regulations that are not in conflict with
27 §§26012, 26012.1 and 26012.2 of this Chapter shall remain in effect.

1 The Commission shall submit, no later than January 31st of each
2 year, an annual audited financial statement of the Fund to the
3 Governor and to the Legislature."

4 Section 6. §42035 of Title XXXVIII of the Government Code is hereby
5 amended to read:

6 "§42035. **Guam Museum facility.** Within two hundred (200)
7 days following its first official meeting, the Board shall present to the
8 Legislature, with the consent of the Governor, a proposal for the
9 establishment of its main display facility.

10 Such proposal shall identify a parcel of government land for
11 the site and its floor space requirements, include estimated costs for
12 construction and annual operation of the proposed facility, and
13 anticipated additional costs associated with the establishment of a
14 new facility. The proposal shall include, but not be limited to, the
15 **Plaza de España** and the restoration of the prewar Governor's
16 Palace building and grounds."

COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS
COMMITTEE REPORT
ON

BILL NO. 441: AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 19-49 AND SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-83 AS AMENDED BY SECTION 41 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-94 AND TO REAPPROPRIATE THE UNEXPENDED FUNDS ORIGINALLY APPROPRIATED IN THOSE SECTIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND PURCHASE OF RECREATION FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT.

The Committee on Ways & Means conducted a public hearing on Monday, May 17, 1993 beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Public Hearing Room to gather testimony on Bill No. 441. Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators John P. Aguon and Anthony C. Blaz.

TESTIMONY

Mr. Anthony C. Mariano, Director and Mr. Dennis M. Zermeno, Deputy Director, Department of Parks and Recreation

The Department was not represented during the public hearing, but later submitted written testimony in support of Bill No. 441.

The Department in their testimony stated that "such proposed legislation will enable the them to fast track the preparation of facilities for the upcoming 1994 Micronesian Games". They also indicated that "this is a timely piece of legislation that will enable the department to take three key Territorial Recreational facilities and upgrade them to the level worthy of both international and local usage.

They indicated that the urgency for the proposed Department of Parks and Recreation Facility improvements is because Guam will be hosting the 1994 Micronesian Games. These games will consist of teams from nine island nations

including Guam. The games will run from March 26 through April 2, 1994. Games will be held in 13 sports and will for all practical purposes resemble the South Pacific Games in intensity and impact.

Again, it is therefore important that our territorial recreational facilities be prepared and ready for this major event. Recreational facility upgrading must move us now into the next century. It is time to replace temporary with permanent and to apply facility finishing touches to elevate a facility from adequate to truly addressing the needs and expectations of our athletes and spectators.

A total of three territorial recreational facilities are addressed in this analysis. They are the Agana Pool, Paseo Stadium, and the Agana Tennis Courts. All three facilities will serve major roles in the up coming Micronesian Games and future South Pacific Games. More importantly, they now serve major roles today as heavy use recreational sites for the people of our territory.

The Department of Parks and Recreation also indicated what and why certain programs that are already in the books are to be eliminated to serve as a funding source for the recommended improvements.

Public Law 20-83, Section 3. Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department to construct a covered multipurpose court in Agana.

The covered multipurpose court, or sports arena, for Agana will require a far larger appropriation than the current (\$400,000) on the books. Therefore instead of having this existing funding sit idle, the recommendation is to use the funding for the new proposed DPR facility improvements. The Department still strongly supports the intent of Public Law 20-83 Section 3. We definitely need a gymnasium of our own to handle the youth center and community programs sports programs. To build a gymnasium to meet DPR needs will cost over two million dollars. It is hoped in the future that by leaving Public Law 20-83 Section 3 on the books that in the future funding will be made available for such a worthwhile project.

Public Law 19-49, Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is hereby appropriated to the Department of Parks and Recreation from the Tourist Attraction Fund to build Men's and Women's bathrooms across from the Carnival Grounds at the Paseo de Susana in Agana.

There is not need for the additional restrooms at the Paseo. Since Public Law 19-49, several events have taken place. First off, the "Carnival Grounds" as mentioned has reverted to a parking lot. The Liberation Carnival has become too large in its space requirements to

be held at the old Paseo site. Secondly, the Department has constructed a new men's and women's restroom adjacent to the Guerrero Stadium. Thirdly the Department has opened the new Paseo Recreation Center which also sports public restrooms for general use.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 441 be **passed as Substituted** by the Legislature.

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 19-49 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND PURCHASE OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE AGAÑA TENNIS COURT; AMEND SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-83 AS AMENDED BY SECTION 41 OF PUBLIC LAW 20-94 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND PURCHASE OF RECREATION FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR THE PASEO STADIUM, AGAÑA POOL AND AGAÑA TENNIS COURT; TO AMEND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DIVISION OF FACILITIES AND MAINTENANCES BUDGET, UNDER CATEGORY 450 (CAPITAL OUTLAY); TO AMEND THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, DIVISION OF THE DIRECTOR'S OFFICE, UNDER CATEGORY 220 (TRAVEL) TO ACCOMMODATE THE THIRTY FIVE (35) STUDENTS THAT ARE PARTICIPATING IN THE JUNIOR STATESMEN PROGRAM FOR THEIR TRAVEL TUITION, AND BOARDING COSTS; AND TO IMPLEMENT THE AUTHORIZATION UNDER PUBLIC LAW 21-42, CHAPTER V, SECTION 8 (e) FOR APPROPRIATION OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM LYTICO-BODIG PROJECT TO TRANSPORT PATIENTS TO THE MAYO CLINIC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. The Legislature finds that Guam will be hosting the 1994 Micronesian Games, consisting of teams from nine island nations including Guam. Competition will be held in 13 sports, scheduled to begin on March 26 and conclude on April 2, 1994. The Legislature further finds that three important venues for a

number of events are the Agaña Pool, the Paseo Stadium and the Agaña Tennis Courts all require upgrading and improvements. The Legislature further finds that the Four Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$470,000) originally appropriated in section 4 of Public Law 19-49 and Section 3 of Public Law 20-83 as amended by Section 41 of Public Law 20-94, have not been expended and are sufficient to bring the three facilities up to the level necessary.

It is therefore the intent of the Legislature to amend Section 4 of Public Law 19-49 and Section 3 of Public Law 20-83 as amended by Section 41 of Public Law 20-94, and to reappropriate the funds to accomplish the stated tasks.

Section 2. Section 4 of Public Law 19-49 is hereby amend to read:

“Section 4. The sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is hereby appropriated to the Department of Parks and Recreation from the Tourist Attraction Fund [~~to build Men’s and Women’s bathrooms across from the Carnival Grounds at the Paseo de Susana in Agana~~] to be expended as follows:

(a) Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) for the Agaña Tennis Court office, pavilion design and construction and tennis fence and wind screens.

(b) Thirty Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000) for portable bleachers”.

Section 3. Section 3 of Public Law 20-83 as amended by Section 41 of Public Law 20-94 is hereby further amended to read:

“Section 41. Section 3. Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) are appropriated from the fiscal year

1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation [~~to construct a covered multi purpose court in Agana.~~] to be expended as follows:

(a) Two Hundred Three Thousand Dollars (\$203,000) for the Paseo Stadium batting cage, stadium seats, foul poles, VIP box seating, stadium painting, parking lot lights, fence replacement and other improvements.

(b) Fifty Seven Thousand Dollars (\$57,000) for the Agaña Pool underwater lights and bathhouse improvements, underwater lane lines, parking lot lights and other improvements.

(c) One Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$140,000) additional funding for the Agaña Tennis Court office, pavilion design and construction, and tennis fence and wind screens.

Section 4. (a) Legislative finding. Thirty-five high school students have been selected to attend the 1993 Junior Statesmen Summer School at various universities from June 20 - August 8, 1993. The training at the summer school involves courses in politics, government, and speech as well as participation in congressional workshop debates. Funding for this court can be taken from the Department of Education's budget for facilities and maintenance section in its total capital outlay since there is enough funds to cover the travel, tuition and boarding costs of the group.

(b) Amendment of Department of Education's Facilities and Maintenance budget. Within the Department of Education's Fiscal Year 1993 total approved budget under the Facilities and Maintenance Section 450 Capital Outlay, the total capital outlay shall be reduced by Seventy-

One Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$71,625) and is amended to read [~~\$3,333,625~~] \$3,265,003. The Total Appropriation of the Facilities and Maintenance Division is amended to read [~~\$11,421,880~~] \$11,350,255.

(c) Amendment of the Director of Education's Office budget. 


WHY THE URGENCY FOR THE PROPOSED DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS...


Guam will be hosting the 1994 Micronesian Games. These games will consist of teams from nine island nations including Guam. The games will run from March 26 through April 2, 1994. Games will be held in 13 sports and will for all practical purposes resemble the South Pacific Games in intensity and impact.

These games are less than a year away.

It is therefore important that our territorial recreational facilities be prepared and ready for this major event. Recreational facility upgrading must move us now into the next century. It is time to replace temporary with permanent and to apply facility finishing touches to elevate a facility from adequate to truly addressing the needs and expectations of our athletes and spectators.

A total of three territorial recreational facilities are addressed in this analysis. They are the Agana Pool, Paseo Stadium, and Agana Tennis Courts. All three facilities will serve major roles in the upcoming Micronesian Games and future South Pacific Games. More importantly, they now serve major roles today as heavy use recreational sites for the people of our territory.

WHAT WILL BE ELIMINATED TO SERVE AS A FUNDING SOURCE FOR ABOVE RECOMMENDED IMPROVEMENTS:

(PL 20-83) - Section 3. Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department to construct a covered multipurpose court in Agana.

The covered multipurpose court, or sports arena, for Agana will require a far larger appropriation than the current \$400,000 on the books. Therefore instead of having this existing funding sit idle, the recommendation is to use the funding for the new proposed DPR facility improvements. The Department still strongly supports the intent of PL 20-83 Section 3. We definitely need a gymnasium of our own to handle the youth center and community programs sports programs. To build a gymnasium to meet DPR needs will cost over two million dollars. It is hoped in the future that by leaving PL 20-83 Section 3 on the books that in the future funding will be made available for such a worthwhile project.

(PL 19-49) - Section 4. The Sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) is hereby appropriated to the Department of Parks and Recreation from the Tourist Attraction Fund to build Men's and Women's bathrooms across from the Carnival Grounds at the Paseo de Susana in Agana.

There is no no need for the additional restrooms at the Paseo. Since PL 19-49, several events have taken place. First off, the "Carnival Grounds" as mentioned as reverted to a parking lot. The Liberation Carnival has become too large in its space requirements to be held at the old Paseo site. Secondly, the Department has constructed a new men's and women's restroom adjacent to the Guerrero Stadium. Thirdly the Department has opened the new Paseo Recreation Center which also sports public restrooms for general use.

DPR FACILITY IMPROVEMENT DESCRIPTION

PASEO STADIUM:

(1) Batting Cage - Construct a full size batting cage on a concrete/asphalt pad. The cage will have a protective roof to make the batting cage useable during inclement weather. Location of batting cage to be in the Paseo Stadium right field bullpen.

Currently there is no batting cage set up for islandwide use in any DPR baseball facility. A batting cage will give baseball players a site for both season and off-season batting practice.

(2) Stadium Seats - Removal of existing aluminum bench type grandstand seats at Paseo Stadium. Placement of 1,777 individual stadium seats throughout the entire Paseo Stadium grandstand area.

The Paseo Stadium is a high use recreational facility drawing thousands of spectators for all levels of baseball to include the Guam Major League, Guam Amateur Baseball League, Babe Ruth, international tournament and Big League games. The facility is a focal point for territorial baseball activity. With the numbers of people that use this facility, the next logical improvement is to put place in individual seating for professional seating comfort and spectator distribution.

(3) Paseo Stadium Painting - Repaint the entire stadium to balance out with the painting scheme of the new Paseo Recreation Building. Already this color scheme has been initiated with the stadium facade painting.

(4) Paseo Stadium Parking Lot Lights - Currently this parking lot has security lighting identical to the Paseo jogging track lights. Where these lights are adequate for lighting a narrow jogging track, they are not sufficient for parking lot security lighting. Plan calls for the placement of high intensity security light clusters in the parking lot. Existing parking lot lights would be used for replacement of existing jogging track fixtures.

This parking lot serves Paseo users not only to include the Paseo Stadium but also the Guerrero Stadium, special events, jogging track, basketball and volleyball court users.

(5) Paseo Stadium Fence Replacement/foul poles/ and VIP Seating. Chain link fencing, both interior and exterior, at the stadium is 13 years old and is now in need of replacement. Stadium foul poles are not constructed to even minimal baseball code requirements. Existing poles to be increased to 28 feet with adequate screening. VIP seating will consist of box seat railings around select three row seats directly behind home plate and below the grandstand concourse.

AGANA POOL:

(1) Underwater Lane Lines and Bathhouse Improvements. Current underwater lane lines have faded over time and need repainting. These are needed to provide competition swimmers the ability to see their position in the pool while swimming in competition. Improvements to the bathhouse include new restroom and shower room fixtures and commode stalls, mirrors, inside repainting, floor non skid painting, placement of industrial fans, removal of non useable plumbing, replacement of floor drain covers and existing wooden benches, and new interior lights to meet OSHA requirements. Pool deck improvements include the painting of non skid safety signs and dividing lines. Compound sidewalks and traffic paths to be included in the painting renovation.

(2) Parking Lot Lights. Current parking lot servicing both the Agana Tennis Courts and the Pool has no security at all. Plan calls for installation of new lights similar to those recommended for the Paseo Stadium parking lot.

AGANA TENNIS COURT:

(1) Office & Pavilion - Current tennis court office and pavilion is a tin walled and roofed structure located directly in front of the Agana courts. This facility serves both as an office and storage room for the DPR tennis operations. The shaded patio areas provide a gathering place for tennis players protection from the elements. They also serve as a staging area for the many tennis presentations and tournament functions that take place at the pavillion. Due to it's scamped size and "temporary" type construction, this facility falls victim to serious damage in major typhoons. Recently, Typhoon Omar left the pavilion over 70% destroyed.

The replacement structure will be permanent in nature to include an office and storage area. It will also have an open roofed second level to serve as an additional staging area for tennis functions and to also serve as a spectator viewing site for tennis matches in progress.

(2) Tennis Fence/wind screens. Perimeter fence has not been replaced in over 17 years. Side fences will have protective wind screens mounted to serve as a buffer to the prevailing winds that sweep across the courts. This will improve the tennis playing quality for both beginners and experienced players. Recent completed CIP projects at the Agana Courts have seen the installation of a first class playing surface and state of the art lighting system.

MISCELLANEOUS:

(1) Portable Bleacher. Recommend purchase of a mobile 250 capacity aluminum bleacher for departmental use. This bleacher unit is towed behind a small pick up vehicle to location for set up and use. Such a bleacher will not only serve large sporting events, such as the Micronesian Games, but will also serve community attractions such as parades and concerts.
