AN ACT TO AMEND §60105, TITLE 21 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ALLOW THE DIRECTOR OF LAND MANAGEMENT TO PROVIDE TECHNICAL, ADMINISTRATIVE, AND OTHER ASSISTANCE TO THE CHAMORRO LAND TRUST COMMISSION TO ADMINISTER THE LAND-USE PERMIT ("ARRENDU") AND OTHER LAND LEASE PROGRAMS NOW UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE COMMISSION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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2 Section 1. Legislative intent. The Legislature recognizes the need to develop and implement interim legislation which will assist both the Director 3 of Land Management (the "Director") and the Chamorro Land Trust 4 5 Commission (the "Commission") in administering the Land Use Permit program and other lease programs now under the purview of the 6 Commission until such time as the Commission is in the position to establish a 7 system for program review and evaluation and a mechanism for efficiently 8 9 administering the land lease programs in their entirety. The Legislature finds that the Commission in facing this task will require a certain period of time 10 11 before it can develop the necessary degree of administrative and operational efficiency and that there is logical basis for tapping the existing professional 12 13 and technical capability within the Department of Land Management (the 14 "Department") to assist the Commission in its early stages of so organizing. 15 It is the intent of the Legislature to grant the Director the latitude to transfer 16 personnel, equipment, supplies or any other resource of the Department to 17 the Commission to assist the Commission in making the necessary transition in the management and administration of short- and long-term land lease 18 programs and their recent placement under the jurisdiction of the 19 20 Commission.

**Section 2. Amendment.** §60105, Chapter 60, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is amended by adding at the end of such section a new paragraph to read as follows:

"The Director of Land Management, with the approval of the Governor, is hereby authorized to assign, transfer or allocate to the Chamorro Land Trust Commission current personnel and other resources deemed necessary to fulfill the purposes and intent of this

Act and to assist the Commission with its mandate. Funding for said transfer shall be made from the annual operations budget of the Department of Land Management (the "Department") as appropriated by the Legislature. Any current classified employee of the Department falling under the provisions of this Act through such transfer shall retain full personnel status, benefits and entitlements as specified in the Department's approved annual operations budget for classified employees."

Section 3. Deposit of land rentals and sales proceeds. Proceeds arising from the leasing of property under the Land Use Permit "arrendu" program and from the sale of lands pursuant to Section 1, Public Law 16-118, Section 2, Public Law 20-133, Section 2, Public Law 20-189, and Section 6, Public Law 21-60 as amended by Public Law 21-72, shall be deposited in the Chamorro Home Loan Fund established in Public Law 12-226.

July 19, 1993

#### I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Housing and Community Development scheduled a Public Hearing on June 29, 1993 at 9:00 a.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, Temporary Legislative Building, Agana, Guam.

Members of the Committee present at the public hearing were:

Senator Edward D. Reyes, Chairman Senator Ted Nelson, Vice-Chairman Senator Tom Ada Senator Tony Blaz

Appearing before the Committee to testify on the bill were:

Mr. Frank Castro, Director of Land Management, in support.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Frank Castro, Director of Land Management, presented written testimony favoring passage of the bill. He specified that it be made clear that transfer of resources to the Commission be limited to parts of what are available at the current Division of Land Administration and not from other divisions within Land Management.

He offered eight employees for the remainder of Fiscal Year 1993. They include:

- 1 Land Agent Supervisor
- 2 Land Agent III
- 1 Land Agent II
- 3 Land Agent I
- 1 Clerk Typist III.

In addition, he was willing to transfer two vehicles, eights sets of desks and chairs, two typewriters, file cabinets and certain office supplies.

Mr. Castro expressed disappointment that the proposed salary for the Commission's executive director is \$70,000 while his, with duties and responsibilities wider in scope, is only \$55,000.

## III. FINDING AND RECOMMENDATION

The enactment of the Chamorro Land Trust Act, effective January 1, 1975, repealed four of the government of Guam's land programs:

leases and sales of public land; land use permits for non-agricultural purposes; agricultural leases; and land development for housing.

Although repealed, these programs were incorporated into the Chamorro Land Trust Commission's programs. The Commission's members were appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature in February, 1993. Like any new organization, its initial operation has been slow. In the meantime, the former administrator of land programs, the Department of Land Management, has not renewed land use permits and affected persons have approached both Executive and Legislative Branches for action.

Public Law 22-09, effective May 7, 1993, appropriated \$500,000 to the Commission for its start-up costs, including paying for an executive director. But, the Commission has reported to the Committee that the salary of the director should be increased to entice qualified and interested candidates. The Committee agrees and this bill proposes a salary of \$70,000 annually.

The Committee commends the Director of Land Management for his initiative to transfer staff, equipment and supplies to the Commission. Because the number of expired permits has reached several hundred and growing daily, the Committee wants to take prompt action and recommends swift passage of this bill and subsequent administrative actions on the Executive side.

- SECTION 2. (a) Legislative Statement. Pacific Islands Bible College is trying to construct educational facilities for the purpose of operating a nonprofit private bible college. The College is designed especially for individuals from Guam and the

Micronesian islands who are interested in bible studies. The College will provide students the opportunity to study postsecondary theology and other church matters which are currently lacking on-island. Presently, when students want to study postsecondary formal theology, often times, it becomes necessary to travel outside of the region. The growing diverse population necessitates that activities such as the proposed institution be made available.

Liebenzell Mission-Guam, a non-profit corporation on Guam since 1976, is a primary sponsor of the College. Liebenzell Mission-Guam owns Lot No. 5396-R5-NEW-3, situmed in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, containing 4,200 ± square meters as shown on Drawing No. CC-9036B, D.L.M. No. 454442. In early 1992, the College applied for Fast Track rezoning from "R1 One Family Dwelling" to "R2 Multiple Family Dwelling" in order to construct a 2-story educational facility with general administrative offices, classrooms, and a library and two 2-story student housing, parking lot and covered walkways. When the Fast Track application came before this Legislature for action, Mangilao residents in the vicinity of the proposed college site prevailed on the Legislature to disapprove the application, primarily because of their concerns about increased vehicular traffic through their neighborhood and increased use of utilities, particularly water, which need upgrading to handle the additional demand.

The Legislature desires to enhance the educational capabilities of Guam, the reputed center of higher education in this region of the world. In order to ensure the concentration of such facilities in one area and to ameliorate concerns of residents on Mariano Road, it is necessary that the government of Guam exchange land with Libenzell Mission-Guam. The government of Guam owns Lot No. 5372-3A, situated in Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, said to contain an area of 42,751 square meters, as delineated on D.L.M. Drawing No. C4-67T-51. The Legislature intends for the government of Guam to identify the northeast corner of Lot 5372-3A and subdivide that portion before executing any land exchange with Liebenzell Mission-Guam.

- 1 **(b).** Authorization for Land Exchange. The vernor of Guam is hereby authorized to exchange on an area-for-area basis a portion of Lot No. 5372-3A, Mangilao, Municipality of Barrigada, containing 42,751 square meters, as shown on D.L.M. Drawing No. C4-67T-51 with Lot No. 5396-R5-NEW-3, owned by Liebenzell Mission-Guam, containing 4,200 square meters, as shown on Warranty Deed (Instrument No. 455529), Drawing No. CC-9036B recorded as Document No. 454442;
  - (c). Appraisals, Survey, Mapping and Registration. The cost of all appraisals, surveys, map preparation, land registration or any other costs related to the above land exchange shall be paid by Liebenzell Mission-Guam. All surveys and appraisals required for the land exchange herein shall be done by registered land surveyor and appraisers and shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Land Management. In conducting the survey, the surveyor shall install permanent concrete monuments at all points.

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- 15 **(d). Terms and Conditions.** The land exchange authorized herein shall be governed by the following terms and conditions:
- 1) the parties agree that there shall be no transfer or conveyance, in any manner or form, of the land exchanged herein for a period of ten (10) years beginning on the date the parties accept the applicable deeds for each parcel;
- 2) the parties agree to incorporate, into the exchange document and applicable deeds, reversion clauses to the effect that any conveyance or transfer of the exchanged lands, or any part thereof, or use other than for a bible college in the case of Liegenzell Mission-Guam, will cause the reversion of the exchanged lands to the original owners;
- 3) the government of Guam shall carry out all actions necessary to identify the northeast portion of Lot No. 5372-3A for the exchange authorized herein before the actual land exchange is commenced.

- 4) nothing contained herein shall be construed to event or prohibit the parties from improving, or having improved, the properties in accordance with the building and zoning codes of Guam.

Dear Mr. Chairman:

My initial comments on the subject mentioned Bill are as follows:

1. The intent is good and I support the Bill, provided however, that it is made clear that the transfer of resources to the Commission shall only be limited to parts of what are available at the current Division of Land Administration and not that which will affect any of the other Divisions of the Department. Those which we shall be receptive in transferring shall be inclusive of:

Approximately eight (8) employees together with the remaining funds for Fiscal year 1993 to cover the salaries and benefits of said employees. The anticipated transfer of employees shall consist of: A Land Agent Supervisor: Two Land Agent III: One Land Agent II; Three Land Agent I: and One Clerk Typist III. The remainder of six employees shall remain with the Department. In other words, of the total of 14 employees of the Division, we shall be transferring eight (8) while the Department will retain six. We will also be receptive in transferring one of the two vehicles the Division currently uses; eight sets of desks and chairs; two of the four typewriters; file cabinets; and, certain supplies available.

With regards to the proposed salary of up to \$70,000.00 for the Administrative Director for the Commission. I have no objection to the proposal. However, it most certainly would appear odd that while the Director of Land Management whose duties and responsibilities are wider in scope is only at the \$55,000.00 pay level, the Administrative Director will be at \$70,000.00. Not willing to write details of the Director of DLM's duties in this letter but if you so desire, I would be glad to provide.



## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. The 22nd Guam Legislature recognizes the need to develop and implement an interim measure which would assist both the Director of the Department of Land Management and the Chamorro Land Trust Commission in administering the Land Use Permit program and other lease programs under the perview of the Commission until such time that the Commission is in the position to establish a system for program review and evaluation and a mechanism for efficiently managing the land lease program in its entirety. The Legislature finds that the Commission in facing this task will require a certain period of time before it can develop a degree of administrative and operational efficiency and that there is logical basis for tapping the existing professional and technical capability within the Department of Land Management to assist the Commission in its early stages of organizing. It is the intent of the Legislature to grant the Director of Land Management the latitude to transfer personnel, equipment, supplies or any other resource of the Department of Land Management to the Chamorro Land Trust

1 Commission specifically for the purpose of assisting the government in making the

2 necessary transition with respect to the management and administration of short- and

3 long-term land lease programs and its placement under the cognizance of the

4 Commission.

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## Section 2. A new paragraph is added to §60105, Chapter 60, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"The Director of Land Management, with the approval of the Governor, is 7 hereby authorized to assign, transfer or allocate personnel and other resources deemed 8 necessary to fulfill the purposes and intent of this Act to the Chamorro Land Trust 9 Commission and to assist the Commission with its mandate pursuant to Public Law 12-10 226. Funding for said transfer shall be made available by the annual operations budget 11 of the Department of Land Management as appropriated by the Legislature. Any 12 classified employee subjected to the provisions of this Act shall retain full personnel 13 status, benefits and entitlements as specified in the Department's approved annual 14 operations budget for classified employees." 15

# Section 3. §75118(1)(i), Chapter 75, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

"\$75118(1)(i). The salary of the Administrative Director shall be determined by the Commission as provided for in said \$75102(i) and shall not exceed the sum of [Fifty Five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000)] Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000) per annum."

Section 4. Funds generated through the leasing of property under the Land Use
Permit "arrendu" program and from the sale of lands pursuant to Section 1, Public
Law 16-118; Section 2, Public Law 20-133; Section 2, Public Law 20-189; Section 6,
Public Law 21-60 as amended by Public Law 21-72 shall be deposited in the

26 Chamorro Home Loan Fund established in Public Law 12-226.
