1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. (a) Appropriation. Six Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-Two Dollars (\$624,452) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Department of Education for the implementation of the Drivers Education Program as authorized by Section 9 of Public Law 22-20. The appropriation is to be expended on personnel, travel, purchase of vehicles, insurance, fuel and maintenance, textbooks and materials, driving simulators, a consultant, and for teacher stipends.

(b) Availability of appropriations; not subject to transfer. The appropriation made in this Act shall be available upon enactment and until September 30, 1994, and is not subject to the Governor's transfer authority.

# COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

ON

BILL NO. 538: AN ACT APPROPRIATING EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY TWO THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWELVE DOLLARS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR DRIVERS EDUCATION COURSES.

The Committee on Ways & Means conducted a public hearing on Thursday, July 22, 1993 beginning at 10:00 a.m. at the Legislative Public Hearing Room to gather testimony on Bill No. 538. Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators Pilar C. Lujan, Vicente C. Pangelinan, J. George Bamba, and Marilyn D. A. Manibusan.

#### **TESTIMONY**

Mr. Michael Condon, School Program Consultant, Vocational & Technical Education Division, representing the Director of the Department of Education

The Director in his brief written testimony, stated that pursuant to Public Law 22-20, Section 9, the department is in the process of developing a comprehensive drivers education program.

The Department submitted the budget needed to launch the program by school-year 1993-1994 which is Two Hundred Five Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$205,760) less than what Bill No. 538 is proposing.

Senator Gutierrez suggested that the Department can further reduced their appropriation request by One Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$144,000) (which is the cost of eight vehicles) by soliciting from other automobile dealers.

Mr. Condon said that they want to get the program started and what Nissan has offered, Mr. Van Shelly, he said that he would like to have the right of first refusal. Mr. Shelly told the Department that since he initiated the first six vehicles, for the Department to go to him first if they needed more vehicles.

Senator Lujan asked if the appropriation included personnel (instructors) for drivers education? How many instructors would be hired by the department? Mr.

Condon's respond was yes, they have included \$253,000 for stipends for twenty eight (28) instructors. Its an after school program.

Senator Gutierrez asked if the program can be started in the fall without getting this Bill No. 538 passed immediately based on the budget that they have now and have this appropriated in October? DOE always have a lot of lapses, can you use those lapses to get the program moving?

Mr. Condon informed the members that they need to get the teachers trained this summer. What the Department needs initially which a letter was transmitted to the Governor requesting for \$69,000. This amount is to pay to get somebody out here to train the teachers this summer and also to purchase textbooks.

Senator Gutierrez stated that we certainly need this program here on Guam.

Mr. Condon concurs with Senator Gutierrez that this program is needed here on Guam. The program that the department designed requires thirty-two (32) hours of classroom instruction, six (6) hours behind the wheels, and twelve (12) hours observation.

Senator Lujan hopes that the program would emphasize about the DUI, the requirements so that they would be aware. Mr. Condon assured the Senator that the program also includes a full ten and one half (10 1/2) hours on Drinking Drugging and Driving. It is just an opportunity for the Department to bring the Substance Abuse program to the students.

Senator Gutierrez suggested to Mr. Condon that since they got the six vehicles from Nissan and if they really need to buy because they just can't give you eight (8) more, I think that you should give them (Nissan) the opportunity first.

Mr. Condon said absolutely, as a matter of fact Mr. Shelly has been very supportive and he said that in addition to the six vehicles, he intents on doing this every year as well. Next year we will be getting six more new vehicles. The only stipulation he ask is that there will be no smoking in vehicles and that is not a problem. Also that the vehicles not be used as personal cars for principals.

Senator Pangelinan suggested that the Department might want to include an element of defensive driving in the program. Mr. Condon said that it is already included. Senator Pangelinan also informed Mr. Condon that there are two (2) certified defensive driving instructors on Guam and that they both work at GTA that the Department might be able to tap on them. The Senator went on to say that one of them just returned from a recertification program, so he is nationally certified on the defensive program. Mr. Condon stated that they know of Mr. Frank Reyes. Senator Pangelinan also stated that Mr. Joe Anderson is the person he is referring to. Mr. Condon informed that Committee that the problem that they are facing is that in order to be certified with DOE, they have to have University credits.

Senator Gutierrez congratulated the Department of Education on moving fast on this issue.

#### **COMMITTEE ACTION**

The Committee on Ways & Means, after due consideration of the testimony offered on Bill No. 538, decided that the funding would come from the appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220. The Committee also agreed that the appropriation be further cut.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION**

The Committee on Ways & Means recommends that Bill No. 538 be passed as Substituted by the Legislature.

FUNDING FOR THE DRIVER'S EDUCATION PROGRAM

Pursuant to Public Law 22-20, the Department of Education is mandated to provide driver's education instruction to secondary students. In order for the program to be implemented by schoolyear 1993-1994, funding for the following program components must be appropriated immediately.

1.	Teacher training	\$17,000.00
2.	Textbooks and other instructional materials	\$28,000.00
3.	Curriculum development	\$9,000.00
4.	Computer system for program administration	\$15,000.00

TOTAL: \$69,000.00

It is imperative that the Department of Education be allotted the stated amount as soon as possible so to meet the driver's education program implementation date of January 1, 1994.

If funding is not provided and the driver's education program does not take into effect, all driving age students, beginning January 1, 1994, will be left without training and thus will be unable to obtain driver's licenses. The adverge consequences will be many, one of which will be the increase in unlicensed and uninsured young drivers on the streets of Guam.


