AN ACT INSTRUCTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO WORK IN CONJUNCTION WITH PRIVATE SCHOOL OFFICIALS IN ADDRESSING THE INCREASING STUDENT CONGESTION WITHIN THE AGAÑA DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP AREA BY LOCATING AN ALTERNATE CENTRALIZED LOCATION WHICH WILL INSURE THE SAFETY OF THE STUDENTS; AND PROVIDING FOR ADEQUATE SHELTER AND LAVATORY FACILITIES FOR THE SITE.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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Section 1. Legislative intent. The Legislature recognizes the increasing 2 congestion of traffic and business activities within the Agaña area, which has 3 on several occasions endangered the lives of private school students who are 4 dropped-off and picked-up in downtown Agaña, across from the Agaña 5 Cathedral. Because of the increasing risk posed to the island's students, a 6 need has surfaced to deal with this situation immediately. Therefore, the 7 Legislature believes that in order to address this condition, coordinated 8 efforts must be made by all concerned government agencies in conjunction 9 with private school officials to bring about a feasible solution which will 10 guarantee the continual safety of the students and simultaneously meet their 11 12 transportation needs.

Section 2. Efforts coordinated. The Department of Public Works 13 ("DPW") is hereby instructed to coordinate its efforts with representatives of 14 the island's private schools and other government agencies (if necessary) in 15 locating and selecting an alternate centralized location for the pick-up and 16 drop-off site of private school children which will address the purpose of this 17 Act. On selection of a location, DPW shall make necessary improvements to 18 the area to insure that the site is adequate to satisfy the general needs of its 19 20 bus drivers and the students. Such improvements should include, but are not limited to, the construction of a shelter which will provide protection for the 21 students from the sun and rain, and lavatory facilities. 22

Section 3. Funding. If funds are necessary to carry out the provisions of Section 2 of this Act, the Governor shall transfer to DPW the sums necessary. If no funds are available for transfer, the Governor shall request the Legislature to appropriate the necessary funds.

- Section 4. Security. The Governor shall cause adequate security to be
- 2 in place at all major student pick-up and drop-off areas in Guam during
- 3 school bus pick-up and drop-off hours.

### **COMMITTEE REPORT**

#### BILL NO. 90

"An act relative to instructing the Department of Public Works to work in conjunction with Private School Officials in addressing the increasing student congested situation within the Agana drop-off and pick-up area by locating an alternate centralized location which will insure the safety of the students; and providing for adequate shelter and lavatory facilities for the site".

### I. BACKGROUND

Bill No. 90 would instruct the Department of Public Works and all other Government of Guam departments and agencies affected, to work closely with private school officials to develop a plan to establish a centralized pick-up/drop-off area for private school students.

The committee conducted a Public Hearing 9:30 a.m. Thursday, October 21, 1993 in the Public Hearing Room of the Guam Legislature Temporary Building in Agana.

All testimony received by the committee was in support of the intent of Bill No. 90. There was a general consensus from the witnesses that the bill needs to address supervision of the students and not so much as to relocate the drop-off/pick-up point.

**Attorney Dierking** testified that the Archdiocese generally supports the bill, however, the bill lacks the language that would provide for the supervision of the students and traffic control by the Government of Guam. Currently, the safety of the students and traffic control is being monitored by a private security, which does not have any jurisdiction on the public roadways.

**Sister McAuley** reiterated the same sentiments as Attorney Dierking, and emphasized that the supervision of the students should be provided by the government of Guam, since the drop-off/pick-up area is on government property. Additionally, restroom facilities and shelters are also needed for the students.

**Sister Kathleen** agreed that supervision is of the utmost importance, however stated that relocating the drop-off/pick-up area is not necessarily the answer. Sister Kathleen continued that the present area is suitable, however, supervision is needed.

**Mayor Felix F. Ungacta** recommended that the drop-off/pick-up point remain status quo. Mayor Ungacta stressed the need for restroom facilities, fountains etc.

**Willie T. Flores** stated that the department is not prepared to give a position on the bill, and requested that the Department of Public Works be given a couple of weeks to prepare a written statement in reference to Bill No. 90.

### III. FINDINGS

The committee finds that there is a need to amend Bill No. 90 to make the necessary changes and that the committee will be accepting additional testimony prior to reporting the bill out of committee.

### IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 90 to the Twenty-Second Guam Legislature with the recommendation **TO DO PASS Bill No. 90, as amended.**

The Department of Public Works is hereby instructed to coordinate its efforts with representatives of the island's private schools and other government agencies (if necessary) in locating and selecting an alternate centralized location for the pick-up and drop-off site of the private school children, which will address the purpose as stated in Section 1 of this Act.

Upon selection of a location, DPW shall make necessary improvements to the area to insure that the site is adequate to satisfy the general needs of its bus drivers and the students. Such improvements should include, but is not limited to, the construction of a shelter, which will provide protection for the students from the sun and rain, and lavatory facilities.

# Section 3. Funding Needs.

Should the Department of Public Works need funding to implement the provisions stipulated in Section 2 of this Act, such funding requests should be submitted to the Governor and the Guam Legislature no later than 180 days following the enactment of this Act.
