AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO UNDERTAKE A MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY OF GUAM; TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR; AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A SLAUGHTERHOUSE AND FOR COMMEMORATIVE SERVICES FOR WORLD WAR II VETERANS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative finding and intent. (a) The Legislature finds that an adequate water system is necessary to sustain the quality of life which the people of Guam deserve and to support those activities which provide economic opportunities for the people of Guam.
- 5 (b) The Legislature takes note that the current rates of the Public Utility
 6 Agency of Guam ("PUAG") for water and sewer services as approved by the
 7 Public Utility Commission ("PUC") and implemented in January of 1981, have
 8 remained fixed pursuant to public law. It is further noted that this freezing of
 9 the rate schedule has resulted in the annual subsidy of about sixty-eight
 10 percent (68%) of PUAG's operation and maintenance expenses. It is
 11 reasonable to conclude that the level of subsidy in the years to come will
 12 increase because of inevitable increases in labor and material costs.
- 13 (c) In order for PUAG to be an effective utility, it must be allowed to 14 function as an autonomous utility and not as a typical line agency of the 15 Government of Guam.
 - (d) As prerequisite to consideration being given for autonomy status, it is imperative that PUAG demonstrate its ability to operate efficiently.

- (e) The Legislature finds it appropriate that PUC, which is charged with the primary task of reviewing and approving rates related to public electrical and telephone utility services, be further delegated the authorization to undertake a management and operations audit of PUAG, which shall additionally address, and include solutions for, the unaccounted-for water rate, as a preliminary step towards any further consideration for operational autonomy.
- Section 2. Management and operations audit of PUAG. PUC is hereby authorized to undertake, and shall immediately commence the conduct

of a management and operations audit of PUAG, which shall additionally address, and include solutions for, the unaccounted-for water rate, as well as a review of existing water rates with recommendation for appropriate increases, if needed, and a phased-in implementation plan. The report of such audit including findings and recommendations for action to be immediately undertaken by PUAG to improve the efficiency of its management, operations, maintenance, and services, and to reduce the unaccounted-for-water rate, shall be completed and transmitted to the Governor, the Legislature, and PUAG, by no later than one hundred eighty (180) days from the approval of the appropriation authorized by Section 5 of this Act.

Section 3. Same: implementation. Upon receipt of PUC's management and operations audit report the Chief Officer of PUAG shall immediately cause such actions to be initiated and implemented as may be necessary to effectuate the recommendations contained therein to improve the efficiency of PUAG's management, operations, maintenance and services, and to reduce the unaccounted-for-water rate.

Section 4. New rate schedule. PUAG, when it has successfully addressed the major findings and recommendations of PUC's management audit of PUAG, and when it has reduced the unaccounted-for-water rate to less than thirty percent (30%), shall, with the concurrence of PUC and at the request of the Governor, submit to the Legislature for its consideration, a request for a cost-based operational rate schedule, which shall, for the purpose of avoiding rate shock, be structured to be phased-in over an appropriate period. Unless the Legislature takes action on such a proposed

rate schedule within fifteen (15) legislative days after its submission, the same
shall go into effect.

Section 5. Reappropriation of \$300,000 from previous appropriation for northern and southern high schools for PUC to perform management audit of PUAG. Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to PUC to perform a management audit of PUAG.

Section 6. Reappropriation of \$600,000 from previous appropriation for northern and southern high schools to the Agricultural Board of Commissions for the construction of a slaughterhouse. Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Agricultural Board of Commissioners for the construction of a slaughterhouse.

Section 7. Reappropriation of \$5,812 from previous appropriation for northern and southern high schools to the Fleet Reserve Association, Latte Branch 73, for Mass Services in commemoration of World War II veterans and their dependents. Five Thousand Eight Hundred Twelve Dollars (\$5,812) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Fleet Reserve Association, Latte Branch 73, to conduct a Commemorative Mass for World War II veterans and their dependents scheduled for December 7, 1993.
