Dear Mr. Speaker:

Enclosed is Substitute Bill No. 561 which I have signed into law as Public Law 22-59.

Section 6 of this measure contains an appropriation source that does not have a balance of \$6,000,000. Therefore, only part of this project has been funded.

The other provisions of this law contain substantial appropriations. The supplemental operating appropriations will be released as needed. However, those provisions for capital projects cannot be implemented at this time because of the government's cash position. When the cash position improves then funds for these purposes may be released.

Section 15 of this law allows use of fiscal year 1993 lapsed funds for implementation of the Hay Study Reevaluation and Appeal Report. However, the fiscal year 1993 books have been closed and no funds are available from that source. The various departments have been using whatever funds they have available for implementing the new compensation schedules. However, some departments are without adequate funds to make retroactive and current year payments. The Bureau of Budget and Management Research is attempting to resolve the dilemma created by the retroactive salary adjustments.







1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Supplemental Funding for the University of Guam for Fiscal**

3 **Year 1994. (a) Legislative Intent.** The University of Guam has experienced
4 substantial growth in the last few years in the number of students and the size
5 of its programs. Due to this increase in interest by the people of Guam in
6 higher education on island, and the necessity of implementing the final hiring
7 of teaching personnel and taking student registration for classes prior to the
8 beginning of Fiscal Year 1994 on October 1, 1993, supplemental funding is
9 necessary to sustain the growth of the University and to avoid dislocation in
10 programs. During Fiscal Year 1993, Partial funding for additional teaching
11 personnel was included in the Fiscal Year 1993 budget for the University. The
12 Three Year Economic Plan contained in Public Law 22-41 provided a
13 continuation of some of the funding provided in Fiscal Year 1993, however, an
14 additional One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) is

1 needed for complete funding of the additional teaching personnel for Fiscal
2 Year 1994.

3 (b) **Reappropriation.** One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
4 (\$1,500,000) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for
5 the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to
6 the University of Guam for its Fiscal Year 1994 operations, to be expended for
7 Personnel Services.

8 (c) This appropriation is available from the date of enactment until
9 September 30, 1994.

10 **Section 2. One Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) for the**
11 **Chamorro Language Commission for the Institute of Chamorro Language**
12 **and Culture Program and to authorize Two Full Time Equivalent Positions**
13 **(2.0 FTE) for Program Planner and for Commission Secretary. One Hundred**
14 **Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000) are appropriated from the General**
15 **Fund to the Chamorro Language Commission for the Institute of Chamorro**
16 **Language and Culture Program enacted in Public Law 21-121 for Fiscal Year**
17 **1994 operations. Additionally, the following positions are created and**
18 **allocated to the Commission:**

22 **Section 3. Two Hundred Eighty Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-one**
23 **Dollars (\$280,221) to the Public Defender Service Corporation. Two**
24 **Hundred Eighty Thousand Two Hundred Twenty-One Dollars (\$280,221) are**
25 **appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Defender Service**
26 **Corporation to cover current costs of existing personnel which was not**
27 **provided for in previous appropriations, and to fund four additional Full**

1 Time Equivalent Positions (4.0 FTE) to reinstate the previous practice of
2 representation by the Public Defender Service Corporation in civil cases and
3 domestic cases not involving violence, as follows:

17 **Section 4. Reappropriation of Seven Hundred Forty-seven Thousand**
18 **Five Hundred Nine Dollars (\$747,509) from the appropriation previously**
19 **made for the northern and southern high school in Section 33 of Public Law**
20 **20-220 to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse for the**
21 **Inpatient Unit, and to provide an administrative provision exempting the**
22 **Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse from the Full Time**
23 **Equivalent restrictions in the budget for certain**
24 **personnel. (a) Appropriation. Seven Hundred Forty-seven Thousand Five**
25 **Hundred Nine Dollars (\$747,509) are reappropriated from the appropriation**
26 **previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of**
27 **Public Law 20-220 to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse**

1 to supplement the Departments Fiscal Year 1994 Budget for the Children's
2 Inpatient Unit. The amount appropriated is for the funding of Twenty-six
3 Full Time Equivalent Positions (26.0 FTE), including one (1) unclassified and
4 Twenty-five (25) classified positions, contractual services, supplies and
5 materials, miscellaneous expenses and utilities.

6 (b) **Exemption from Full Time Equivalent restriction for Department**
7 **of Mental Health and Substance Abuse.** Notwithstanding any other
8 provision of law, for Fiscal Year 1994, the Full Time Equivalent (FTE)
9 restrictions imposed by the Three Year Economic Plan shall not be applicable
10 to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the
11 Department is authorized to hire direct and/or allied health care personnel,
12 i.e. physicians, nurses, counselors, psychologists, social workers, psychiatric
13 technicians, youth service workers, chemical dependency treatment
14 specialists and closely related personnel to fill positions in any division within
15 the department, except for Administration and Support Services Divisions,
16 and provided that the total compensation will not exceed the total funds
17 provided for the salary appropriated for the utilization of the authorized Full
18 Time Equivalent (FTE).

19 **Section 5. Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) for Guam's Delegate to**
20 **Congress.** Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) are appropriated from the
21 General Fund to the contingency fund of the Guam Delegate to the U. S.
22 House of Representatives as provided for in §15100 of the Government Code
23 enacted in Section 1 of Public Law 17-2.

24 **Section 6. Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000) from the appropriation**
25 **previously made for the Northern and Southern High School in Section 2 of**
26 **Public Law 20-39 to the Department of Public Works for the Guam Veterans**
27 **Memorial Building.** Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000) are reappropriated

1 from the appropriation previously made for the Northern and Southern High
2 Schools in Section 2 of Public Law 20-39 to the Department of Public Works to
3 augment the appropriation made pursuant to Section 6 of Public Law 21-31
4 for expenses associated with the design, construction and furnishing of a
5 Guam Veterans Memorial Building.

6 **Section 7. Reappropriation of Two Million Seven Hundred Fifty**
7 **Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000) from the appropriation previously made for**
8 **the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to**
9 **the Guam Community College for the architectural and engineering design**
10 **of a portion of the new Guam Community College Campus, and**
11 **authorization of appropriation of Twenty-seven Million Dollars**
12 **(\$27,000,000) from the General Fund to the Guam Community College from**
13 **the Fiscal Year 1995 revenues, to be available on October 1, 1994. (a)**
14 **Appropriation. Two Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars**
15 **(\$2,750,000) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for**
16 **the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to**
17 **the Guam Community College for architectural and engineering design of**
18 **the following portions of the new Guam Community College Campus:**

19 1) Site Development, including --

- 20 (i) survey of the property
- 21 (ii) site preparation
- 22 (iii) roads, walkways, parking
- 23 (iv) landscaping
- 24 (v) fencing, retaining walls
- 25 (vi) water distribution and supply
- 26 (vii) storm water
- 27 (viii) electrical distribution

- 1 (ix) site connections
- 2 (x) on-site sewer
- 3 (xi) off-site sewer system connection from site to Route 10
- 4 (Installation will enable neighboring residences to connect
- 5 to the system).

6 2) Vocational Shops and Laboratories (estimated 122,900 square feet) --

- 7 (i) tourism and marketing
- 8 (ii) engineering and technology
- 9 (iii) business and computer science

10 Any funds remaining from this appropriation after completion of the design
11 of the items listed above shall be utilized for construction of the items.

12 (b) **Authorization for appropriation of Twenty-seven Million Dollars**
13 **(\$27,000,000) from the Fiscal Year 1995 revenues, to be available on October 1,**
14 **1994, for construction of named portions of the new Guam Community**
15 **College Campus. Twenty-Seven Million Dollars (\$27,000,000) are**
16 **authorized to be appropriated from the Fiscal Year 1995 revenues of the**
17 **General Fund, to be available on October 1, 1994, for the construction of the**
18 **portions of the new Guam Community College Campus which are**
19 **enumerated in Subsection (a) of this Section.**

20 **Section 8. Reappropriation of One Million Five Hundred Thousand**
21 **Dollars (\$1,500,000) from the appropriation previously made in Section 33 of**
22 **Public Law 20-220 to the Department of Public Works for demolishing the Old**
23 **Piti Elementary School and constructing a multipurpose building for the Piti**
24 **Mayor's Office, the Youth Center, and the Community Center. One Million**
25 **Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) are reappropriated from the**
26 **appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high schools in**
27 **Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Department of Public Works for the**

1 purpose of demolishing the old Piti Elementary School and constructing a
2 multipurpose building in Piti to house the Mayor's Office, the Youth Center,
3 and the Community Center.

4 **Section 9. Reappropriation of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) from**
5 **the appropriation previously made for the northern and southern high**
6 **schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Agana Mayor's Office for**
7 **Agana street signs. (a) Legislative Intent.** The Legislature recognizes the
8 tremendous need for street signs within the Agana area, the business capital
9 of Guam. Street signs serve to benefit the local population as well as the
10 visiting tourists to the island. Many of the signs throughout the Agana area
11 were destroyed during recent typhoons and need to be replaced.

12 **(b) Reappropriation.** Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000) are
13 reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the northern and
14 southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Agana
15 Mayor's Office for the purpose of financing the purchase of street signs for
16 Agana.

17 **Section 10. Reappropriation of Sixty-six Thousand Two Hundred**
18 **Forty Dollars (\$66,240) from the appropriation previously made in Section 33**
19 **of Public Law 20-220 to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for a fire hydrant**
20 **adjacent to Lot number 10062-9-3, Harmon Loop Road, Dededo. (a)**
21 **Legislative Intent.** The Legislature finds that a substantial number of
22 dwellings have been constructed in the vicinity of Lot Number 10062-9-3 near
23 the Harmon Loop Road in Dededo. Further, while the number of dwellings
24 and families has increased tremendously in this area, fire protection has not,
25 seriously affecting the protection of life and property. It is also the finding of
26 the Legislature that the lack of fire hydrants in the area can affect the
27 insurance cost of the existing and future homes in this location.

1 **(b) Appropriation.** Sixty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Forty Dollars
2 (\$66,240) are reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the
3 northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the
4 Public Utility Agency of Guam for the installation of a fire hydrant at the
5 public access adjacent to Lot Number 10062-9-3 near the Harmon Loop Road
6 in Dededo.

7 **Section 11. Reappropriation of Three Hundred Sixty-one Thousand**
8 **Four Hundred Nine Dollars (\$361,409) from the appropriation previously**
9 **made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of Public Law**
10 **20-220 for sports equipment and operational costs for the 1994 Micronesian**
11 **Games. (a) Legislative findings.** In keeping with Guam's commitment to
12 serve as the venue for the 1994 Micronesian Games, the Legislature finds it is
13 the onus of the government of Guam to adequately prepare for the massive
14 undertaking. The Games are expected to draw the best athletes, totalling
15 1,500, from throughout the region to Guam to compete within the standards
16 of international competition within their respective sporting events.

17 To ensure Guam's facilities will meet the standards required for the
18 1994 Micronesian Games, the Legislature finds Guam must act immediately
19 to construct, upgrade or refurbish the facilities as required for the Games, in
20 which more than 121 events will be held and with more than 1,500 athletes
21 and officials competing in 13 different sports.

22 In addition, the Legislature finds it incumbent upon the government of
23 Guam to provide the funds necessary to cover all operational cost to
24 administer the Games as projected by the 1994 Micronesian Games
25 Coordinating Committee (Coordinating Committee).

26 **(b) Reappropriation.** Three Hundred Sixty-one Thousand Four
27 Hundred Nine Dollars (\$361,409) are reappropriated from the appropriation

1 previously made for the northern and southern high schools in Section 33 of
2 Public Law 20-220 to the Department of Parks and Recreation for sports
3 equipment, refurbishing of sports facilities and operational cost for the
4 upcoming 1994 Micronesian Games. The reappropriation in this Section shall
5 be deposited in the fund herein established as the "1994 Micronesian Games
6 Fund (Fund) and its custodian shall be the Department of Parks and
7 Recreation.

8 1) The Department of Parks and Recreation Director shall be
9 the Fund's certifying officer.

10 2) No funds shall be authorized for release unless officially
11 requested for in writing by the Coordinating Committee Chairperson
12 or designated representative in the absence of the Chairperson.

13 3) The Fund's certifying officer shall be held accountable for any
14 expenditure not justified in writing by the Coordinating Committee
15 Chairperson or designated representative. Within Sixty (60) days
16 following completion of the Games, the certifying officer shall submit to
17 the Committees on Ways and Means and Youth, Senior Citizens and
18 Cultural Affairs a detailed financial statement showing all expenditures
19 from the Fund with corresponding receipts and requests for
20 disbursement by the Coordinating Committee.

21 4) Any money unexpended for the Games shall lapse and revert
22 back to the General Fund.

23 **Section 12. Reappropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars**
24 **(\$200,000) from the appropriation previously made for the northern and**
25 **southern high school in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Department of**
26 **Parks and Recreation for the Sports Fund for off-island**
27 **travel. (a) Legislative findings. The Legislature finds that Public Law 14-33,**

1 which establishes the "Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel" (the "Fund") to
2 provide grants to defray expenses for off-island sports competitions in sports
3 events by non-profit organizations and individuals, is a funding source that is
4 constantly tapped as there are more individuals, teams and organizations
5 engaging in off-island sports events and competitions. With the expansion of
6 sports and recreational facilities, Guam can expect to realize a growing
7 interest in competitive sports, giving rise to an increase in funding requests
8 for off-island competitions. The government of Guam cannot adequately
9 support continuous funding requests that are made through the Department
10 of Parks and Recreation, but it does acknowledge the need to support the
11 growing interest in the world of competitive sports. To kindle interest, the
12 Legislature finds it must maintain a constant funding level in the Fund. The
13 Fund is administered by the Department of Parks and Recreation which has
14 established criteria in awarding grants for off-island competitions.

15 (b) **Reappropriation.** Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) are
16 reappropriated from the appropriation previously made for the northern and
17 southern high school in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the Department of
18 Parks and Recreation's Sports Fund for Off-Island Travel. This
19 appropriation is effective until September 30, 1994 and is not subject to the
20 Governor's transfer authority.

21 **Section 13. Reappropriation of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) from**
22 **appropriation previously made in Section 33 of Public Law 20-220 to the**
23 **Public Utility Agency of Guam to repair irrigation water line from former**
24 **Inarajan Reservoir to Inarajan farmers. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are**
25 **reappropriated from the appropriation previously made in Section 33 of**
26 **Public Law 20-220 to the Public Utility Agency of Guam to clear debris from**
27 **and to repair and maintain the eight inch (8") pipeline leading from the**

1 former Inarajan Reservoir which provides non-potable irrigation water to
2 the farmers of Inarajan. This pipeline shall be cleared and repaired with the
3 coordination of the Inarajan Municipal Council.

4 **Section 14. Forty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$44,000) increase of**
5 **previous appropriation for Merizo Baseball Field. Section 2 of Public Law**
6 **20-158 is amended to read:**

7 "Section 2. One Hundred Sixty-four Thousand Dollars
8 (\$164,000) are appropriated from the General Fund to the
9 Department of Public Works to renovate the baseball field in the
10 Municipality of Merizo."

11 **Section 15. Lapsed funds from Fiscal Years 1993 and 1994 to implement**
12 **the Civil Service Commission's Hay Study Reevaluation and Appeal Report.**
13 **The Governor is hereby authorized to use up to a total of One Million Five**
14 **Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) of lapsed funds from the Fiscal Years**
15 **1993 and 1994 budgets to fully implement the recommendations of the Civil**
16 **Service Commission's Hay Study Reevaluation and Appeal Report.**
