Dear Mr. Speaker:

Enclosed is Substitute Bill No. 564 which I have signed into law as Public Law 22-60.

Section 2 of this measure contains an appropriation. This provision cannot be implemented at this time because of the government's cash position. When the cash position improves then funds may be released.

Section 5 of this law allows use of fiscal year 1993 lapsed funds for implementation of the new salaries for mayors and vice mayors. However, the fiscal year 1993 books have been closed and no funds are available from that source. The mayors and vice mayors will have to implement the salary increases by using fiscal year 1994 funds appropriated to them.





**AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE EDUCATIONAL
TRAINING AND CULTURAL ENHANCEMENT ACT
OF 1993; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR;
AND USING LAPSED FUNDS FOR SALARIES OF
MAYORS AND VICE MAYORS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

1 **Section 1. Legislative intent.** Educational and performing art
2 enhancement opportunities for island residents each year progressively
3 increase as more organizations, schools and individuals with interests in the
4 performing arts venture beyond Guam's shores to stage performances for
5 invitational events or engage in competitions not offered locally. The
6 Legislature finds such participation as beneficial in the development of
7 performing art skills and for broadening the education of resident
8 participants. Such off-island events, however attractive or beneficial they
9 may be, are often not within the financial reach of eligible participants, given
10 the costs of air fare and accommodations. The Legislature recognizes the
11 benefits of such events as arts and humanities competitions including the
12 Junior Statesman Foundation and Close Up and is compelled to protect the
13 opportunities they present by extending financial support. Any off-island
14 event in which performances of organizations or individuals from Guam are
15 featured, generates favorable attention to the island and promotes efforts to
16 boost the island's visitor rates.

17 **Section 2. Appropriation.** Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000)
18 are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Council on the
19 Arts and Humanities Agency ("CAHA") to be set aside in the Treasury of
20 Guam in a fund hereby established as the "Off-Island Educational, Training
21 and Cultural Enhancement Fund" (the "Fund"). Such appropriation shall be
22 set up in a separate account and shall not be considered part of CAHA's
23 annual budget.

24 **Section 3. Fund's Custodian and Certifying Officer.** CAHA shall serve
25 as the Fund's custodian and shall be responsible for setting up the eligibility
26 requirements governing usage of the Fund. CAHA's director shall manage
27 the Fund and CAHA's certifying officer shall be the Fund's certifying officer.

1 **Section 4. Expenditures.** Expenditures from the Fund shall be limited
2 to fifty percent (50%) of the total cost for off-island travel for the eligible
3 applicant, group or organization, with the exception of CAHA's annual
4 cultural tour, which shall be funded by special appropriation. CAHA shall set
5 Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) as the ceiling for all requests.

6 (a) The representative of the recipient organization shall provide the
7 CAHA director with an accurate accounting of the expenditure of all funds
8 for air transportation within (30) days, or if there is misuse of funds in the
9 opinion of CAHA, the individual, group or organization shall not receive
10 further grants from the Fund and shall reimburse the Fund in an amount
11 determined by CAHA.

12 (b) The CAHA director shall make a report to the Governor and the
13 Legislature on June 30th of each year which shall include the following: The
14 number of applications, the number and amounts of grants approved, and
15 other data concerning management of the Fund.

16 (c) Any person or representative of a group or organization who
17 willfully misuses a grant received under this Act, shall be guilty of a petty
18 misdemeanor and be subject to a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars
19 (\$500).

20 **Section 5. Lapsed funds from Fiscal Years 1993 and 1994 budgets to**
21 **fund the new pay schedule adopted by the Civil Service Commission for the**
22 **Mayors and Vice Mayors.** The Governor is hereby authorized to use lapsed
23 funds from Fiscal Years 1993 and 1994 budgets to fund the new pay schedule
24 adopted by the Civil Service Commission under its Resolution No. 94-078 for
25 the Mayors and Vice Mayors.
