# COMMITTEE ON WAYS & MEANS

## COMMITTEE REPORT

ON

BILL NO. 167

**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE \$500,000 FOR THE DESIGN OF  
SIDEWALKS IN DEDEDO.**

### PUBLIC HEARING

The Committee on Ways and Means conducted a public hearing on Thursday, July 22, 1993 beginning at 10:00 a.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room to gather testimony on Bill No. 167. Senator Carl T. C. Gutierrez, Chairman of the Committee conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators Elizabeth P. Arriola, Thomas C. Ada, Theodore S. Nelson, Vicente Pangelinan, Antonio R. Unpingco, J. George Bamba, Pilar C. Lujan and Speaker Joe T. San Agustin.

### PURPOSE

Bill No. 167 is designed to appropriate Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the design of sidewalks in the Kaiser and Old Village areas of Dededo.

### TESTIMONY

Sabino P. Flores, Acting Chief Engineer of the Capital Improvement Projects, Department of Public Works and Marc A. Gagarin, New Chief Engineer for the Division of Highways, Department of Public Works orally testified that the Department of Public Works is in support of Bill 167 for the design of sidewalks in Dededo, however they will provide additional information on the design at a later date.

Senator Gutierrez asked if the appropriation that Department of Public Works asked for several years ago, for the sidewalks on Y-Sengsong and West Santa Monica was completed and if so, was it approximately \$1,500,000 to be completed, Mr. Flores confirmed that was correct. Senator Gutierrez then stated that appropriation for Kaiser and the Old Village of Dededo will cost \$500,000 and further asked Mr. Gagarin if he had any preliminary estimates for the Dededo project and Mr. Gagarin stated he had none at the time and that the information will be produced at a later date.



Senator Unpingco wanted to clarify if the appropriation of the design for the Dededo project for \$500,000 is Fifteen percent (15%) of what the project will cost. Senator Gutierrez replied that it is usually Ten percent (10%) of what it will cost. Therefore, the amount would be approximately Five Million Dollars (\$5000,000) which is what Speaker San Agustin thinks it might be, Gutierrez stated.

Written testimony was submitted by Jose A. Rivera, Mayor of Dededo Village, in support of Bill 167. As delineated in his testimony, Mayor Rivera requests that the appropriation be increased to \$515,000.00 to include in the design, the sidewalks alongside of Fatima Street which lies between upper and lower Liguán Terrace. This street is a main route going to and from Dededo from three different directions: Route 16, Marine Drive and Santa Monica Avenue. Therefore, there is a need for sidewalks to be constructed along Fatima Street for the protection of pedestrians, joggers and bicycling, residents walking to the stores in the vicinity and youths who walk alongside this street to their school bus shelters. The safety of the residents walking alongside the road is a most serious concern and most certainly warrants attention and action. By constructing side walks along the side of this heavily traveled road, it will prevent an accident or tragedy from occurring.

Senator Gutierrez asked Mr. Flores if a Fifteen Thousand Dollar (\$15,000) increase will take care of Fatima Street. Mr. Flores replied that it is possible for the design. Senator Gutierrez then stated to Mr. Flores to take into consideration a possibility of adding Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to be included in Department of Public Works' reporting.

Senator Bamba asked Mr. Flores if they would have any problems with the easement in the Old Dededo Village areas and Mr. Flores stated that this problem is part of their evaluation and that they are researching whether they have the proper easements to actually construct the sidewalks. Mr. Flores also stated that DPW would factor the Design Costs, Additional Survey, Preparation Surveying Map, Acquisition and Condemnation.

Senator Unpingco asked Mayor Rivera if he was satisfied of the present design of the Y-Sengsong sidewalks that was completed. Mayor Rivera stated that it is acceptable and although the sidewalk is not as perfect as it should be, the fact that they do have a sidewalk is a safety hazard for the children that attend the schools around the vicinity. Mayor Rivera also stated that the reason it was done that way is because the terrain in itself is so complicated to make the sidewalk as straight as it could be. Actually it is somewhat a blessing in disguise because there has been no other traffic accidents in that area since the one that occurred by the entrance of Ghura 48. Senator Unpingco then asked if the design for the sidewalks included certain areas that would go up and down like little hills, instead of straight. Mr. Flores replied that during the process of completing the design phase, Department of Public Works did work closely with Mayor Rivera and both parties were cognizant of the obstacles they had to deal with such as the power poles that are up by the entrance of route 1 that encompasses the Y- Sengsong where the residents are

located. Now, rather than asking GPA to relocate the power poles, they decided to construct the sidewalks around the power poles with railings to reduce further cost. And as for future circumstances, DPW and GPA should work together when they are going to erect a power pole so that they do not interfere with the proposed sidewalk design. As for the Vendor's located down Fatima Street, Mayor Rivera feels that if they are going to be allowed to stay where they are then the design of the sidewalk should be designed to accommodate them. However, if they are going to be asked to relocate because of the Public Law that just passed, then the sidewalk will be straight.

Senator Unpingco then asks Mayor Rivera if he receives money from the vendor's that are selling on Fatima Street. Mayor Rivera responded that there is a Bill introduced by Senator Nelson that encompasses the business establishments going north on the right hand side from Harmon Loop all the way to the Mobil Gas Station which will have to rent the particular space depending on the appraised value on the spot occupied, and the money from the rent will go to the Municipality of Dededo to be used for the upgrading and maintenance of the recreational facilities.

Senator Lujan asked Mayor Rivera if the sidewalks that was completed on Y-Sengsong and Santa Monica still intact. Mayor Rivera confirmed that it was.

Written testimony that was submitted by Department of Public Works stated that the amount provided will be adequate for the design work, however, the concern we have is that we may be designing such an extensive project that the Government of Guam cannot afford in view of all the critical major highway projects that have yet to be designed and constructed.

They did a cost estimate and if the sidewalks with proper drainage were to be constructed today it would cost about \$8 million. The design work will take about a year to complete and then add six (6) months for a construction contract to be let, making it about 2 years before any actual construction begins. Using a 20% annual inflation rate this project will cost close to \$11.5 million by the time it is implemented.

They recommend that this Bill be held in abeyance until after the implementation of the Department's Short-Range Highway Improvement Program or down scope this project to cover just the collector roads.

## FINDINGS

None at this present time. Pending on Written Testimony from Department of Public Works.

## RECOMMENDATION

The Committee recommends that Bill 167 be reported out to the Full Legislature with the recommendation **TO DO PASS** as Substituted.

Dear Senator Gutierrez:

On July 22, 1993 our Department presented verbal testimony on Bill Nos. 151, 167, 287, 288, 289 and 363 at your Committee's public hearing. The following is our written testimony for these bills:

Bill No. 151

An Act to appropriate \$500,000 to fund the Community Improvement Program for Piti.

Section 1, Subsections  
a, b, and c:

The Department of Public Works has estimated the costs of the projects in these sections and has determined that the total amount is within the amount to be appropriated in this bill.

Section 1, Subsection d      The opening of roads to landlocked families in the Kamingaville area of Piti.

In March of this year our Department opened a new road to provide legal access for the Sablan and Sian families in the Kaminga area who were physically landlocked. This project cost our Department about \$50,000 out of its operating budget to put in a coral base road. Our estimate to have this new road paved having a 14' width is about \$15,000.

We request that the \$50,000 our Department has already expended on this project be reimbursed or that the Department be allowed to use this amount from this bill for any other highway project that may not necessarily be located in Piti.

Bill No. 167

An Act to appropriate \$500,000 for the design of sidewalks in Dededo.

The amount provided will be adequate for the design work, however, the concern we have is that we may be designing such an extensive project that the Government of Guam cannot afford in view of all the critical major highway projects that have yet to be designed and constructed.

We did a cost estimate and if the sidewalks with proper drainage were to be constructed today it would cost about \$8 million. The design work will take about a year to complete and then add six (6) months for a construction contract to be let, making it about 2 years before any actual construction begins. Using a 20% annual inflation rate this project will cost close to \$11.5 million by the time it is implemented.

We recommend that this Bill be held in abeyance until after the implementation of the Department's Short-Range Highway Improvement Program or down scope this project to cover just the collector roads.

Bill No. 287

An Act to appropriate \$500,000 to the Department of Public Works for the reconstruction and repair of the Inarajan Pool, pavilion and related facilities.

Funds in the amount of \$614,000 have been obtained from the Federal Emergency Management Agency for these projects. However, this amount is insufficient to completely restore the Inarajan Pool and related facilities such as pavilions and restroom facilities. The amount of funds to be appropriated under this bill will provide the required supplemental funds for this project.

Bill No. 288

An Act to appropriate from the General Fund \$3,100,000 to the Department of Public Works for the design and construction of gymnasiums in the municipalities of Yona, Talofof, Inarajan, Merizo, Umatac, Santa Rita and Agat.

The design of the Tamuning gymnasium is to be site adapted for the proposed gymnasiums in this bill. After consulting with the various village mayors on the availability of sites for the gymnasiums and estimating construction costs based on current prices, we recommend that the amount to be appropriated for these gymnasiums be increased to \$10.8 Million.

Bill No. 289

An Act to appropriate \$275,000 for the design and construction of pavilions and bathroom facilities at Ypan Point Beach (\$200,000) and a basketball court at Ipan

Beach Park (\$75,000).

The Department of Public Works has assessed the extent of the improvements in this bill and has determined that the proposed appropriation is insufficient for these projects based on estimated construction costs. The amounts to be appropriated should be increased to \$300,000 for the design and construction of pavilions and bathroom facilities at Ypan Point Beach and \$175,000 for a basketball court at Ipan Beach Park for a total appropriation of \$475,000. Language of the bill should include a lighting system for the basketball court as requested by the Mayor.

Bill No. 363

An Act to separate the Abandoned Vehicle and Street Light Fund into two separate funds and to impose a New Vehicle Recycling Fee so as to more efficiently dispose of abandoned motor vehicles.

We are in support of this legislation with some recommended changes:

Section 7161, paragraph (b)

That the classification of vehicles not be by Subcompact, Compact, etc. but rather be identified and based by the weight of the vehicle and it should include all vehicles not just cars i.e., dump trucks, trailers, truck tractors, etc..

Using weight as the basis for the fee all vehicles will be affected yet there will be little room for any confusion when implementing this program.

Up to 1,800 lbs.	\$ 75
1,801 to 2,500 lbs.	\$125
2,501 to 3,500 lbs.	\$200
Over 3,500 lbs.	\$250


We strongly recommend that the amount to remain deposited from the New Vehicle Recycling Fee be increased from the proposed Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars to a minimum of Sixty (\$60.00) Dollars. This recommended increase is based on the cost to dispose of an abandoned vehicle. We conducted a telephone survey of several towing service companies and their minimum price ranged from \$30-\$45 for small cars and \$60 and more for large cars, vans and trucks. Our estimated cost to dispose of vehicles using our Department equipment and manpower is about \$50.

For your information, the finance strategy for the implementation of the Guam 2010 Highway Master Plan will involve the floating of a highway bond which debt service payback will consider the raising of the vehicle registration fee.



**BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the design of sidewalks in the Kaiser and Old Village areas of Dededo.
