BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. The Legislature finds that the ever increasing number of people in the island's workforce, the youthful makeup of its population, and the relative affluence of many residents have created or added to a number of problems, including traffic congestion, time scheduling difficulties when working parents must provide for the needs of children, and increased difficulty in accessing government and other services because the hours when such services are available conflict with normal working hours.

In many cases the government is not providing convenient access for the very people it is supposed to serve, by forcing the general public to take leave or use their lunch hours to receive government services because those services are provided only during certain restricted hours. The Legislature further finds that the level of stress affecting government employees may be lessened if they are provided greater flexibility in their working hours.

It is therefore the intent of the Legislature to require that government of Guam service agencies extend their work hours in order to provide better service to the public at no additional personnel expense to taxpayers. It is the intent of the Legislature to accomplish this goal by giving each agency the authority to stagger employee working hours and allow flexible work schedules, thus reducing traffic congestion, and assisting private employees that have family scheduling difficulties or problems accessing government and other services because of conflicting work hours.

Section 2. §4119 is added to Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§4119 (a) Extended hours. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all line agencies, departments, autonomous entities and instrumentalities of the government of Guam, including the

Superior Court of Guam, not excluded by paragraphs (e) and (f) of this section shall commence their regular work day at 7:00 a.m. and conclude at 6:00 p.m. Mondays through Fridays, excluding holidays. Extending the work week to Saturdays and Sundays shall be permitted at the discretion of the director of each agency.

- (b) Scheduling options. Directors of each agency shall develop a schedule of working hours for all employees within such agency which shall include but not be limited to staggered hours, flexible working hours and, at the director's discretion, Saturday working hours. The director shall consider specific employee requests relative to work schedules whenever possible. The total number of hours worked per week for each employee shall not be changed by such new schedules of working hours.
- (c) Open to public. Except as otherwise provided in this section, directors shall ensure that all services normally provided to the public are available during all working hours.
- (d) Overtime not allowed. Overtime is not authorized to achieve the implementation or execution of the provisions of this section.
- (e) Optional exclusions. A director shall have the option to exclude his agency or a division of such agency from the provisions of this section if such agency or division meets one (1) or more of the following conditions:
 - 1. It has less than ten (10) employees;
 - 2. It has no direct contact with the public;
 - 3. Its director determines that implementation of such work schedules would cause hardships and decrease the ability

of such agency's or division's employees to perform their duties.

- (f) Other exclusions. Agencies or divisions of agencies which currently provide services to the public on a twenty four (24) hourper-day basis, on an on-call basis, or during work schedules differing from the standard workweek of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday excluding holidays, are excluded from the provisions of this section.
- (g) Definitions. For the purposes of this section, "director" means the executive head of an agency; "division" means any section, program or administrative unit of an agency; and "agency" means an agency or department of the executive branch of the government, or an autonomous instrumentality of the government of Guam, or a public corporation, or the Superior Court of Guam."

Section 3. Effective date. Line agencies, departments, autonomous entities and instrumentalities of the government of Guam shall begin implementing the provisions of this Act as soon as practicable, but no later than one hundred eighty (180) days after its effective date.

PUBLIC HEARING ON BILL NO. 591

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs conducted a public hearing on Monday, December 20, 1993, in the Tamuning Community Center. Senator Ted S. Nelson, Chairman of the Committee, called the hearing to order at 7:10 p.m. Also present at the hearing was Senator Vicente C. Pangelinan.

TESTIMONIES ON BILL 591:

One person testified on Bill 591, Dr. O.V. Natarajan, Administrator of the Division of Environmental Health of the Department of Public Health and Social Services. He is in favor of the bill with a few changes which he recommended: The bill provides that agencies should conclude regular office activities at 6 p.m. and excludes agencies that work on a 24-hour-per-day schedule. Dr. Natarajan's division does not fit into either category, but instead has some personnel assigned to work a night shift.

He suggested amending the bill to provide for those employees who must work evening hours and also to add a clear definition of the term "division."

Sen. Pangelinan asked Dr. Natarajan if he felt that the bill had more good than bad points. Dr. Natarajan said that there were problems with the bill as it relates to DPH&SS but that overall the good outweighed the bad. Sen. Pangelinan asked if the bill would benefit DPH&SS. Dr. Natarajan said that it would.

Sen. Nelson said that the traffic to and from the north of the island along Routes 1 and 15 was terrible and that something had to be done about it. He said traffic on other roads was very bad as well, especially during morning and afternoon rush hours. He said if government employees could get off at 4 p.m. or at 6 p.m. it would help the traffic flow.

As there were no further questions, Chairman Nelson declared Bill 591 publicly heard and adjourned the hearing.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs recommends that Bill No. 591, AN ACT TO EXTEND THE WORKING HOURS OF CERTAIN GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO LESSEN TRAFFIC CONGESTION, PROVIDE FLEXIBLE WORKING HOURS AND BETTER SERVE THE PUBLIC, be amended to allow for Dr. Natarajan's suggestions and to be passed as substituted.

TESTIMONY ON BILL NO. 591

FXTENDING THE WORKING HOURS OF GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

I am Dr. O.V. Natarajan, Administrator, Division of Environmental Health. Thank you for giving us the opportunity to give our comments on Bill 591. Our operations will be also affected if this bill becomes law.

We support the concept on which the bill is based. We would like to support the bill, provided some of our concerns listed below, are addressed satisfactorily:

(1) Section 2 Article 4119 of the bill mandates that our Division, similar to other agencies, shall conclude regular office activities at 6:00 p.m. Subsection (f) of the same article excludes some agencies which provide services on a 24 hour per day basis or an on-call basis. Our Division does not fall under either exclusion catagory.

The inspections of night clubs will be performed after the 6:00 p.m., the end of the mandated workday. That would pose a problem. Sometimes our Animal Control Officers are on duty up to 7:00 p.m. at night. Therefore, our agency and similar agencies should have the flexibility to extend the services beyond the 6:00 p.m. when the workday "shall conclude".

In subsection (e) of the Article 4119 it is stated that (2) "A Director shall have the option to exclude his agency or a division of such agency". The word division is not If the word "division" is interpreted as a defined administrative unit of the Department, then the criteria for exclusion of having less than ten (10) employees in a division may not be enough. Some of our programs have fewer employees, sometimes only (1) one; for example; the Radiological Health and Clean In-Door Air Programs. In such cases it is not possible to provide 55 (7:00 a.m to 6:00 p.m.; 5 days/week) hours per week, with a 40 hours per week employee. employees are entitled to annual leave, sick leave, maternity leave, paternity leave, workmen compensation, etc etc. when we normally would not expect them to show up to work. The word division might have to be changed to another word such as section or program, or the

exclusion class of less than 10 employees can be expanded to say less than 10 employees with the same Civil Services Commission Title.

Again, we would like to support the intent and the concept behind the bill. However, we would like to see the bill amended to improve it to address our concerns.

AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §4119 TO TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO EXTEND THE WORKING HOURS OF CERTAIN GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO LESSEN TRAFFIC CONGESTION, TO PROVIDE FLEXIBLE WORKING HOURS, AND TO BETTER SERVE THE PUBLIC.

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- "§4119. (a) Extended hours. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all line agencies, departments, autonomous entities and instrumentalities of the government of Guam not excluded by paragraphs (e) and (f) of this section shall commence their regular work day at 7:00 a.m. and conclude at 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. Extending the work week to Saturdays shall be permitted at the discretion of the director of each agency.
 - (b) Scheduling options. Directors of each agency shall develop a schedule of working hours for all employees within such agency which shall include but not be limited to staggered hours, flexible working hours and, at the Director's discretion, Saturday working hours. The Director shall consider specific employee requests relative to work schedules whenever possible. The total number of hours worked per week for each employee shall not be changed by such new schedules of working hours.

- 1 (c) Open to public. Except as otherwise provided in this 2 section, directors shall ensure that all services normally provided 3 to the public are available during all working hours. (d) Overtime not allowed. Overtime is not authorized to 4 achieve the implementation or execution of the provisions of this 5 section. 6 (e) Optional exclusions. A director shall have the option to 7 exclude his agency or a division of such agency from the 8 provisions of this section if such agency or division meet one (1) or 9 10 more of the following conditions: 11 1.
