AN ACT TO ADD §42000.1 TO TITLE XXXVIII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE TO ENCOURAGE THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY TO ACQUIRE BOOKS AND OTHER WRITTEN MATTER AUTHORED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS CONTAINING INFORMATION OF VALUE TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; TO REPEAL AND REENACT §42012 OF SAID TITLE ON THE APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY, AND TO AMEND §§42008, 42009,

42014 AND 42015 OF SAID TITLE TO DELETE REFERENCES TO THE GUAM MUSEUM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative intent. For many years, local residents have written books and other documents about Guam, the Mariana Islands, Micronesia, and the Pacific region which contain valuable information beneficial to the people of Guam, pertaining to Guam's history, culture, language or traditions. Such books and materials written by local authors should be collected by Guam's major informational resource center, the Guam Public Library, for the benefit of future generations. This Act authorizes the Guam Public Library to solicit or purchase, if necessary, such materials for the Library's informational collection.

Section 2. §42000.1 is hereby added to Title XXXVIII of the Government Code to read:

"§42000.1. Collection of locally authored books and materials. The Library is hereby authorized to actively solicit or purchase, if necessary, books and written matter authored by local residents which contain information of significant historical and cultural value to the people of Guam. The Library shall insure that all materials so acquired will benefit the people of Guam and the Library's territorial collection. The Board shall establish and promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law on the implementation of this section. The Library is authorized to request funds for the implementation of the provisions of this section to be included in the Library's annual budget request submitted to the Governor for submission to the Legislature."

COMMITTEE REPORT ON BILL NO. 512

(AS SUBSTITUTED BY THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

"AN ACT RELATIVE TO ENCOURAGING AND AUTHORIZING THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY TO SOLICIT OR PURCHASE BOOKS AND WRITING MATERIALS AUTHORED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS CONTAINING SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION OF VALUE TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTIONS 42012 OF TITLE XXXVIII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY, AND TO AMEND SECTIONS 42008, 42009, 42014 AND 42015 RELATIVE TO THE DELETION OF REFERENCES PERTAINING TO THE GUAM MUSEUM FROM SUCH PROVISIONS."

The Committee on Education, Twenty Second Guam Legislature, conducted a Public Hearing on Bill No. 512, relative to authorizing the Guam

Public Library to solicit or purchase locally authored books and writing materials of informational value to the People of Guam, and Bill No. 474, relative to requiring the appointment of the Director of the Guam Public Library, on Thursday, July 15, 1993, in the Public Hearing Room, Temporary Legislative Building, Agana. Because of the applicability of the provisions within both bills to the Guam Public Library, the Committee has combined both provisions into a single measure, which is now Bill No. 512, as substituted by the Committee on Education.

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Kenneth R. T. Perez Chairman, Guam Public Library Board

Mr. Kenneth R. T. Perez, Chairman of the Guam Public Library Board, presented oral and written testimony to the Committee in support of both Bill No. 512 and Bill No. 474. On Bill No. 512, Mr. Perez stated that the library is the holding place of information on the island and that the proposed provision would help acknowledge local authors for their contribution to Guam's culture and heritage, and asked that the measure be passed to help the library with its information collections. On Bill No. 474, Mr. Perez testified in support of the measure emphasizing that the Board is in support of the proposed increase in the requirement for a quorum.

Frank R. San Agustin Territorial Librarian, Guam Public Library

Mr. Frank R. San Agustin, Territorial Librarian of the Guam Public Library, presented oral and written testimony in support of Bill No. 474. Mr. San Agustin presented a brief history on the position of Territorial Librarian and its administrative responsibilities, thus necessitating the change in the title of the position. Mr. San Agustin further explained his support for the increase in the quorum requirement of the Board which is presently three; when the number of Board members were increased to seven in 1985, the quorum requirement was not increased accordingly. Mr. San Agustin concluded by stating that Bill No. 474 addresses the importance of appropriateness and consistency in government and eliminates ambiguities in the present law.

Willis S. Cannon Chairman, Civil Service Commission

Mr. Willis S. Cannon, Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, presented written testimony on behalf of the Commission in support of Bill No. 474. Mr. Cannon presented a proposal for amending the provision in the measure pertaining to the selection of employees. Mr. Cannon concluded his statement by mentioning that the Commission questions the proposal to require the Board's appointment of the Director to legislative confirmation, because the appointment of the Board members are already subject to legislative confirmation.

COMMITTEE QUESTIONS / COMMENTS

Senator Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Chairperson, posed a question to the representatives from the Guam Public Library on Bill Nos. 512 and 474. Senator Bordallo asked Mr. Frank R. San Agustin and Mr. Kenneth R. T. Perez if the Guam Public Library has ever turned away a local author from presenting the library with their written books or materials. Mr. San Agustin responded that the Library has never refused individuals who would like to donate their writing materials to the facility, but not many have approached the Library in the past.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS / RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Education finds that the Guam Public Library is the primary source of information on the island, thereby it should continue to increase its collection of informational books, magazines and other reference materials; such materials should also consist of information on the culture, heritage and history of Guam and its People. The Committee also finds that the government of Guam should encourage our the Guam Public Library, which is the primary source of information and reference materials, to collect books and documents written by local residents which may contain information useful to the preservation and enhancement of the island's local traditions and culture. The Committee further finds that Public Law 21-118 separated the Guam Museum from the Guam Public Library, but did not make appropriate amendments deleting any reference of the Guam Museum from Guam's laws on the Guam Public Library, thus, the proposed provision would make necessary Therefore, the Committee on Education, Twenty amendments accordingly. Second Guam Legislature, recommends that Bill No. 512, as substituted by the Committee on Education, "AN ACT RELATIVE TO ENCOURAGING AND AUTHORIZING THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY TO SOLICIT OR PURCHASE BOOKS AND WRITING MATERIALS AUTHORED BY LOCAL RESIDENTS CONTAINING SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION OF VALUE TO THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; AND TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTIONS 42012 OF TITLE XXXVIII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE APPOINTMENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE GUAM PUBLIC LIBRARY, TO AMEND SECTIONS 42008, 42009, 42014 AND 42015 RELATIVE TO THE DELETION OF REFERENCES PERTAINING TO THE GUAM MUSEUM FROM SUCH PROVISIONS", be favorably considered and passed by the Twenty Second Guam Legislature.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF **GUAM:**

Section 1. Authorization for the Purchase of Locally written Materials.

a.) Legislative Intent.

For many years, local residents have written books and documents about Guam, the Marianas, Micronesia, and the Pacific Region containing valuable information which may be beneficial to the People of Guam, comprising information pertaining to Guam's history, culture, language or traditions. Such books and materials written by local authors should be collected by Guam's major informational resource center, the Guam Public Library, for the benefit of future generations. This provision would authorize the Guam

Public Library to solicit or purchase, if necessary, such materials for the library's informational collection.

b.) Collection of Locally Authored Books/Materials.

The Guam Public Library is hereby authorized to actively solicit or purchase, if necessary, books and writing materials authored by local residents which contain information of significant historical and cultural value to the People of Guam. The Library must insure that any and all materials acquired through this Act will truly benefit the People of Guam and the Library's material informational collection.

The Guam Public Library Board shall establish and promulgate rules and regulations relative to the proper implementation of this Act. Copies of such rules and regulations shall be distributed to the Governor and the Guam Legislature within 30 days following its adoption.

c.) Authorization for funding request.

The Guam Public Library is hereby authorized to request funds for the implementation of the provisions within this Act. Such funding requests shall be included in the Library's annual budget request, and submitted to the Governor and the Guam Legislature.

Section 2. Director of the Guam Public Library and Deletion of References pertaining to the Guam Museum.

a.) Change of Title from Territorial Librarian to Director.

Section 42012 of the Government Code is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 42012. Librarian Director.

The Board shall appoint a Librarian Director, subject to the confirmation of the Legislature who shall perform such executive functions in connection with the operation of the library as may be designated by the Board, and who shall serve as executive secretary of the Board without additional

compensation."

b.) Quorum Requirements.

Section 42008 of the Government Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 42008. Same: Quorum.

Three (3) Four (4) members of the Board shall constitute a quorum."

c.) Board Actions.

Section 42009 of the Government Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 42009. Same: Acts.

The concurrence of three (3) four (4) members of the Board shall constitute a quorum."

d.) Employees.

Section 42014 of the Government Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 42014. Selection of Employees. The Librarian and all other persons Employees employed shall be appointed, paid and hold their positions pursuant to the provisions of Title IV, Chapter IV of Guam Code Annotated and other personnel laws the Personnel Law, Title V of the Government Code, now in force, or as hereafter amended, and their remuneration shall be established in accordance with the provisions of Title 4, Chapter 6, 4 GCA and other personnel laws such law."

e.) Acceptance of Contributions.

Section 42015 of the Government Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 42015. The Board shall have authority to accept on behalf of, and in the name of, the Government of Guam from any government or agency thereof, or any person, advisory services, grants-in-aid, gifts, donations of money and other property for the benefit of the Library, or the Guam Museum,

Guam Archives; provided that any grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or other form of assistance involving an obligation on the part of the Library or the Guam Museum or the Guam Archives or the Government of Guam shall require the approval of the Governor."

TESTIMONY

(Bill No. 474)

Good morning Senator Bordallo and members of your Committee on Education. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to testify on Bill No. 474.

I support Bill No. 474. Public Law 2-107 in August 1954 established the Library and mandated that the Library Board "Librarian." Since that time the position "Territorial Librarian" was established in the classified service and remained classified until 1983 when it was converted into the unclassified service. That action removed the position of "Territorial Librarian" from the list of classified service. As a result, the role and functions of the Territorial Librarian as head of the Guam Public Library shifted from a librarianship to that of administratorship or directorship. As early as 1979 during the first Guam Governor's Conference on Library Information Services, the relationship between the Librarian and Director of Library Services was defined and one of the conference recommendations was to establish the position of Director, Guam Public Library, apart from the Civil Service Commission's established position of "Territorial Librarian."

Over the years Since 1987, I was subjected to scrutiny for not being a Librarian but was never challenged as to my role as Director, head of the Guam Public Library; in fact, I had many praises of being a good administrator. To conclude this section of the bill, let me just say that in my research of the Public Library System throughout the country (United States) over 95% of the head of the Library are holding the position of directorship.

Extending the brief history of the Library to Sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 of Bill No. 474, P.L. 2-107 established a five (5)

member board and then another member was added and subsequently in September 1, 1985, through P.L. 18-14 the current composition of the board reached seven (7) members with the addition of a secondary student member. While these were happening, the constitution of the quorum was never changed and it continued to remain at three (3) members. Section 3 of Bill No. 474 is appropriately an extension of Section 2. Section 4 of Bill 474 is simply enhancing the intent of Section 1 of Bill 474 which separates the unclassified position of Director from the normal process of recruitment for the classified service. Under Section 5 of Bill 474, the intent of the section is simply to correct the oversight when this section (Section 42015) was not addressed after P.L. 21-118 separated the Museum from the Guam Public Library.

I completely support Bill 474 as written and I believe it is a significant bill as it addresses the importance of appropriateness and consistency in government and eliminates ambiguities.
