Twenty Third Guam Legislature 1996 (FIFTH) Special Session

I, Ted S. Nelson, the Acting Speaker and Presiding Officer of the Twenty Third Guam Legislature, hereby acknowledge, that at 2:55 p.m. Friday, June 21, 1996, the Office of the Acting Speaker received a transmittal from Acting Governor Bordallo with respect to the existing conditions on the island's power system, and the urgent need to improve the reliability of our electrical infrastructure in order to meet the increased capacity requirements.

In a transmittal letter to the Speaker of the Legislature on June 10, 1996, Governor Gutierrez expressed concern with respect to the thirty (30) day procurement restrictions with regard to declarations of emergency. Because it is not practical or logical that emergency crisis can be solved within a thirty (30) day period, Governor Gutierrez was prompted to call on the members of this Legislature to work with the Administration to act on solutions to our island's obvious and protracted infrastructure problems. In response to the Governor's request, Bill No. 666 "An Act to Provide for Emergency Procurement for the Island's Power Generation", was introduced on June 10, 1996.

Presently, with the need to meet increased capacity requirements resulting from the completion of the new Southern High School, the opening of the new Tamuning Elementary School, and other new building projects around the island, Acting Governor Bordallo, by her letter of June 21, 1996, has urged this body into action for the purpose of addressing proposed legislation to provide the Guam Power Authority the authority necessary to accomplish the emergency and urgent needs to insure the adequacy and reliability of our electrical power generation system.

Therefore, I hereby certify, pursuant to §2103 of Title 2, Guam Code Annotated, that emergency conditions will exist involving danger to the public health and safety resulting from the rash of load-shedding and power outages during the heaviest demand periods which compromise public health and safety, and waive the statutory requirement for a public hearing on Bill No. 1(5-S), a bill identical to Bill No. 668 (LS), introduced on June 10, 1996, upon request of the Governor of Guam in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam.

Dear Speaker Nelson,

After being briefed on the relevant facts associated with existing conditions of the island's power system, and with the urgent need to greatly improve the reliability of our electrical infrastructure in order to meet the increased capacity requirements resulting from the completion of the new southern high school, the opening of the new Tamuning Elementary School, and other new building projects around the island and in order to avoid the totally unacceptable rash of load shedding and power outages during the heaviest demand periods which, in fact, compromise the public safety and welfare, I have decided that the public interest and the safety and welfare of our citizens will be considerably compromised if nothing is done to permit the Guam Power Authority to immediately proceed with whatever is necessary to secure the additional generation required to provide the capacity and reliability needed to satisfy immediate and short term demands and needed to permit GPA to adequately and effectively perform the maintenance required.

Therefore, I find it necessary to invoke the powers granted to the Governor of Guam under Title I of Chapter 3, §1423(h) to call the Guam Legislature into Special Session at 2:00pm on Saturday, June 22, 1996, for

the specific purpose of considering emergency legislation necessary for the protection of the public interest, public health, safety and welfare. I have attached proposed legislation which has been drafted to provide the Guam Power Authority the authority necessary to accomplish the emergency and urgent needs to insure the adequacy and reliability of our electrical power generation system in the most effective and efficient manner possible.

RE: DRAFT BILL RELATIVE TO PROCUREMENT FOR POWER GENERATION.

Dear Speaker Parkinson:

Attached please find a copy of a draft bill and draft floor amendment which addresses our present emergency situation with regard to power generation. ² The draft bill is entitled: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT FOR THE ISLAND'S POWER GENERATION".

As you know, our current procurement laws are quite restrictive with regard to declarations of emergency to immediately address major procurement for emergency situations, because the procurement for emergencies must be completed within Thirty (30) days. For power generation, as well as water and sewer areas, it is not practical or logical that the crises will be solved, all necessary procurement made, within Thirty (30) days.

I have been working closely with Senator Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson on needed changes in the procurement law to address the power generation concern. The attached draft legislation is a collaborative effort and makes it possible to address emergency procurement for power generation. This emergency may be addressed either by securing new sources of power generation through land-based generation equipment or sea-based power sources. In any event, procurement restrictions need to be eliminated so that this situation can be addressed.

I have been inundated with proposals from various sources relative to the supply of power generation. Up to now, I am reluctant to act on these proposals due to procurement law restrictions. Now is your opportunity to work with the Administration, to act on solutions to our island's obvious and protracted power problems. urge you to take either the route of expediting the legislative action by introducing the attached draft bill and declaring an emergency on it, or adopting the attached draft floor amendment concurrently with other pending legislation.
