Enclosed please find a copy of Substitute Bill No. 311 (LS), "AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §5117 OF TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING AUTHORITY FOR DUTY TIME FOR ALL TEACHERS TO THE BOARD OF EDUCATION", which I have signed into law today as Public Law No. 23-112.

This bill authorizes the Guam Territorial Board of Education to set duty hours for teachers. Currently, duty hours are specified by law to be from 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class to 15 minutes after the last class, and teachers are required to spend 5 hours a day in instructional time, with additional time as specified by the Board of Education, up to a total of 8 hours per day.

I believe that the Territorial Board of Education will prescribe appropriate duty hours for teachers, and this matter does not have to be legislated.

Employees occupying permanent positions shall accrue sick leave at the rate of one-half day (4 hours) for each biweekly pay period in which they are in pay status for the entire ten (10) days; otherwise, there shall be no accrual for such period. For the purposes of this section, all full time employees of the Department of Education, University of Guam and the Guam Community College shall be deemed to be employees on the same two thousand eighty (2,080) hour year divided into twenty-six (26) bi-weekly pay periods as other permanent positions within the Government, even though such employees may be paid in accordance with the different payroll system. Therefore, they shall accrue thirteen (13) days sick leave per duty year.

(b) Upon the effective date of this Act, members of the Guam Legislature shall not be eligible for the prospective accrual of sick leave.

Section 2. Effective Date. The effective date of this Act shall be at the commencement of the Twenty-Fourth Guam Legislature.

Bill No. 439 - AN ACT TO AMEND §4108(a) OF TITLE 4 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PROSPECTIVE ELIMINATION OF THE FUTURE ACCRUAL OF SICK LEAVE BY MEMBERS OF THE GUAM LEGISLATURE.

PREFACE

The Committee on Rules convened at 6:25 p.m., Wednesday, February 8, 1996 in the Legislature's Public Hearing Room in Agana, Guam.

Alongside Chairman Sonny Lujan Orsini were Speaker Don Parkinson, Vice Speaker Ted S. Nelson and Senators Tom Ada, Lou Leon Guerrero, Vicente C. Pangelinan, Antonio R. Unpingco and Judith Won Pat-Borja.

OVERVIEW

Included in the report from Inspector General, Senators should not accrual sick leave as public servants. There is no mechanism establishing a single individual to approve or deny a request for sick leave.

As public officials, Senators are expected to meet with members of the public and entertain whatever concerns are brought to their attention, be it during the regular work day or off hours.

Be that as it may, the accrual of sick leave may be classified as a benefit for members and used to add extra time to their service for retirement credit purposes.

COMMITTEE FINDINGS

Senator Tom Ada addressed the members of the Committee and recommends that it include all elected officials. The exclusion of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Agency Directors makes the Bill discriminatory directed at Senators alone.

In response, the Chairman responded that previous reports from Inspector General indicated that the accrual of sick leave by Senators is an extra perk enjoyed by members. Hours accrued during a term are often used to pad onto their times in service for retirement

Speaker Don Parkinson testified in favor of Bill 439. He supports the fact that Senators may pass legislation to discriminate against themselves. Secondly, Senators are salaried employees who are paid on a set basis. They receive a set pay whether or not they are sick for a day or two during the pay period.

Public Law 19-34, section 36 established the compensation of Senators at 50% of the Superior Court Judges and the Speaker at 50% of the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court of Guam. These are set salaries and to deviate from the law is illegal. (ATTACHMENT I)

Vice Speaker Ted Nelson informed the Committee that he is in support of the removal of sick leave and annual leave of Senators. However, he will not support any move to remove such leave from mayors and other elected officials.

Senator Judith Won Pat-Borja supports the status quo. Stating that Senators should be held accountable of their time in office. When they to are sick, members should be required to sign leave for the period they are out of the office.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Senators are elected by the people and are expected to be available at all time of the days. Thus Senators are not at their reigns while they are in the office and not at times that they are out. In light of the fact that Senators are salaried employees and their compensations are established by statute, the accrual of and sick leave becomes an extra benefit added to senatorial time in service. Furthermore, the Committee on Rules wishes to report out Bill 439 with the recommendation to do pass.
