Dear Speaker Won-Pat Borja:

Enclosed please find a copy of Bill 29 (LS), "AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 831 TO TITLE I, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED TO NAME THE ADELUP COMPLEX IN ADELUP THE "RICARDO J. BORDALLO GOVERNOR'S COMPLEX", which I have signed into law today as **Public Law 23-116**.

It is indeed fitting that during the tenure of the Gutierrez-Bordallo Administration, this legislation is presented to my office for enactment into public law. As a senator in the 20th Guam Legislature, it was my privilege to sponsor Bill 1198 which provided for naming the Adelup complex after the late Governor Bordallo. I am pleased that, as Governor, I am able to bring this idea to fruition with the enactment of this public law.

At this historic moment, I am honored to have as my Lieutenant Governor, The Honorable Madeleine Z. Bordallo, widow of former Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo. I am also honored to have in my cabinet, as the Director of the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities, Ms. Deborah Bordallo, daughter of Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo. Madeleine and Deborah, along with Governor Bordallo's granddaughter, Nicole Nelson, serve as this Administration's and this community's links to the legacy of Ricardo J. Bordallo: Governor, visionary, businessman, farmer, Democratic Party leader, statesman, and man of the people. Ricky Bordallo contributed a great deal to Guam and it's people whom he loved dearly. He dreamed dreams that seemed out of proportion at the time, yet in the sharp light of hindsight, these out-of-proportion dreams seem just right for today's


world. He was a tireless worker for the people during his many years in public office. His public career began in 1954 with his election as Senator and continued during four of the most momentous decades in Guam's history. Ricky was a leader of the Popular Party and, after it's affiliation with the national Democratic Party, became the first State Chairman of the Democratic Party of Guam. He was the Democratic Party's nominee for Governor in the island's first five Gubernatorial elections and was successful in twice being elected to this high office.

Perhaps more memorable than the public offices he held are the ideals which Ricky championed during his life. He was one of the founding fathers of our Quest for Commonwealth and the cause of securing the rights of the Chamorro People. He launched the Green Revolution which gave due priority to the development of Guam's agricultural sector. Ricky also believed that for any community to succeed it must have a strong sense of pride in itself and its heritage. Consequently, he was a strong advocate for support of the Chamorro culture and development of public facilities that were not only useful but also served as a source of pride and inspiration for our people. The Adelup complex, which will now bear his name, and the other facilities constructed by the late Governor Bordallo, serve as a fitting testament to his idealism and his love for our people.

It is these ideals which are Ricky's most enduring legacy and which stand as more than ample support for the memorialization of his life and contributions. In recognition of Ricky's legacy and achievements, I am pleased to name the Adelup Complex the "Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor's Complex" to memorialize the many positive accomplishments for Guam that were secured by Governor Bordallo during his time. I consider myself fortunate to have the opportunity to designate this complex in memory of the husband of my Lieutenant Governor and the father of my Director of CAHA, both of whom, along with Nicole, are the true representatives of Ricky's legacy to Guam.

A copy of the Governor's message and bill has also been delivered to the Office of the Legislative Secretary.

- 1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:**
2 **Section 1.** A new §831 is hereby added to Title 1, Guam Code
3 Annotated, to read:

1 “§831. Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor’s Complex. The Adelup
2 Complex, located in Adelup shall hereafter be known as the “Ricardo J.
3 Bordallo Governor’s Complex.” Any provisions in the laws of Guam
4 referring to the Adelup Complex are hereby deemed to read the “Ricardo J.
5 Bordallo Governor’s Complex.” The Governor of Guam, the Mayor of Asan,
6 and members of the Asan Municipal Planning Council, shall cause to be
7 erected appropriate nameplates or signs designating the Adelup Complex as
8 the “Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor’s Complex.” Further, at such ceremony as
9 the Governor, the Mayor of Asan, and members of the Asan Municipal
10 Planning Council deem appropriate, the “Ricardo J. Bordallo Governor’s
11 Complex” shall be officially named and a plaque bearing the name, picture,
12 and a bust and brief history of the contributions of the Late Governor Ricardo
13 J. Bordallo to the people of Guam shall be affixed within a suitable spot in or
14 on the building and buildings.”
