Enclosed please find a copy of Bill No. 717 (LS), "AN ACT TO BRING THE DEPARTMENT OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION INTO COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL LAW REQUIREMENTS RELATIVE TO FEDERAL FUNDING BY AMENDING §41101, REPEALING AND REENACTING §41103, AND REPEALING §\$41104, 41105, AND ITEM (7) OF §41106 OF TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED", which I have signed into law as Public Law 23-126.

This legislation was submitted by the Office of the Governor to the Legislature for enactment into law to respond to federal requirements. Signing this bill into law now guarantees the continuance of federal funding for the territory in order to keep our vocational rehabilitation programs active and serving our citizens. A failure to bring our Department of Vocational Rehabilitation into line with the funding guidelines jeopardized the approximately \$2 Million yearly that presently funds the bulk of the vocational rehabilitation programs.

Federal requirements demand that the funding that is entrusted to the territory be under the responsibility of personnel who devote full time to providing program services to the people for vocational rehabilitation. Federal requirements also demand that an advisory group consisting of citizens who are involved in the provision of services, or who are direct consumers of services, provide input into the vocational rehabilitation programs.

In order to comply with these requirements, it was necessary to streamline the structure of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, as outlined in this legislation. It is no longer possible to have a part time Board of Control which also manages and directs the programs. Although this structure was used in the past, newer federal legislation provides that consumer based advisory groups have an important input into programs.

I am very pleased that this legislation was enacted quickly, to guarantee continued services to the people who need them.

Hafa Adai to you Senator, and the members of the Committee on Education. My name is Rodney Priest and I currently serve as the Vice Chairperson, of the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council (GRAC). The Council is federally mandated to provide the essential functions of reviewing, analyzing, and advising the Director of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, in matters related to the extent, scope, and effectiveness of the services provided by the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR). Especially in matters that affect or have the potential to affect the ability of qualified Individuals With Disabilities in achieving their rehabilitational goals and objectives. It is to that end that I am here at today's public hearing, to attempt to provide some rationale as to why Bill 717, must be passed and done so expeditiously, so as to maintain the continuity of services that DVR now provides to qualified Individuals With Disabilities.

First I would like to thank the current members of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation's Board of Control for their diligent work, and to say that their input will always be welcomed at the Rehabilitation Advisory Council's meeting.

The United States Department of Education's (USDOE) Rehabilitation Services Administration (RSA) has long been concerned with the apparent inconsistencies and conflicting lines of authority between the Director of DVR and the Board of Control. The 1996 Guam State Plan identified the Director of DVR as having full responsibility and authority for the administration and supervision of the vocational rehabilitation services program, in compliance with Section 101 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (as amended). P.L. 18-32 gives similar administration and supervisory powers to the Board of Control. These powers were indeed necessary when the DVR had a revenue producing branch. It needed an entity to control those funds. This is no longer the case at DVR,

and the need for a Board of Control has also passed. The Rehabilitation Advisory Council has also become aware of the Board's attempt to become more involved in the day to day operations of the DVR. It is the blurring of the lines of responsibility that has caused the RSA to delay the approval of the 1997 Guam DVR State Plan and thus jeopardize the vocational rehabilitation services provided by the DVR, with the over \$2 million of money granted to the DVR. These services include but are not limited to Direct Services to qualified Individuals with Disabilities, Supported Employment and Independent Living Rehabilitation Services for consumers at DVR

The Rehabilitation Advisory Council wholeheartedly supports the intent of Bill 717. It is also the sincere wish of the Council that any member of the existing Board of Control who desires to continue to assist qualified Individuals With Disabilities, in the process of fulfilling the fundamental goal of obtaining gainful employment, express their intent and become members of the Rehabilitation Advisory Council, so that we may continue to collaboratively work with the Director of DVR in assuring the proper provision of services to qualified Individuals With Disabilities.

Madame Chair, members of the Committee on Education, thank you for your time in allowing me to provide testimony in favor of Bill 717.

Hafa Adai and Buenas Madame Chair and members of the Committee on Education. My name is Joseph Artero-Cameron, Director of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation.

I come before you today to testify in support of Bill 717 that proposes to amend and repeal Public Law 18-32 (§41103 through 41106, Guam Code Annotated), the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation's enabling legislation.

The passage of Bill 717 is very urgent in order to bring Guam into compliance with federal mandates concerning the administration of federal monies.

At present, the Department's State Plan for federal funding fiscal year 1997 is in jeopardy until the proposed changes to the local statutes are implemented.

The Department stands to lose more than \$2 million in federal funds for next fiscal year unless the current code sections about the Board of Control are repealed and amended to require that the activities of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation be placed solely under the responsibility of the Director who is a full time employee responsible for the administration of the Department and accountable for federal funds as mandated by federal law. The Rehab Act requires that the Rehabilitation Advisory Council (RAC) be the advisors to the Director of the Department.



This is in response to your recent request for Regional Office comments on the proposed legislation - Guam Senate Bill 7/7 - currently under consideration to resolve the conflict between existing local Government Guam law and the federal Rehabilitation Act, as amended in 1992 (Act), related to the designation of authority and lines of responsibility for the administration of the state vocational rehabilitation programs jointly funded by state and federal funds.

In our analysis, if enacted as presently written Bill 77 (copy enclosed) would eliminate any appearance of conflict with the Act and bring the organization of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation into full compliance with those provisions of the Act related to the Sole State Agency and State Plan provisions. This Bill clearly establishes that the responsibilities for all executive and administrative functions of the Department would be vested in a full time. Director who has been appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Guam Legislature. Moreover, as presently written, enactment of this Bill would assure our Regional Office approval of those provisions of the Guam State Plans, under Titles I and VI, Part C of the Act, as they relate to the Sole State Agency, and thus remove this as a potential barrier to uninterrupted continuation of federal funding into federal fiscal year 1997.

Dear Mr. Cameron:

This is to acknowledge that this Regional Office has received the Guam Department of vocational rehabilitation's State Plan Amendments for Title I and VI, Part C for fiscal year 1997. In our pretiminary review of these documents, we noted that Attachment 3.9 was not included with this submission. I am enclosing a copy of our identical Memorandum 96-98, deted May 30, 1996, which describes the procedures for preparation of these materials.

We must have these additional attachments as part of our review of the Amendments, as the State Plan for fiscal year 1997 cannot be approved in their absence.

In our preliminary review we also note that DVR has not addressed the issues previously identified by this office related to lines of authority and responsibility for administering the rehabilitation program in Guam. As you will recall, there has been a great deal of discussion and correspondence between our office and your agency, as well as with Governor Gutterrez and his staff, related to the apparent inconsistencies and conflicting of lines of authority that currently exist between the Director of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) and the Board of Control. As currently approved, the Guam State Plan identifies the DVR Director as having full responsibility and authority for administration and supervision of the vocational rehabilitations services program.

However, when the Board of Control was re-established early last year as a result of Government Guam law, the local law established similar administrative and supervisory authority and responsibilities within the Board of Control. During the past year we have been advised that the Board of Control has sought increased authority for the day-to-day administration of the vocational rehabilitation program.

When the Guam State Plan for Title I and VI, Part C for fiscal year 1998 was approved by this office, Governor Gutierrez was again (copy of letter sitached) reminded that this constituted a compliance issue, and his assistance in resolving this issue was sought.

In his response, we were assured that the Government of Guam would review this matter and seek a resolution consistent with the provisions of the Rehabilitation Act, as amended (Act). We have not, however, seen any indication of steps to resolve this issue, either in terms of amendments to the approved State Plan or changes in the local Guam laws...

Thus, I must advise you that the currently proposed State Plan under Title I and VI, Part C, for fiscal year 1997 is not approvable by this Regional Office. To be approvable, the State Plan must contain an assurance that the program will be administered as defined in Section 101 of the Act, as well as language to clarify the lines of authority and responsibilities of the director and the Board of Control, that is consistent with the Act.

Obviously, this is a very serious matter, as future funding of the Vocational Rehabilitation program is at stake. I cannot everly stress the importance of resolving this issue as soon as possible.



RESOLUTION 96-01

The Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council for the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation hereby formally adopts the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the loss of federal funding for Vocational Rehabilitation programs in Guam will devastate the lives of the consumers and their families who will have no other recourse to meet their critical needs; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation's federal funding of approximately \$2,012,601.00 is at stake; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 1988, the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation provided USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration with copies of proposed legislation to amend P.L. 18-32 (17 GCA §41103 and 41105) to include clarification of the Director's role and authority for administration of the vocational rehabilitation programs on Guam, and redefined the Board of Control powers and duties to "...provide technical and advisory support to the Director..."; and

WHEREAS, P.L. 18-32 had in fact not been amended, and that the Board of Control had been re-instituted on January 1995 thus constituting a compliance issue as defined in Section 101 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the new Board of Control is providing substantially more than "...technical and advisory support to the Director...", clouding the area of the Director's responsibilities as well as the lines of authority within the administration of the Government of Guam thus created a major compliance issue that required resolution in order to insure continued funding of the Vocational Rehabilitation programs under the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as Amended, hereinafter referred to as the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation is federally funded with a 21.3% local matching fund; and

WHEREAS, when the Board of Control was re-established early last year as a result of P.L. 18-32, the local law established similar administrative and supervisory authority and responsibilities within the Board of Control same that of the federally mandated duties for the full-time Director for the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the 1996 Guam State Plan as currently approved by USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration, identifies the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation Director as having full responsibility and authority for administration and supervision of the vocational rehabilitation services program; and

WHEREAS, legislation has yet to be passed to address the issues previously identified by USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration related to lines of authority and responsibility for administering the 78.3% federally funded vocational rehabilitation program in Guam; and

WHEREAS, Region IX, USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration, has cited the Guam Department of Vocational Rehabilitation for compliance violation inconsistent with the provisions of the Act, as referred to in their letter dated July 23, 1996; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation's 1997 proposed State Plan under Title I and VI, Part C, is not approvable by Region IX USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration; and

WHEREAS, the USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration will only approve a State Plan that contains an assurance that the vocational rehabilitation program in Guam will be administered as defined in Section 101 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council hereby attaches to this resolution an Impact Statement (Attachment 1) detailing that the loss of federal funding to the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation potentially poses a dangerously significant budget crisis that will negatively impact the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation's consumers, many families in Guam, Government of Guam agencies, rehabilitation professionals and support staff of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, non-profit/profit organizations and private corporations doing business with the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Guam Rehabilitation Advisor Juncil for the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation finds that it generally agrees with the concerns outlined by Region IX USDOE Rehabilitation Services Administration that the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, is not in compliance with its State Plan, given the various assurances and certifications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that by federal statute, the federal government saw a need nationwide to have an advisory council to review the activities of each state and territorial vocational rehabilitation agency, and as a result, the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council was created by Executive Order 93-05, thereby with the existence of the Board of Control, a duplication exists.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council recommends that Sections 1,2 and 3 of Public Law 18-32 relative to the Board of Control be repealed and re-enacted. The new language should effectively eliminate the Board of Control and transfer all authority and administrative responsibility to the Director of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the elimination of the Board of Control thereby facilitates the establishment of clear, established policies and procedures that will bring the Department into compliance with the Act.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council acknowledge the efforts and invaluable input that has been made by the Board of Control members and suggests that the Governor consider appointing them to the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Guam Rehabilitation Advisory Council is concerned about the imminent termination of funding if compliance issues are not resolved prior to October 1, 1996.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. (a) Legislative intent. Presently, Guam 3 Department of Vocational Rehabilitation is administered by a Director who 4 is responsible for the execution of the "state plan" for vocational 5 rehabilitation programs funded by the federal government. Department also is advised by the Rehabilitation Advisory Board (RAC), 6 7 made up of a cross-section of consumers and others involved in vocational rehabilitation. The establishment of the RAC is mandated by federal law. 8 9 In addition, local law specifies a "Board of Control for Vocational 10 Rehabilitation". The Board of Control under local statute is "the governing and the policy making body of the Department" (see §41103 of Title 17, 11 12 Guam Code Annotated). At the same time, "All executive and 13 administrative functions of the Department are vested in the Director who 14 is the Executive Officer of the Board. The Director is appointed by the 15 Board with the approval of the Governor and with the advice and consent 16 of the Legislature."

The federal government requires a "state plan" to be submitted for approval each year in order for federal funding to be released to Guam for the purposes of vocational rehabilitation. The Director of the Department is approved as the party responsible for implementation of the state plan. According to federal regulation, the responsibility for the federal funds released must be vested in either a Director, or in a Board, but not in both. Our local statutes currently mix the role of the Director, who is a full time employee, and the role of the Board of Control, which meets occasionally and whose members are not full time employees. According to federal requirements, the person or board responsible for the federal funds must devote full time and attention to this position and be accountable for the funds.

The federal government has served notice to Guam by written correspondence dated July 23, 1996 that the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation must be brought into compliance with federal law, and that otherwise federal dollars totaling over \$2 Million will be lost for Fiscal Year 1997.

In order to bring Guam into compliance, it is necessary to repeal the current law relative to the Board of Control. The activities of the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation must be placed under the responsibility of the Director, advised by the Rehabilitation Advisory Council, also mandated by federal law and currently in existence as required. The members of the Board of Control may be appointed to the Rehabilitation Advisory Council and thereby continue their work in this field.
