AN ACT TO PRIVATIZE THE OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE OF THE GLASS PULVERIZER CURRENTLY UNDER THE CUSTODIAL CARE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative findings and intent. The Legislature finds that 2 since the installation of the glass pulverizer, the Department of Public Works 3 4 has not been able to maintain the pulverizer at its maximum operating potential to service the needs of the people of Guam. It is incumbent upon 5 this government to see that public funds are utilized effectively and 6 7 efficiently. The Legislature further finds that since the installation of the glass pulverizer, the Department of Public Works has remained unable to secure a contract for the maintenance of the pulverizer. Therefore, it is the Legislature's intent in order to realize optimal gains from the use of the 10 1 1 pulverizer, including strengthening the recycling program on Guam, that 1 2 responsible parties be contracted to perform the operations and maintenance 13 of the glass pulverizer or, in the alternative, that the glass pulverizer be sold to a qualified private entity. 14

Section 2. Operations and Maintenance of Glass Pulverizer. (a) 1 Option to Lease. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to enter into 2 contract(s) with reasonable and responsible parties to operate and maintain 3 the glass pulverizer. Bids for this contract shall be in compliance with all 4 applicable laws of the Territory, including but not limited to, the Procurement 5 Law. (b) Option to Sell. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to sell 6 the glass pulverizer to reasonable and responsible parties. (c) All bids shall be 7 in compliance with all applicable laws of the Territory, including but not 8 limited to, the Procurement Law. Lease or sale of the glass pulverizer shall be 9 10 final and not subject to legislative review. Section 3. Report to the Legislature. The Governor, upon successful 11 lease or sale of the glass pulverizer, shall make available to the Legislature a 12 final report of such transaction. 1 3

COMMITTEE REPORT

Bill No. 560

"An Act to Privatize the Operations and Maintenance of the Glass Pulverizer Currently Under the Custodial Care of the Department of Public Works"

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs conducted a Public Hearing 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, May 28, 1996 in the Legislative Session Hall.

Committee Members Present: Sen. T.S. Nelson, Chairman

SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Gil Shinohara, Director, Department of Public Works provided the committee with oral testimony in support of Bill No. 560. In his testimony, Mr. Shinohara stated that at the present time, the Department of Public Works has neither the budget, nor the personnel to operate and maintain the glass pulverizer. Mr. Shinohara also stated that since the pulverizer was assembled, it was only operational for one day. The one day operation was for the purpose of conducting a test on the capability of the pulverizer. Shortly after the test, the island was hit by Super Typhoon Omar which caused some damage to the pulverizer. Since that time, the Department of Public Works has not been able to get the pulverizer operational. The department has made several attempts to get assistance from the company where the pulverizer was purchased, however, those attempts were unsuccessful. Therefore, the decision to lease or sale the pulverizer to a private company would not be objected by the Department of Public Works.

Mr. Tony Perez, Deputy Director, Department of Public Works provided the committee with oral testimony in support of the Director's comments in support of Bill No. 560. There being no further witnesses appearing before the committee on Bill No. 560, the Chairman declared Bill No. 560 duly publicly heard.

FINDINGS

The committee finds that since the installation of the glass pulverizer, the Department of Public Works has not been able to keep the pulverizer operating at its maximum potential. At a cost of Three Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$390,000) to the taxpayers of Guam, the Legislature is of the opinion that in order to provide such service, it would be in the best interest to allow a private company the opportunity to operate and maintain the glass pulverizer.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 560 to the Twenty-Third Guam Legislature with the recommendation **TO DO PASS as amended**.


