BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

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Section 1. Creation of the Islandwide Beautification Task Force. A new §2104 is added to Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

3 "§2104. (a) The Lt. Governor shall appoint an Islandwide 4 Beautification Task Force, consisting of the Director of the Guam Visitors Bureau, the Director of the Department of Public Works, the 5 Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Director of the 6 Department of Agriculture, the Director of the Department of 7 Corrections (DEPCOR), and other members as the chairperson shall 8 deem necessary. The Task Force shall be under the direction of the 9 Office of the Lt. Governor, who shall serve as Chairperson of the Task 10 Force.

(b) The Task Force shall work in conjunction with the Mayors' 12 13 Council and existing government agencies and private individuals and organizations to beautify and promote Guam. Its function shall include, 14 but not be limited to, the coordination of efforts for the clearing of 15 overgrown weeds or trees, the planting of plants or flowers, and the 16 restoration of graffiti inflicted structures along the island's highways 17 18 and scenic areas.

19 (c) The Task Force shall purchase only those horticultural 20 products grown on Guam."

COMMITTEE REPORT

BILL NO. 132

"An Act create an Islandwide Beautification Task Force under the directive of the Lieutenant Governor's Office in coordination with the Government of Guam agencies in an effort to keep Guam beautiful."

I. BACKGROUND

The intent of Bill No. 132 is to create an Islandwide Beautification Task Force for the purpose of overseeing and implementing beautification projects around the island of Guam. The bill calls for the Task Force to be under the directive of the Lt. Governor's Office, which shall coordinate with the various departments/agencies of the Government of Guam. The committee conducted a Public Hearing in the Session Hall of the Guam Legislature Temporary Building, Agana.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. Joaquin Perez, Chief of Staff Office to Lt. Governor Madeleine Z. Bordallo provided the committee with testimony in support of Bill No. In his testimony, Mr. Perez recommended that the membership of 132. the Task Force include agencies of the Government of Guam in coordination of the Mayors' Council. Mr. Perez continued that the Lt. Governor has already initiated efforts to resurrect the Guam Beautification Task Force, and that calls have been made to former members of the 1986 Task Force to review for inclusion in the new Beautification Task Force. With government agencies appointed to the Task Force should Bill No. 132 become law, the beautification of Guam becomes a collateral duty of these In his testimony, Mr. Perez suggested that the bill be more agencies. specific in that the Directors of these departments be identified as integral members. The purpose of this recommendation would be to ensure that the members of the Task Force are those who can make decisions. Mr. Perez thanked the committee for the opportunity to testify, and asked that the committee report Bill No. 132 to the Legislature with the recommendation to do pass.

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Edward Artero, Mayor Municipality of Yigo provided the committee with oral testimony in support of Bill No. 132. Mayor Artero recommended that Department of Corrections (DEPCOR) and the Department of Youth Affairs (DYA) be included in the Task Force to be utilized in the area of manual labor.

Greg M. Borja, Mayor Municipality of Santa Rita provided the committee with oral testimony in support of Bill No. 132. Mayor Borja informed the committee that the Mayors' Council has always played a major role with respect to the beautification of the island. Mayor Borja continued that Mayors have had their share of frustrations when it came to coordinating with various departments and agencies. However, beautification projects that were implemented have contributed to the beauty of the island. Funding that was made available through previous appropriations must be reappropriated for other municipalities to enjoy. Mr. James P. Castro, representing the Barrigada Municipal Planning Council provided the committee with oral testimony on Bill No. 132. For the record, Mr. Castro informed the Chairman and the members of the committee that the funding appropriated to the Mayors' Council for the purpose of implementing a beautification project within nineteen (19) districts was never released. Overall, the Barrigada Municipal Planning Council supports the intent of Bill No. 132.

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Mr. Bert Unpingco provided the committee with written testimony in support of bill No. 132. Mr. Unpingco testified that Bill No. 132 is the way to go if we are sincere in beautifying the island. Mr. Unpingco continued that with increasing interest by tourist from Korea and Taiwan as well as other countries, it is important that we as a people promote the beauty of our island. Mr. Unpingco commended everyone associated with trying to form this Task Force and offered his assistance when the Task Force has officially been organized.

Mr. Michael Kuhlmann, Director Department of Agriculture provided information to the committee in reference to Bill No. 132. Mr. Kuhlmann informed the members that the Department of Agriculture supports this beautification program, and that the department is ready to support the program with seedlings ready to be planted. Mr. Kuhlmann mentioned that the Mayors have already acquired several plants to beautify their villages.

Mr. A.J. Sonny Shelton, Acting Director for the Department of Parks and Recreation was not present at the hearing, however, provided the committee with a prepared statement in support of Bill No. 132. In his testimony, Mr. Shelton mentioned that with the limited funding, equipment and personnel in the department, he suggested that the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) be tapped to subsidize the financial needs of the Task Force. Mr. Shelton continued that the TAF should be the foundation of the Task Force in improving and beautifying our roads, natural and historical sites, our beaches, parks, and recreational facilities, especially those previously damaged by typhoon and earthquake. In conclusion, the Department of Parks and recreation supports Bill No. 132, however, without the additional funding from the TAF, this program may be difficult to realize.

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The committee finds that there is merit to the intent of Bill No. 132. There is a need to continue the efforts in beautifying the island. The committee further reiterates that the bill must include the Mayors of the various municipal districts in terms of the planning and implementation of the beautification projects for the island.

IV. RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on General Governmental Operations and Micronesian Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 132 to the Twenty-Third Guam Legislature with the recommendation **TO DO PASS Bill No. 132 as amended.**

Honorable Chairman, Members of this Committee

By way of introduction, I am Joaquin Perez, Chief of Staff to Lt. Governor Madeleine Z. Bordallo. I am here to testify in support of this legislation to establish a Guam Beautification Task Force with membership to include agencies of the government of Guam.

As many members of this Committee know, Lieutenant Governor Bordallo has always been involved in beautification projects for this island. As the First Lady of Guam from 1975 to 1978 and from 1983 to 1986, Lt. Governor Bordallo was actively involved in numerous beautification projects. As the founder and Chairperson of the Inetnon Famaloaon, Lt. Governor Bordallo was the primary mover in such beautification and cultural projects such as the Sirena, Two Lover's Point, Chief Quipuha, Chief Gadao and the Santa Marian Kamalen momunent.

As a Senator in the Guam Legislature for five terms, Lt. Governor Bordallo was always a force to contend with in matters related to the beautification of this island. It should be noted that one of her primary philosophies is that Guam should be beautified not only for the sake of tourism but also for the perpetual enjoyment of our people. The people of Guam are beautiful people and this beauty should be reflected in the beauty of their homeland.

As Lt. Governor, Mrs. Bordallo has already initiated efforts to resurrect the Guam Beautification Task Force. We have called former members of the 1986 Task Force and are reviewing names for inclusion in the new group.

We are supportive of this legislation because it officializes the existence of the Task Force. With government agencies appointed to the Task Force by virtue of law, the beautification of Guam becomes a collateral duty of these agencies. We would like to suggest that the law be more specific in that the Director of these departments be identified as members. We make this recommendation simply to insure that the members of the Task Force are those who can make decisions. In closing, as her Chief of Staff, I can assure this Committee that Lt. Governor Bordallo is in full support of this legislation and will assure this body that she will spare no efforts in her quest to make Guam as beautiful as possible for everybody, visitors and residents, young and old alike.

GOOD MORNING SENATOR NELSON AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

The Department of Parks and Recreation supports the bill in its entirety and looks forward to the Beautification of our island. However, with the limited funding, equipment and personnel in our Department, we will be unable to keep up with the expectations of Bill 132. Therefore, we suggest that the Tourist Attraction Fund (TAF) be tapped to subsidize the financial needs of the Islandwide Beautification Task Force.

This fund, which is administered by the Guam Visitors Bureau, was established for the purpose of improving the physical facilities of public parks and recreation areas in order to attract more tourists, our islands number resource. Last year was monumental for our island. We welcomed a record number of visitors--even celebrated out one-millionth visitor from Japan, Guam's backbone in tourism.

The TAF should be the foundation of the Task Force in improving and beautifying our roads, natural and historical sites, our beaches, parks and recreational facilities, especially those previously damaged by typhoon and earthquake. In addition, constructing new facilities, such as walking paths, biking trails and sidewalks will increase the pride in our local community and lure more visitors to our beautiful island.

In conclusion, the Department of Parks and Recreation supports the intent of this bill; however, without additional funding that our Tourist Attaction Fund can provide, it will be difficult to make our dream a reality.

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Islandwide beautification efforts will have an impact in the promotion of the tourism industry by improving our island's natural attractions. Coordination of such efforts can be done by this Islandwide Beautification Task Force.

It is difficult to determine the financial requirements of this bill if enacted, due to the unspecified conditions of the Task Force. It is noted however that financing of beautification projects may not have to impact General Fund Revenues. Already existing are community programs supported by private companies, such as the "Adopt-a-Highway Program" administered by the Department of Public Works. In addition appropriations under the Tourist Attraction Fund have been legislated for beautification projects, such as Public Law 20-92 appropriating \$190,000 to the Mayor's Council.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM 1

2 Section 1. Legislative Statement. The greatest asset the Territory of Guam has is the Chamorro Culture along with the people. The legislature recognizes that the beauty 3 of the island is a direct reflection of the culture, island and its people. In order that we 4 give the visitors who visit the island a true picture of the beauty of Guam, it is-important 5 that we present the island as a lovely and picturesque place to visit. Furthermore, the 6 people of Guam can be proud of our island as the most beautiful in this side of the world. 7

8 During the past year, we have experienced a record number of visitors. Bv presenting a beautiful island to the visitors, we can work towards increasing the number of 9 returning visitors and expand our current visitors base. With tourism as our largest 10 industry, we must try to build on the successes of the past and build for even greater 11 12 successes in the future

13 In order to ensure that the island meets its maximum potential in beauty, it is imperative that the people of Guam be involved in such an effort. Therefore such a task 14 force shall be under the directive of the Lieutenant Governor's Office. This office shall 15 work in coordination with the Guam Visitors Bureau, Department of Public Works, 16 Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Agriculture. Such a Task 17 Force shall work in conjunction with the Mayor's Council of Guam. Furthermore, the 18 Task Force shall be open for public input. 19


